1. James¹ Cutler, of Sprawston, a suburb of Norwich, England, an early settler in Lexington, came from Watertown, and located near the Bedford line. His house was one of the first built. He died 17 July 1694, aged 88. His will, dated 25 Nov. 1684, presented to the court by his sons John and Thomas, proved 20 Aug. 1694, mentioned his children James, Thomas, John, John Coller, Richard Park's wife, John Parmenter's wife, Sarah Waite, Mary Johnson, Hannah Winter, Joanna Russell (Philip's wife), Jemina, Samuel, and Phebe. 

DANFORTH, Jenathan, youngest son of Nicholas and Elizabeth Danforth, was b, in Framlingham, in High Suffolk, England, 1627-8, Feb. 29. His mother d. in England, 1629; his father, in Cambridge, 1638, April, His brother, Thomas, of Cambridge, was one of the most useful and eminent citizens of the colony; selectman, 1045-71; town clerk, 1645-68; assistant, 1659-78. Deputy Governor, 1679-92. except during Andros usurpation, after which, only the prolonged life of the venerable Gov. Bradstreet prevented his election as Governor. He was President of the District of Maine, 1681-92; member of the Council, 1(9)-9; Judge of Superior Court, after 1692; Treasurer of Harvard College, 1650-69; Treasurer of Middlesex County, and from 1648-86, Recorder, The acknowledged leader of the party which resisted the arbitrary proceedings of the King, and effected the counter-revolution in Massachusetts. He d. 1699. Nov. a, aged 77. His brother, Samuel, grad. H. C., 1643; was ordained colleague with John Ellot, as pastor at Roxbury; d. 1674. Nov. 19, leaving an eminent reputation for scholarship and piety. His wife was Mary, dau, of John Wilson, Boston's first pastor,

Our Jonathan Danforth was of worthy stock, and in view of his long life and many and varied services, he might be recognized as the father of the town. His marriage was the first on our records, though it seems to have taken place in Boston, as it was also recorded there. His skill as a surveyor, gave him employment far and white. For forty years he probably surveyed every land grant in Billerica, and must have explored every nook and corner of the ancient town. His descriptions fill some 300 pages, in his own, very clear and handsome hand-writing, in the

SOLOMON CUTLER, the ancestor of the Cutlers of Rindge, was from Lexington, Mass., where his kinsfolk have been numerous. He was a descendant of James Cutler, the emigrant, who was b. in England about 1606, and settled in Watertown, Mass., as early as 1635. About 1648 he removed from Watertown to Cambridge Farms, now Lexington, where he d. May 17,1694. His first wife, Anna, d. in Sept., 1644; he md. (2d) March 9, 1645, Mary King, widow of Thomas King, who d. Dec. 7, 1654, and he md. (3d) about 1662, Phebe Page, a dan, of John Page, the emigrant, ancestor of numerous Page families in Rindge. James Cutler, the eldest son of James and Anna Cutler, was b. Nev. 6, 1635, and md. June 15, 1665, Lydia (Moore) Wright, widow of Samuel Wright, of Sudbury, and dan of John Moore, also of Sudbury. He d in Lexington, July 31, 1685. Thomas Cuffer, his son, b. Dec. 15, 1677; and. Sarah Stone, dau, of Dea, Samuel and Dorcas (Jones) Stone, of Lexington. They resided in Lexington. He was selectman several years. Their eldest son was David Cutler, b. Aug. 6, 1705; and. Mary Tidd, dan, of Joseph and Mary Tild. They resided on the old homestead, near the Bedford line. He was selectman 1749, 1750, 1751. He d. of small-pox, Dec. 5, 1700, and his widow d. May 25, 1797. They had nine children. Of these the sixth was Solomon, who settled in Rindge. Vide Hudson's "History of Lexington."

Solomox Cutler was b. in Lexington, May 10, 1740 (not May 15, as stated by Dr. Bond and by Hudson). He was ind, by Benj, Read, Esq., of Lexington, Dec. 23, 1761, to Rebecca Paige, of Bedford, a sister of John Paige, of Hardwick, who md. Mary Cutler, a sister of Solomon. Rebecca was b. in Bedford, Aug. 23, 1743, They came to Rindge, probably in 1771, and were admitted to the church by letter from the church in Lexington, March 21, 1772. Capt. Cutler lived many years as a farmer and innholder, about one-half mile from Rindge Centre, on the farm subsequently occupied by Dr. Thomas Jewett. He was styled Lieutenant in 1775, and Captain in 1777, and subsequently, on account of commissions held in the home organizations. In 1777 he was a member of Capt. Stone's company, which marched in response to an alarm at Ticonderoga, but is not known to have been in the service at any other time. He was selectman 1775, 1777, and 1783. His wife, the mother of eight children, d. Oct. 18, 1782, and he md. (2d) Hepsibeth Bush, of Sterling, Mass., by whom he had two children.

on account of his ready sympathy and his self-sacrificing efforts in their behalf, He served the town in various offices. and was representative to the General Court in 1860 and 1872. He was deeply interested in the publication of the history of the town; and, through his efforts, the sum necessary for the completion of the illustrations was obtained. By his will, besides other public bequests, he left the sum of \$100 to each of the three churches, to be used in assisting the worthy poor of the parish. He died in 1886.

JOHN CUTLER was born in Reading in 1705. In 1728, he bought the farm in the north part of the town now owned by Alfred Cutler. Morse; 1828 he was of the concern of Thurston & Banister in Boston; 1837 he went to Charleston, S. C., and was for five years in the employ of Kelsey & Halstead. During that time Charleston

was visited by the vellow fever and almost depopulated. He staid and attended to his duties but did not escape without a severe attack of the dread disease, from which he recovered: 1838 he was of the concern of Banister & Lanneau. The partners were W. A. Banister, Peter Lanneau, C. G. Memminger, W. I. Burnett. C. G. Memminger was later Secretary of the Treasury of the Confederacy. The concern was formed for the dry goods importing trade direct to Charleston, S. C. 1839 by the death of Lanneau the concern became Banister & Ravenel. While in business in Charleston he commanded a company of the State militia and was chief marshal of the ceremonies at a public reception given to John C. Calhoun. May, 1838, he went to Europe in the Great Western, the first steamer that crossed the Atlantic with passengers from New York. He arrived in London the day before the coronation of Queen Victoria and saw her as she was escorted to Westminster Abbey to be crowned. 1845, realizing in part the unsettled condition of affairs in the South he went to New York and became one of the concern of Petit, Banister & Harris in that city. 1849-59 he was a partner in the firm of Edward Lambert & Co. in New York. Having an extensive southern acquaintance he had many large customers in that part of the country. 1859 he retired from the concern as a partner but staid in their employ for two or three years, making in that time several trips south regarding the settlement of accounts with concerns there. His last trip brought him to Charleston the day of the bombardment of Fort Sumter followed by its surrender. The years following his retirement he spent part of the time in Newburyport, New York and Worcester. The Public Library Building, in which are the Pliny Merrick Fund Books, and the massive granite entrance gates to cemetery, are reminders of his public spirit and love for his native town. These two gifts and the general use of his family name (as Banister Common) to Brookfield Common make his name a household word. He was a member of the Union League Club of New York.
