BIBLE RECORD OF PETER D'AUGE (DOZIER)

Five people contacted the editor of this column in response to a query requesting the Bible record of Peter D'Auge printed June 26. We are printing the record as sent in by a member of the Historical Soc.:

Jacque Dugue' 1st wife Elizabeth Dupuy from Besance en Berry, came to SC to live bringing two sons, Pierre Duque', Isaac Duque' and one daughter Elizabeth Duque' - Pierre married Angelica Gregory and had Peter Douge who became a Colonel in the Revolutionary War & afterwards a General in the NC Militia, and a son Willoughby who married Millicent. They had Eulalah, Enoch, Willoughby, Peter, Dennis, Eang, Chloe, Annie, Sarah, Margaret & Joseph. A copy of the Bible Record is in the possession of a Mrs. Babb follows:

Peter Dauge, son of Peter Dauge and Angelica or Augusta, his wife, was born Anno Domini 1739, December.

Elizabeth Williams, daughter of Ludwick Williams and Dorothy, his wife, was born November 17 -

Mary Dauge, daughter of Peter Dauge and Elizabeth, his wife, was born October 29, 1763 about 2 a.m. Friday.

Isaac Dauge, son of Peter Dauge and Elizabeth, his wife, was born the 24 Sept. at daybreak on Friday.

Lemuel Dauge, son of Peter Dauge and Elizabeth, his wife, was born March 1, 1768 about 2 o'clock.

Willoughby Dauge, son of Peter Dauge and Elizabeth, his wife, was born April 7, 1770.

Elizabeth Dauge, daughter of Peter Dauge and Elizabeth, his wife, was born Sept. 12, 1772 on Saturday.

Angelica Dauge, daughter of Peter Dauge and Elizabeth, born Dec. 30, 1775 on Saturday.

Emelia Sawyer Dauge, the daughter of Peter and Peggy Dauge, was born March 10 Anno Domini 1796.

Sophia Scott Dauge, daughter of Peter and Peggy Dauge, was born April 23 Anno Domini 1798.

Margaret Williams Dauge, daughter of Peter and Peggy Dauge, was born February 4 Anno Domini 1800.

General Peter Dauge, the father of the above children departed this life September 1, 1801, age 61 years, eight months and thirteen days.

General Peter Dauge and Peggy, his wife, were married Apr. 20, 1795.

Margaret Dauge, the wife of General Peter Dauge departed this life May 6, 1812.
