Delilah Catherine (Damron) Nelms, daughter of George and Delilah Catherine (Fisher) Damron, was born April 18, 1837 in a log cabin two miles northeast of Ector, Texas (Fannin County) she died November 23, 1912 at her home at Ector Texas.

She knitted socks for the soldiers during the Civil war.

She planted the tall, large old cedar trees at Carson cemetery at Ector Texas in the 1860's. The trees still stand there today, like large tall sentinels over the graves. They are a living memory of Delilah Catherine (Damron) Nelms who was born near Caney Creek two miles northeast of Ector, Fannin County, Texas and about one mile from Carson cemetery one hundred and thirty years ago when Fannin County Texas was still a vast wilderness in the days of the Republic of Texas. Delilah Damron married C.C. Nelms b. 1825 Kentucky. he was a Civil War Veteran.

George Damron was Scotch-Irish. His wife, Delilah Catherine (Fisher) Damron was Irish. Delilah Catherine (Nelms) Allen was a daughter of C.C. Nelms and wife, Delilah Catherine (Damron) Nelms. of Ector, Fannin County, Texas.

In June 1924, Juanita, Daughter of John Edwin (Ed) Allen and wife, Delilah Catherine (Katie) Nelms Allen, saw a large golden, beautiful Cross in the sky, about dusk, late one evening at her parents farmhome two miles northeast of Ector Texas. It was directly above her Mother who was sweeping the front yard.

A few minutes before her beloved Father, Ed Allen, died at his farm home northeast of Ector, Fannin County, Texas the morning of October 1, 1929 at 7:06 A.M. a large beautiful Star was seen high in the sky directly over his home, by his daughter, Juanita. After he died, the Star was gone. He died of a heart condition. He was English, Scotch and Irish.

In June 1960, Juanita took a picture of her beloved Mother sitting in her porch swing on her front porch at her farm home northeast of Ector Fannin County Texas. A large Kotalpa tree was in bloom by the front porch and in the picture you can see the sunshine on the white flowers of the Kotalpa tree. Her beloved Mother Delilah Catherine (Katie) Nelms Allen died four months later, October 17, 1960 at 11:05 A.M. at her farm home northeast of Ector Texas from a heart condition. She was Scotch-Irish, English and Dutch. Her daughter, Juanita, picked twelve large beautiful dark wine colored Zinnias from her beloved Mother's front yard that her beloved Mother had planted in the spring. Juanita took them to the Florist shop at Bonham Texas and had them made into a spray which she took and placed by her beloved Mother's casket.

In the spring of 1961, two Zinnia bushes sprung up through the grass under Juanita's front bedroom window directly in front of where she slept. They bloomed dark wine colored blooms all summer until late fall. No flowers had ever been planted there before. Juanita has a picture of them. One of her neighbors, Mrs Faye Hughes, was with her when she discovered the Zinnia bushes growing up through the grass under her bedroom window directly in front of where she slept. They were just about two inches high.

Delilah Catherine Nelms, daughter of C.C. Nelms and wife, Delilah Catherine (Damron) Nelms married John Edwin Allen, son of William Riley Allen b. 1841 Ector Texas, a Civil War Veteran and his wife, Martha (Ford) Allen born 1843 Ector Texas. She was English and Irish.

He was a Road Engineer and was appointed to build the Rocky Ford Toll bridge across Red river in 1839. He and three other men completed it in 1840. He was also appointed to build the old Jefferson Warren trade road. John Stevens, Joseph Swagerty and Daniel Montague were also appointed to

help him build the road. George Damron was very prominent in civic affairs of the settlement at Bonham Texas. He was a charter member of the Masonic Lodge of the Community around Ft. English in Fannin County Texas.

George Damron, Bailey English and several other men built Fort English, a stockade fort with several buildings inside of it at Bonham, Fannin County, Texas in 1836,

George Damron married Delilah Fisher b. 1798 Kentucky. she died Dec. 11, 1857 at her home northeast of Ector Texas and is buried in Carson cemetery north of Ector Texas. They married in 1816 They came to Bonham, Fannin County, Texas with Bailey English and his family and several other families in 1829. Bailey English and Delilah Catherine Fisher Damron were cousins. Delilah Fisher Damron was Irish and English.

George and Delilah Damron and family were the first settlers near Caney creek six miles west of Bonham Texas and two miles northeast of Ector Texas in 1837. They built the first log cabin there and their daughter, Delilah Catherine Damron was born in that log cabin April 18, 1837. The farm is now owned by James E. Ramey and wife, Nita Ramey.

In November 1838, George Damron received a Headright Certificate for 1280 acres of land northeast of Ector, Fannin County, Texas, where he and his wife, Delilah Catherine Fisher Damron settled and spent the last years of their life. The farm in later years was owned by Jake Fitch and his wife.

Delilah Damron Nelms lived her entire life at Ector, Fannin County, Texas. She was born April 18, 1837 in a log cabin two miles northeast of Ector Texas. the daughter of George and Delilah (Fisher) Damron, who were the first settlers two

Miles northeast of Ector Texas near Caney creek. Delilah Damron Nelms planted the large tall old cedar trees in Carson cemetery at Ector Texas They still stand there today like large tall sentinels over the graves.

They are a living memory of Delilah Damron Nelms who was born two miles from Carson cemetery one hundred and thirty one years ago in a log cabin when Fannin County, Texas was just a vast wilderness in the days of the Republic of Texas.

C.C. Nelms was the son of Reverend John A. Nelms, a Methodist Minister. ^{Uncle} was a Circuit rider in the 1840's, 1850's and 1860's until his death in 1867 at his home at Ector Texas. Reverend John A. Nelms was born 1797 in Virginia. He and his wife, Mary Belle Crain Nelms who was born in 1795 in Tennessee, came to Texas from Kentucky in 1842 with their children. Reverend John A. Nelms was a Methodist Circuit rider in Kentucky before he came to Texas. He and his wife and children came to Texas from Kentucky in a covered wagon drawn by oxen and settled in Fannin County Texas in 1843.

C.C. and Delilah Damron Nelms were loved and respected by all who knew them. Every one called them Uncle Chris and Aunt Pud. They always lent a helping hand to all who were in need.

Especially white roses.

She married John Edwin Allen who was born December 17, 1867 Ector Texas. They married July 6, 1890 at Ector Texas in the home of her parents, Mr and Mrs C.C. Nelms. They were married by Reverend J.L. Mayes. A wedding reception was held in the home of her parents after the wedding.

John Edwin (Ed) Allen died October 1, 1929 at his home northeast of Ector Texas from a heart condition. He is buried in Carson cemetery at Ector Texas beside his beloved wife, Delilah Catherine (Katie) Nelms Allen. Reverend Byers and Reverend Vaughn, Methodist Ministers, held his funeral service.

A saddle made with pink Carnations & one pink Orchid & the stirrups in white placed at the head of his grave at his burial as a symbol of his life as a Cowboy, U.S. Deputy Marshall on horseback, and a Cattleman.

He was a cowboy in his youth and rode the range for many years, riding herd on the cattle and helping at the round-ups. Then he and Mr Cain from Ravenna Texas were in partners together for many years in a ranch across the old Red river over in Oklahoma from Fannin County Texas. where they raised cattle. They rounded up the last herd of wild horses in the Oklahoma territory. Allen Duckworth, nephew of Ed Allen, used to help him and Mr Cain when they rounded up the wild horses in the Oklahoma territory. Ed Allen and Mr Cain went to and fro from their homes in Fannin County Texas to their ranch across Red river in Oklahoma. Always coming home on week-ends to their homes in Fannin County Texas. The beautiful old red river separates Texas and Oklahoma. Bonham, Fannin County, Texas is 12 miles from the red river. in the red river valley.

The great flood of 1908 washed away all their cattle and outbuildings and they all went floating down Red river. and they had to start all over again in their cattle business. They started their ranch across red river in Oklahoma in 1906 and they quit ranching across Red river in Oklahoma in 1920 and farmed in their later years of life at their farms in Fannin County Texas. Ed Allen at his farm home near Ector Texas and Mr Cain at his farm home at Ravenna Texas. They were both lifelong natives of Fannin County Texas.

John Edwin (Ed) Allen was a U.S. Deputy Marshall on horseback in the late 1890's and the early 1900's. He also owned a Meat market and Grocery store at Ector Texas in the early 1900's. He studied Law in his youth but followed the life of a cowboy, U.S. Deputy Marshall and a cattleman.

Ed and Katie (Nelms) Allen were schoolday sweethearts and were both born and reared at Ector Texas. They both attended the same school and the same First Methodist church at Ector Texas that their parents attended when they were growing up.

Aunt Kate, as she was called by everyone, professed religion and was baptized in the First Methodist church at Ector Texas in 1885 when she was thirteen

years old. Ed and Kate's two youngest children, Juanita and Charles was baptized in the same First Methodist church at Ector Texas Sunday morning November 2, 1917. They held each other by the hand as they walked up to the Altar to take the Vows of the church. Ed Allen took the Vows of the same First Methodist church when he was eight years old.

Delilah Catherine (Katie) Nelms Allen lived every day of her life for Christ. So did her beloved husband, John Edwin (Ed) Allen live every day of his life for Christ. Everyone knew them as Ed and Kate. They were both from the most respected and the most prominent and oldest pioneer families in Fannin County Texas. They were a friend to all and always lent a helping hand to all those who were in need.

All ten of Ed and Katie's children were born and reared at Ector, Fannin County, Texas (Ector has a population of about 500 persons) All ten of their children attended the same First Methodist church and the same Public school at Ector that they attended.

The times you've kissed our dirty chubby little hands when they were hurt. When and as I think of you and all you've did and cared for me, I cannot restrain the tears from flowing down my cheeks. At daybreak this morning, while I was on watch high upon this ship, a light came through the clouds and I immediately thought of Mother.

It was like a Blessing sent from heaven and like you have always been to me. Before very long, I'll be at my destination and this trip has had its trials and its triumphs.

Remember, I love and cherish Mother in all I do.

Delilah Catherine Damron Nelms, daughter of George and Delilah Catherine Fisher Damron, was born April 18, 1837 in a log cabin two miles northeast of Ector, Fannin County, Texas. she died November 23, 1912 at her home at Ector Texas. She knitted socks for the soldiers during the Civil war. She planted the tall, large old cedar trees at Carson cemetery in the 1800's. The trees still stand there today like large tall sentinels over the graves. They are a living memory of Delilah Catherine Damron Nelms who was born near a fork of Caney creek two miles northeast of Ector Texas. and about two miles from Carson cemetery One hundred and thirty years ago. when Fannin County was a vast wilderness in the days of the Republic of Texas.

George Damron was Scotch-Irish. His wife, Delilah Fisher Damron was Irish.

In June 1924, Juanita, daughter of John Edwin (Ed) and Delilah Catherine (Katie) Nelms Allen, saw a large golden beautiful Cross in the sky, about dusk, late one evening at her parents farm home two miles northeast of Ector, Fannin County, Texas.

A few minutes before her father, Ed Allen, died at his home northeast of Ector Texas October 1, 1929 at 7:05 A.M. a large beautiful Star was seen high in the sky directly over his home, by his daughter, Juanita. After he died, the Star was gone

In June, 1960, Juanita took a picture of her mother, sitting in her porch swing on her front porch at her farm home northeast of Ector Texas. A large Kotalpa tree was in bloom by the front porch and in the picture you can see the sunshine on the white flowers of the Kotalpa tree. She died four months later, October 17, 1960. Her daughter, Juanita, picked twelve large dark wine colored Zinnias from her front yard that her mother had planted in the spring. Juanita took them to the Bonham Floral Shop, 715 Willow St. Bonham Texas and had them made into a spray which she took and put by her Mother's casket.

In the spring of 1961 two Zinnia bushes sprung up through the grass under Juanita's front bedroom window directly in front of where she slept. They bloomed dark wine colored blooms all summer until late fall. No flowers had ever been planted there before. Juanita has a picture of them.

help him build the road. George Damron was very prominent in civic affairs of the settlement at Bonham Texas. He was a charter member of the Masonic Lodge of the Community around Ft. English in Fannin County Texas.

George Damron, Bailey English and several other men built Fort English, a stockade fort with several buildings inside of it at Bonham, Fannin County, Texas in 1836,

George Damron married Delilah Fisher b. 1798 Kentucky. she died Dec. 11, 1857 at her home northeast of Ector Texas and is buried in Carson cemetery north of Ector Texas. They married in 1816 They came to Bonham, Fannin County, Texas with Bailey English and his family and several other families in 1829. Bailey English and Delilah Catherine Fisher Damron were cousins. Delilah Fisher Damron was Irish and English.

George and Delilah Damron and family were the first settlers near Caney creek six miles west of Bonham Texas and two miles northeast of Ector Texas in 1837. They built the first log cabin there and their daughter, Delilah Catherine Damron was born in that log cabin April 18, 1837. The farm is now owned by James E. Ramey and wife, Nita Ramey.

In November 1838 ,George Damron received a Headright Certificate for 1280 acres of land northeast of Ector, Fannin County, Texas, where he and his wife, Delilah Catherine Fisher Damron settled and spent the last years of their life. The farm in later years was owned by Jake Fitch and his wife.

C.C. Nelms served in the Ind. Mtd. Vols. 14th Brigade, Texas Militia. He enlisted
July 6, 1861 at Bonham Texas. His wife, Delilah Damron Nelms knitted socks for
the soldiers during the Civil war.

C.C. Nelms died at his home at Ector Texas July 2, 1911 at the age of 86 years.
He is buried beside his beloved wife, Delilah Damron Nelms, in Carson cemetery
at Ector Texas.

C.C. Nelms built the first house at Ector Texas. where all eleven of his and
Delilah's children were born and reared.

Delilah Damron Nelms lived her entire life at Ector, Fannin County, Texas. She
was born April 18, 1837 in a log cabin two miles northeast of Ector Texas. the
daughter of George and Delilah (Fisher) Damron, who were the first settlers two

Miles northeast of Ector Texas near Caney creek. Delilah Damron Nelms planted the large tall old cedar trees in Carson cemetery at Ector Texas . They still stand there today like large tall sentinels over the graves.

They are a living memory of Delilah Damron Nelms who was born two miles from Carson cemetery one hundred and thirty one years ago in a log cabin when Fannin County, Texas was just a vast wilderness in the days of the Republic of Texas.

C.C. Nelms was the son of Reverend John A. Nelms, a Methodist Minister. He was a Circuit rider in the 1840's, 1850's and 1860's until his death in 1867 at his home at Ector Texas. Reverend John A. Nelms was born 1797 in Virginia. He and his wife, Mary Belle Crain Nelms who was born in 1793 in Tennessee, came to Texas from Kentucky in 1842 with their children. Reverend John A. Nelms was a Methodist Circuit rider in Kentucky before he came to Texas. He and his wife and children came to Texas from Kentucky in a covered wagon drawn by oxen and settled in Fannin County Texas in 1843.

C.C. and Delilah Damron Nelms were loved and respected by all who knew them. Every one called them Uncle Chris and Aunt Pud. They always lent a helping hand to all who were in need.

She was buried in a beautiful white dress of white satin and white nylon, with her white Bible in her right hand and a white carnation in her left hand. She had always requested all her life that she be buried in white, with her white bible in her right hand. Her daughter, Fay, wanted a white Rose to be placed in her left hand but could not find a white Rose so a white carnation was placed in her left hand as a symbol of the beautiful life she had lived and that she had always planted a yard full of beautiful flowers and she had always loved flowers. Especially white roses. She married John Edwin Allen who was born December 17, 1867 Ector Texas. They married July 6, 1890 at Ector Texas in the home of her parents, Mr and Mrs C.C. Nelms. They were married by Reverend J.L. Mayes. A wedding reception was held in the home of her parents after the wedding. John Edwin (Ed) Allen died October 1, 1929 at his home northeast of Ector Texas from a heart condition. He is buried in Carson cemetery at Ector Texas beside his beloved wife, Delilah Catherine (Katie) Nelms Allen. Reverend Byers and Reverend Vaughn, Methodist Ministers, held his funeral service. A saddle made with white roses and one orchid, and the stirrups in white was placed at the head of his grave at his burial as a symbol of his life as a Cowboy, U.S. Deputy Marshall on horseback, and a Cattleman. He was a cowboy in his youth and rode the range for many years, riding herd on the cattle and helping at the round-ups. Then he and Mr Cain from Ravenna Texas were in partners together for many years in a ranch across the old Red river over in Oklahoma from Fannin County Texas. where they raised cattle. They rounded up the last herd of wild horses in the Oklahoma territory. Allen Duckworth, nephew of Ed Allen, used to help him and Mr Cain when they rounded up the wild horses in the Oklahoma territory. Ed Allen and Mr Cain went to and fro from their homes in Fannin County Texas to their ranch across Red river in Oklahoma. Always coming home on week-ends to their homes in Fannin County Texas. The beautiful old red river separates Texas and Oklahoma. Bonham, Fannin County, Texas is 12 miles from the red river. in the red river valley. The great flood of 1908 washed away all their cattle and outbuildings and they all went floating down Red river. and they had to start all over again in their cattle business. They started their ranch across red river in Oklahoma in 1906 and they quit ranching across Red river in Oklahoma in 1920 and farmed in their later years of life at their farms in Fannin County Texas. Ed Allen at his farm home near Ector Texas and Mr Cain at his farm home at Ravenna Texas. They were both lifelong natives of Fannin County Texas.

John Edwin (Ed) Allen was a U.S. Deputy Marshall on horseback in the late 1890's and the early 1900's. He also owned a Meat market and Grocery store at Ector Texas in the early 1900's. He studied Law in his youth but followed the life of a cowboy, U.S. Deputy Marshall and a cattleman.

Ed and Katie (Nelms) Allen were schoolday sweethearts and were both born and reared at Ector Texas. They both attended the same school and the same First Methodist church at Ector Texas that their parents attended when they were growing up.

Aunt Kate, as she was called by everyone, professed religion and took the Vow of the First Methodist church at Ector Texas in 1885 when she was thirteen

years old. Ed and Kate's two youngest children, Juanita and Charles took the Vows of the same First Methodist church at Ector Texas Sunday morning November 2, 1917. They held each other by the hand as they walked up to the Altar to take the Vows of the church. Ed Allen took the Vows of the same First Methodist church when he was eight years old.

Delilah Catherine (Katie) Nelms Allen lived every day of her life for Christ. So did her beloved husband, John Edwin (Ed) Allen live every day of his life for Christ. Everyone knew them as Ed and Kate. They were both from the most respected and the most prominent and oldest pioneer families in Fannin County Texas. They were a friend to all and always lent a helping hand to all those who were in need.

All ten of Ed and Katie's children were born and reared at Ector, Fannin County, Texas (Ector has a population of about 500 persons) All ten of their children attended the same First Methodist church and the same Public school at Ector that they attended. All ten of their children were members of the First Methodist church at Ector Texas

"Somewhere on the Atlantic ocean."

May 1943

Dear Mom:

By the time this reaches you, it may be past Mother's Day but I want you to know I am thinking of you and will be thinking of you on that day.

Of all the things you did with your dear little toiled and worn hands. The prayers and tears you've shed over our fevered brows. The times you've kissed our dirty chubby little hands when they were hurt. When and as I think of you and all you've did and cared for me, I cannot restrain the tears from flowing down my cheeks. At daybreak this morning, while I was on watch high upon this ship, a light came through the clouds and I immediately thought of Mother.

It was like a Blessing sent from heaven and like you have always been to me. Before very long, I'll be at my destination and this trip has had its trials and its triumphs.

Remember, I love and cherish Mother in all I do.
