COINCIDENCES, CONNECTIONS, CORRESPONDENCE, & CONFUSION

Since the Aug issue of DDD I have had the pleasure of corresponding with several of you. Sometimes it seemed that each letter I received contained a coincidence that tied it to a previous letter. My problem was remembering WHERE I read that before? After much stumbling and a few false starts here I am with a few updates for you on items which previously appeared in DDD and some questions on others.

Thanks Marian for all of this info. You have been generous with your re-
 search and this was never more apparent than when I received LETTER # 2
 from Ruth Withers of Grafton, W.VA. Ruth sought help on her line, John
 Daniels m 20 July 1775, Philadelphia PA Sarah Ball. I was able to help
 Ruth because Marian Botel had sent me copies from a book in the Nat. Gen.
 Soc. Lib., DUMONT DE SOUMAGNE AND ALLIED FAMILIES WITH COLLATERAL LINES OF
.....DANIELS, by John Sanderson DuMont, 1960. The book had an interesting
 account of Ruth's family on pages 120-129. After exchanging several letters
 and making corrections in the books account the following history emerged.
 DANIELS FAMILY OF BUCKS CO., PA.

Capt. John Daniels was a British officer in the Fr. & Indian War. He came
 to America in 1754. His wife Sarah Ball, was the daughter of Wm. Ball
 and Frances Slaughter, grand-dau of John Ball and Sarah Roades. John and
 Sarah Daniels lived briefly in Fauquier Co., VA where a son, William Ball
 Daniels was b 29 Oct 1784. John Daniels remained in the British Army and
 died while fighting on Malta, where he was buried with full military honors,
 Sept 1793. Sarah Ball Daniels, b 1750, d 21 Nov 1828, buried Norristown,
 PA at "Old Swedes" Church. The will of Sarah Ball Daniels was written,
 1823 while she was residing at Warminster, Bucks Co., PA., but was probated
 1829 in Montgomery Co., PA (Will Bk 6, p. 541). Children listed in the will:
 Abigail, m. George Washington Withers, resided Fauquier Co., VA; William
 Daniel and wife, Ann (Eldridge) Daniel; Joseph Daniels; John Daniels (deceased
 when will written).

LETTER # 3 arrived from Dave Harness, 4918 Tahoe Circle, Martinez, CA 94553.
 His earliest ancestor was Eli Daniels, b 1800, Loudon Co., VA, m 3-29-1821,
 Loudon Co., VA Elizabeth Wagley; dc 1865 Pottawatomie Co., Kansas. Dave
 had done a lot of VA research especially the counties of Loudon, Fairfax,
 and FAUQUIER. He shared lots of his info with me which will appear in
 DDD next year, but I was able to combine some of this data with Old Faithful
 Heinemann's Daniel Families of the Southern States (Vol. 2 p 40b Fam 7) and
 old copies of "Daniell, Daniells News and Notes (Vol. 8, 1975, p. 5) and
 have an interesting picture of the DANIEL FAMILY OF LOUDON CO., VA.--
 unfortunately I could not fit Dave's ancestor, Eli Daniels, in this line
 but we're still hoping to find the right clue.

In the VA files of DDD I found a letter written to me in 1985 from Ken Rockwell, 2010 Terrace Dr., Ventura, CA 93001. Some of the data mentioned in it seems like it may be talking about the above family but there are some obvious similarities and/or mistakes. Ken's earliest ancestor was Jane Daniel, married Enos Drake 25 Sept 1800, in "W.VA". Enos Drake was b in LOUDON CO., VA 3 Sept 1775. Several of Jane and Enos' children were b in Loudon Co. Enos died in Morgan Co., OHIO. In the letter Ken wondered if Jane Daniel was a dau of James Daniel b 1729, of Loudon Co., VA, m Ester Yarborough and had known son, Samuel, b 1781, moved to Ohio. It looks to me like a couple of generations may be combined in this account. Can any of you help straighten this out?

Regarding the records of Morgan Co., Ohio I have FGS on file sent by Nadine Heppell, 556 Dalton Way, Goleta, CA 93117, in 1985. They are for Fenton Lee Daniel/Daniels, b 20 Oct 1827, Fairfax Co., VA., m. 30 Mar 1854, Morgan Co., Ohio Martha Jones. Fenton was a son of James and Millie Daniel. Cemetery records from Morgan Co., Ohio appeared in the Aug 84 issue of DDD.

Letter #4 from Thomas Edson Doughten, 5055 Rolandale Rd., Toledo, Ohio 43623. provides an update on the DANIEL FAMILY OF IREDELL CO., NC as published in the Jan 1987 issue of DDD, Yerby Daniel manuscript. Shepherd Daniel, b 1780-90 (1820 census of Iredell Co., NC); m Mary Moss, census records indicate the following age groups for their children: 2 males b 1820-25; 1 male b 1825-30; 1 female b 1820-25; 1 female b 1825-30. One of the sons was PINKNEY O. DANIEL, b 2 Feb 1824, Iredell Co., NC, d 18 Nov 1919 Grayson Co., VA, m 1) Ruth Cox 2) Jane Rutherford 3) Jane Osborne. HISTORY OF WASHINGTON COUNTY, INDIANA, p. 850.

....The marriage of W.A. Medlock to Nora L. Daniels took place in 1896. Mrs. Medlock who was born in Harristown is the daughter of Marcus L. and Margaret (Crandell) Daniels. Marcus Daniel, who was born on Mill Creek, west of Salem, of English parents, during his life followed the carpenter's trade. He lived in Harristown until 1896, when he moved to Ft. Wayne and at that place passed the remainder of his life.....



Phyllis's ancestress was PENELOPE L. O'DANIELS, b. 22 Nov 1823, in GA.; married 7 Sept 1842, Rush Hudson, in Alabama. Penelope's father was John O'Daniel/ DANIELS and her mother was named Elizabeth. You must admit there are a lot of missing Daniel's in Al, GA, SC, and NC. As I considered O'Daniel and M'Daniel early Irish and Scot-Irish derivatives of Daniel I wondered why I have never looked under those spellings for "lost links". The result of all this is I am going back through the early records as time permits and trying to look for these variations. Look for my findings in future issues of DDD. Ethel Mooney of Newell, Al. saw Sonia Hetherington's query in the Jan. issue of DDD and shared some of her records on Littleton Daniel and Heard Co., GA Daniels that helped fill in the family in better detail.

Don Lynch of Redondo Beach, CA, our favorite "Titantic Mystery" writer is still delving into those Daniel members on the ship. He reports that a genealogist in Montreal may soon shed some light on the missing maid named Daniel. (see 1986 issues DDD for background info)

Marian Botel, our faithful supporter, finds Daniel researchers everywhere she goes. One of them, Linda S. McCleary, is the Genealogy Librarian at the Arizona State Archives. Her ancestress was Margaret Daniel, b. 1800, MD or PA ; married 2 Aug 1824, Patrick Caldwell. All of their children were born in Scott Co., Indiana. Linda admits she hasn't done much on her Daniel family, she is too busy helping others with their research. Can any of you help her???

HISTORY OF KENTUCKY BAPTISTS FROM 1769-1885, by J.H. Spencer, Vol. 1 p. 435

THOMAS M. DANIEL held the longest and most successful pastorate in Christiansburg church, and was one of the most efficient and popular preachers that ever lived in Shelby County. Few men have ever lived and labored so long in the same locality, and had so few enemies.

Mr. Daniel was born and raised in Owen Co., KY. In his youth (in October 1838) he professed conversion and united with New Liberty church, in his native county. He was licensed to exercise a gift, in March, 1840. He appears to have developed slowly, at first. In June, 1844, he was requested to preach one Sunday in each month at the church of which he was a member. He was ordained to the full work of the ministry, in June, 1846, by Lewis D. Alexander, Elijah Threlkeld, and Paschal H. Todd. Having been called to the care of the church at Christiansburg, soon after he was ordained, he took a letter from New Liberty church, in November, 1847, and immediately joined the church at Christiansburg, where his membership remained till his death. Soon after he was called to Christiansburg he became pastor, also of Indian Fork and Buffalo Lick churches in the same county, and, afterwards, of Campbellsburg church in Henry County. These churches all prospered under his ministry.....

.....Thus the next mention of an O'Daniel in Maryland chanced upon, in the course of other researches, is that of Richard O'Daniel, who was a soldier on the patriotic side in the American Revolution. He seems to have enlisted in Frederick County.....There is also a Michael O'Daniel shown in the 1790 census of Montgomery County.....

.....the first of the patronymic who went out to Washington County, Kentucky, the traditions are so clear....at Saint Rose's, near Springfield,two of these early Kentucky O'Daniels, Walter and James..... there was a James O'Danald who lived near Warwick, in the southeastern part of Cecil County.....from at least 1794 to 1799 [he] was overseer or manager of land belonging to the Jesuit Fathers.....[James] was a son or brother of Joseph O'Daniel who married Mary O'Brien.

p. 17 ROBERT BUFFINGTON DANIEL

Chief Robert Buffington Daniel, born Jan. 16, 1815, eldest son of Judge James Daniel, educated in the States. In 1836, at 21 years of age, married Ann Taylor, second daughter of Chief Richard Taylor.

They settled on Bates (Beattie's) Prairie, Cherokee Nation, where he followed farming until outbreak of Civil War, when they went to the Choctaw Nation, staying until 1865, when they returned to Bates Prairie, being penniless, with difficulty managed to live. Appointed member Supreme Court one term, then Chief Justice of the Cherokee Nation. In August, 1871, elected Second Chief and on following Jan. 16 (his birthday) 1872, he died, deeply regretted by the entire Cherokee people. He was a man of good practical education and force of character. In 1882, Ann Taylor Daniel moved to Vinita, after her daughter's marriage and her son's death. She lived in a nice residence. She was 70 years old in 1892 and appeared much younger. She was kind and charitable and much beloved and respected. Both buried in Vinita cemetery.

Chief R.B. Daniel, son of Judge James Daniel and Mary Buffington and grandson of Marmaduke Daniel and Nancy Still.

He was older brother of Mary Jane Daniel who married George Carselowey, parents of James Madison Carselowey.

Chief Daniel lived on Mustang Creek, north and west of present day Ketchum, Oklahoma.

p. 18 Some Cherokees from the East who came to the Cherokee Nation West, Indian Territory, in 1834: Alexander McDonald-Daniel family-Charles McDaniel-Daniel McDonald

p. 18 The Moses Daniel Wagon Train arrived in the Cherokee Nation West on March 2, 1839.

p. 41 James and Moses Daniel lived in the old Hickory Log District in Georgia, Gherokee Nation East. James Daniel was a member of the First Constitutional Convention held at New Echota, Georgia in 1827, representing Hickory Log District. The two Daniel men are sons of Marmaduke Daniel and Nancy Still. James Daniel married Mary Buffington, daughter of Ezekial Buffington and Mary Emory. Moses married Martha Tarrent.

p. 72 Minnie Watie (daughter of Gen. Stand Watie and Sarah Caroline Bell) married John Martin Daniel. She died Feb. 27, 1875, and her sister, Jacqueline Watie, died March 17, 1875.

In May I received a very interesting letter from a Daniel researcher, Michael Lacopo of Mishawaka, Indiana who was a descendant of the Stith Daniel family of Johnson Co., Indiana. (ref: Heinemann Vol. 1, page 126, #900)--.." STITH DANIEL was born in Ky around 1799 or 1800. His wife, Frances E. Truman was born in Ky or VA in 1804 or 1805. The earliest reference I have to this family is their move to Johnson Co., Ind. between 1826-1830. They appear in the 1830, 1840, and 1860 census of Johnson Co., but are nowhere to be found in the 1850 census. No reference to them after 1860 can be found.

The known children of Stith and Frances are DAVID F. (1831-1876); JOHN O. (1833-1857); WILLIAM (1835-cal877); MARTIN V. (1837-?); ROBERT M. (1841-1930); PAULINA JANE (1843-1909); and JAMES (1844-?). David and John married in Johnson County. William and James married in Miami County, Indiana, where David, William, Robert and James moved to in 1865. No further reference has been found on Martin, and from census records there appear to be more children.

Paulina Jane Daniel married William L. Nowels in 1870 in Jasper Co., Indiana....."

From a second letter from Michael I learned a mistake in Heinemann that those of you with copies might like to make note of. See p. 126. #1513 Sarah A. Daniel was NOT a daughter of Stith Daniel. She was the WIFE of # 1507, John O. Daniel, who died 14 Dec 1857. In the 1860 census Sarah was living with her in-laws as a Widow. She remarried David Allen Pritchard on 20 June 1861 and had several children by him. The only surviving child of John O. and Sarah Daniel was a son John O. Daniel who was living with his aunt Serelda Daniels in Miami Co., Ind. in 1880. Serelda was a sister of Sarah A. (both had the maiden name Watkins) and was married to John's brother David F. A Fred indeed is a Fred in need, says Fred Society founder Fred Daniel.

In an ocean of Roberts, Michaels, and Jeffreys, the name Fred stands out like a Creature from the Black Lagoon at the manicurist.

Television hasn't helped the problem. On the tube, Fred has been a cartoon caveman, a detective's parrot, a bumbling shipping clerk, a fast-talking stereo salesman, a frog and a chimp.

William Shakespeare, though no stranger to the name used Fred only five times in his complete works.

But few remember the first names of composer Chopin, the husband of scientist Madam Curie or political philosopher Engels. Or that guitarist Freddie King wrote the blues classic "Hide Away".

So Daniel, 34, at war with a negative public image, formed an organization devoted to Fred. Mission: To make Fred a name to be proud of.

"The idea behind the Fred Society is to improve the connotations people have," says Daniel. "To get them away from the caveman-nerd image."

Daniel says he has an army of 3,000 card-carrying Freds with troops in such unlikely bastions of Fredness as Australia, New Zealand and England, where Fred Basset is a popular comic strip hound.

The headquarters of the 3-year-old club, which requires no membership fee, is Palm Desert, Calif. When not promoting Fredship, Daniel is a free-lance graphic artist.

ANCESTRY OF TITANIC DISASTER VICTIMS

The Titanic, that great Goliath of the deep, has finally parted with some of her secrets. All of us have been following Don Lynch through each of the 1986 issues of DDD as he tried to unravel the twisted threads of clues on two of the victims, surnamed DANIELS. His efforts were crowned with success when he made a trip to Boston, Mass. in October. Sitting there gathering dust on a shelf in the Boston Public Library was a book--A HISTORY OF THE TOWN OF FRANKLIN, MASS.; From its settlement to the completion of its first century, By Mortimer Blake, 1879. Pages 238, 239 give a record of the DANIELS Family. The ancestry of Bess Waldo Daniels Allison, who died on the Titanic is as follows:

- 2) Joseph Daniels, Jr. m. Bethiah
- 3) David Daniels, b. 1699, m. Magdalen

Sarah Daniels, also on the Titanic and listed as a maid of Bess Allison, may have been a daughter or grand-daughter of Josephus Daniels or Ernest D. Daniels, both related to Arville. The daughter of a Southern Baptist pastor, the long time high school teacher several times had seen previous plans to get to China stymied by various reasons, most recently by age limits.

Voicing delight at being accepted to teach English for a year in Zheng Zhou, she said it's "what the Lord wanted me to do.".....

JOHN SIMON DANIEL, b 13 Nov 1821, TN.; d 4 Oct 1873. He was the son of JOHN WILLIAM DANIEL. John Simon married Mary Ann Jefferies, b 24 Sept 1823, TN., daughter of John Jefferies who settled near Wedding Gap, where he died 1856.

John and Mary along with William and James Daniel purchased 300 acres in Township No. 17, from President James Buchanan on 1 Aug 1857. This acreage is today the site of Siloam Springs, in Benton Co., ARK. The family came to Arkansas from Tennessee sometime before 1849.

The additional comments are items I have found through doing various research. I have noted my data sources.

Moultrie County

Margaret J. Daniel to Joseph Ray -- January 4, 1860

(The 1870 Federal Census of Moultrie Co., IL lists Joseph Ray, age 35, born in Ohio, with his wife, Margaret, age 26, born in Illinois, and with the following children, Henry, age 9, William, age 7, Anna, age 5, and Francis, a 3 year old boy.)

Amanda Daniels to John R. Dodson -- April 2, 1857

(The 1860 Moultrie Co., IL Federal Census list Amanda as being 19 years old and born in Illinois. No children are listed.)

Mary E. Daniels to James Hill -- July 21, 1854

(The 1860 Federal Census of Moultrie Co., IL lists two James Hill households-- both with wives named Mary. The one I am listing here matches best to the age considerations. James Hill, age 27, farmer, born in Illinois. With him is his wife Mary, age 25, born in Illinois; and two children -- Samuel, age 3 years and Mary D. who is listed as being 1 year old.)

Nancy Daniels to Thomas Young -- September 29, 1856

(In the 1860 Federal Census of Moultrie Co., IL Thomas Young is listed as 53 years old; farmer; born in Tennessee. With him is his wife, Nancy, age 40, born in Tennessee; and the following children--John, age 20, Rebecca, age 17, Elizabeth, age 13, Louisa, age 11, Ann, age 2, and Martha C. who is listed as 4 months old. Also in the house is Artemesia Daniel who is 11 years old and noted as Mr. Young's stepdaughter.)

Rebecca Daniels to William H. Panches -- July 4, 1860

(In the 1860 Moultrie Co., IL Federal Census, Rebecca Daniels is living in the household of Jackson and Catherine Harshe. She is listed as being 19 years old, born in Illinois. She is noted to be an assistant with the house.)

Susan Daniels to Abial Stark -- September 1, 1848

(In the 1850 Federal Census of Moultrie Co., IL there is listed: Abel Stark age 53 with Susan, his wife, age 35, and Henry, age 9, Sarah A., then age one year. Also

THE SOCIETY OF THE CINCINNATI - founded in 1783 for any officer of the United States or its Allies, who served during the American Revolution. Membership is restricted to one living descendant at any one time from one such former member or officer of the American Revolutionary Armed Forces. Often an ancestor who had been a member of the Society was a former French Allied Forces serviceman.

SONS OF CONFEDERATE VETERANS - organized in 1896 for any male descendant of an individual who had served in the Confederate forces to the end of the Civil War, or who was killed, died in prison, or retired from the service of his country.

SONS OF THE AMERICAN REVOLUTION, NATIONAL SOCIETY - organized in 1889. Open to any man above the age of 21 years and "a citizen of good repute in the community," if he is a lineal descendant of an ancestor who was unfailing at all times to the cause of American liberty as a civilian, or as a member of the armed forces of any of the American colonies.

SONS OF THE REVOLUTION, GENERAL SOCIETY - instituted in 1876 for any male above the age of 21 years, of good character, and a descendant of any person who had served the cause of American independence in the armed forces, or in a civil capacity.

SONS OF UNION VETERANS OF THE CIVIL WAR - organized in 1881 for male descendants of veterans of the Union Army in the Civil War, 1861-1865.

UNITED DAUGHTERS OF THE CONFEDERACY - founded in 1894 for women who were descended from veterans of the Confederate forces during the Civil War, 1861-1865.

UNITED SPANISH WAR VETERANS - organized in 1904 for veterans of the War with Spain who had served between 21 April 1898 and 4 July 1902.

VETERANS OF FOREIGN WARS OF THE UNITED STATES - organized in 1898 for veterans of the Spanish American War. It was later expanded to include veterans of World War I, World War II, the Korean Conflict, and the Viet Nam War who had served overseas.

The organizations listed above are just some of the great number of such associations to which Americans can, and do, or did, belong. For anyone desiring names and addresses of these organizations, please refer to the following publications which can usually be found in the reference section of your local library:

The Association Directory, published annually by the Ayer Company, Philadelphia, PA.

The first volume of the Encyclopedia of National Organizations of the United States, published annually by the Gale Research Company, Detroit, MI.

In the 1860 Moultrie Co., IL Federal Census, Abial Stark is listed as 64 years old, a farmer, born in Pennsylvania; his wife Susan, age 43, was born in Tennessee. In their household are Ann, age 10, Emeline, age 6, Ellen, age 3, and Nancy who is 5 months. Also with them is Emily N. Daniels, age 14, listed as Mr. Stark's step-daughter.)

Mathew L. Daniel to Louiza Hill -- August 26, 1859

(In the 1860 Moultrie Co., IL Federal Census, Mathew L. Daniel, age 21, and his wife Louiza, age 19, is living next door to the Stark family listed above.)

(The 1881 History of Moultrie & Shelby Cos., IL notes on page 109 that Mathew L. Daniels was mustered out of the 41st IL Infantry Regiment on August 20, 1864.)

(Marrowbone Cemetery Readings, Bethany, IL lists:

Matthew L. Daniel, d. May 25, 1862, aged 29y 1m 16d

Mary A., daughter of J.L.L. & L. Daniel, d. April 13, 1862, aged 1y 10m 10d)

William W. Daniel to Sarah A. Wilbourn -- November 13, 1859

(In the 1860 Moultrie Co., IL Federal Census, William Daniel, age 24, is listed as being a native of Illinois; Sarah A., his wife, age 16, was born in Indiana. In their household are Mary A. Daniel?, age 12, and William Phillips, age 8, both of whom are listed as "ward" and both born in Illinois.)

(The 1881 History of Moultrie & Shelby Cos., IL notes on page 117 that William W. Daniels died at LaGrange [TN] January 4, 1863.)

Sarah Ann Daniel to Samuel McCune -- May 18, 1864

Artimissa Daniels to John Stokes -- September 17, 1868

(In the 1860 Moultrie Co., IL Federal Census, Artimemesia Daniel is listed as age 11 years, stepdaughter of Thomas Young. Her mother, Nancy, is listed as being 40 years old and a native of Tennessee.)

Mary A. Daniels to Jessee Jackson -- December 19, 1867

(Mary A. Jackson married Thomas Jefferson Hoggatt on June 23, 1872. Thomas J. Hoggatt was married previously to Sarah Vaughan on April 23, 1866)

(The 1870 Federal Census of Moultrie Co., IL list Mary A. Jackson, age 22, with Mary E., age 6 months. Also listed in the household are Samuel Hoffman, age 21, William Selby, age 23, and John Timmons, age 22, who are noted as farmhands. Her neighbors are William & Phoebe Hoggatt and family and Andrew J. & Rachel Hoggatt Myers and children. In the Andrew J. Myers home is also John A. Hoggatt.)

*(Pea Cemetery Readings list
Jessie A. Jackson, d. Jan. 31, 1879, aged 26y 11m 21d)*

Milly M. Daniels to James Hill -- April 18, 1861

(In the 1850 Federal Census of Moultrie Co., IL there is Milla Daniel, age 5, living in the household of John and Susan Bone. By 1861, this child would have been 16 years old. Could this be Milly M. Daniels?)

(In the 1850 Federal Census of Shelby Co., IL, there is listed Milla Daniel, age 23, born in Tennessee with Nathan, age 1 month. They are in the household of Susanah Rogers, age 50, who was born in South Carolina.)

Josiah Daniel to Eliza McKinney -- August 31, 1848
(The 1850 Federal Census of Shelby Co., IL lists Josiah Daniel, age 21, with his wife, Eliza, age 21, and Anna who is listed as being 10 years old. All three were born in Illinois.)

Canal Daniel to Nancy Hill -- September 27, 1849
(The 1850 Shelby Co., IL Federal Census lists Canal Daniel, age 26, with his wife Nancy, age 24. Both born in Illinois.)

Oliver Daniel to Mary Ann Daniel -- March 27, 1851
Dacceus Daniel Jr to Setely Alzira Neil -- March 20, 1851
John Daniel to Agnes Daniel -- May 19, 1853
Eleanor Daniel to James Greer -- December 19, 1833
Betsy Daniel to Manning Hopkins -- March 26, 1835
(The 1850 Shelby Co., IL Federal Census lists Manuel Hopkins, age 36, with wife Malinda, 24, and with Jane, age 12, Nancy, age 10, William C., age 8, Hiram, age 6, and Oliver listed at the age of 4 years.)

Hester Daniel to Lambeth Hopkins -- April 6, 1837

(The 1850 Shelby Co., IL Federal Census lists Lambeth Hopkins, age 38, with his wife, Hestor, age 33, and children Alexander, 11, George W., 9, Martin, 7, Ann, 6, Jane, 4, and Hestor, age 1 year.)

Martha Daniel to Moses Hill -- January 14, 1849

Malinda Daniel to Samuel Hopkins -- October 25, 1849

Sally Daniels to John P. Phillips -- June 14, 1849

(The 1850 Shelby Co., IL Federal Census lists a J. P. Philips, age 62, born in North Carolina with Sariah, age 15, Marion, age 2 and Mary 1 ½ years; all born in Illinois. [Could this be Sariah "Sally" Daniels?])

Elizabeth Daniels to Andrew J. Rogers -- August 6, 1850

Bazel Daniel settled one-half mile north-east of Big Springs about 1828.

William Daniel built a cabin near Fancher's in 1831.

Nathaniel Daniel built his cabin within half a mile of Big Springs the same year.

Fancher and the Daniels only held "squatter claims". They improved about four acres each, on which they raised a little corn. However, they spent most of their time hunting. Fancher left this country in the fall of 1828 for the west, and was soon after followed by Bazel Daniel and his son William; Nathaniel and Amon remained. The Daniels were from Tennessee. Bazel Daniel was a native of North Carolina.

... Amon Daniel, son of Bazel, settled in the south part of the township, section five, in about 1835. February 6th, 1837, he entered forty acres in this section the same day Nathaniel Daniel entered forty acres in section eight. Amon Daniel raised quite a large family, and improved a good farm, where he lived until his death. Nathaniel raised a family of six children, and resided in the township until his death. *(Three of his children were living when the 1881 history was prepared; two in Texas, and one, Paul Daniel was living in Prairie Township.)*

Notes from page 43 {Shelby Co.}:

... Mr. Oliver bought a "squatter's" improvement of Josiah Daniel, near the Shelbyville

spring, which consisted of a small cabin and a few acres of cleared land.
The first cabin built within the present limits of Shelbyville, was constructed by Josiah Daniel in 1825 or 1826.

Notes from page 295 {Shelby Co.}:

Hunters would come and go, remain a short time hunting and trapping, and then go elsewhere. Josiah Daniel built a cabin on Brush creek, trapped and hunted for a living, and left after the Mexican War for Missouri--this country was settling up too fast for him. Zane Daniel hunted and trapped here for a short time on Brush creek.

Note from page 309 {Shelby Co.}:

Paul Daniel, now living here, is one of the old residents of the county; his father, Nathan Daniel, came to Big Spring township in 1831.

When Day is Done

Even though he couldn't write or read music, Union Gen. Daniel Butterfield composed a now world-famous bugle call during the Civil War.

You may not remember his name, but you'll recognize *Taps*. The haunting melody is sounded throughout the armed forces and at military funerals, as well as at memorial services for law enforcement personnel.

In July 1862, Oliver Norton made history as the first bugler to play *Taps*.

Casualties on both sides during the Peninsular Campaign were staggering. More than 20,000 confederate and 16,000 Union soldiers were killed or wounded in action.

One night when the army's regulation call, *Extinguish Lights*, was sounded, Butterfield—depressed over his unit's heavy losses—felt that the melody was woefully inadequate.

The general reasoned there should be a more fitting tune to convey a feeling of sadness but mingled with a spirit of hope. He wanted a memorable bugle call to unite his troops.

Getting his composition on paper wasn't easy because Butterfield couldn't write or read music. The general

hummed and whistled his soon to be famous bugle call for an aide.

The, Butterfield summoned his bugler, Oliver Norton. He handed the 22 year old private a coffee stained envelope on which the musical arrangement was scribbled.

Norton later recalled, "I did it several times, playing the music as written. Then, the general changed it somewhat, lengthening some notes and shortening others, but retaining the basic melody as he first gave it to me."

When satisfied with the revisions, Butterfield ordered Norton to play the bugle call that night. Troops were surprised and enthralled. The flag was lowered and *Taps* filled the air.

As *Taps* spread to other Union encampments, it became the nightly call for Union soldiers and soon was played in confederate units, too.

The author of the lyrics isn't known. These words are sung at Boy and Girl Scout camps:

*"Day is done/ Gone the sun/
From the lake/ From the hill/ From
the sky/ All is well/ Safely rest/ God
is nigh."*

But it's the music of this soul-rendering bugle call that moves men, women and children when it is played on Veterans Day or any other day or at a funeral of a veteran.
