WHEREAS, *W.H. Day* late of the County and State aforesaid.

W.H. Day deceased, died intestate, having whilst *he* lived, and at the time *his* death, Real and Personal Estate within the County and State aforesaid, by means whereof the full disposition and power of granting the administration of all and singular, the Real and Personal Estate of the said deceased, and also auditing the accounts, calculations, and reckonings, of the said administration, and a final dismissal of the same, to this Court is manifestly known to belong: I, desiring that the Real and Personal Estate of the said deceased may be well and truly administered, converted and well disposed of, do hereby grant unto the said *W.O. Day*

full power by the tenor of these presents to administer the Real and Personal Estate of the said deceased which, to *him* in *his* lifetime, and at the time of *his* death did belong; and to ask, levy, sue for, recover and receive the same; and to pay the debts in which the deceased stood obligated, so far forth as *his* Real and Personal Estate will extend according to their rate and order of law; being first sworn on the Holy Evangelists of Almighty God, to make a true and perfect inventory thereof, and to exhibit the same into the Court of Ordinary aforesaid, in order to be recorded, on or before the *5th* day of *Aug* 19*12*, next ensuing, and to render a just and true account, calculation and reckoning of the said administration, when thereunto required: And I ordain, depute, and constitute you, the said *W.O. Day* Administrat*or* of all and singular the Real and Personal Estate of the said deceased.

MANUSCRIPTS AT NEHGS

Family Association Collections at NEHGS

THE HISTORIAN/ARCHIVIST FOR THE REYNOLDS Family Association (RFA) contacted NEHGS in September 2003. RFA was exploring potential repositories for a collection of documents and papers accumulated over the past 110 years. Founded in 1892, RFA is a national organization that seeks to document and preserve the history and genealogy of the various Reynolds families that emigrated to the United States primarily in colonial times. I was notified in February 2004 that the RFA Board of Directors voted to donate the collection to NEHGS, along with a financial donation to help pay for archival supplies needed to prepare the collection for

storage. RFA records include correspondence, membership applications, compiled genealogies, photocopies and abstracts of primary and secondary sources, and the "RFA Archives," data on Reynolds individuals arranged by given name with source and compiler. The membership applications include charts documenting descent from one of the identified Reynolds progenitors. Since parts of the collection were stored at

the homes of various

officers, some time was required before the material could be assembled and shipped to NEHGS. We received the collection in November 2005. This time lapse between initial inquiry and receipt of the collection is not atypical.

NEHGS member Phyllis O. Whitten wrote *Samuel Fogg, 1628–1672: His Ancestors and Descendants*, originally published in 1976 and released on CD-ROM in 2004. Beginning in 1999, Phyllis donated Fogg family research, as well as Fogg Family Association records, to NEHGS. She continues to send material periodically;

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

Wells is the third oldest incorporated town in Maine and one of only five to possess vital records of the late seventeenth century. Originally the town included both the towns of Kennebunk, which separated in 1820, and Ogunquit, which separated in 1980. Records appear to have been kept continuously since 1695 although the ravages of time have taken its toll. Fortunately in the mid-1800s the town clerk was commissioned to make a copy of the existing records. Those are available and include documentation to the early 1800s.

Wells was originally governed by the laws of the Massachusetts Bay Colony and, as such, registration of vital records was required in 1639 with stricter enforcements in 1657.

If your ancestors came from this region, you will in all likelihood find this book to be of invaluable help in your research, especially so since these records in this book include later births, marriages and deaths taken from the annual town reports.
