

DEATH

Harold F. DIXON, 85, a World War II
Navy hero who survived 34 days adrift
on a raft in the Pacific Ocean died
June 26 in San Diego. Born in Moline
Kansas Jan 10 1902, he was raised in
Bartlesville, OK. He was awarded the
Navy Cross after he and two other men
survived in a rubber raft after their
plane was forced to ditch in the Pacific
in 1942. After drifting 1200 miles in
34 days, they washed ashore in the Cook
Islands. The raft is now on display
at the Smithsonian Institute.



R.H. HUTCHINSON PAPERS

Some of you will be interested to know that The Friends Historical Collection, Guilford College, Greensboro, NC 27410 has secured part of the papers of the late R.H. Hutchinson of Snow Camp, N.C. Mr. Hutchinson researched many families of Piedmont NC from the 1920's to the 1960's when he died. Much of his research was on the DIXONs of Snow Camp NC and Chatham Co NC who were descendants of William and Ann GREGG DIXON. He corresponded with the late Ben F. DIXON, Simeon Wilson DIXON, Ben WALKER and many of you. The "Quaker Room" at Guilford College has part of his records now and they are quite interesting, but not nearly complete. There are several boxes of his notes and letters (one box of DIXON material). When I visited him in the early 1960's, he had literally a room full of papers and notebooks. You descendants of Jesse DIXON and Lydia WINTERS may be interested to know that Mr. Hutchinson found these entries in the N.C. COLONIAL WAR ACCOUNTS: "June 1781 Taylor and Ramsey certify to Jesse DIXON paid by land grant May 1784." and "Jesse DIXON allowed ____ for service in militia by board of auditors for Division of Wilmington from 16 July 1783 to These boards of auditors were set up by the State of N.C. to pay its citizens for service or goods used during the period of the Revolutionary War, which N.C. figured lasted from JUL 1776 to Sept 1783.

Was in the Battle of Brier Creek in GA and Eutaw Springs and Dorchester in SC. Served as a private and was discharged in Salisbury NC after serving 18 months.

Jeremiah DIXON applied for a pension Mar 25 1834 but died before evidence was complete. Pension number 33171 was issued Sept 16 1835 to his surviving heirs at a rate of \$40 per annum.

He was married August 10 1785 (place not given) to Elizabeth GOFF. Their children were:

JOHN DIXON of WARREN CO., KENTUCKY

Now for my Dixon line. I descend from one of those mysterious John Dixons who seem to have suddenly appeared out of nowhere (it seems mysterious John Dixons only slightly outnumber the mysterious William Dixons). My John DIXON was in Green Co., KY by the mid 1790s, finally settling in Warren Co. in 1801. The name of his wife is not known. John died in Warren Co. in 1823. His children:

A. John DIXON, Jr.

B. Henry DIXON

C. Haldenby DIXON

D. Mary DIXON

E. Frederick DIXON

At this point I should confess that there is some circumstantial evidence for John's origin. There were two Dixon families living in colonial Williamsburg, both active in civic affairs. They were the families of John DIXON and Haldenby DIXON, John was the printer of the Virginia Gazette, member of the Common Council, and Mayor of Williamsburg. John died 27 Apr 1791 in Richmond. He married Rosanna HUNTER on 1 Jan 1767 and had:

H. George DIXON b. 10 Sep 1780

Haldenby DIXON, possibly a brother of John, the printer, was also a member of the Williamsburg Common Council. He owned a large plantation in Hanover Co. and died c1803 when he no longer appears on the tax list. A possible son, Samuel DIXON is listed with him. I believe it possible that the John DIXON who went

to Warren Co., KY is another son of Haldenby DIXON of Williamsburg and Hanover Co., VA. I base this on similarity of names of these families. I have not found the name Haldenby DIXON in any other family line. Well, back to the children of John DIXON of Warren Co.

A. John DIXON, Jr. born c1770 apparently never married. His will, dated 27 Jun 1829 in Allen Co., KY (not probated until Nov 1853) leaves everything to brothers, sister and a nephew Thomas F.W. DIXON.

B. Henry DIXON b. c1770-1775 in VA m. Warren Co., KY 9 Apr 1806 Nancy HUBBARD, dau of Ephriam and Ann (EDMONDS) HUBBARD. Henry was a Deputy Sheriff and Justice of the Peace in Warren Co. When Edmonson Co. was formed from Warren, Henry was appointed its first County Court Clerk. Henry moved to Hempstead Co, AR in 1831, where he died in 1836. His children:

E. Frederick DIXON d. 1831 never married. His land was sold with the proceeds provided to his brothers and sister.

A Rhoda DIXON owned land next to John, Jr., Frederick and Mary but I have no information on her relationship. She could have been John Sr.'s wife. There are a considerable number of records concerning this family in Warren Co.

ELISHA DIXON OF WHITE OAK TOWNSHIP

The first settlers in White Oak Grove, McLean County, Illinois, were Smith and Elizabeth Dixon Denman, who came there in 1829. Stephen and Betsy Dearborn Taylor settled there in 1837. There must have been others in the meantime, since Mr. Taylor said he had "the best neighbors". But our story is of Elisha Dixon, who came somewhat later. (We did not learn if he was a relative of Elizabeth Denman.)

Elisha Dixon was born June 14, 1809, near Romney, Hampshire County, Virginia. His parents were John and Drusilla Harvey Dixon. His father was of English, Irish and Scotch descent, and his mother came of German stock. These Dixons were related to Jeremiah Dixon, one of the surveyors of the Mason-Dixon Line.

John Dixon and his family moved to Ohio in 1815, settling on the Stillwater River in Harrison County, near Freeport. Here Elisha received his education – chiefly reading and spelling – in the common schools.

In 1828, Elisha came to Dry Grove, then in Tazewell County but now in McLean County. He lived there in a one-room cabin for two years. His father and family followed him there in 1829.

Elisha enlisted in Captain Robert McClure's company in May of 1832 during the Black Hawk War. The company was a part of Brigadier General Samuel Whitesides' brigade. They fought at Dixon's Ferry; buried the dead from the battle at Stillman's Run; were sent with three other companies to defend Ottawa; went on to Indian Creek to bury three families who had been murdered by Indians; traveled back to Ottawa and were honorably discharged at the mouth of Fox River, Illinois, on May 28, 1832.

Upon his return home, Mr. Dixon took up farming in White Oak Grove. He is shown as having bought eighty acres of public domain land in Section 15 on September 18, 1835, at a total cost of \$100. A John Dixon, presumably his father, bought 240 acres at different times from November 20, 1829 (while the area was still Tazewell County) to August 27, 1836.

In December, 1828 (or 1829), Elisha married Mary Brown, of Dry Grove. She was born in about 1811 in Overton County, Tennessee. They had nine children, four of whom died in infancy. Those who lived were William and Eliza Ann (twins), Lucinda, Sara and John. (In the 1850 census, William A. and Eliza Ann were 19; Lucinda, 17; Sarah, 14; and John F., 1. All the children were born in Illinois.)

In 1845, Elisha was elected school treasurer and kept the office fourteen years. After a couple attempts to rob him, he grew uneasy at being responsible for the school money and gave up the office. He also served as Constable and Road Commissioner.

Daughter Eliza married John Caton in 1851 in McLean County (although their marriage license was not returned for recording); and Lucinda married John J. Fail in Tazewell County on October 14, 1850. (An earlier McLean County license was returned without marriage because the groom, John J. Fail, was too young.) The author was unable to find either the name of William's wife or the date of their marriage. John's wife was Minerva; but we only know that through her inheriting from Elisha.

In the 1860 census, John is the only child listed at home, and he was 12 years old.

Although LeBaron's 1879 history and Elisha's obituary both indicate that his wife Mary died in 1866, her death must have come earlier since the McLean County Marriage Records show that he married Alcina (also spelled Elsina) D. Lawrence, the widow of O. B. Lawrence, on May 24, 1864. According to the obituary, they had six more children. The only names found to date are Mary E., who was two years old at the time of the 1870 census, and Elsina who was listed as one year old in the 1880 census. The 1870 census lists Elisha, Elsina, 49; Rebecca, 19; and Mary E., 2. In 1880, the household consisted of Elisha, Elsina and another Elsina, age 1. (The relationship of the children to Elisha was not shown in either census.)

According to *The Good Old Days in McLean County*, only two children were living in 1874: William lived at Minier in Tazewell County and John F. taught school near Pontiac. However, no mention was made of Mary's death and Elisha's remarriage. The 1879 history spoke of Mary's death but did not mention the marriage to Elsina.

In 1869, Mr. Dixon sold his original farm, which had grown to 254 acres in the almost forty years he lived there, and bought another 120 acres, also in White Oak Township. Here he spent the rest of his life.

Elisha was described as six feet, two inches tall, heavily built with thick, white hair. In *Good Old Days*, Mr. Duis wrote, "Mr. Dixon can talk when he gets himself started. He can embellish matters and make them shine by the power of his imagination. When people talk to him, he can see the sharp corners and the inconsistencies of their conversation, and woe to the incautious man who makes wild statements in his presence."

Mr. Dixon was a lifelong Democrat and was a member of the White Oak M.E. Church.

Elisha Dixon died at home September 23, 1892, of "old age, assisted by injuries received two weeks ago in a fall," according to the September 26,1892, *Daily Pantagraph*. All of his children by both marriages preceded him in death. His property was left to his widow Elsina for her lifetime and, upon her death (probably in 1897), it was sold and the proceeds divided among Mary Elsina Dixon Arment (a granddaughter – don't know her parents); Herbert, Edgar and Charles Dixon and Minnie Dixon Fenwick (children of William); William Caton (son of Eliza Ann Dixon Caton); and Minerva Dixon, the divorced wife of John F. The will mentioned the children of Lucinda Dixon Fail; however, there were apparently none living when the estate was settled.
