

JAMES DOBBIN - June B.

James Dobbin born Devry or Dover County, Ireland circs 1712. Ho came to the colonies with his brothers, Alexander and John; and his sisters, Jane and Rosenna. In his 36th year in January of 1746 he married Anna Skiles in Pennsylvania. Ann Skiles was the daughter of Henry and Catherine Skiles Sr. of Leacock Township, Leacaster County, Pennsylvania. Cathorine outlived her husband Henry Skiles Senior. In Henry Skiles Sr. 's will dated April 19th. 1750 mention is made of Ann Elizabeth Dobbin his daughter. In 1750 we find James Dobbin, his white Ann, and two of their sons James and Alexender Dobbin Living 8 miles west of Salisbury on East Bank of Second Oreek, South Yodkin River in Rowan County, North Caroline, James Dobbin received a land grant from John, Earl of Granville, December 21, 1761. Then on the 28th of August, 1762. These lands being situate in the Parish of St. Luke's in the county of Royan, lying on both sides of Second Crock. Joining Malcolm Hamilton, Alexander Dobbin, and William Porter. Said land containing in the whole 555 acres in all. James Dobbin organized the congregation of thystira Presbyterian Church, Bowan County, North Carolina, and was chosen directing elder and sided in the byilding of the church,

Thyatira is one of the oldest Presbyterian churches west of the Yadkin River, if not the very oldect. In fact, it is one of the oldest Prosbyterian churches in North Carolina. It is located in Rowan County. ten miles west of Salisbury on Highway 150, in the Millbridge community.

The deed for the land on which the church and cometary are located was made on Jenuary 17, 1753, and is registered in the Courthouse in Salisbury. A duplicate was made on January 18, 1753, the original of which is to be seen in the vestibule of the church, it beginning as

follows:

THIS INDENTURE, made the Eighteenth day of January in ye year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and Fifty Three, Batseen Jno Lynn of ye County of Anson in the Province of Morth Carolina, of the one part, And the Congregation Known by To Congregation belonging to ye Lower meeting house between ye yetkin river & the Cutabo Do, adhering to a Minister Ideensed From or by a Presbytery Belonging to & the old synod of Philadel-phis.

Mote that Rowen was still a part of Anson County when the deed was made, Rowan being set off as a separate county on March 27, 1755. The deed indicates that there was a Presbyterian congregation in this community prior to the making of the deed. We learn, too, that its first name was "Lower Meeting House", which was changed by December, 1755, to "Cathey's Meeting House", named after the Catheys, a prominent family of the community. The word "church" was reserved for the Anglican, or Episcopal Church which was the State Church prior to the Revolutionary War.

James Dobbin was on the jury in 1769, on grand jury in 1771, pathy jury in 1771, and grand in 1772. James and Alexander Dobbin put in claims for venirey tickets in 1769. James Dobbin and John Murdech were among those to lay out a read from Robert Murdech's to John Freheck's Mill in 1770. James Dobbin is among many of the Statesville Sattlement to lay out a read from William McGrarey on the north side of the south fork of the Yadkin River to Salisbury in 1772. James Dobbin is guardian of Ann Porter, orphan, under 100 pound bond in Pebruary of 1772.

Jemos Dobbin was unable to take an active part in the American Rovolution having been lamed by a fall from his horse. Jemos Dobbin died on February 8, 1788 in Rowan County, Forth Caroline.

JAMES DOBBIES' WILL, PAGE 1: Willbook C, page 76 made February 5, 1788, produced in 1791, sick and weak, Wife is Anna. Son John to get the plantation but must reserve portion for his mother; Alexander and Hugh to get five shillings. Daughters:

Mary (wife of John Schools (Skiles)); Anna, (wife of Devid Cowan); Rosenna (wife of Richard Greham); Elizabeth; Cathrine; Margaret and Rebecca. Has some land on Beaver Dam Branch. Executors: sons John and Alexander and con-in-law, John Schools. Witnesses: James Mo-Carley (?), Anna Thomson, and Samuel Young.

Ann Elizabeth Skiles Dobbin, born in Pennsylvania (Lancaster County); the wife of James Dobbin, born in Ireland, died in Movember of 1789 in Rowan County, North Carolina. The only record that we find for Anna Skiles in Pennsylvania is mention of her in her father's will whereby he gives her twenty shillings which the executors are not obliged to pay until five years after her father's death.

Wife: Catharine "If she not give herself the liberty of being drunk" Children: William Jr; Henry; Fetter; Harman; Elizabeth Rutter; Ostherine Cowen; Ann Elizabeth Dobbins; yagst s. James (miner); yagst da. Margaret (minor) son: John, executor with Edward Barwick, Esq.

It is very likely that Ann Elizabeth Dobbin Skiles, sister Catherine Cowen and her husband accompanied the Dobbin family to Rowen County, Morth Carolina as we find the Cowens in Howen County, North Carolina at the same time in the same location.

There were thirteen known children born to James and Anna (Skiles)

Dobbin. Mrs ---- Grigge of Jefferson, Ashe County, North Carolina

claims as her exceptor Jemes Dobbin and submitted the following dates of

birth and death for these children. Information on all of this can be

found in the McCubbins File, Public Library, Salisburty, Rowan County,

I. John Dobbin Jr. First son of James Dobbin and Ann Elizabeth (Skiles) Dobbin. Born on October 19, 1748 in Lancastar County, Pennsylvania. John was a blackmenth.

In November of 1772 Barasboth Bekor, ago 14, the orphen of Henry Bekor is apprenticed until 21 years of ago, to John Dobbins to learn "The Art and History of a Blacksmithersathe Said Jno Dobbins to give Sd: Apprentice a pair of new Bellows, a Sledge & set of Mammers". (the most prominent people of that day kept blacksmith shops or tavorns).

John Dobbin, son of James and Ames, Gled on Document 31, 1817.

His will dated on October 20, 1817 was proved in the February term
of 1818. This was in Rowan County, Berth Caroline. He records exist
to show a marriage for John Dobbin Jr. His will is as follows:

My nophew: Jacob D. Skiles, giving him, among other things 400 acros adjoining leads of heirs of Hugh Dobbins, docid.
.... In consideration of his mother Catherine Dobbins my sister.... Sister: Elizabeth Dobbins and her three daughters, Elizabeth, Ruth, and Frescilla. Hephew: Abel McBroom. Sisters: Jane McBroom, Anne Cowan, Rosanuah Graham, Elizabeth Dobbins. Catherine Dobbins, Hargaret Cowan, and Robecca Cowan (some are living with him.) Executors: Jacob D. Skiles. William Chunn(?). Text: William Berber, Thomas Chunn. (signed) John Dobbins.

Died of land from James Dobbin to son John Dobbin: --James Dobbins, August 28, 1762; Lend grant from John, Earl of Granville, 500 acres. (Book 5, p. 131) and John Dobbins (Book D, P. 61) lets John Dobbins have it on Upper End and the veters of Beaver Dan Branch, South Yodkin River.

Book 12 page 585: On March 5, 1792, Alexander Dobbins the elder (no wife signs) lets John (son of Alexander Dobbins of Rowan County) have 226 acres next John Dobbins (the son of James), Jamette McBroom & William Novem for 100 pounds, witnessed by M. Stokes & D. Cowan & proved by Esq. Montford Stokes in May term of 1792. (This is part of grant #300 going from the State on November 4, 1784) of 623 acres). Fock 10 page 258 P Nov. 4 1784. The state grants (#309 et 50 shillings the 100 acres) to Alexander Dobbin 623 acres on both sides Second Croek next Alexander Long. ---Cours, ----Marlin, ----Henilton, James Dobbin & John Skiles.

ZI. Alexander Dobbin Jr. Born on November 30, 1749 in Purnsylvania. Alexander Dobbin Jr. Eszried Hancy Ivwin. Died December 11, 1828 (Will Book H. p. 447). Rouan County, North Carolina. Three children: A. Joseph Dobbin

- B. Alexander Dobbia
- C. Polly Dobbin

Book B, p. 155: on Merch 1, 1787. James Dobbin gives to his son.
Alexander Dobbin (both of Rowan County, North Carolina) 400 acres on

both sides of Beaver Dan Branch. Next said Alexander Dobbin, Henry Hughey, John Cowan, John Lowrence, for love etc. witnessed by Hugh and John Dobbin and proved by the latter on February 9, 1793. (This is part of 700 acres granted by Earl Granville on December 21, 1761.

The will of Alexander Dobbins (Book H. P. 447) made on April 20, 1827 in perfect health. Sons: Joseph, (part of the plantation where Jenes Graham now lives, with the house, field, and part of the low ground on Beaver Dam Creek) and Alexander (my mansion house, etc.) Daughter; Polly. Executors: my two sons Joseph and Alexander. Hitnesses: John S. Graham, Richard Graham, and J. E. Dobbins.

As Mancy (Irwin) Dobbin--wife of Alexander is not mentioned in the will of Her husband Alexander Dobbin--it is apparent that she is already deceased.

A.-A. Joseph Dobbin, the son of Alexander and Manoy Irwin, never married. He was born and died in Rowan County, North Carolina. Joseph Dobbin purchased land as shown in the following deeds:

Book 20, P. 121: June 8, 1808. Charles McKenzie, no wife signs, lets Joseph Dobbins, (both of Rowan County, N. C.) have 50 scres on both sides of the main road from Salisbury to Charlotte on a branch of Cold Witer Orest, next Col. Martin Phifer and crossing a small branch for \$800.00 witnessed by James Dobbins and Joseph B. Todd and proved by the latter in May, 1809.

Book 20. P. 250: August 13, 1811. Joseph E. Dobbins, -no wife signs-lets George Savitz (both of Rowan County,
North Carolina) have fifty scree on both sides of the
main road from Salisbury to Charlotts on a branch of
Cold water Creek next Col. Martin Phifer, for \$850.00.
witnessed by M. Braly and Locker Partee and proved by
the latter in August of 1811. (Charles McKenzis let
said Dobbins have this).

The will of Joseph Dobbin (Book I., P. 124) made while "sick and weak" on December 18, 1841 and probated in February of 1842. Brother Alexander (my rights in land willed by my decembed father, Alexander Dobbin, on Witherese Creek and both sides Beaver Dom; also two tracts adjoining these but which he and I bought since his death--one from Thomas

Matthews and the other from Thomas C. Polk, but he must let mistor Folly live on the Matthews tract or as much of it as her son, Mozekish M. can cultivate.) Baniel I. Nobb. Enset utors: brother Alexander and Joseph Cowes. Witnesses: John Dobbin and Joseph Greken.

- B.-B. Alexander Dubbin und the second son of Alexander Dubbin Jr. and his wife Manoy Irvin. Records are needed for this son.
- C.-C. Folly Dobbin was the only daughter of Alexander Dobbin Jr. and his wife Hency Irwin. He know that Polly was married as she has a son Hozekich.

1. Hesokiab ...
Nothing further is known. Records are known for this family.

III. Henry Dubbin was the third sen of James and Anna (Skiles)

and was born in Rower County, North Caroline on January 11, 1751.

Houry Dobbin died on June 9th, 1783 in Rower County, North Caroline.

Hanry Dobbius, son of James and Ames (Skiles) Dobbin. August 5, 1783, administration of cetate to John Dobbins, L200 specie for security.

IV. Jemos Dobbin Jr. 1s the fourth son of James and Anna (Skiles)

Dobbin, He was been in Rowan County, North Carolina on February 5th,

1753. James Dobbin Jr. died on Cotober 2nd, 1785.

Jones Dobbin is next to David Caldwell on May 6. 1778, see entry #765, where David Caldwell gots 640 seres next him, Timothy McGuire, James Erwis, and including Flagg Swamp next Robert Simington, John Archibald, and Margaret Johnston.

V. John (Jour-Jeamette) Debbir-the fifth child and the first daughter of James and Ann (Skiles) Debbin was born on July 19th, 1754 in Roven County, Worth Careline. Jame married James McBroom. The marriage bend was deted Jamesy 17, 17-... It was witnessed by Hugh Debbin. One child was born to James (Dobbin) McBroom and James McBroom.

VI. Hary Dobbin-the sixth child and the second deughter of Jenes and Ana (Misabeth Skiles) Dobbin and was born in Bowan County, North Carolina on Jaluary 27, 1756.

VI. Hary Dobbin married her cousin John W. Skiles who was born in Lancaster County, Pennsylvania and came to Rowan County, North Carclina and settled on 320 acras on the south side of Sills Creek. The said land having been deeded to John W. Skiles by his parents Henry (son of Henry and Catharine Skiles of Lancaster County, Pennsylvania) and Rosannah Skiles of Leacock Township in Lancaster County, Pennsylvania.

At the same time engher son James Skiles and his wife, Margaret Devers, sattled on 320 acres on the south side of Skile Creek, said land given to son James out of affection from his parents Henry and Rosanna Skiles.

James and Margaret (Devers) Skiles did not choose to remain in Rowan County, Forth Carolina and sold their land as follows and returned to Pennsylvania. James Skiles served in the Revolutionary War.

Book 8 page 142: Docember 21, 1773, James Skiles & wife Margaret 1st let Benjamin Cowan—all of Rowan County, North Carolina—have 320 acres on the south side of Sills Creek, for 250 pounds, witnessed by William Cowan Jr. & Hugh Jenkins & proved by the latter in May of 1774, (This is part of the 640 acres which Earl Granville let James Hill have on May 25, 1752 in Ameen County, now Rowan County, and he let Honry Skiles have on August 22, 1752 who let his son, the above James Skiles have 520 acros of it on June 12, 1771——and see book 7 page). It begins at a stake and goes 148 poles to a white oak, east 347 poles to a hickory, north 148 poles to a stake, then west 347 poles to the beginning.

Hary Dobbin Skile's husband, John W. Skiles, was a wegon-maker.

The 1790 census of Rowan County, North Caroline for John Skiles shows

two males over 16. Four females. Three claves.

The two moles are John Skiles and a sen Jacob Skiles.

A. Jacob Skiles married Nallie ? Jacob is probably deceased before 1820. We find no 1820 census for Jacob Skiles in North Carolina.

The four females listed in the 1790 census of John Skiles ere his wife Mary (Dobbin) Skiles and their three daughters.

E. -B. Anna Skiles married Charles Dailey who was the son of William Daily of New Jersey. Amna married Charles Dailey on October 16th, 1797 in Rowan County, Borth Caroline. The bondsman was John B. Felmer and the witness was John Rogers.

Two children were born to Arna Skiles and Charles Deily.

We believe that Anna Skiles may have been decessed before her father John Skiles made his will in 1806 as Anna Skiles Daily is not mentioned. The will of Mary Skiles does list her two grand-children: John and Jane W. Daily.

C.--C. Jens Skiles married Joseph Graham in Rowen, North Carolina.

Marriage bend on the 24 of February in 1796. The bendeman was

Plohard Gillespie.

Jana Skiles and Joseph Graham had Shras children,

- 1, John Skiles Grahem,
- 2, Richard Graham.

Jane Skiles Grahem died shortly efter the birth of her daughter Jane.

D. -- D. Elizabeth Skiles married her brother-in-lew Joseph Graham.

Joseph Graham was the husband of her decessed sister Jana. Elizabeth

Skiles married Joseph Greham on December 20th, 1803 in Rouse County, North Carolina. John McBroom was the bondsman and the witness was A. L. Caborn. The only known child born to Edizabeth and Joseph Grekam was Folly Graham.

On August 10, 1813 Joseph Graben was appointed guardies of John Skiles Graham and Richard Graham-his some by his first wife, Jame Skiles.

John W. Skiles died in the year of 1815 and his wife, Hery Dobbin Skiles, died in 1818. Both left wills montioning their heirs.

VII. Mugh Dobbin was the seventh child of James and Ann (Skiles) Dobbin.

He was born in Rowan County, North Carolina on May 25, 1757. Follow
ing is a dead to land given to Hugh by his father James Dobbin.

James Dobbins (Book 11, Page 31, May 8, 1787) a yeoman, out of love for his son Rugh Dobbin, a wagon maker, gives him 440 cores on Second Crock next to George Robison, Francis Loar, John Shoile (Skiles), and Alexander Robbin. (Book 36, Page 133, December 24, 1811) States grants (#3022) 601/2 acres on Second Crock next to John Skiles.

Rugh merried GRIZZY TRWIN. They had six children.

- C. John Dobbin.
- D. Hency Dobbia.
- E. Polly Dobbin.
- P. Elizabeth Dobbin.

All are listed in the will of their father, Rugh Dobbin, dated March 12, 1811. Hugh Dobbin died on May 3, 1811.

A.-A. Joseph B. Dobbin was the first sen of Hugh and Grizzy (Irwin) Dobbin. Joseph E. Dobbin may have bed two wives as there is quite a spen in the age of the first children mentioned in the 1850 census of Meoni M. Dobbin and the younger children mentioned in the 1850 census census.

Recal M. Dobbin was her in Tennessee in 1799. She is a widow as shown in the 1850 census for Rowan County. Earth Caroline.

The following children listed with her are all born in North Carolina.

- 1. Jemira A. Dobbin who was born in 1814. Jemina married John Bleckwell on February 25, 1857.
- 2. Emily G. Dobbin who was born in 1819. (I believe the chove two children to be the daughters of Joseph E. Dobbin from a first marriage.)
- 3. Nancy E. Dobbla was born in 1833. Hency married Richard F. Graham on October 27, 1852. This family will be given in full in the chapters on Skiles-Graham.
- 4. Joseph B. Dobbiu was born in 1835.
- 5. Excel H. Habbin was born in 1877. Heclmi married Julius A. Elliott on July 19, 1860. Himons was Jos. E. Dobbin, her brother.

All marriages are in Rowan County, North Carolina. The division of the estate of Joseph E. Dobbin Sr. did not take place until February 20, 1855. Buch research has proven those mend in the division of his estate are his wife, his children, his nephows, and his sister.

- B.-A. James Dobbin was the second son of Eugh and Grizzy (Irvin)
 Dobbin. James wife to unknown and they had two oblidren.
 - 1. Grizzy E. Dobbin married Joseph C. Graham in the 19th of September in 1849. The witness was H. M. Dobbin.
 - 2. Hugh A. Dobbin married bears M. Verble on the 9th of February in 1843. Laure Marie Verble, the wife of Euch

Dobbin was born on Jarusky 23, 1826 and Gied on December 19, 1843. Her age was 15 years 5 months, and 26 days. She was buried in Salisbury Incheron Church.

A. Hugh A. Dobbin married next Hermoret A. Livbord on the 31st of Jonaery in 1849.

Navey Dobbin has a will. It is in Rook H. P. 92. in the year D. a.D. of 1849. It lists her nephew, Migh A. Jobbin (son of her brother Jezes) and also her wisco Elizabeth(daugher of her sister Polly).

Polly Dobbin has a donahter nemed Blizeboth. E. DE.

P.-F. Elizabeth Dobbin was the last child of Hugh and Grissy (Irvin) Dobbin. Has a will:

> The will of Elizaboth Dobbins, Book E. Pegce 40-41, made 19 September 1846, signed Batsy Debbin, and proved Hover-ber Seesion 1846 names nephew Hugh and nices Griszy (chil-dren of James Debbins) his sister Hency, sister Felly, and Mary Elizabeth (relationship not given).

VIII. Anna Dobbin Jr. This was the alabtic child of James and Anna (Skiles) Dobbin. She was born on January 28, 1759 and she married David Cowan of Nocklinburg County, Forth Carolina. The marriage bond has the date missing. It was witnessed by Alexander Dobbin.

IL. Roserna Dobbin Jr. This was the ninth child of James and Anna (Skiles) Dobbin. She was born on October 6, 1760 in Rowan County, North Carolina. Dosama married Richard Graham of Tomassee.

I. Elizaboth Dobbin was the tenth child born to James and Anna (Skiles) Dobbin on July 21, 1762 in Rower County, Morth Coroline. She died on Jennery 21st, 1829. Elizaboth maggied a Robbin (first name unknown). they had three children.

MI. Octivating Toobin was born on March 18, 1764 to Rowen County,

North Carelina and was the touth child of Jones and Arna Skiles

Dobbin. In the will of John Lobbin her brother deted in 1817

John Dobbin gives to Jacob D. Skiles 400 seres of land in consideration of his mother Catharine Dobbin (called inn).

May 10, 1788: "Jacob Skiles gave Bond with John Couch Secwrity in the sum of 1200.0.0 to keep the County Indemnified & Indial such orders of court as may be made respecting a Eastare Child beget on the Body of Ann Dobbins of Which he is the reputed Fother. And it is now Ordered that said Jacob Skiles pay ten Pounds to the said Ann for Hursing etc. The first Year". Now. 10, 1791: "Ordered that Jacob Skiles pay to Alexander Dobbins twenty mine pounds, for four Tears keeping a Basterd child of which said Skiles is the reputed father, this including the Order of May, 1788 not satisfied." Feb. 11, 1792: Another order that John Skiles (bail of Jacob Skiles) pay and Dobbins, & that Alexander Dobbins bring the destard of said Jacob Skiles to the mext court.

Jacob Skiles Sr. was the sen of John W. Skiles and his wife
Mary Dobbin Skiles. Mary was the sletter of Catherine Dobbin.
Whether Jacob married Catherine (Ann) Dobbin is not known. He may
have absorded or died as no further records can be found in North
Carolina to fit Jacob Skiles Sr. He was the sen of John Skiles of
Rowan County, North Carolina. Catherine died on November 25, 1842 or
1843. This was in North Carolina. This line of the above Jacob
D. Skiles will be carried completely in the chapter on Skiles-Graham.

- XII. Margaret Dobbin was born on September 16, 1766, Howan County;

 Worth Carolina. She married William Cowan of Rowan County, North

 Carolina. She died on October 1, 18--.
- KIII. Rebook Dobbin was bern on October 8, 1786 in Rowen County, North Carolina. She married David Count of Rowen County and the marriage bond was dated 23 August 1792, probably same as from Mecklenburg County, both Marriage Bonds in Rowen County. Died on February 2, 1822.

Apparently David Cover married two sisters, and possibly a third. The first Marriage Bond in Rovan County on David Coven is 25 August 1732 to Roberth Dobbins, witnessed by
