THOMAS DOUTHIT REVOLUTIONARY SOLDIER

The following is an extract of letter from Harrison Chapter DAR, Indianapolis, IN to NSDAR, Washington D.C.

Sarah Douthit m. Jessee Connely, 11 May 1799, in Jefferson Co., KY. Tax records for Jefferson Co., Ky shows Thomas Douthet in 1791 and in 1799 shows Thomas' brothers, James, John, Solomon and Silas all from the will of John Douthit of Hampshire Co., VA in 1803. Several others of the descendants are also mentioned on the tax records. John Douthet m. Jenny Woods, 30 Jan 1798, in Jefferson Co., KY. Thomas Douthet was the only one old enough to be the father of Sarah Douthet in Jefferson Co., KY. Cannot find a will for Thomas in either Jefferson Co., KY or Clark Co., IN. There were two other Douthet marriages in Jefferson Co., KY who would have been children of Thomas who were: Priscilla Douthett, m. David Vanwinkle, 24 Mar 1804; Savannah Douthitt, m. William Salle, 23 Sep 1803. Thomas Douthet had a brother, Silas born in 1763 who died in Franklin Co., KY and another brother Caleb was there with Silas.

REVOLUTIONARY SOLDIERS BURIED IN INDIANA

Douthitt, Thomas: Buried in Utica, Ind; m. Mollie Wright; 12 children; 7 daughters and 5 sons, including John Douthitt, with whom soldier lived. Descendants are: Applegate, McKinney, Goldsmith, Weir, Thatcher, Connelly, Reuble, Allen, et al. Soldier was orphaned, apprenticed to a shoemaker, seized by a press gang and put on a British ship; he was the only one of six who jumped overboard to reach shore. Went to Philadelphia, served for seven years in Revolution, was at Valley Forge. Migrated from Pittsburgh and settled on Pennsylvania Run in KY, 1789. HANNIBAL PERRY DOUTHITT OBITUARY

Hannibal Perry Douthitt was born in Benton County, Iowa, August 12, 1859, and died at his home near Ponca, Nebraska on April 9, 1903.

Mr. Douthitt came to Dixon County when a mere boy, settling with his parents on Silvercreek. On December 25, 1881 he was married to Miss Lillie M. Beardshear. In the spring following they moved to the place six miles north of Ponca that has been their home ever since, where by diligence and good business management they accumulated a comfortable fortune.

Mr. Douthitt was prominent in the business and political affairs of the county; was chairman of the county board at the time of his death and was a leading candidate for the nomination for county treasurer. He was a prominent lodge man, being a

member of the Masonic, Odd Fellow and Workman orders. He carried \$2,000 life insurance in the latter order.

He was taken sick on Thursday evening, April 2, with an acute attack of pneumonia and died on the following Thursday at about noon. The funeral was held on Sunday afternoon at two o'clock at the Lutheran church, conducted by Rev. George Bray. The funeral was perhaps the largest ever held in Ponca. The procession formed at the edge of town and marched to the church, headed by the Masonic, Odd Fellow and Workman lodges, followed by the hearse, family and a long procession. The church was unable to accommodate all who sought entrance.

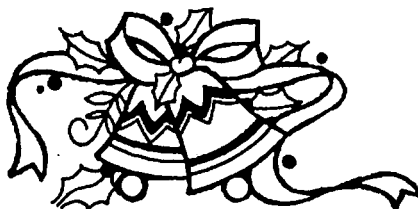
A pathetic incident in connection with the funeral was the fact that the second daughter, Pearl, was sick, also with pneumonia, and was unable to attend the funeral. The cortege passed down East street in order that she might be able to witness it from her sick room at the Kingsburn home where she was staying.

Deceased leaves a widow and five children, four daughters and a son, to mourn the untimely death of a kind and affectionate husband and father.

NEWS FROM CARY ANDERSON

The next few pages are taken from letters received from Cary Anderson, president of the Douthit Family Association. If you do not have his new address in Bolivia it is: Dr. W. Cary Anderson, Cochabamba Cooperative School, Casilla 1395, Cochabamba, Bolivia.

I hope all my shipment of materials on genealogy arrives safely in Cochabamba. That is always my fear when I move. I now have over 10,500 descendants in my files of John Douthit.

I plan to order an Apple IIe to be sent down to Cochabamba. I haven't learned word processing yet, but I am sure in that isolated area, I'll have plenty of time to do so. Then, I hope to get a new manuscript done on the diskettes. I cannot promise anything for any date, but I am at this point ready to stop adding.

That Jacob Dautthit was just Jacob Dautt in the 1840 census of Hamilton Co., OH, p. 209. The eldest male was 30 to 40. The other male was 15-10. I did not get the females as my researcher did not send that. I would still like to see if the females fit those of Jacob Douthit, son of Abraham Douthit. I was at Ft. Wayne, Indiana library and didn't copy it myself! When I saw it was DAUTT just put the film back.

By the way, the Ft. Wayne library is fantastic! It has such a large collection of family histories which makes research in family names very exciting and rewarding. I highly recommend it to one and all. I have been at Newbury in Chicago, Salt Lake City, DAR in Washington, and the Library of Congress. I would go to Ft. Wayne first to check their family histories.

I had some research done and was sent pages from A Record of My Paternal Ancestors compiled by Robert B. Powers, Delaware, OH, 1967. This deals in part with the Douthit family of Crawford Co., PA and Portage, Morrow and Rutland Counties, OH. From this the following items are of interest:

There is a small pamphlet in the New York Historical Library by A.T. Douthit titled

"The Douthett and Ward Families--Genealogical Notes." Who can find this and copy it??

The following seems to be taken from this pamphlet:

The name Douthett dates back to the time of the Renaissance. The first members of the family who, in the latter part of their lives bore the name as it is now spelled, were French, and being Huguenots, they, together with 400,000 of their Protestant brethren, the most industrious, the most intelligent, and the most religious of the nation, quitted France after the Revocation of the Edict of Nantes by Louis 14th, Oct 18, 1685, and took refuge in other lands. A portion of the Douthett family went first to Wales, and in this country, it is said, the name was changed from Doucette into its present shape. This change seems to have been occasioned by the peculiarities of the Welch language for tradition says in the case of one of the connection who did not go to Wales, the name remained as it was, to wit: John Doucette, who was from 1717 to 1726, Governor of Anapolis, capitol of Acadia, now a seaport of Nova Scotia. (See Winsor's Narrative and Critical History of America, Vol. 5, p. 409)

Who can find this work of Winsor???

There appears in Vol. 30, p. 64 of the Maryland Historical Society Records some Douthit material. It doesn't appear to be anything new, but hopefully someone can find this record. There appears to be a pamphlet in the Maryland Historical Society in Baltimore, MD, on the genealogy of the Douthett Family. Can someone check this out??

I had a report from the College of Arms in London. Cost me \$100 and there was absolutely nothing that will help us on our Douthits! There is an archive in Edinburgh, Scotland, that has records of Coats of Arms issued in Scotland. I haven't yet written there as I expect they will need a \$100 also. This research gets costly! The address is:

CORRECTION Page 15 of the December 1984 issue.

M3. Delete all of the information. I assumed there was only one William Holliman/Holeman, etc. I found in the Ft. Wayne, IN, library that none of these children belong to our Sarah Howard. There appear to be two William Holliman/Holeman in Rowan Co., NC, at that time. The information on p. 15 of the Dec. 1984 issue as to Holeman pertains to the family that evidently pronounced its name like "hold man." I think the William Holliman/Holeman that Sarah Howard married was from the clan that pronounced its name "haul la mun." I have found two William Holeman/Holliman in Rowan Co., NC, for that time.

CORRECTION!!!!

Both myself and Mrs. Ruth Douthit have in our books that Mary Scott Douthit had 79 grandchildren at her death. I found the original copy from the Moravian Archives and it says 71 (NOT 79). On page 14 of the Dec. 1984 newsletter, I asked "Where are the other 5?" That was a typo as I had found 65 and said there were 79, but it sure was closer to the missing number. As I have 65 identified that were born prior to the death of Mary Scott Douthit and the memoir says she had 71 (seventy-one) there are only six missing, and these could be infants that died.

I do not have a copy of my book at hand, but the error is in the memoir of Mary Scott Douthit. The error is on page 20 of Mrs. Douthit's book, second column, next to last paragraph.

I was looking at my notes collected in Ft. Wayne and think I may have discovered something. In a book Clermont County, Ohio 1980 A Collection of Genealogical and Historical Writings, Vol. 1, p. 156:

End of material from the article. There is much more on the descendants of various of the children of John Hill.

John Hill had a son Thomas and a daughter Elizabeth. John Douthit Sr. had a son Jacob Douthit, b. 1765 that married an Elizabeth Hill and a daughter Rebecca Douthit, b. 1762? that married a Thomas Hill. Both of these couples left the Rowan Co., NC, area. There is a Thomas Hill with wife Rebecca in Clermont Co., OH, in the early 1800's. There is a Jacob Douthet and wife Elizabeth in the early 1800's in Warren Co., OH.

Two of John Hill's sons died in Warren Co., OH. From the article above, one of John Hill's daughters, Elizabeth, b. 1774 m. ---- Daugherty /sic/. We have seen Daugherty as a spelling for Douthit.

What Rebecca Douthit's birth year was

(one record I don't have at hand gave it as 1762) is a question. There are cases of ladies marrying younger men. Also, we do not have the source of Thomas Hill birth of 29 Mar 1772.

If we could find old Elisabeth Hill, b. 1774 who m. Jacob Douthit on the 1850 census or if Mary Douthit who m. John Wasson had lived to 1880, (and I don't have her death date) we might be able to see the place of birth of Elisabeth Hill that m. Jacob Douthit.

Also, if we could find where Jacob Douthit, Philip W. Hill and Benjamin Hill lived in Warren Co., OH, it might help add information.

On the 1800 tax list of Madison Co., KY, there is a Jacob Douthet. Elizabeth Douthit, daughter of Jacob Douthit and Elisabeth Hill was on the 1850 Wayne Co., IN, census as age 52, b. KY. Can someone look at the 1800 tax list of Madison Co., KY and see if there were any Hills???

There was a daughter of John Hill, Sarah, for which there is no marriage given in the article. I wonder if the records of Warren Co., OH, reveal the wife of William Ferguson. If it turns up as Sarah, another piece of helpful information.

Another book, History of Clermont Co., OH, Philadelphia, Louis H. Everts, 1880, p. 524, has information on the Hill family:

"Of the many who settled in Stonelick township in 1809-10 were John, Jacob, Thomas and Samuel Hill, brothers, and sons of John Hill, Sr. John was the eldest of the family, and was born on Antietam Creek, MD, near the site of the battlefield of Antietam, July 27, 1762; Jacob in 1766; Thomas in 1772 and Samuel in 1779. We have not the dates of the births of the rest of the children,—Joseph, Elizabeth, Sarah, Philip, and Benjamin,—as they settled in Warren County."

Here we have Elizabeth settling in Warren County, OH, where a Jacob Douthet with a wife Elizabeth was found in 1814 /Special Sessions Book 1, p. 97, Warren Co., OH/ We also see that Sarah went to Warren Co., OH.

More reason to try to locate the wife of William Ferguson. The NC marriage bonds might give the name of who Sarah Hill married or who William Ferguson married.

We now know:

1. Jacob Douthit, son of John Douthit Sr., m. Elisabeth Hill in Rowan Co., NC.
2. We know that a Jacob Douthet was in Madison Co., KY, 1800.
3. Elizabeth Douthit who m. 25 Nov 1815 Michael C. Wolf was b. 1797-8 in KY. The marriage was in Warren Co., OH.
4. A Jacob Douthet with wife Elisabeth was in Warren Co., OH, 1814.
5. An Elisabeth Hill, dau of John Hill, lived in Warren Co., OH.

The article from Hist. of Cler. Co., OH continues:

"In 1780 John Hill, Sr., emigrated to North Carolina, where John Hill Jr., was married to Rachel Butnen, a member of the Moravian Church. In 1785 both families removed to Rowan Co., and lived a number of years in the town of Salisbury, where John, Jr., was county jailer. In 1790, John Hill, Sr., bought a farm four miles from the town of Salisbury, on which he lived until 1797, when he emigrated to Kentucky, stopping at Newport, where he resided about one year and came to Ohio, buying a large tract of land near the present site of Loveland, on which he lived till his death, and which was afterwards divided between his seven sons and two daughters."

We also know:

6. Some of the Hills were in Kentucky in late 1700's. Thus, it appears that we have the Hill/Douthit connection quite clearly.

Can someone look up the KY probate and/or land records to find where old John Hill Sr. divided up his land??? This division of land is extremely important. I would love to see it.

I am sending you the latest charts on the children, grandchildren, and great-grandchildren on John Douthit and Mary Scott. There are a number of corrections and additions since the last one. There are many less blanks and unknowns.

I am not convinced completely that Rebecca Douthit's is correct. There were various Hill families in Rowan Co., NC, area in the late 1700's. She could have married another Thomas Douthit than the one that went from Rowan Co., NC, to Clermont Co., OH. The Thomas Hill, b. 29 Mar 1772, had a wife Rebecca, and the children on the chart are theirs. I just can't be certain, as the birth of Thomas Hill in 1772 bothers me a bit. I got information from somewhere that Rebecca Douthit was twin to Abraham, b. 9 Mar 1762. Would she have married a man 10 years younger? Could the typist have made a mistake on Thomas Hill's birth year? More research needs to be carried out on the Hill families in Rowan Co., NC, area.

The one family that really drives me up the wall is Mary Douthit, b. 13 Aug 1773 who m. Robert Orr. I have researched Orr family in SC, GA, and TN, and can't pin this family down.

Someone should be able to find the Robert Jones and Mary Douthit family in Surry Co., NC. Also, the David Elrod family in Davidson Co., NC of 1840 needs to be researched. Henry South and Sarah Hill are the last families that I need desperate help on. I gave up on Jacob Douthit son of Abraham Douthit Sr. I don't have any idea where to search now.

REPORT ON THE HOWARD REUNION

(From a press release sent by Margaret Howard Adams.)

"The first reunion of the James Benjamin and "Polly" Kimbrough Howard descendants was held in Graves County July 5 and 6 (1985). A get acquainted party was hosted by the Reunion Committee and the Texas Cousins at the Holiday Inn in Mayfield on Friday night.

"Saturday morning groups assembled at Burnetts Chapel United Methodist where they were directed to family cemeteries by Glenn Kelso and Charles Adams...

"Lunch was served at the church. The program opened in the afternoon with a skit in which Polly and Benjamin Howard were at home in North Carolina talking of their move to a new frontier and of the hardships they might encounter...

"Margaret Howard Adams discussed the Benjamin Howard family in which she traced the eight children, forty-seven grandchildren and 176 known great grandchildren.

"Mrs. Clara K. Bartlett of Tony, Alabama shared some of her research on the Howard background. She took the Benjamin Howard family back through Tennessee, North Carolina, Virginia and Maryland to the immigrant Matthew Howard...

"The oldest and one of three great grandchildren to attend the reunion was Mrs. Roxy Cook Casey of Fresno, California. She is 91..." Approximately 90 people from 13 states attended the reunion.

Margaret Adams wrote about the reunion, "This reunion was almost as exciting as the Douthit one in Clemmons. Seeing people for the 1st time is exciting. There I found all the cemeteries and finding the Howard one was doubly thrilling because I did not expect to find it and to find Mary Douthit's dates was too much at one time."

LOST FAMILY FOUND

Pearl and Gene Douthit of Lakewood, CO share the following touching account of finding lost family members.

"Thru the timeless efforts of Ruth Long and Davis Douthit of Columbus, Ohio we found part of our family we never knew existed. Thru correspondence, we made a visit to No. Georgia in October 1983 to meet our cousins. What a glorious reunion it was--and there was no doubt that we are "kin." They filled in all the details about my grandfather Davis Douthit, who had left the area at an early age and did not go back. He never told the family much about his life, and so, over the years we had lost all contact with anybody who may have known them. Thru the book, "Here Come the Douthits," the daughter of one of our cousins wrote to Davis Douthit, who in turn wrote to us. That is how we finally went to the towns of Tenna and Cisco in No. Georgia and met the Douthit family--Phyllis Douthit Campbell, Florence Douthitt Brackett and Maxine Douthit Kersey, also their cousin Paul Douthit and his father Tom Douthit. Maxine has a daughter Lisa (who) started the contact between families was also there. 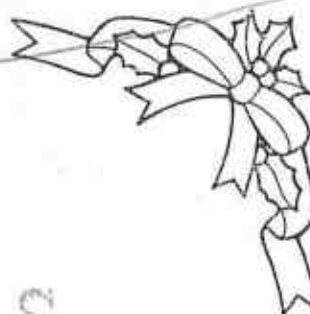
