WILL OF JOHN DOWNEY DATED 15 May 1826- ABBEVILLE DISTRICT SC:

In the name of God amen. I John Downey of the District of Abbeville in the State aforesaid, Planter, being in unusual health, and of sound and disposing mind and memory, but calling to mind the uncertainty of life, and being desirous to dispose of all such worldly estate it hath pleased God to bless me with, do make and ordain this my last Will in manner following , that is to say:

I will and desire that all my just debts and funeral expenses be punctually paid and discharged. I give and devise to my wife Sarah Downey all of my estate, as well real as personal, that I now have or may hereafter die possessed of, to her and her heirs and assigns forever, and to be disposed of as she may think proper by her will or otherwise.

And lastly, I do constitute and appoint my friends John Burton and Alexander C. Hamilton Executors of this my last will and testament by me heretofor made.

In testimony whereof I have here unto set my hand and affixed my seal this fifteenth day of May in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty-six and of the independence of the United States of America the fiftieth. (Signed) JOHN DOWNEY

To my grandchildren, the sons and daughters of Calvin DOWNEY and Phebe (Anderson) DOWNEY, vis: Reuben DOWNEY, Peyton DOWNEY, John DOWNEY, Samuel DOWNEY, Stephen DOWNEY, and Polly (DOWNEY) Hall, Betsy (DOWNEY) O'Neal, Ann DOWNEY, Sarah DOWNEY an equal part of my estate to that received by any one of my children, they to receive what would have come to their mother; To my grandchildren, Sarah White, Martha White, Milla White and Elizabeth White, the portion that would have come to their mother, if alive; To the children of my son, William Anderson, deceased, an equal share; To my sons, Stephen, Reubin, John, James and Jesse (Anderson) each an equal portion. ABSTRACTS OF GRANVILLE CO. NORTH CAROLINA, BOOKS 7 (1808-16) & 8 (1816-21):

Pgs. 45-47 March 14, 1809- Proved May Court 1809: Robert DOWNEY wills to my wife, Sally and my sons, James and John, my daughters, Polly, Nancy and Sally, and my youngest sons, Thomas and Mathew; All negroes to be kept together for the support of my wife and family, until my youngest child is of age; To my son, James, a horse and a negro, if my wife thinks wise; To my son, John, a horse and a negro, if my wife thinks wise; To my daughter, Polly,, when of age or married, a slave and a horse; To my daughter, Nancy, a slave and a horse; To my son, Thomas, when of age or married, a horse and a negro; To my son, Mathew, a horse and a negro; To my daughter, Sally, a negro and a horse; To each of my children a bed & furniture, a cow & calf and a ewe & lamb, when of age or married; When my youngest child is 18 years old or married, then I wish my property allotted to my wife, including the dwelling house, for her own use and sufficiency of furniture and other necessities, stock, negroes, tools, etc. After all bequests are made and delivered, and my children are all of age, all remaining property is to be divided to all my children and that loaned to my wife, sold and divided to all my children , after her death. Executors: My brother, James DOWNEY, and my friend, James W. Smith. Witnesses: Willis Lewis, Mary Lewis & Eliza Cobb. (Editor's note: Robert was a fairly young man with, at least 3 minor children.)

Pg. 563 December 28, 1814- Sale of property of Robert DOWNEY, deceased, by James DOWNEY, Executor. Mentions John; S.L. (Sally); James, Sr.; John; Thomas P; James, Jr.; and Polly Downey as buyers at the sale. (Editor's note: His wife, Sally was living & all children age 18+.)

Pgs. 211-216- August Term 1817, Granville Co. Court- Petition of James Downey and wife, Jenny (who was the widow and relict of Charles Mitchell, deceased, late of this Co.) against Thomas Mitchell, et Al. ... Charles Mitchell died possessed of land containing 770 acres in Granville Co, willing to his widow, Jenny (now Jenny DOWNEY, wife of James DOWNEY) and his son, Anson, all he possess. Now Jenny and her present husband, James Downey, request that her 1/3rds or dower in land be given to her, with dwelling house and all other houses; Anson Mitchell, lately deceased intestate and it is understood that the brothers and sisters of Charles Mitchell, deceased, are heirs to the real estate of said Charles and of Anson Mitchell, as collateral relations; (Editor's note: There is much more data on the siblings of Charles Mitchell and there heirs.)

Pgs. 314- 315 November Term 1819- Mary DOWNEY, widow of John DOWNEY, deceased, against Thomas P. DOWNEY, Administrator. (John) died intestate this year and she asks for a year's support from his estate. The Administrator sold the crop and other property of John, so the Court gave her money February 5, 1820.

Pgs. 330- 333- September 24, 1819- Account of the sales of property of John DOWNEY, deceased, by Thomas P. DOWNEY, Administrator; Buyers were Thomas P. DOWNEY, Sarah DOWNEY, Mathew H. DOWNEY, James Downey, Jr., Samuel DOWNEY and Mary DOWNEY, among others. (Editor's note: These may be the sons of Robert, above.)

U.S. TERRITORIAL PAPERS, VOL XVII ALABAMA TERRITORY:

Petition of Inhabitants of Clarke Co, Alabama Territory 24 June 1818. To His Excellency Governor Bibb: Sir, we the undersigned citizens of Clarke Co recommend Hezakiah Mitchins as a suitable person for the appointments of a County Constable and pray your excellency to give him the appointment. Signed... Calvin Downey ... (and 27 others.)

It is known that John Downey was also called John Downing. The siblings are known because of brother William's will which was signed and probated between 13 September 1780 and 30 November 1780.

Information from the Bayliss Family Biography - Handley Library, Winchester, Virginia. John Downing (Downey) received a grant of land from Lord Fairfax. Land Office, State Capitol, Richmond, Va. Northern Neck Book, page 27. —John Downey, founder of this family in America, was a Protestant from Northern Ireland; had three sons: Darby, John and William and one daughter, Mary James. She was referred to as "my sister, Mary James" in the will of William Downey, dated Sept. 13, 1780 - Will Book A, page 292, Shenandoah County Circuit Court, Woodstock, Va. Quoting from the Bayliss Family Biography: "He (Darby Downey) mentioned his first wife, Mary Arewine, four sons, John, William, Darby and Eleazor, and three daughter, Sarah, Elizabeth and Mary in his will" NOTE by E. Thompson: This information must have been taken from an old will of Darby's for his will which is recorded in Will Book R, page 382, Shenandoah County Circuit Court, Woodstock, Va. and the will was proven Nov. 12, 1832. In that will he names his third wife Sythia, the four sons, John, William, Darby, and Eleazor and four daughter - Sarah, Elizabeth, Mary, and Susannah. Susannah was the only child of Darby's second wife, Susannah David Downey, and the youngest child. The other seven children were sons and daughters of the first wife. No children by the third wife. — Darby Downey is shown as a Lieutenant of Virginia Militia in District 11. Twyman Williams Collection, Personal Papers, 21127, page 38. Shenandoah County, Minute Book, 1774-1780, Reel 52, page 42, Court Session of April 30, 1778, at page 44, records the swearing in of Darby Downey as a Captain in the Militia.
