THE DUNHAMS FROM WARREN COUNTY KENTUCKY

The DUNHAM name is often misspelled in many of the early records. There are many reasons for this, but namely due to the lack of education of most of the people in early times. Some of the spellings that may be found are DENHAM, DONHAM, DUNNAM, DUNUM, DUNHAM, DUNHOLM, and other variations. The most common spelling is DUNHAM although in more recent times, some of the various spellings have stuck and are associated with lines from various areas. The accepted spelling of my Mississippi line is DONHAM.

I am trying to trace the line back to New Jersey from Kentucky. This is where I think that they came from. I believe that they came up the Shanadoah Valley and through the Cumberland Gap to Kentucky in 1785/90 time. According to "THE WILDERNESS ROAD TO KENTUCKY" by William A. Pusey, by the spring of 1784 there were only 20,000 people in Kentucky. During 1784, 30,000 migrated to Kentucky by the Wilderness Road from Virginia and North Carolina. By the 1790 Census, there were over 75,000 people living in Kentucky. The 1800 Kentucky census lists over 220,000 people. The Warren County Kentucky DUNHAMS were among the group that followed the Wilderness Road to Kentucky. An alternate route was down the Ohio river, but it was not extensively used until after 1795.

The first record of this line that shows up in Kentucky is Dennis DUNHAM, believed to have

been born about 1750/55. An unclaimed letter in Lexington, Fayette County, Kentucky in 1790 was addressed to him with an address of "Near Lexington". He was found in the tax lists of Bourbon County, Kentucky in 1791 and January 1793.

Dennis received a 200 Acre land warrant in Logan County Kentucky. The land was surveyed on 9 August 1796. This area of Logan County became part of Warren County Kentucky on 1 March 1797. Dennis was found in Warren County Kentucky tax list on July 1797 as owning 200 Acres of land. He received another land warrant of 159 Acres that was surveyed on 15 August 1799 in book 2, page 168. This land was taxed to Dennis in 1799 (200A), 1802 (200A), 1803 (159A), The 159A was taxed to Jonathan DUNHAM on August 1804 and to John DUNHAM in 1805.

Could Dennis DUNHAM be of the same line as William DENHAM of Madison County, Kentucky? Marie M. Foster wrote the manuscript "The History of William DENHAM and His Family". A copy of this manuscript was found in the LDS Library in Salt Lake City.

The manuscript talks about a James DENHAM from Virginia that moved to New Jersey about 1752 and died there in 1760. His children moved to Kentucky and was there in the 1780's around Lexington, Fayette County. The Manuscript lists James's children as Margaret A. born c1739, John born 1741, James born 1743, William born 1745, and Obadiah born c1747. These

business meeting followed by informal sharing, and the fourth Tuesday of the month at 10:00 AM is a program meeting. Both meetings are held at the Carlsbad City Library.

We all found so many goodies at the Carlsbad City Library, that we spent part of our first day and all of the second day there.

On the morning of the third day, we went to the HUNTINGTON BEACH CENTRAL LIBRARY, located at 7111 Talbert Avenue (tele: 714-842-4481). The library is located on the corner of Talbert Avenue and Goldenwest Street. For those who are traveling south from the Los Angeles area on the San Diego (405) freeway, exit at Goldenwest Street. The hours of operation are Monday: 1:00 PM - 9:00 PM, Tuesday - Thursday: 9:00 AM - 9:00 PM, Friday & Saturday: 9:00 AM - 5:00 PM.

The Huntington Beach Central Library is a very impressively designed building, utilizing a natural park setting, with landscaped gardens and a beautiful waterway. If you plan to spend a day there, be sure to bring a picnic lunch and enjoy it at one of the picnic tables in the park.

Housed at the Huntington Beach Central Library is the genealogical collection of the Orange County Genealogical Society. We spent the whole day here, and could have easily spent another. The collection includes a large section of family histories, and has a good selection of books on each state, in addition to general genealogical reference books, a surname index file, and a periodical section. The collection also includes many of the beautiful nineteenth century atlas books, and a large number of census indexes, including many of the new 1860 and 1870 indexes.

And, speaking of census indexes, all three research facilities that we visited had a copy of the 1860 Census Index of New York - North. This index encompasses the following New York state counties: Clinton, Essex, Franklin, Fulton, Hamilton, Herkimer, Jefferson, Lewis, Montgomery, Oneida, Oswego, Saint Lawrence, Saratoga, Warren, and Washington. New York state has been divided into six sections for the purpose of the 1860 census index. The six index books will include the North, South, West, Brooklyn (including Kings and Queens counties), Buffalo (including all of Erie County), and New York City (Richmond, Bronx and New York counties). At this time, only the 1860 Census Index of New York - North has been published. Since a great deal of my research is in New York state, I for one, can't wait until the whole state is completed.

We stayed until the library closed at 9:00, and as all genealogists know, some of our biggest research discoveries.....the discoveries that will make or break a whole lineage..... are found just before the library closes. Jan made a big research discovery at 8:45, and she couldn't copy pages fast enough!

After a quick bite to eat, we started for home. Traffic after 9:00 PM in the Los Angeles area was very light, and we were surprised to find that it only took us about an hour to get home to Thousand Oaks from Huntington Beach. We had three very productive days, each of us making progress on our own individual research, and we thoroughly enjoyed visiting the three genealogical collections.

children were listed in a will of James who was born in England and died in NJ in 1760. I believe that Dennis and Timothy could be part of this family. Dennis was born about 1750/55 and is believed to have died before 1820 in Warren Co Kentucky. Another child could be Hardin DENHAM.

Obadiah DENHAM had a son named Timothy born about 1784. Dennis DUNHAM had brother named Timothy born about 1750/60.

The last child listed in his will was born in 1747 while he died in 1760. I believe that he did not list any children under 10 years of age in his will. He was probably in his thirties or forties when his last child, Obadiah, was listed in the will. This is why I do not believe that his last child was Obadiah. No children were listed being born from 1747 to his death in 1760. Both Dennis and Hardin were born in this time frame. Hardin was also listed as living in Warren County in the tax lists of 1817 through 1825 and he died in Madison County Kentucky. Another possibility is that Dennis and Timothy may have been the children of a brother of James DENHAM.

I have no proof that the DENHAM and DUNHAM families of Kentucky are the same lines, but a lot of circumstantial evidences leads one to believe that it is possible.

The first Warren County Kentucky Tax Record of July

1797 listed Dennis, John, and Timothy DUNHAM. A John DUNHAM was listed as an Ensign in the 1st Division, 2nd Brigade, 25th Regiment of Warren County Kentucky "Corn Stalk" militia on 1 November 1797. A Timothy DUNHAM was listed in the same unit on 19 July 1805. I am still trying to sort out the early years in Warren County, Kentucky as to who was the child or brother of whom. This DUNHAM line had all moved or died off from Warren County, Kentucky by the mid 1800's. They had populated the county for about 50-60 years. The paragraphs below are what I believe to be true at present with the information that I have.

The numbering system that I used is that for each digit added, it means another generation. The number 111, means that this is the third generation in the line and that his fathers number would be 11. His children's numbers would be 111X. X represents the sequence of the child in the family. The first child would be 1111, the second child would be 1112, the third child would be 1113 and so on. A number as 1243 would indicate the fourth generation (four digits) and the number 3 would indicate that this was the third child in the family of 124. Only the DUNHAMS are numbered. No attempt has been made to trace the auxiliary lines. I do have some information on some of the auxiliary lines but no attempt was made here to list them. The numbering scheme would be continued to other lines by adding a decimal and

continuing. A * indicated my direct line. I am still searching....

FIRST GENERATION

*(1) Dennis DUNHAM, b 1750/60 was married to Dorothy. I think that his children were John (11) born about 1774, Jonathan (12) born 1781, Phebe (13) born about 1787, Dennis (14) born about 1790, and Effie (15) born about 1797.

(2) Timothy, b 1750/60; was probably Dennis's brother. Timothy's wife is unknown. A Timothy DUNHAM was listed in the Warren County, Kentucky tax lists for the years 1797 through 1826. I believe that his children were Timothy (21), b c1775; Dorothy (22), b c1785; and Lamuel (23), b 1760/80. Timothy (21) and what is believed to be his eldest son, Dennis (213), shows up in the 1830 Census for Lafayette County, Missouri. A Timothy DUNHAM is listed in the Warren County, Kentucky tax lists for the years of 1797 to 1826.

SECOND GENERATION

(11) John DUNHAM was born c1774, and died c1834. His wife was Mary HUDSOE. A John DUNHAM was listed in the Warren County Tax lists from 1797 to 1831. His land settlement record was found in the Warren County court land records dated 23 Oct 1834. Their children were Ira (111), b 1802; Elizabeth (112), b c1803; Jonathan H. (113), b 1807; John S. (114), b 13 Sep 1809; Mahulda (115), b 1813;

Dorathy (116), b c1812; Agatha (117), b c1814; William Harrison (118), b c1816; Oliver P. (119), b c1818; Mary Ann (11A), b 1823; and Strangeman Stanley (11B), b 20 July 1825. Jonathan H. and William Harrison is listed in the 1840 Rives Co (Henry Co Oct 1841) Missouri. Ira (111) moved from Warren County, Kentucky to Johnson County, Missouri before 1850.

*(12) Jonathan DONHAM was born in Virginia in 1781. His wife was Milbery PHILIPS. She was of Welsh descent and came from Richmond, Virginia. Phillips county Arkansas was named after Milbery's brother, Silvanus. Jonathan was a Justice of the Peace in Yallobusha County, Mississippi in 1841. They were married in Warren County, Kentucky on 1 Oct 1799. Their children were Sallie (121), b c1800; William (122), b 1803; John (123), b 1 Nov 1805; Polly (124), b c1810; Charity (125), b c1812; Nancy (126), b c1815; Zachariah (127), b c1820; Isaac (128), b 1823; Carrel (129), b c1824; James (12A), b c1825; Elizabeth (Bettie) (12B), b 1826; and Benjamin F. (12C), b 1830. Jonathan moved to Warren County, Tennessee for about ten years, (c1805-1815) then on to Shelby County (1820) and Fayette County, (1830) Alabama. He is found in Yalobusha County, Mississippi in 1835 and in Lafayette County along with Pontotoc County. He died at his son's, John, home in Lafayette County, Mississippi in 1858. Most of his children moved to Arkansas. William stayed in Alabama and raised his family in Marion County.

(13) Phebe DUNHAM was born 1787 and married William HIGGINS on 25 May 1807 in Warren County, Kentucky.

(14) Dennis DUNHAM was born 1790/95 and married Dolly HUDSPETH on 6 Feb 1815 in Warren County, Kentucky. He was found in Lawrence County, Arkansas in 1830 and 2 males under 5, 2 males 5-10, 1 male 10-15, 1 male 30-40 (Dennis), 1 female 10-15, 1 female 15-20, 1 female 20-30 (wife, Dolly). He was found in White County, Arkansas in 1840 with 1 male 5-10, 1 male 15-20, and 1 male 40-50 (Dennis). No females were listed.

(15) Effie DUNHAM was born 1795/1800 and married Joseph SKAGGS on 1 August 1915 in Warren County, Kentucky.

(21) Timothy DUNHAM was born c1775 and married Mary HARRIS. A Timothy was listed as an Ensign in the Warren County "Corn Stalk" Militia 25th Regiment on 19 July 1806. I believe that some, but not all, of his children were Sally (211), b c1803; Susan (212), b 9 July 1805; Dennis (213), b 1809; and James S. H. (214), b c1812. Timothy moved to Lafayette County, Missouri with his family before 1830. The 1830 Lafayette County census shows the following people living in his home. One male 50-60 years (Timothy), one male 20-30 years, one male 15-20 years, one female 40-50 years (Mary, his wife) one female 20-30 years and two females 10-15 years. It is believed that the

one male 20-30 and one female 20-30 could have been a married child (James S. H.?) with his wife living in the home. His son Dennis (213) was listed as living alone and between the age of 20-30 years.

(22) Dorathy DUNHAM, b c1785; married James SKAGGS on 27 July 1811 in Warren County, Kentucky.

(23) Lamuel DUNHAM, b1760/80, is listed as giving consent in the marriage record of David Skaggs and Hannah Dunham in Warren County, Kentucky in 1801. A Timothy DUNHAM was listed in the same record for security bond. His children were Hannah (231), b c1780. One of his descendants was probably Lemuel P.(23X1), b 1836 in Kentucky; and shows up in the Warren County, Kentucky 1850 Census as an orphan living with Jeremiah THOMAS, and in Mississippi County, Missouri in 1880.

THIRD GENERATION

(111) Ira DUNHAM was born 1802 in Warren County, Kentucky and shows up in the tax records in 1824 through 1837. In the 1830 Census, he is in Warren County, Kentucky. He is found in Johnson County, Missouri in 1850; and Henry County, Missouri in 1860. He was living with his son, Winfield Scott, in the 1870 Henry County, Missouri census. Ira's wife was Elizabeth born in Kentucky c1802. Their children were John A. (1111), b 1827; Ira W. (1112), b 1828; Armistead J. (1113), b 2 Jan 1831; Joseph H. (1114), b 1834; Levi P. (1115),

b 1836; James L. (1116), b 1839; William V. (1117), b c1842; Mary J. (1118), b c1845; and Winfield Scott (1119), b 1848. All are believed to have been born in Warren County, Kentucky.

(112) Elizabeth DUNHAM, b c1802 in Warren County, Kentucky married John WOLF c1820 in Warren County, Kentucky.

(113) Jonathan H. DUNHAM, b 1807 in Warren County, Kentucky is listed in the Warren County, Kentucky Tax lists in 1828 and 1829. The 1830 census of Warren County, Kentucky lists him. He first sold land in Henry County in Book D, Page 230 during the 1833/36 time. He is found in Rives County (Renamed Henry Co in Oct 1841) Missouri in 1840, and Henry county in 1850, 1860, and 1870. Jonathan married Isabella M. HARRIS on 29 January 1827 in Warren County, Kentucky. They had the following Children: John O. (1131), b 1834; Martha J. (1132), b 1837; Sarah E. (1133), b 1838; William J. (1134), b 1840; Frances G. (1135), b 1841; Benjamin F. (1136), b 1845; Jonathan H. (1137), b 1847; and Louisa (1138), b 1849.

(114) John S. DUNHAM, b 13 Sep 1809 in Warren County, Kentucky is listed in the Warren County, Kentucky tax list from 1833 through 1838. He married Susan Ann Skaggs (b 13 Sep 1819) on 28 Jan 1839 in Warren County,

Kentucky. He died on 6 July 1888 and is buried in the Old Union Baptist Church Cemetary in Warren County. They had at least two children; William H., (1141) b 22 Apr 1840, d 23 Sep 1866; and Eugene U., (1142) b 23 Apr 1845, d 26 Jul 1865.

(115) Mahulda DUNHAM (Hulda), b 1813 in Warren County, Kentucky is not believed to have married. She was living with her mother, Mary, in the 1850 Warren County, Kentucky census. She died before 1886.

(116) Dorathy DUNHAM, b c1812 in Warren County, Kentucky married Mr. ELLISON c1830.

(117) Agatha DUNHAM, b c1814 in Warren County, Kentucky married Mr. HANCOCK on 4 November 1897 in Saline County, Arkansas.

(118) William Harrison DUNHAM, b c1816 in Warren County, Kentucky went with his brother, Jonathan H. to Missouri and was found in the 1840 Rives County (Renamed Henry Co Oct 1841). He was listed in the court record that sold his fathers estate on 23 Oct 1834.

(119) Olliver P. DUNHAM, b c1818 in Warren County, Kentucky was listed in the court record that sold his father estate on 23 Oct 1834.

(11A) Mary Ann DUNHAM, b 1823 in Warren County, Kentucky was listed in the court record that sold her fathers estate on 23 Oct 1834.

(11B) Strangeman Stanley DUNHAM, b 20 July 1825 in Warren County, Kentucky married Willie J. WILLOUGHBY (b 18 Nov 1836, d 25 Nov 1899) in Warren County Kentucky on 9 Oct 1862. He moved to Allen County, Kentucky in 1866. He died on 19 November 1888 in Allen County and is burried in Harmony Church Cemetary of Allen County. He was a soldier in Company D 52nd Kentucky mounted Infantry in 1864. They had the following Children: Thomas P. (11B1), b 23 Aug 1863; Mary R. (11B2), b c1865; Virginia E. (11B3), b c1867; Elizabeth (11B4), b c1870; Agnes D. (11B5), b c1872; Josephine (11B6), b c1874; Jonny M. (11B7), b c1876; Lourany C. (11B8), b 1878; and John W. D. (11B9), b c1880.

(121) Sallie DONHAM, b c1800 Warren County, Kentucky married John McGUIRE c1820 in Alabama. They had two sons before John died. She remarried a Mr. Grisam. One son became a minister.

(122) William DONHAM, b c1803 in Warren County, Kentucky and can be found in the Marion County, Alabama censuses in 1830, 1850, and 1870. He is burried in Bull Mountain Cemetary, Marrion County, Alabama. He married Polly McGUIRE in Alabama c1825. They

had the following children in Marion County, Alabama: John (1221), b 1827; Marguerett (1222), b c1830; Mubary Parilee (1223), b c1831; Sarah Adoline (1224), b 1833; Polly E. (1225), b 1835; Zilpha Lieurany (1226), b 1837; Rebecca Kiziah (1227), b 1839 in Mississippi; William J. (1228), b 1841; James K. Polk (1229), b 1843; Argena Arvie (122A), b 1848; and Eliza (122B), b 1850.

(123) John DONHAM, b 1 Nov 1805 in Warren County, Tennessee and married Elizabeth ODAM c1825 probably in Slesby County, Alabama. John can be found in the 1830 Marion County, Alabama census, 1840 Yalobusha County, Mississippi census, 1860 Lafayette Co, Mississippi Census. He was a charter member of the Primitive Baptist Church of Water Valley, Mississippi. In 1880 he was living with his son, Joab, in Grant County, Arkansas. John and Elizabeth had the following children: James F. (1231), b 1834; Benjamin (1232), b 1837; William Carrel (Coon) (1233), b 1838; Louisiana (1234), b 1839; John Henry (1235), b 1842; Frnacis H. (1236), b 1845; Mary (1237), b 1845; George W. (1238), b 1847; Nancy Lumira (Nannie) (1239), b 15 Apr 1849, d 2 Feb 1929; Joab W. (123A), b 1851; Susan (123B), b 1853; Thomas (123C), b 25 Sep 1855; and Martha Missouri (Mattie) (123D), b 1858.

(124) Polly DONHAM, b c1810 in Warren County, Tennessee and married Sam TAYLOR c1830 probably in Shelby County, Alabama. They had the following children: George,

Summer was sometimes as destructive as winter. I've heard Mother tell of a summer when their crops looked so nice, then one day the grasshoppers came in such hordes that it almost appeared like a cloud over the sun and when they had finished there was not one blade of corn, nor grass, nor even a leaf on a tree. After the slaughter of the buffalo for the hides, there appeared many bones on the prairies which had a sale value of \$1.25 per wagon load and grandfather ranged as far as Dodge City and Medicine Lodge in collecting and selling bones when he could not have other work.

Modes of transportation change and social customs vary from time to time but people have always found a way to meet other people and this happened to my folks, who were married in Great Bend in 1892. I came along the next year with the panic. JESS RUSSELL was six years old. ELLA got here a year and a half later and FLOYD in 1897.

JESS RUSSELL and MINNIE BASE were married in 1909 and had four sons and a daughter. JESS passed away in Cimarron October 1960. ELLA and PETE REMPEL were married in 1915 and lived in El Paso and Albuquerque, where ELLA still lives. PETE passed away in 1953, They have three daughters and one son. FLOYD and FRANCES PRICE were married 1923 and he practiced law in Ashland where he passed away August 1952, leaving a daughter and two sons.

DOYNE DURHAM and I were married August, 1915. We had a son, VAUGHN. Doyne passed away November, 1918. I spent three years teaching school in and near St. John and went to work in St. John National Bank in 1919. GERTRUDE MISNER and I were married December 1921. We came to Wyoming in 1926 and have had a good life on a cattle ranch, and since 1950, in Wheatland. Gertrude was a music teacher in St. John schools 1919 and 1920. Her home was Dodge City.

VAUGHN has a degree in engineering from Wyoming University and is employed as an engineer by the Federal Bureau of Roads with headquarters in Denver. He spent three and a half years in the Air Corps, 1942-1945. He has three sons and one daughter.

I probably have written much more than you will be able to use or maybe not what you wanted, but some or much can be cut out. Other information possibly can be furnished if necessary or advisable. Kindly feel free to delete any part you choose.

If convenient, I should be glad to see it in final form before it is printed if you make any changes of significance. If not, go ahead as you decide. I shall be anxious to see the completed history as I'm sure many will have interesting contributions. It has been interesting to live while I have and to know the people I know.

(125) Charity DONHAM, b c1812 in Warren County, Tennessee and married Pleasant JOHNSON c1835 probably in Shelby County, Alabama. They had the following children: Eveline, Price, William, Green, Jonathan, John, Bettie, Sallie, Nancy, and Zura. Most were born in Mississippi.

(126) Nancy DONHAM, b c1815 is believed to have been born in Warren County, Tennessee, but she could have been born in Alabama. She married Kiar COCHRAN c1835 probably in Shelby County, Alabama. They had the following children: Claricy, Jane, Milbra, John Jonathan, and Martha. Most were born in Mississippi.

(127) Zachariah DONHAM, b c1820 in Tennessee or Alabama and married Polly ODAM c1840 in Alabama or Mississippi. It was probably in Mississippi. He died in Jefferson County, Arkansas in 1865. The children were Marion (1271), Martin (1272), Nancy (1273), John (1274), Mary (1275), Zachariah (1276), Isabell (1277), George (1278), and Julia (1279). All were born in Mississippi.

(128) Isaac DONHAM, b 1823 in Shelby County, Alabama. He married Eliza BARTON probably in Mississippi. They are in the 1850 Yalobusha county, Mississippi Census. Their children were Francis (1281), b 1847; William (1282), b 1849; Maggie (1283), b c1851; John

(1284), c1853; Zachariah (1285), b c1855; Elizabeth (1286), b c1858; Mary (1287), b c1868; and Annie (1288), b c1862.

(129) Carrel DONHAM, b 1824 in Alabama. He died in Mississippi.

(12A) James DONHAM, b c1825 in Alabama and he married Sarah JOHNSON in Yalobusha County, Mississippi March 1847. He had a short leg with a small foot. He lived in IZARD County, Arkansas and Hill County, Texas. Two of their children were Thomas (12A1), and Sallie (12A2).

(12B) Elizabeth (Bettie) DONHAM, b c1826 in Fayette County, Alabama married Mr. SEWELL c1845 probably in Yalobusha County, Mississippi. She remarried a Mr. Hollinsworth and had one child.

*(12C) Benjamin F. DONHAM, b 1830 in Fayette County, Alabama. He can be found in the 1850 Pontotoc County, Mississippi; 1870 Calhoun County, Mississippi; and 1880 Yalobusha county, Mississippi censuses. He married Eliza J. GODFREY (b c1830, d c1858) in Itawamba County, Mississippi on 6 June 1852. No children are known. He married Lucretia Jane SEAMANS (b 1838) c1860 in Mississippi. The children were Mary Elizabeth (Molly) (12C1), (b 1862, d Nov 1939); and Lou Ella (Ellen) (12C2), (b Jun 1871, d Nov 1939).

(211) Sally DUNHAM was born in Warren County, Kentucky c1803. She married William Nash Wade

In book E No 1 page 147 (1855/59) he sold land to George Carlyle.

(231) Hannah DUNHAM married David SKAGGS on 1 January 1801 in Warren County, Kentucky. A Lemuel DUNHAM gave consent and Timothy DUNHAM posted security bond.

(1111) John A. DUNHAM was born was born in Warren County, Kentucky in 1827 and moved with his father, Ira to Johnson County, Missouri before 1850. He shows up in the 1850 Johnson County, Missouri census living with James Douglas believed to be the father of his wife, Mary A. She was born in 1824 in Missouri.
