The foregoing data, back to beginning was in a report (copy of which Emily J. Johnson,  
Blacksburg, Va., has) by C.H. Dey Oregon City, Ore. from the notes of J. Warren Dey. One of these men was  
the son of James Hance Dye. Warren Dey, states in his report, which was made in 1925  
(of the descendants)  
that he has records of following children of John & Anne. William, Joseph, James, John (or John), etc.

The Dey Genealogical material, collected by J. Warren Dey was turned over to the  
New York Historical Society, by his brother, Richard H. Dey.

at Pn. Wm Cty, Court House of the Estate of Daniel Dye, but there was a Vincent Dye, in the  
County, who had a son Daniel so it is not certain to which it belonged.  
The Estate was settled in 1832.

Emily has a copy of the Will of John Dye, Jr. which was presented to  
H. Wm County Court on May 7, 1798. Will was witnessed by Wm Hixon  
and Wm Dye. The will named his five children.

The requests to James, John and Daniel to be paid to them  
as they became of age.

Ann Hixon Johnson. Daughter of Rev. Johnson & Lydia Hixon Johnson.  
 (She was also called Nancy) She was born in 1797. Died Sept. 21, 1861.

They lived at Union Mills, Fairfax County,  
 where they <sup>had</sup> a number of mills, a saw mill,  
 a carding and fullering mill, a grist mill  
 and a General mill. All powered by water.  
 John was first a Lieutenant, then a Captain,  
 a Major and a Lieut. Colonel in the  
 Virginia Militia. The original certificates  
 commission him are in the Gulick and  
 Johnson files.

There is a large collection of original letters, documents  
 bills, etc. in the Gulick files, which come down  
 from our great grandmother, Ann Hixon Dye.

H-82-1 Albert Johnson Dye.  
(Un-married)

Born 2 p.m. May 24, 1813. He moved Independence County, Arkansas there on Nov. 16, 1837, near Batesville. There are a number of letters from him to his mother and other members of his family. In one he speaks of building a mill and has the water wheel about finished.

The last letter is dated July 31, 1839 and refers of attending a Methodist Camp Meeting. The preacher put him on list as convert and refused to remove his name. He was a Baptist. There is a record that he died in 1876, but a letter from a member of Henry Clay Dye's family stated that he disappeared and no one knew what became of him.

Born Tuesday, Jan. 24, 1815. Died in 1875. He was born at Clover Hill Farm, Johnson home, near Manassas, Va. He left Union Mills, to go to

Batesville, Ark., where A. J. Dye had moved. In a letter, dated Oct. 30 at Versailles, Ind., to his mother, he tells of his trip by wagon and arrival at Versailles on Oct. 20 in the forenoon and the birth of his daughter, Margaret Virginia, the following morning at the home of his Cousin, John D. Pidmore.

K-9-b-2 Christopher Columbus. Born Dec. 9, 1843. Died shortly after Aug. 22, 1865

in Galveston, Tex. where went shortly after the Civil War  
to die of Yellow Fever. There is a letter, dated Aug. 7, 1865,  
to his mother saying there was yellow fever in Galveston.  
There is also a note, dated Aug. 22, 1865, to Huldah Dye  
from Mr. Shropshire telling her Columbus  
had yellow fever and that he had seen him at 11 A.M.  
that morning and he was doing well, and that  
he had also talked to his doctor who said Columbus  
was out of danger. Apparently he died shortly thereafter.
