The following record is believed to be a correct listing of our branch of the Dye family from the present back to the first arrival, Jans Lorenszen Duyts, from Denmark, in 1639.

The foregoing data, back to beginning was in a report (copy of which Emily J. Johnson, Manassas, Va., has) by C.H. Dye, Oregon City, Ore. from the notes of J. Warren Dye. One of these men was the son of James Hance Dye. Warren Dye, states in his report, which was made in 1905 that he has record of following children of John & Anne. William, Joseph, James, & John (the youngest)

The Dye Genealogical material, collected by J. Warren Dye was turned over to the New York Historical Society, by his brother, Richard H. Dye.

About 1770 the Dye's came to Virginia from New Jersey. It is believed from Middlesex County. They settled in Prince William County. They came together with the Hixons and Johnsons.

Copy of a letter from John Hixon Dye to him. There is an Inventory and Appraisement at Pr. Will Cty. Court House of the Estate of Daniel Dye, but there was a Vincent Dye, in the County, who had a son Daniel so it is not certain to which it belonged. The Estate was settled in 1832.

Emily has a copy of the Will of John Dye, Jr. which was presented to H. Will County Court on May 7, 1798. Will was witnessed by Wm Hixon and Wm Dye. The will named his five children.

The bequests to James, John and Daniel to be paid to them as they became of age.

Ann Hixon Johnson. Daughter of Ruf. Johnson & Lydia Hixon Johnson.
 (She was also called Nancy) She was born in 1797. Died Sept. 21, 1861.

They lived at Union Mills, Fairfax County where they ^{had} a number of mills, a saw mill, a carding and fulling mill, a grist mill and a General mill. All powered by water. John was first a lieutenant, then a Captain, a Major and a Lieut. Colonel in the Virginia Militia. The original Certificate-Commission him are in the Gulick and Johnson files. There is a large collection of original letters, documents, bills, etc. in the Gulick files, which came down from our great grandmother, Ann Hixon Dye.

Born 2 p.m. May 24, 1813 He moved Independence County, ^{Arkansas} Arrived there on Nov. 16, 1837, near Batesville. There are a number of letters from him to his mother and other members of his family. In one he speaks of building a mill and had the water wheel about finished.

The last letter is dated July 31, 1839 and tells of attending a Methodist Camp Meeting. The preacher put him on list as convert and refused to remove his name. He was a Baptist. There is a record that he died in 1876, but a letter from a member of Henry Clay Dye's family stated that he disappeared and no one knew what became of him.

Born Tuesday, Jan. 24, 1815. Died in 1875. He was born at Clover Hill Farm, Johnson home, near Manassas, Va. He left Union Mills, to go to Batesville, Ark., where H. J. Dye had moved. In a letter, dated Oct. 30 at Versailles, Ind., to his mother, he tells of his trip by wagon and arrival at Versailles on Oct. 20 in the forenoon and the birth of his daughter, Margaret Virginia, the following morning at the home of his cousin, John D. Fildmore.

had yellow fever and that he had seen him at home
that morning and he was doing well, and that he
had also talked to his doctor who said Columbus
was out of danger. Apparently he died shortly after.
