

EDICK HISTORY

The Edic, Edick, Edich, Edict, Editch and Ittig are supposed to have been spelled 41 different ways

They originally migrated from a' colonie of Palatinate, a district west of the Rhine River in southwest Germany, Bavarian until 1945. It became a District of 2111 sqare miles with a population of 1,047,844 of Rhineland Palatine in 1946

They migrated mostly to New York State, made settlements of German Flatts, Fort Herkemer, Columbia, Edicks, Dennisions Corners, Tomkins, Palatine, Sanford, Dickinsons Station. The town of Edicks is about 17 miles southeast of Utica, it is shown on Rain. McNaly Road Atlas.

The earliest settlement I have found was in Herkemer Co. N.Y., German Flatts (Town of Dennisions Corners And Pains Hollow), first settlements were made by a colonie of Palatines in 1722, who had located on the Hudson, among the early settlers were a family of Editch.

Our line of Edicks migrated from around Herkemer Co. N.Y. George Edic and brother Christopher Edic came down the Erie Canal and across Lake Erie on a Barge and settled in Guaga Co. at or near Russel Ohio in 1833. Just how many of their family came with them + have not been able to prove so far. George Andrew Edick the third son of George Edic came at that time, and probably most of their families came at that time but am unable to prove.

Christopher was postmaster at Russel Ohio for several years and latter moved to Willoughby Ohio. George Edic spent two years in Chicago and returned to Ohio.

Jacob C. Edick married Martha VanValkenburg, they had three children, Edgar Jacob, Amos Delman and Martha Brestine who was born at North Newbury Ohio 1861 was married at E. Saginaw Michigan in 1880 to Thomas Kehoe, she died in 1892.

George Andrew Edick married Laura VanValkenburg, she was a sister to Charlie VanValkenburgs father, Charlie came to Michigan, settled one mile north of Gladwin. Laura VanValkenburg Edick died in Ohio leaving 6 children.

George Andrew Edick married a second wife Charlotte Ladow, they had two children.

Thomas George Edick married Mary Logan who was an adopted child of John Logan, she was born Susan Pugsley, her mother when she was a baby, they had a large Family and her father adopted her to John Logan, Logans had a Susan so they renamed her Mary.

George Andrew run a dairy farm near Chagrin Falls Ohio.

Thomas George Edick went to school in Ohio and latter taught school in Ohio.

Some of George Edics decendents moved to Michigan, George Andrew Edick and Thomas George Edick and family came to Gladwin Co. Michigan in 1876.

Thomas George and sister Eunice who married John Weir were the only ones of George Andrews first family to stay in Gladwin Co. Maggie married Alonzo Jacobs and Harry her brother (single) of George Andrews second family remained in Gladwin.

Ed and Amos Edick must have come to Gladwin before 1776, as the tax payers of section 8 Gladwin Township bought one acre of land for a site for Section 8 School from Amos Edick in 1775, in the S.E. $\frac{1}{4}$ of the N.W. $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 8, upon which a log schoolhouse was built by Daniel Webster.

When they first came to Gladwin Co., George Andrew and Charlotte Edick lived in a log house, and Thomas George and Mary Edick lived in a log house near by On now Lechner Rd. in S $\frac{1}{2}$ of the S.W. $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 4 Gladwin Township Near John Weir Farm.

Thomas George settled on the S $\frac{1}{2}$ of the S.W. $\frac{1}{4}$ of section 8 Gladwin Township. He traded farms with Gibb Sherman Then traded back in 2 years.

George Andrew lived on the S.W. $\frac{1}{4}$ of the N.W. $\frac{1}{4}$ of section 8 Gladwin Township.

George Andrew run a milk route from his farm E-N-E-S thru McClure W. to Dassay Rd. S. by Longs farm W. to Riley Hill S to Milk Cannery at Foundry Corners.

secure death, Agreeable to the statement of several, John Klepsadd e
and Jacob Ittig - Edick in English - were going from Herkimer to a
place called the Long Bridge" after horses, when they were suprised
by the enemy and both scalped. This is no doubt the same man -
John Docstader, Corroborated by Saura Munn and Jacob Secknor.

Dear Mrs. House,

Will try and answer your question in regard to the two Jacob Ittigs in the Revolution. Jacob Ittig a Revolutionary Soldier, settled after the war in the Town of Deerfield, outside Utica and raised a family of ten children.

Jacob Ittig (Edic), born 1755, died Feb. 23, 18²⁰ age 65 yr. 7 mo., he married Elizabeth Weaver, born Aug. 2, 1760 at Stone Arabia, died Sept. 12, 1847. She was the daughter of George J. Weaver and Anna Elizabeth DuBois. They are buried in the Maynard Cemetery, on the River Rd., Utica to Rome, N.Y.

There is an Edic Book, compiled by members of the family, in the Genealogy Department at the Utica Public Library. It is taken from the Jacob Ittig Bible and only goes back to Jacob. At present time I cannot give you any more information on Jacob due to lost and burned records prior to 1760.

Jacob C. Edick, your ancestor, of Spinnerville, N.Y., said to be the son of Captain Michael Ittig. While I have birth records of some of Michaels children, I cannot find Jacob C. record.

Ittig, Michael, of town of German Flatts. Eldest son, Frederick to be given as birthright \$5.00 and his choice horse or mare out of the whole number of my horses. 3 sons, Frederick, George, Michael, land which I executed by deed unto them August 12, 1800, 3 daughters (not named), separate deeds for land, beloved wife (not named). Michael to provide wife (his mother) with a sufficiency of flour meal, wine, rum, tea and all such other articles and provisions necessary for her own maintenance and I servant maid. Witnesses: James Lawler (?), Henry Hess and Jacob Ittick. Execs.: Friends, Jacob G. Wheeler, Peter M. Myers, of the Town

of Herkimer, Will made November 28, 1805, recorded April 30, 1806.

I just cannot understand why Jacob C. is not mentioned in any of these deeds or will if he is Michaels son, maybe it will straighten out someday.

If you have anything that helps on Jacob C., would you please let me know. As of now I guess that Jacob and Jacob C. are nothing closer than cousins.
