Harmon Eakle signed his name on two documents: a deed and his marriage contract with Rachel Salady. Using these signatures, we can prove the Johann Herman Ekell on the oaths and passenger lists in Pennsylvania in 1741 is the same man who died in Washington County, Maryland in 1799.

Note especially the differences between the way Herman formed his "e" and "a" in Herman and the "k" in Ekell.



Early Settlement of Quittopahilla

By I. DANIEL RUPP

Reformed Church Messenger (1872)

As early as 1723, some Germans from Schoharie, New York, settled on and along Tulpehocken Creek. Six years afterwards, 1729, other Germans, direct from Europe, began a settlement on the Quittopahilla Creek, at and around the present site of the town of Lebanon. Among the first settlers were Michael Burst, George Steitz, Anastasius Uhler, Jacob Steiner, George Berger, Henry Nauman, John Mish, Michael Boor, Herman Egel, George Adam Weidel. Most of these were Squatters on Indian lands. The land south of the Blue Mountain was only purchased in 1732, from the Indians, by Thomas Penn, Proprietary of Pennsylvania.

These all were members of the congregation at Quittopahilla, who, with female members, mer to worship God in the Berg-Kirche, built in 1733. The house of worship was jointly owned by the Lutherans and the German Reformed. The first Lutheran pastor was the Rev. Johan Casper Stoever, who came from Germany to Pennsylvania, 1728. The Rev. Conrad Templeman had charge of the German Reformed congregation at Berg-Kirch, from 1745 to 1760, when, as it appears from the minutes of Coetus, he gave up Berg-Kirch: "Templeman is stone blind; and' preaches at the present time, Oct. 1760,

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The Pennsylvania section of the International Genealogical Index (IGI) for Harmon Eakle actually includes three entries—all of them accepted by the computer as different. "Joh." is a standard church-register abbreviation for Johann/Johannes. Note that there is an alphabetical space between the Joh. entry and the other two. Sometimes this gap will be several frames long.

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
Note also that the computer does not differentiate between two names for the same church--Hill Lutheran and Quitapohila Hill are one and the same church. The C in the source code means "Christening entry" and the M means "marriage entry." These are copied directly from the church record.

The warrants, surveys, and patents for Pennsylvania have all been microfilmed and are available at the state archives in Harrisburg or through the Genealogical Library of the LDS Church and its branches. The warrant register is a partial index to all three classes of records. It lists in alphabetical sequence by county the persons who submitted warrants for surveys to be made. It does not index neighbors who border the land surveyed or the person who gets the patent if different from the warrantee.

Herman Ekell received warrant No. 127 for 150 acres of land in Lebanon Township, Lancaster County, Pennsylvania 24 September 1748. The survey was returned 26 January 1763 with 122.12 acres only (Vol C50, page 133, GS #1,004,888).

The patent was recorded in Vol. AA8, page 28. The copy on microfilm is almost illegible due to ink bleed picked up by the camera. A copy of the original manuscript has been ordered from the state archives in Harrisburg.

Not far from the Ekell survey were two for Herman Ohrendorff, who is probably related to Christian, although no one seems to have tracked that relationship.

Christian Ohrendorff also had 218 acres adjoining Herman Ekell in Lebanon Township; the original warrant is reproduced in From Mill Wheel to Plowshare: The Story of the Contribution of the Christian Orndorff Family to the Social and Industrial History of the United States by Julia A. Drake and James Ridgely Orndorff (Cedar Rapids, Ia.: The Torch Press, 1967) showing Herman Ekell as a neighbor. No entry for this land is listed in the Warrant Register.

Since the god parents were responsible for the spiritual, moral, and physical upbringing of the child if anything happened to the parents, those named to such a commitment were usually related to the family or intimate friends. That the increase of population was constant, will appear on comparing the names of the taxables of the above list with the

Harmon Eakle and his sons Christian and Henry served on the Washington County Committee of Observation. The minutes for this committee have been published in Volumes 21, 44, 45, 53 of Maryland Archives. Christian was commissioned a 1st Lt. and assigned a company of militia men as part of the Maryland forces. Philip Eckle served in Christian's unit according to the pension application he later filed in Pendleton County, Virginia.

Philip Eckle, in his application for a Revolutionary War pension, stated that the only person who could verify his service was Christian Eckle his nephew. Christian was interviewed in Pendleton County, Virginia was the son of Christian, Philip's brother. He married Jane Cook (Koch) 20 October 1800 and his father Christian Ekell was his bondsman. We can document his receipt of 160 acres in Augusta County, Virginia from the estate of his father Christian Eakle probated 23 March In 1812 he sold this land to Henry 1802. Eakle of Augusta County and moved to Pendleton County. A subsequent entry in the Augusta tax rolls stated "location unknown."

Philip had two nephews named Christian -one the son of his brother Christian; one the son of his brother Henry. Henry's son remained in Maryland and died there in 1861. He is buried in the Salem Lutheran Churchyard, Bakersville, MD, which overlooks Henry's land. This Christian never had any contact with Pendleton County, Virginia.

This pension proves that the unknown brother in the family compiled by Cousin Edith Folsom Hatch in the 1930's was Philip.

The pension application also sets this Philip apart as different from the Philip Eakle who moved from Berks County, Pennsylvania into Augusta County, Virginia and left a large family of boys with names similar to those in the Christian Eakle family. [More on the Berks County Philip Eakle/Eckel will be printed in a forth coming issue of Ekell Archives.]

Harmon Eakle also had a son named Harmon who went to Augusta County, Virginia sometime before the American Revolution began. Harmon Eakle/Eagle was a member of the Illinois Regiment led by George Rogers Clark. [More on this Harmon in a subsequent issue of Ekell Archives as well.]

Harmon safeguarded his property for his own children by providing for Rachel, his second wife, with this pre-nuptial agreement. Because it is a property document, it is recorded among deeds rather than in the marriage register.

Harmon used the legal device of 1 Shilling to safeguard any challenge to his will by his older children. This device is also an indication that he had already provided for his older children. Both Christian and Henry had substantial holdings of their own.

When we first began research on the Eakle family, we started with family sources brought West on the overland train in the 1880s. Among these family sources was an heirloom which did not surface until 1976 as we prepared for our family reunion. One cousin related how sitting in the dentist's office one day she picked up an antique magazine to pass her time. An article on handblown glassware made by the Stiegel Glassworks in Manheim, Lancaster County, Pennsylvania caught her eye. The article described the incredible worth of each piece and ended with a statement that there were only two known pieces outside the New York Metropolitan Museum of Art. All at once she jumped from her chair. Taking the magazine with her, she raced home. enough, there in the back of her china closet still wrapped in the original tissue her mother put around it was a piece of handblown Stiegel glassware.

Inside was a yellowed slip of paper on which her grandmother had written, "This tumbler and its accompanying plate belonged to my great-grandmother Eakle." This was one of

the first clues that our family had come through Pennsylvania, but the ancestor who brought the tumbler with her was unknown.

There was also a family tradition that our ancestor, Christian Eakle and his four brothers--Harmon, Henry, Peter, and an unknown brother--emigrated from the Rhineland to America together. Who the father was we did not know.

In the 1930s a Cousin Edith Folsom Hatch had collected many facts mostly by writing to relatives in Virginia whom her mother and grandmother had known--like letters from family members in Tennessee and North Carolina. Like ties with Maryland where Virginia cousins sometimes went shopping for brides. Like bounty land awarded in Ohio. Tantalizing tidbits without enough detail to make searches in these states possible until recently.

Then slowly by writing to county clerks and using the small store of printed books available to her in Salt Lake City, Cousin Edith obtained marriages and wills. When she fit the evidence she had all together, this was the result.

Moravian Pioneers in the Swatara Valley - 1752

Undoubtedly the Moravians were the best recordkeepers of all the Pennsylvania Dutch church groups. For when they established a congregation, they prepared family registers of all their members, giving vital statistics of parents and children, and, most valuable of all, telling where in the old homeland the emigrant had come from.

We print here one of these lists, the "Catalogus der Geschwister in Swatara den 25 Oct. 1752" (Catalogue of the Brethren and Sisters in Swatara, October 25, 1752). It was painstakingly transcribed from the original document in the Moravian Archives at Bethlehem by the late Rev. Dr. William J. Hinke.--D.Y.

- 1) Ludwig Born, a tailor, from Rimschweyler in Zweybruecken, b. 1702, Reformed. Wife: Anna Marie, from Wuenschberg, b. 1705, Reformed. Husband received into Moravian membership, 1749; wife, 1750. For about ten years I have researched the various Orndorff families which were known to have emigrated in the 18th century to Pennsylvania. I am descended from three different Orndorff emigrants. There were several emigrations in the 18th century:

- 1709-10 Henry Ohrendorff to New York (researched by Hank Jones)
- 1737 Herman Orndorff to Lebanon Co., PA
- 1741 Christian Orndorff to Lebanon Co., PA
- Johan Conrad Ohrendorff to PA & MD
 Johannes Peter Ohrendorff to PA & MD

Most, if not all, of these Ohrendorffs came from the old territory of Nassau-Siegen or nearby, now approximately Kreis Siegen, Lower Northrhine Westfalia.

Herman Orndorff, 1737, was the nephew of Christian Orndorff of the 1741 emigration. Herman is my ancestor.

The 1753 emigrants came from a parish about 12 miles from Herman and Christian's area. Conrad and Peter were brothers, but apparently not related to Philip Henrich, although all emigrated from the same parish of Burbach. Peter and Conrad stayed a while in Lebanon Twp., Lancaster Co., PA, but both bought land and finally settled in Carroll Co., MD in the 1770's. Peter is my ancestor.

Philip Henrich settled in Chester Co., PA, with descendants moving into the Shenandoah Valley of Virginia in the last quarter of the 18th century. No connections to the Lebanon Co. Orndorffs that I have detected.

The 1765 Joes is probably the man who settled in Elizabeth Twp. Lancaster Co., PA. I have estimated that the land probably straddles the boundary between Lebanon and Lancaster Co. a little east of PA Route 501. Joes, known as John Orndorff, doctor, is my ancestor. His exact origin in Germany is unknown, but it was clear that he knew the Lebanon Co. Orndorffs well and their children intermarried.

Although we have a record of the 1741 emigrant Christian Orndorff's birth and marriage in Germany, we had no record of his children's baptisms there. I have enclosed a short article with information on his family showing they came from "Kiselberg in Freudenberg." [see p. 1] This is likely an error. I have done a great deal of research in this area of Germany, including using the services of a genealogist in Siegen who has researched the Orndorffs there for fifty years. He says there is no Kiselberg there. I note that over in the Hesse area there is a Kesselberg. Perhaps the document should have read Kesselberg and Freudenberg. I've never had a chance to check this out.

There are some published family histories on this line done many years ago: From Mill Wheel to Plow Share by J. R. Orndorff and Julia Drake about 1939; Christian Ohrndorff Family in Germany by Julia Drake about 1967. Neither one is strictly a genealogy.

There are a few errors which should be pointed out for anyone doing research on this line. Both these books has assumed that the mother of the children of Christian Orndorff, the elder emigrant (we call him Christian I) was an Elizabeth Miller or Mueller, and that they were married in Germany. An old family bible of the Orendorffs in Illinois had as its first entry Christian Orndorff-Elizabeth Muller When research in the 60's showed Christian married to or Miller. Agnes Washebach (Weschenbach), those researchers simply assumed that Agnes had died in Germany and Christian had married Elizabeth and then had a family. My research in PA showed an Agnes Ohrendorff d. 1751, buried in the row for married women in Moravian Cemetery at Hebron, I believe. Later records of the Moravian Archives speak of the wife of Christian Orndorff (the elder one) in the 1770's or so before he died. Therefore he probably married a second time, but in PA, and this may or may not have been the Elizabeth Miller of the bible record, but she certainly was not the mother of these grown children listed in the enclosed records.

Christian I had several children, Anna Margareta who married Harmon Eakle was one. There were two sons: Johann Christian (Christian II)--settled in Sharpsburg, MD and vicinity; Johann Henrich--probably settled Centre Co., PA.

Ms. Drake and J. R. Orndorff knew nothing of Johann Henrich Ohrendorff other than a mention of him in Moravian records. I believe he is the Henrich Ohrendorff who settled in Adams Co., PA 1762-82 and then in Centre Co., PA where Orndorffs still live on the old original homestead there. I visited them a couple of years ago, but they know nothing of their early ancestry.

Of the 1765 emigrant Henrich Ohrendorff, I know nothing.

FAMILY HISTORIES

Eckols, William--Sussex County, VA

John Bobbitt of Sussex County, Virginia was a son of Thomas Bobbitt. John was a grandson of John Bobbitt of Chowan Precinct in North Carolina. John Bobbitt of Sussex was a central figure in the Bobbitt family. He lived at the point where most of the relatives lived or had lived. He undoubtedly knew more about the Bobbitt family genealogy than any other descendant of William from Wales. Descendants of John Bobbitt still live today in Sussex County near and on property that belonged to John and Thomas Bobbitt.

John Bobbitt was married three times. His first wife was Florina Everret. There is no record of this marriage, but John and Florina had two daughters, Elizabeth Bobbitt and Polly Bobbitt.

The second marriage of John Bobbitt was to Mary Gilliam on April 3, 1788 and the marriage was recorded in Sussex County. One son of this marriage was named Green Branch Bobbitt. He apparently was the only child who lived to maturity.

The third marriage of John Bobbitt was to Frances Mitchell on October 11, 1792 in Sussex County. The marriage was recorded. Six children were born to John and Frances Bobbitt.

John Bobbitt was the bondsman for the marriage of his daughter, Elizabeth Bobbitt to William Rainey on December 19, 1799 in Sussex County. John was the bondsman for the marriage of his daughter to William Eckols, on December 1, 1800 in Sussex County. Both marriages were recorded.

John Bobbitt died on June 6, 1822 and left a will in which he mentions all of his children who lived to maturity including this bequest:

I give to my grandson, John Bobbitt Eckols, one part and the other part to my daughter Florina E. Robertson, and the other part to my daughter, Lucy Jones Bobbitt and the remaining part to my daughter Frances Mitchell Bobbitt...

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
