

MARTIN ELLIOTT'S FAMILY BIBLE

Introduction:

Records in the National Archives show that Martin Ellett (Elliott) enlisted in the Second Troops, First Regiment, Light Dragoons, Continental Troops, under Captain John Watts, as a Private in January, 1783, and that he was to receive 8 1/3 dollars per month. They also show that on November 30, 1784, he received the balance of his pay of \$15. His service is also recorded in the *CENTENNIAL EDITION DAR PATRIOT INDEX*, published in 1990 by the National Society of the Daughters of the American Revolution.

His entry states that he was born in 1750 in Virginia and that he died 14 March 1832 in North Carolina and that he married first Anne Finch, then Elizabeth McCombs. He was a Private in the continental Line from Virginia. His father-in-law, Adam Finch, is also listed. He was born about 1724 in Virginia, he died 2 Feb 1801, in Virginia, and he married Mary Thomson. He was Captain in the Virginia militia.

My research has revealed that Martin Ellett was born in December 1752 in Chesterfield County, VA, a few miles southwest of Richmond, the son of John Ellett and his first wife, Esther. John Ellett's will refers to his wife Millie (Amelia), his oldest son Martin, two sisters (Betsy and Nancy), and two younger sons (William and James). Since Martin and Betsey were much older than William, Nancy, and James, John Ellett's first wife (Esther) probably died after Betsey was born, and Millie was probably the mother of William, Nancy, and James.

Martin Ellett changed the spelling of his family name from "Ellett" to "Elliott" after he purchased a large tract of land in Rutherford county, NC, in 1806. He built the first frame house in the area on the west side of the First Broad River, in what is now the west-bound lane of US 74. The Martin Elliott Family Cemetery is in the pasture on the northwest corner of the intersection US-74 and NC-226 (Polkville Road). All of the original grave markers have disappeared, but there is a large marker for Martin Elliott's grave, erected in 1932 by his descendants and the local chapter of the DAR.

Martin Ellett's Parents:

Chesterfield County land records show that John Ellett purchased land on the south side of the James River at Falling Creek in Dale Parish from John Pleasants on 19 November 1748 for 40 pounds. They also show that John Ellett and his wife Esther sold 100 acres of land to Joshua Roberts on 1 March 1750, for 50 pounds. In September 1752, they sold 200 acres to Robert Ellit (Ellett) for "great love and affection," and in November 1752, they sold 300 acres to James Ellitt (Ellett) for 80 pounds. This series of transactions suggests that Robert Ellett was John Ellett's father, that his father gave him money to go to Chesterfield County and buy a very large tract of land, and that James Ellett was John Ellett's brother.



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If John Ellett was the son of Robert Ellett, he was born about 1724 in King William County, VA. King William County marriage records have not survived, so there is no way of determining when John Ellett married Martin's mother, the names of her parents, or the date of their marriage. Since Martin Slaughter owned land in Prince William County and John Ellett named his oldest son Martin, and Martin Ellett named one of his sons Martin Slaughter Ellett, there is a good chance that John Ellett married one of Martin Slaughter's daughters.

Since Martin was born in December 1752 and his parents were married before they sold the 100 acres of land on 1 March 1750, Martin Ellett probably had an older brother (born in 1780 or 1781), he was probably named John in honor of his father, and he died in infancy. Edward A. Woolen of Richmond, VA, a descendent of Martin Ellett, thoroughly researched the surviving land and marriage records in the 1980s and found that John Ellett's first recorded transaction in Amelia County, southwest of Chestfield County, was the purchase of 285 acres from James and Ruth Hall on 3 October 1759. Nottoway County was cut from Amelia County in 1789. John Ellett was living in Nottoway County when he signed his will on 15 April 1792 and when he died in 1796.

John Ellett's will was recorded at the Nottoway County Courthouse on 2 June 1796. It is evident from his will that John Ellett was well off, if not wealthy. He bequeathed 430 acres of land in Lunenburg County, 3 Negroes, and 40 pounds in current money to Martin Ellett, who had been lent the money and was already in possession of the land and the Negroes. He bequeathed William 230 acres of land in Nottoway County, 500 acres in Lunenburg County, and one Negro boy. He bequeathed James the 395 acre homestead in Nottoway County after his mother's death or remarriage and 300 acres of land in Lunenburg County and one Negro boy. Nancy Ellett received one Negro girl. He left his books to his wife Millie for her lifetime and directed that they be equally divided among William, Nancy, and James Ellett, the three children still living at home. The existence of this collection of books suggests that Martin Ellett as well as his younger brothers and sisters were reasonably well educated.

More About Martin Ellett:

Research by Angie Boyd Hansen revealed that Martin Ellett purchased land in Lunenburg County, VA, in 1777. According to her November 1959 notes, the deed states that Martin Ellett was from Amelia County. This was probably the land referred to in his father's will. It was between the North and Middle Meherrin Rivers, which are in the southwest corner of Lunenburg County, in the general vicinity of Rehoboth, a little town on state route 49. Lunenburg county, which was cut from Brunswick County in 1732, originally encompassed the area from Amelia County south to the North Carolina border and west to the frontier. After Halifax County was cut from Lunenburg County in 1752, Bedford County was cut in 1754, Charlotte County in 1765, and Mecklenburg County in 1765, it was less than one-fifth its original size.

On 20 January 1780, Martin Ellett of Lunenburg County, VA, married Anne Finch, the daughter of Adam Finch and Mary Crenshaw of the adjoining Charlotte County, VA. This date is based on *MARRIAGE BONDS AND MINISTER'S RETURNS OF CHARLOTTE COUNTY*. Martin Ellett subsequently bought land in Charlotte County and sold his land in Lunenburg County. They had twelve known children: Jiney, born 11 December 1780; James Finch, born 22 February 1783; John, born 4 July 1785; John Crenshaw, born 11 December 1787; Martin Slaughter, born 21 February 1783; Robert, born 28 July 1791; Sara Hicks, born 5 January 1793; Nancy, born 27 February 1795; Susana, born 29 October 1797; Ann, born 13 August 1799; Elizabeth, born 4 October 1803; and Adam Harmon Finch, born 2 May 1806. All were born in Charlotte County, VA. John Died in infancy, and Ann died when she was 16. The others lived to reach maturity.

Revolutionary War Service:

My search of records in the National Archives revealed that Martin Ellett enlisted in the Second Troop, first Regiment, Light Dragoons, Continental Troops, under Captain John Watts, as a Private in January, 1783, and that he was to receive 8 1/3 dollars per month. They also show that on 30 November 1784, he received the balance of his pay of \$15. Since he was born in December, 1752, he was 30 years old when he enlisted, and he served almost two years. He married and had a least one child (Jiney) when he enlisted in the Virginia Line. Since all able-bodied men were required to serve in the local militia, he probably served in the local militia, but there are no surviving records of his service, probably because the only surviving militia records are pay records for service outside their district.

The Martin Elliott family group record prepared by Edward A. Wollen of Richmond, VA, in July, 1993, states that Martin Elliott was: "Private, 1st Regiment, Light Dragoons, under Capt. John Watts, Continental Troops, Virginia Line, Revolutionary War." His source was "War Dep't, AGO, vol. 4, page 173." The "War Department" became the Department of the Army in 1947. "AGO" is the abbreviation for "Adjutant General's Office." These records are in the National Archives.

According to the *AMERICAN REVOLUTIONARY WAR MAP 1774-1783*, published by the Virginia Independence bicentennial Commission, there was fighting with the Indians in Virginia's Northwest Territories from 1774 until 1780, and there were encounters between british troops in Norfolk, Portsmouth, and Suffolk, but there was little fighting in the interior until Benedict Arnold raided Richmond in January, 1781, and Lord Cornwallis decided to move his forces to Virginia in March, 1781. Therefore, it is unlikely that Martin Elliott, who lived in Lunenburg County, was involved in any of the encounters between the British and the militia.

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Further it is unlikely that Martin Elliott was involved in any fighting with the British during his service with the continental Troops, because the British troops under Lord Cornwallis surrendered at Yorktown, VA, on 19 October 1781, fifteen months before Martin Ellett enlisted. Further, the British House of Commons voted to bring the war to a close on 27 February 1782, and a preliminary treaty was signed 20 November 1782. After the treaty ending the war became final and definitive on 3 September 1783, Washington moved his Army to Newburgh, New York, to wait for Britain to withdraw her troops. The last British soldiers were evacuated on 25 November 1783 and on 23 December 1783 Washington delivered his farewell address to the Congress, which was assembled in the Maryland State House in Annapolis. Since Martin Ellett was not discharged until 30 November 1784, he and his unit (Second Troop, First Regiment, Light Dragoons, continental Troops) were probably retained on active duty to protect Virginia's frontier settlements from Indians.

DAR Membership:

Martin Elliott's Revolutionary War service is recorded in the *CENTENNIAL EDITION DAR PATRIOT INDEX*, published in 1990 by the National Society of the Daughters of the American Revolution. His entry states that he was born in 1750 in Virginia and that he died 14 March 1832 in North Carolina and that he married first Anne Finch, then Elizabeth McCombs. He was a Private in the continental Line from Virginia. His father-in-law, Adam Finch, is also listed. He was born about 1724 in Virginia, he died 2 Feb 1801, in Virginia, and he married Mary Thomson. He was Captain in the Virginia militia.

DAR Applications:

The local chapter of the DAR will normally arrange for a genealogist to help applicants prepare their application for membership, but the applicant is required to complete the Applicant's Working Sheet. The sheet requires the applicant's name, date and place of birth, date of marriage, name of husband, and , if applicable, the date of the husband's death or the date of the divorce. It then requires the names of her father, the date and place of his birth, the date and place of his death, the date and place of his marriage to the applicant's mother, her name, the date and place of her birth, and if applicable, the date and place of her death.

This sequence of data is required for each generation, back to the ancestor who served in the Revolution. The applicant must also provide the names of all the ancestor's children, their dates of birth, and the names of their spouses. The applicant must also identify the sources for all of the information. Copies of pages from family Bibles are usually acceptable sources of family history data. Martin Ellett's descendants will find part of the required data for his children in the Martin Ellett Family Bible.

Martin Ellett Family Bible:

As shown in the following copies of extracts from the Martin Ellett Family Bible, Martin Ellett and Anne Finch had twelve children: Jiney, born 11 December 1780; James Finch, born 22 February 1783; John, born 4 July 1785; John Crenshaw, born 11 December 1787; Martin Slaughter, born 21 February 1783; Robert, born 28 July 1791; Sara Hicks, born 5 January 1793; Nancy, born 27 February 1795; Susana, born 29 October 1797; Ann, born 13 August 1799; Elizabeth, born 4 October 1803; and Adam Harmon Finch, born 2 May 1806. All were born in Charlotte County, VA. John died in infancy, and Ann died when she was 16. The others lived to reach maturity.

The title page shows that this Bible was printed during or before the American Revolution. The first entries were on the "blank" page after the last page of The New Testament. They appear to be written by the same person (probably Martin Ellett) at the same time (after 13 August 1799), probably in anticipation of the 1800 census taker's visit. The first line, "Mr. Martin Ellett - his Book -" is followed by the following entries:

"Jiney Ellet was born December the 11 - 1780
 James Finch Ellett was born February the 22 - 1783
 John Ellett was born July the 4 - 1785
 John Chrinshaw Ellett was born December the 11 - 1787
 Martin Slaughter Ellett was born February the 21 - 1789
 Robert Ellett was born July the 28 - 1791
 Sara Hicks Ellett was born January 5 - 1793
 Nancy Ellett was born February 27 - 1795
 Susanna Ellett was born October 19 - 1797
 Ann Ellett was born August 13 - 1799"

The same person probably made the following entry after Elizabeth's birth:

"Elezebeth Ellett was born October the 4 1803."

The rest of the entries on this page are a mishmash. An entry stating that Elizabeth Elleott was born October 4th, 1803, was squeezed in between the "Elizabeth Ellet was born October the 4 1803" and a "James Finch Ellett was born December the" entry; the James Finch Ellett entry was scratched out; the "Lucy Marion Elliott was born August 19th, 1829," was added; and another James Finch Ellett was born" entry was added and scratched out. The page ends with a very large "Adam Harman Finch Ellett was born May 2, 1806" entry, written by a different person. Martin Ellett may not have been at home when Adam was born, because he and his oldest son (James Finch Ellett) were in Rutherford County, NC, closing on the James finch Ellett's sale of the land on the First Broad River to his father on 14 April 1806.

The entries on the preceding page are in a distinctly different handwriting. One states that "James Finch Ellett was born February the 22 # 1789"; the second states that Ann Ellett was born August 18th 1799 and was born the second time the 23 of August 1816"; the third states that Elezebeth was born October 4th 1803"; "Jacob Ozier was born April 15th 1804"; and "the second time 1819." It is my belief that the phrase "the second time" refers to the date the person died. Although I have been told that the phrase implies a belief in reincarnation, I am inclined to think that it meant that the child had gone to live in heaven. Ann was 17, and Jacob Ozier was 15 when they were born the second time. Since Jacob Ozier was born only seven months after Elezebeth; it is unlikely that he was the son of Anne finch Elliott. According to the 1790 Census data, there were no Oziars in Virginia, but there was a William Ozier living in Mecklenburg

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County, NC, in 1790. Perhaps Jacob Ozier was an orphan that Martin Elliott adopted. There were no Ozier families in Rutherford County in 1810 or 1820.

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Anne Finch Elliott died in 1825, after Martin Ellett had changed the spelling of the family name to "Elliott." In 1826, Martin Elliott married Elizabeth McCombs, a young widow. Lucy Marion Elliott was Martin Elliott's daughter from marriage to Elizabeth McCombs.

Anne Finch, born in 1761, was the daughter of Adam Finch and Mary Crenshaw Finch. She was the youngest of six known children: William, Thomas, Zachariah, Edward, John, and Anne. Adam Finch, who was descended from Huguenot immigrants, served as a Captain in the Virginia militia during the Revolution. According to the 1810 Census for Rutherford County, Martin Elliott owned 34 slaves, and some of them probably came from Adam Finch's estate.

Family Cemetery:

After Martin Ellett purchased the land between the First Broad River and Brushy Creek from James Finch Ellett in 1806, he built a large house on the west side of the First Broad River in what is now the west-bound lane of US 74, just west of its intersection with NC 226 (Polkville Road). It was the first frame house in the area. The framing was sawed with a whipsaw and was of oak. It was three stories high and had a basement. The corner posts were 12 inches square, and all the framing was well mortised. This description of the house is from one of James Carson Elliott's newspaper articles. He received his information from John Hardin, who helped tear down the house. Most of the houses in the area were log cabins with a loft, but some of them were two stories with an attic. None of them had basements.

The Martin Elliott Family Cemetery is on the hill in the pasture on the west side of the NC 226 (Polkville Road), just north of the traffic light. Unfortunately there is no easy access to the cemetery from either NC 226 or US 74, because there are steep embankments and briars, and there is a barbed-wire fence around the pasture. However, Pvt. Martin Elliott, 1st Regiment Dragoons-Continental Troops Revolutionary War 4 March 1782. This is not surprising, because Martin Elliott died on 14 March 1832, and was buried in the family cemetery.

There are no surviving cemetery records. Martin Elliott's daughter Ann died 23 August 1816, when she was 16, and she was probably the first to be buried in the family cemetery. Jacob Ozier, who was probably an adopted orphan, died in 1819, when he was 15, and he was probably buried next to Ann. Martin Elliott's wife, Anne Finch Elliott, died in 1825, and was probably buried with Ann and Jacob. There may have been others buried there, including slaves, because Martin Elliott was one of the wealthiest men in Rutherford County. The 1820 Census shows that he owned 25 slaves. The graves probably had wooden markers that rotted and were not replaced, excepting the marker for Martin Elliott in 1932.

Status of the Family Bible:

The Martin Ellett Family Bible passed to James Carson Elliott, the son of William Martin

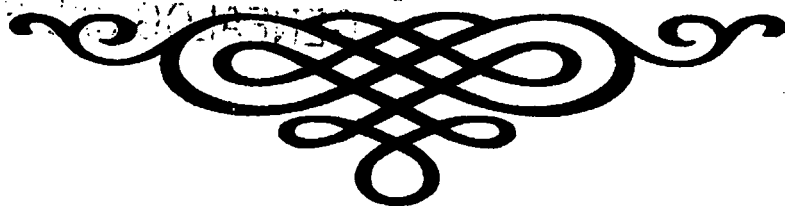
Elliott and Barbara Rudasil Carson, who was born in July 1845. He grew up before the civil War, joined Company F, 56th Regiment of NC Troops, and wrote *THE SOUTHERN SOLDIER BOY: A THOUSAND SHOTS FOR THE CONFEDERACY*, describing his experiences. After the war, he was a school teacher with an interest in politics, government, state, community, and church affairs, and he frequently wrote on current events as well as family history for the local newspapers.

James Carson Elliott died in 1936, leaving a large collection of family history papers, including the Martin Elliott Family Bible, to his youngest son, Plato Jefferson Elliott, who was born 19 March 1896. Plato married Eugenia L. Loller in January, 1904, and they had three daughters: Elizabeth Ann Elliott, born 2 November 1933; Barbara Mildred "Millie" Elliott, born 30 May 1940; and Martha Louis Elliott, born in 1943. Plato died on 18 December 1956. In 1989, Plato's widow, Eugenia Loller Elliott, loaned the Martin Elliott Family Bible to Charlie Whisnant Elliott, my cousin, and he made copies of these three pages for distribution to Elliott family members. Elizabeth married Reese Honeycutt, Millie married Cal Sandman, and Martha married Ronald Hester. On 16 December 2001, Martha stated that she had no objections to publishing copies of these extracts.

Addendum

Martin Elliott, who was predeceased by his first wife, Anne Finch Elliott, and most of his children, including his oldest daughter, Jiney Elliott Cabaniss; and two of his older sons: John Crenshaw Elliott and Martin Slaughter Elliott, died on 14 March 1832, at the age of 80. He was survived by his oldest and youngest sons: James Finch Elliott and Adam Harmon Elliott. According to an undated newspaper article written by James C. Elliott and published in *The Shelby Star*, there was an estate sale and Thomas Wilson, a neighbor of James Finch Elliott, purchased Martin Elliott's Bible. After Thomas Wilson died in 1861, the Bible passed to one of his daughters, the second wife of Sibel Hendrick, who directed that the Bible be returned to the Elliott family. It was delivered to Ensley Elliott, the son of Thomas F. Elliott and the grandson of Martin Slaughter Elliott. After Ensley died, the Bible passed to his brother Tom, who gave it to James C. Elliott, probably in the 1890s when James C. Elliott and Thomas W. Elliott were neighbors.

A BRIEF HISTORY OF FALLSTON SCHOOL
as it appeared in THE FALLSTONIAN, 1941
by Weller R. Gary, Principal

The Methodist Church served as a school building until 1887. At that time Mr. J. Z. Falls established a brick yard and made the brick with which the first school house was built. It was two stories high with an auditorium on the first floor and three class rooms on the second floor. Reverend Lee Falls was the first principal.

When North Carolina made public high schools legal in 1907, Fallston was the first to establish a state high school in rural Cleveland County. This made it necessary to add to the old building. A frame structure was built across the front of the brick building.

A local tax election was held and results of that election were in the hands of the Cleveland County Board of Education in the early spring of 1924. Since loans could not be obtained until December, 1924, the contract was not let until the spring of 1925.

The new building had twelve rooms, two wash rooms, a heating plant, and an auditorium. Since 1925, it has been necessary to build again. The present plant has a 114 foot wing added to the rear of the 1925 house. A tin can type of gymnasium with two extra rooms was erected in the fall of 1932. A vocational building with classrooms, shops, and laboratories was completed in 1940.

Mr. Lockwood writes that the word "gentleman" was a designation to distinguish one who was a landed proprietor, or lived independently. A Memorial Window to the memory of the Rev. John Eliot, the Apostle to the Indians, in the church at Widford, was dedicated with appropriate ceremonies, on the 21st of May last. The cost of this window was defrayed by a subscription among his descendants in the United States (see ante, page 80). The rector of the church, the Rev. J. T. Lockwood, gave a sketch of the life of Eliot, and the United States Ambassador, the Hon. Thomas F. Bayard, who was present by invitation, made an address. An account of the proceedings was printed in the *Boston Evening Transcript*, June 16th. A fuller account appeared in the *Herts Guardian*, May 26, 1894.—EDITOR.]

BENNETT ELLIOTT of Nasinge, Essex, yeoman, 5 November 1621, proved 28 March 1622. My body to buried in decent and Christian manner. I give and bequeath all the rents and profits of all my copy and customary lands and tenements &c. in the several parishes of Ware, Widford, Hunsdon and Estweeke in the Co. of "Harford" unto my trusty and well beloved friends William Curtis, my son in law, Nicholas Camp the younger and John Keyes, all of the said parish of Nasinge, for the space of

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eight years from the time of my decease quarterly to pay unto my son John Elliott the sum of eight pounds a year of lawful money of England for and towards his maintenance in the University of Cambridge, where he is now scholar, and the residue of the rents and profits I give and bequeath for and towards the bringing up of my youngest children, that is to say, Francis, Jacob, Mary and Lydia. And the inheritance of all my said lands lying in the said parishes I give and bequeath as followeth. First, to Francis, my youngest son, and to his heirs forever, one parcel of land called Crotwell Croft, containing two acres more or less, and one other parcel of land called Coles Croft, containing one acre more or less, and one parcel of land called Dameter in Great Hyfield and one other parcel of land lying in Little Westney, by estimation one acre and a half more or less, and one parcel of land lying in Sowters Common Meade, containing half an acre, with all the rents and profits after the end of the said eight years have expired; and I give and bequeath unto my son Jacob and to his heirs forever all that my messuage or tenement in the said parish of Widford, with all the lands thereunto belonging lying in the said several parishes of Widford, Ware, Hunsdon and Estwick, with all other the appurtenances other than those lands before given to my son Francis, with all the rents and profits of the same from and after the said eight years. I give and bequeath unto my daughter Lydia the sum of fifty pounds of lawful money, to be paid unto her at the age of eighteen years or day of marriage, which shall first happen. I give unto my daughter Mary the sum of twenty pounds of like lawful money, to be paid unto her in like manner and I give unto my goddaughter Mary Curtis the sum of three pounds of like money, payable to her as to the others; and my will and mind is that if either of my said two daughters die before their said age or marriage that then the survivor to have her part or legacy as aforesaid and that if they both happen to die before the said time that then the sum of forty pounds thereof be paid to my son John and the residue to and amongst my younger children.

Item, my will and mind is that so soon as may be after my decease my executors make sale of all my stock of cattle, corn and all other goods and chattles that be "a broade" out of my house and of so much of my moveable goods within the house as in their discretions cannot well be kept in their own property till my said children be of age to use the same, to such persons as will give most money for the same, and the money rising thereof to employ for the use, behoof and maintenance of my said children to the best advantage they lawfully may or can; and further my will and mind is that my daughter Mary and my daughter Lidia shall have the chest in the yellow chamber and all that is in the same, over and above their parts in the rest of my goods, and my will and mind is that my son Phillip shall have so much of my household implements as cannot well be removed without loss, for his part of my said goods if it rise to be so much; if his part come not to the value then that he may have them at a reasonable price if he will before any other; and I give unto my son Francis four silver spoons which were given him at his Christening, over and above his my part of goods, and my will is that my daughter Mary Curtis have the keeping of them till he be of age, and for that my said daughter Mary Curtis hath heretofore had a good and competent part of my goods for her portion and preferment in marriage, whereby she is already provided for, I give unto her only the sum of five shillings to make her a small ring to wear in remembrance of my love to her and because my estate in goods and chattles will hardly be sufficient for the education of my young children, Francis,

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Jacob, Mary and Lydia therefore I more give unto my said friends William Curtis, Nicholas Camp and John Keyes, whom I trust for their bringing up, the sum of ten pounds a year yearly for the space of eighteen years after my decease out of my messuage and customary lands in the parish of Nasinge, or out of any part thereof, for the better maintenance of my said children; and the inheritance of my said messuage, lands and tenements with their appurtenances, with all the rents and profits thereof other than the said ten pounds a year out of the same for the time aforesaid, I give and bequeath unto my son Phillip Elliott and to his heirs forever; and my will and mind is that my said friends pay all such fine or fines as shall be due to the lord or lords for their said lands when they shall be thereunto admitted, and the rest of my estate in goods, rents, money, debts or chattels, with the profits thereof if any be, to deliver to my said children by even and equal portions at the end and expiration of the said eighteen years; and for that cause I do hereby ordain and appoint my said beloved friends William Curtis, Nicholas Campe the younger and John Keyes my full and sole executors &c. and I give to either of them for their pains herein taken forty shillings apiece, and my earnest request is that Mr John Tey of the said parish of Nasinge Esq. would be aiding and helping to my said executors by his good counsel and advice for the better execution thereof, and my will and mind is that if any question or doubt do arise between my executors concerning this my said will that they submit themselves to be ordered and ruled by him without any further trouble or contention.

THE PILGRIM FATHERS OF NAZING.¹

Communicated by W. WINTERS, Esq., of Waltham Abbey, Essex, England.

THE original founders of New-England, "that gem of the great nation" which subsequently spread itself so rapidly over the half of a continent, were generally of English birth and descent. Col. J. L. Chester has collected as many as five hundred names of Essex men who were technically made freemen of the colony of Massachusetts Bay between the years 1631 and 1641. These men were for the most part heads of families, representing much of the real strength of the colony.²

The rural village of Nazing, "the home" (as it has been called by an American author) "of our fathers, around which were clustered the affections and remembrances of their youth," comprises the north-west corner of Waltham half-hundred. There is a peculiar feature about this quiet little village and its surroundings, which is strictly characteristic of the many rustic homesteads and picturesque spots for which Old-England is so noted. One might imagine, from the great number of gable-fronted cottages, with low thatched roofs and overhanging eaves, that abound in Nazing's upland especially, and the distance it lies from any line of rail, that it had undergone but little change during the past three hundred years. The old parish church is situated on the side of a hill overlooking parts of Hertfordshire and Middlesex: bounded on the west by the river Lee, and on the east and south by Waltham Abbey and Epping. The accompanying view of the church³ represents the building as it appeared when the emigrant fathers worshipped within its old grey walls. It consists of a chancel, nave and north aisle, with a square embattled tower containing five bells. The body and aisle are divided by four pointed arches rising on circular clustered columns; behind the first column, which is apparently hollow, is a small door leading by a narrow winding stairs to an aperture in front of the chancel, sufficiently large to exhibit a person nearly at full length to the congregation. This was no doubt the entrance into the rood loft; but whether this was originally intended as a place of penance is not certainly known. It is evident, however, that at no very remote period it was used for purposes of general thanksgiving, as on a wood-

on tablet beneath the aperture is inscribed the exvi. Psalm: "I will pay my Vows unto the Lord in the sight of all his People."

This church was appropriated by King Harold to his then newly founded church in Waltham, and was first supplied by the canons of Waltham or by persons appointed by them. The vicarage occurs among the small benefices in the taxation of Nicholas IV. in 1281, and was valued at 30s. The abbots and convent of Waltham remained patrons of the vicarage till the dissolution of the abbey temp. Hen. VIII.

The interior of the church has undergone a slight change. The old oak seats, which were carved at the ends with a variety of grotesque characters, were about three months ago cleared out, with the exception of about five of the best of them, which have since been refixed at the east end of the side aisle. These seats date back to the time of James the First. There are a goodly number of fine mural stones in the church, chiefly to the memory of several branches of the Palmer family, who have been connected with the parish for more than two centuries. A member of this notable family is now living in Nazing, namely, Lieut. Col. George Palmer, one of the renderers of the ancient forest of Waltham, &c.

The parish registers of Nazing, which yield many an important item in connection with the emigrant fathers, commence in the year 1559. John Hopkins was then vicar. In 1579 he was deprived of his living, as I suppose, for nonconformity. Richard Perion seems to have been curate with Hopkins, as his name is mentioned in the register as early as 1559. The first register-book is headed with the following text of Scripture: "O Lord increase our faith." This old parchment volume has afforded me great pleasure in rummaging through it. By the kind permission of the vicar, I have culled out a few quaint entries which are very amusing. The brief history of each individual is summed up thus:

1580, "Nicholas, a vagrant woman child," Christened Jan. 15.

1593, "William flaxe nursechild," Buried Nov. 7.

1599, "A wandering woman," Buried Sept. 2.

1601, "A wandering boye," Buried Jan. 13.

1604, "Phebe, a bastard," Christened . . . April.

1605, "Ed. a young child," Buried

Beside these curious entries, there are in the same volume, several names of persons who helped to establish new colonies and promote the interest of the new world of liberty, in the murky days of King Charles the First. Such names have now become familiar to most of the descendants of early American settlers; although they may have long been forgotten by the old resident families of Nazing. The names of Eliot, Ruggles, Curtis, Payson, Peacock, Graves, Heath and others are carefully embalmed in the old records of Nazing.

parish-church; also those of Shelly and Brazier, which two at present I am unable to connect with the New-England settlers.

In the year 1631, the ship "Lion" (master, William Pierce) left the shores of England with the first batch of Nazing pilgrims on board. John Eliot, the celebrated "apostle to the Indians," was there, with William Curtis and Sarah his wife, and children, in company with the wife of Governor Winthrop who came from another part. They were ten weeks on the water. The same ship speedily returned for another cargo of precious souls. In the summer of 1632 she left the Thames once more for Boston, N. E., having among her passengers several Nazing worthies. William Heath and his wife and children were on the roll. Isaac the elder brother of William did not quit Nazing till 1635. Early in 1633 John Graves, with his beloved wife and five children, left the land of their nativity for the shores of New-England. In 1635 they were followed by a strong muster of Nazing christians. They were "transported to New-England, imbarqued in the Hopewell, master Wm. Burdick." They took "the oath of allegiance and supremacy per certificate from Stansted Abby there." Robert Ballard was the then vicar of the parish of Stanstead Abbots. The ship "Planter" sailed the same year with a number of emigrants from St. Albans, but I have not discovered that there were any among them from Nazing.

An American writer mentions the fact that there are several passages in the apostle's records¹ of singular interest, "being the only indication of the locality (Nazing) of the colonists in England which has been preserved to us. They reflect a few scanty rays of light back through more than two centuries to the village church of Nazing, where were many of the church enjoying society together, and gathering courage for the dark voyage across the Atlantic and the untried perils of the western wilds, driven away by the illiberal and unwise counsels of Archbishop Laud, whose memory, though he was a patron of learning, has little claim to the respect of those who wish well to the cause of religion and humanity."

John Eliot records the death of two of the company (Graves and Ruggles) which occurred in the November of 1644: "These two break the knot first of the Nazing Christians. I meane they first dyed of those Christians y^e came from y^e towne in England." These Nazing pilgrims left England, as has been stated, not in one company, but at different times, when they could best escape. "It is certain," says Mr. J. W. Thornton, "that one of them did not arrive till the year 1637, and they probably continued to come as late as 1640, during a period of at least nine years. Their wills and other legal instruments show that they were to a considerable extent connected by family ties and relationships in England, which rendered

it probable that Nazing may have been the place of their origin and not merely a temporary residence."

Col. J. L. Chester informs us that "these were the men with many others out of the same county, to whom what was afterwards a great Republic owed its first existence: brave Englishmen who took their lives in their hands and faced with dauntless courage all the certain dangers and uncertain terrors of the enterprise to which they had committed themselves. The moss-grown tombstones in every neighboring church-yard, and the old parish registers, reveal these names at every step and on every leaf, and it is almost exclusively to these that the American genealogist can appeal with any hope of success."

I have in my collection of local documents, several relating to the parish of Nazing; one of which is a perfect original list of "all the coppieholders and freeholders belonging to this manor of Nazing this twelfth of January 1637." In it appears the names of Shelly (Trott, Palmer), Curtis, Brasier, Graves, Payson, Peacock, Camp and other relatives of the New-England fathers. Most of these appear to have been men of substance. I have also several curious accounts of "Pains and Amerciaments" imposed by the Nazing "Jury," as early as 1614. In one, of the date of 1625, is the name of Robert Graves. In a later one I find the names of "John Payson at the Berry," and George Curtis, who were to be fined "V^s apeece yf they doe not mende yt (the fence) betwene this and — day of July next."

Several of the Nazing families already alluded to were relatively connected, doubtless, with those of the same name living in the adjoining parish of Waltham Abbey, in which place I am particularly interested, having been for several years past engaged in collecting materials for a large history of the parish.

The parish-register of Waltham Abbey contains several corresponding names with those who emigrated to New-England between the years 1631 and 1641, but I have not as yet been able to identify any of them with the early settlers of New-England. I should be glad, however, to hear anything relating to William Brett, who went from Waltham Abbey to Virginia in the reign of James I. The following family of Eliots is taken from the parish-register of Waltham:

In 1721 Mr. Walter, who excelled in the science of harmony, being grieved and annoyed beyond measure at the very indifferent performances in the sanctuary, published in a small volume "The Grounds and Rules of Music Explained; or, An Introduction to the Art of Singing by Note. Fitted to the Meanest Capacity." The music was printed with bars for the first time in America. The tunes were composed in three parts only. It ran through successive editions until 1764. This book threw the churches into commotion, some battling for the old and some for the new way of singing,—that is, by rote or note. "I have great jealousy," said a writer in the "New England Chronicle," "that if we once begin to sing by note, the next thing will be to pray by rote, and then comes popery."

Mr. Walter's sermon, "The Sweet Psalmist of Israel," delivered in 1722, and dedicated to Judge Paul Dudley, has been pronounced the most beautiful composition among the sermons handed down to us by our fathers. His uncle, Rev. Cotton Mather, commemorated him in a discourse which was shortly afterwards printed, with the title of "A Good Reward of a Good Servant."

The apostle Eliot's estate of two and a half acres was a long, narrow strip, having a front of one hundred and forty-five feet on Washington Street, facing the old schoolhouse and Gov. Dudley's residence, his orchard extending back to the Training Field, just beyond Winslow Street. Rev. Mr. Walter's estate adjoined him on the north, while the highway to Dorchester (Dudley Street) formed his southern boundary. The lower part of Warren Street, not then laid out, divides Eliot's lot.

His house stood just in the rear of the People's Bank building, and is probably the old house that was pulled down when that was built, and which was long owned and occupied by the Mears family. It was of two stories, with a gambrel roof, its porch or main entrance in the centre, and is remembered

as a very old house by the most aged persons now living in Roxbury. Its next occupant after Eliot was Deacon Samuel Williams, who married Theoda, daughter of Deacon William

Parke. Their son, Rev. John Williams, of Deerfield, was carried into captivity by the Indians. North of Mears, on a part of the Eliot estate, was the house and lot of William Blaney.

The Will of JOHN CAMPE the elder of Nasing, co. Essex, yeoman, dated 21 May 1630, proved 11 June 1630. Bequeaths to sons John, George, Nicholas, Thomas; to daughters Mary and Sarah; to grandchildren Elizabeth and John Campe; to John Elott my grandchild when he reaches the age of 18 years; residue to wife, Mary, who is named executrix; desires his good friends Richard and William Campe to be overseers. [Register 26, Com. Ct. of London (1629-1634), p. 42.] [REGISTER (1894), vol. XLVIII, p. 399.] This will shows an apparent connection with the family of John Eliot, the Indian Apostle.

On 23 Nov. 1638, JOHN GRAVES, of Roxbury, New England, Cowleech, guardian of his daughter Sarah Graves, under age, appoints his well beloved friends Robert Wood, of Harlowe, co. Essex, Shoemaker, and Nicholas Campe, of Nasing in the said county, husbandman, his lawful attorneys to recover of Lydia Ford late of Nassing, widow, his sister, £7 10s. for six years rent of a piece of meadow in Nasing, being part of his daughter's legacy under the will of Thomas Finch late of Hertford, co. Hertford, yeoman. The money received to be paid to his well beloved friend Nicholas Parker of Boston, New England, planter. [Lechford's *Manuscript Note Book*, p. 23.] John Graves died in 1644. He was a friend of John Eliot, the Indian Apostle, both coming from Nasing, co. Essex, and living in Roxbury. Nicholas Parker was a merchant of Roxbury, afterwards removing to Boston.

CARPENTER

JOSIAH¹ CARPENTER (*William*,² *William*¹), born at Rehoboth 18 Dec. 1664, died there intestate 28 Feb. 1727. He married at Rehoboth, 24 Nov. 1692, ELIZABETH¹ READ, born at Rehoboth 25 Jan. 1668/9, died there 8 Oct. 1739, aged 72 years (gravestone), daughter of Thomas² and Elizabeth (Clark) Read.

Josiah Carpenter was elected one of the highway surveyors in 1720. At a town meeting held 27 Oct. 1721 Mr. Jathniel Peck, Mr. James Bowen, and Mr. Josiah Carpenter were chosen a committee to handle the Town's part of the £50,000 issue of the Province of Massachusetts Bay Bills of Credit [*Rehoboth Town Meetings*, Book II, p. 209].

Nicholas Campe testified at Newport, 14 Aug. 1723, that he sent his sister to Josiah Carpenter with a counterfeit Province of Massachusetts Bay £5 bill, made at Rehoboth by Mary⁴ (Peck) Butterworth, on the back of which he wrote "one Hobots name", and that Carpenter received it [*Original Document*, Newport Superior Court Clerk's Office, Drawer 1722M-1723 Sept.].

On 8 Apr. 1728 Elizabeth Carpenter, widow, was appointed by the

THE ELIOTS OF CORNWALL.*

This branch of the family descended from John Eliot of Devonshire, who married Joan, daughter and heiress of W. Sigdon of Sigdon, co. Devon. It appears that this family flourished for several generations in Devonshire prior to their removal into Cornwall. The above mentioned John and Joan Eliot had issue a son Walter Eliot, who was returned among the gentry of Devonshire in 1433. He married Margery by whom he had William Eliot, who married Joan, daughter and heir of Nicholas Coteland of Coteland (by Alice his wife, daughter and heir of John Barleston), and had a son John Eliot of Cutland near Ashburton *vizd* 1480, who by his wife Joan, daughter of John Bonvill of Chute, had Isabella, wife to John Somerton, and Edward Eliot of Cutland, who married Alice, daughter of Robert Guy of Knightsbridge, and died 26 March, 1522, according to the disquisition in Rolls Chapel, 13 Hen. VIII. He had issue three sons: 1. John Eliot who married first, Mary, daughter of John Bruin of Plymouth; second, Grace, daughter of John Fitz of Tavistock. 2. Thomas Eliot, married Joan, daughter of John Norbrook of Exeter. 3. Robert Eliot, Canon of Exeter and Subdean of Salisbury, died 1562. Thomas Eliot (second son) had Richard Eliot of Port Eliot, heir to his uncle John Eliot, and who married Bridget, daughter and heir of Nicholas Carswell of Devonshire. His son, Sir John Eliot, died in the Tower of London in 1632. His wife was Radigund, daughter of Richard Geddy, and by whom he had issue John Eliot of Port Eliot, who married Honora, daughter of Sir Daniel Norton, and died 1685. Sir John Eliot had also Susan, Elizabeth, Bridget, Richard, Edward and Nicholas.

John, the son of Sir John Eliot, had issue—Daniel, died in 1702 and buried at St. Germans; Honora, Bridget, Douglas, Radigund and Susan. Nicholas, the youngest son of Sir John Eliot, married daughter of Mr. Prideaux of Paddon, and had issue—William, who took to wife Anne, daughter of Lawrence Williams, by whom he had Edward Eliot, heir to Daniel Eliot, and who married first, Susan, daughter of Sir W. Coryton; second, Elizabeth, daughter of James Craggs; also Richard, Katherine and Elizabeth. Arms borne by the family—Argent a fess, Gules, between two bars gemelles wavy, azure. Crest—On a wreath an Elephant's head couped argent, collared gules. Motto, Occurrent nubes.

ELIOTS OF GLOUCESTERSHIRE.*

In Cold Aston church is a small monument on which is inscribed, viz.: In Memory of Samuel son of Joshua Elliott, clerk and Elizabeth his wife daughter to Edward Aylworth of Aylworth, co. Gloucester. Hee died August 1. 1667. Shee died January 27 1672.

There was Judith, the daughter of John Eliot, Esq., living temp. Charles II.

In Dursley church it is recorded that Esther Tyndal married John Elliott Clerk (Curate) of Dursley, co. Gloucester. She died 30 April, 1743, aged 81. Also Hannah, daughter of John and Esther Elliott, died 10th September, 1698.

George Millard Elliott, late of Lowell, Mass., N. E., the son of Joel and Esther Elliott, is the living representative of the Gloucestershire branch of the Elliott family.

John Elyot held land in Apuldreifield, co. Kent, 18 Hen. VI. An entry occurs as follows: "John Elyot for 'le Rodeland' & heñ. & rel. iij." circa 1440.

Elizabeth Gresham, the daughter of Sir Thomas Gresham, Lord Mayor of London, married to James Elliott. The entry of her birth is given in Add. MSS. 6239. See Nichols's Topographical and Genealogical Works, vol. ii. p. 514. The said Elizabeth was born 19 Nov. 1537, "Upon the Frydaye."

George Elliott is mentioned in a deed relating to land in Wheatley and Bentley, co. York, date 25 July, 1622.

THE following letters, &c., addressed to Hugh Peters, found among the State Papers of Hyde, Earl of Clarendon, give some idea of his activity and usefulness as an agent, and the trust that was reposed in him by the agitators, before the Commonwealth was established and after. Short extracts from the different news letters received by Lord Chancellor Hyde, are also herewith given whenever they throw any light upon the movements or opinions of Hugh Peters.†

The Commissioners of Sussex to Mr Hugh Peters. (Original.)

Mr Peters wee underwritten (as the deputy lieutenants in Kent have done) doe acknowledge it acceptable service for any to appeare in person or with horse, money or plate, or imburst for two months to goe forth with Colonel Morley, Colonel Staply or any intrusted for the defence of the Kingdom or County, so to preserve their religion and libertyes, as is desired by the late vote of Parliament for the raising the Countyes. And wee shall to our utmost further this worke together with the disarming ma-

THE ELIOTS OF ROXWELL, CO. ESSEX, ENG.*

Thomas Elliot, of Roxwell, living *circa* 1491, was born in Wales, and was one of the masters in chancery. His son Richard was a Devonshire gentleman, and had a son and heir Thomas, who married Margaret, daughter of Thomas Wilson of Cottered, co. Herts. This Thomas resided at Hunsdon in the same county, and was probably the head of the Hunsdon branch of the family. He had issue George Elyot of Bishop Stortford, who died 6 Sept. 1551,† and John Elyot of the same place who married first Elizabeth Graves (probably of Nazing, from whence several of that name sailed to New England in after years). His second wife was Margret Sheppy. John had issue by his first wife four sons and two daughters: 1. John Elliot of London Esq. clerk of the Navy,‡ and who married Elinor, daughter of Sir John Newton, Knt., and had issue one son, Sir Thomas Elliot of Stamford Rivers, co. Essex; 2. George Elliot; 3. Rowland Elliot, who married the daughter of George Brown of White Roding, co. Essex; 4. Edward Elliot of Newland Hall (buried in Roxwell church, 29 Dec. 1595). He married Jane, daughter of James Gedge, Esq., of Shenfield, co. Essex, and had Jane Elliot, who married John Butler of Little Burch, Essex, 27 Dec. 1599. Dorothy Elliot (Harl. MSS.). Elizabeth Elliot, who married John Younge of Roxwell, and Edward Elliot. 5. Winifred Elliot, married Richard Pelleston. 6. Blythe Elliot, married George Haines or Hawes.

Whether the Eliots of Roxwell and Hunsdon were related to the Nazing branch or not is difficult to discover. Some persons have stated they were, probably on the ground that Benett Eliot, the father of the Apostle to the Indians, held property in Hunsdon and in the surrounding villages.

In fact, in a catalogue of a sale issued by Messrs. Puttock and Simpson some years ago, appeared the following announcement, with other valuable documents:

"The Original Will on Parchment of Richard Bright of Roxwell,* Essex dated 10th April 1573 in which is bequeathed Newekunde, which afterwards became the property of the father of John Eliot the apostle to the Indians and other documents relating to the Eliot Family together with a long and Historical Letter in the autograph of George Washington, etc."

The Eliots of Newland Hall held the manors of Wickhams, Margaretting, with the rectory of Norton Mandeville (an ancient and interesting Essex church). Queen Elizabeth let the manor of Farnham in 1575 to the elder Edward Eliot above named. She also granted a confirmation of free warren to John Eliot of Bishop Stortford, the father of Edward. The two brothers John and George Eliot were buried in Bishop Stortford church. *Salmon* in 1728 states "that an old stone in the chancel had lately this inscription:

'Here under this stone lieth buried in the Mercies of God the Bodies of George Elyot and John Elyot Gentlemen, being two Brothers which George deceased the 6 of Sept. 1551. The said John Oct. 30 1557. Whose deaths have you in Remembrance, calling to God for Mercy.'

Edward Eliot, the son of John, died at Writtle, near Chelmsford, co. Essex, and was there interred. A monumental brass records that—

"Neere unto this place resteth in peace the body of Edward Elliot, late of Newland, in the countye of Essex, Esq.; son of John Elliot of Stortford, in the countye of Hertford. He tooke wyfe Jane one of the daughters of James Gedge, son and heire of Margaret Gedge, one of the daughters and heire of Thomas Barfield of Shenfield; by whom he had yssue 4 sonnes and 6 daughters. They lived together in married estate 33 yeres and he decessed the 22 day of Decemb. in the yere of our Lorde 1595. *Ætatis suæ 60.*"

The Rev. A. D. Stackpoole, vicar of Writtle, informs the writer that "in Writtle church there is a monument to two persons named Eliot, father and son, one of Newland in Essex, the other of Stortford. Our (Writtle) parish register does not go back as far as 1595, when the second Eliot died. It is a curious monument, and for publication should be copied by an artist. There are fourteen figures in *alto relievo*. At Widford (close to Ware) I am told that there are Elliotts in the Registers." This is possible, because Benett Eliot held lands in Widford, Ware, Estwick and Nazing. Edward and Jane Eliot of Newland Hall possessed property in the parish of Bromfield, co. Essex, *temp.* Elizabeth.†

Some persons have stated they were; in fact, in a catalogue sent to me last year, announcing certain sales which were to take place in "May, 1872," the following item occurs: "The Original Will on Parchment of Richard Bright of Roxwell, Essex, dated 10th April, 1573, in which is bequeathed 'Newland,' which afterwards became the property of Edward Eliot, the father of John Eliot, the apostle to the Indians and translator of the Indian Bible; and other documents relating to the Eliot Family, together with a long and interesting Historical Letter in the autograph of George Washington, etc.?" This statement respecting Edward being the father of the celebrated John Eliot is decidedly wrong, as is proved by the will of Bennett Eliot of Nazing, made Nov. 5, 1621. [See *Herbert Journal*, Boston, edited by W. H. Whitmore, Esq.]

A Philip Eliot, M.A., was vicar of Hunsdon, co. Herts (situated a few miles from Nazing). He succeeded Ed. Jude, who was at one time vicar of Nazing. William Curtis, born in Nazing, and bapt. 21 June, 1618. (Could not be son of the above William, but may have been son of George Curtis of Nazing.) He sailed to N. E. with John Eliot in 1631. The church record says of him that he "a hopeful scholar, but God took him in 1631." The parish-register of Nazing gives the following: "John Eliot was baptized the vi of februarye 1602-3." "John ut, infans." Buried "18 februarye, 1602-3." Most probably the son of Bennett Eliot. Mary Curtis, sister of William (supra), married Thomas Ruggles, son of Thomas of Nazing. She was born in Nazing, bapt. 1589. Had seven children born in Nazing. (Emigrated in 1632.)
