In July 1982 issue we had started printing from the packet of material submitted by Leslie D. Boling. We will publish more of material here. This material seems to be from Missouri.

Married on 24th Jan 1871 near Gosneyville by Rev. Mr. Wilson, Mr. A. T. ESTES to Miss Miriam Harrel.

18 Aug 1871: JOHN N. ESTES allowed \$800.00 for board and clothing of Drury and Georgia Reynolds, children of William T. Reynolds, decd.

Died in this county near Kearney, 19 Oct 1871, Mrs. Dimitia Pence, wife of Capt. William H. Pence and youngest daughter of the late HENRY H. ESTES, in her 34th year. Left husband & children.

7 June 1872: 50th anniversary celebration of Clay County. A group of gentlemen, all over 60 years of age, were photographed. Among them were L. B. ESTES and MARTIN ESTES.

25 Sept 1872: At the residence of the bride's father, by Rev. F. M. Palmer, Jr. Jas. M. Bivens to Miss Lizzie ESTES, both of Clay County.

6 June 1873: A letter from Howard Everett dated June 3rd "that my old friends might know my whereabouts, I will state that I own property in Pleasant Hill, Cass Co. I was born in Virginia Oct 24, 1793. I moved to Kentucky in 1810; to Mo. in 1819; built the second cabin in this county on Crockett's Creek in what is now Clay Co. and was then in Howard Co. Old PETER ESTES and Cornelius Gill had built the first cabin on Rush Creek, just below the residence of the late James Walker. I moved to my cabin April 3, 1820, poor except for having a good wife and a pair of twins, Grandison and Tilman Everett. In July, we got into an Indian fight. We killed two and wounded one, but the Indians were too much for us and we had to fort for defense. Signed: Howard W Everett.

22 August 1873: Sheriff's Sale in Partition--- JACKSON ESTES, JEFFERSON ESTES, William H. Pence, Lucinda Creek, and Sidney Creek, John Corum and Emaline Corum - against - Eliam ? Courtney, Archibald C. Courtney, Jefferson Pence, William H. Pence, Jr.; Josiah Pence, Lucinda Pence, America Pence, Rob't Y. Pence, Emeline E. Pence. Harris E. Pence and Adam Pence.

29 August 1873: Died in this City on the 23rd inst, Mrs. MARY D. ESTES, widow of the late FOUNTAIN ESTES, in her 72nd year. Had been a citizen of Liberty about 40 years.

8 May 1874: Married May 13th by the Elder Asa N. Bird, Mr. David L. Adams of Jefferson Co., Kansas and Miss REBECCA J. ESTES, dau of Mr. BERRY ESTES, of this county. (Clay)

OLD MEN OF CLAY COUNTY, MISSOURI IN 1870:

BARTLEY ESTES. I was born in Fayette Co., Kentucky on the 31st day of March 1795. My father was a native of Spottsylvania Co., Va. and settled in Ky. at a very early day. My father and two paternal uncles were soldiers in the Continental Army during the Revolutionary War. One of my uncles was wounded in seven different parts of his body in one battle. I had two brothers in the War of 1812, and both were in the Battle of the River Raisin and there taken prisoners. They escaped the Tomahawks of the Indians. One was subsequently in the Battle of the Thames. I came to Clay Co., Missouri about 40 years ago, and have lived here ever since. I have been a Free-Mason more than 40 years. I have always been a Whig and am disfranchised.

Married by Elder Asa N. Bird at his residence on 18 October 1874

Jan 8, 1875: Circuit Court - Sept Term. John M. Allen against-- MARY J. C, BARBEE (Formerly ESTES) and Charles M. Barbee, her husband; and ANNIE E. HINDMAN (formerly ESTES) and Hawley D. Hindman, her husband; Sarah F. Quinn and John B. Quinn her husband. Sarah and John Quinn are not residents of Missouri. Object is to obtain partition of land.

Jan 15, 1875 - Died near Little Shoal at his grandfather's, B. F. ESTES, Little Dannie, son of Abraham and Permelia A. BOWRING, aged 3 years 2 months.

March 19, 1875: A list of Clay Co., Missouri Volunteers who served in the Mexican War under Capt. O. P. Moss:
A. ESTES - dead

April 14, 1876: The Lever of Plattsburg says:
Died in Maysville, Missouri on the 2nd inst, of fever and pleurisy, Mr. JOHN N. ESTES, formerly of this city. Leaves a wife and four children.

Nov 3, 1876 : Providence - James A. B. Stevenson is a bachelor no longer. Married to Miss IVA ESTES by Rev. W. A. Crouch.

Married at the residence of the bride's father, Mr. Bandy, on the 19 July 1877 by Elder Jas M. Via, Mr. JAS B. ESTES to Miss Tesanna Bandy. Attendants: JOHN ESTES and Miss Nannie Bandy.

Mrs. ELIZABETH ESTES, of Pike Co., died at her home in Calumet Twp. 26 Dec 1877, aged 88 years. She was born in Bourbon Co., Ky., but had lived in Pike Co. 51 years.

Died in Haynesville on 27 Dec 1877, Mrs. FANNY ESTES, aged about 36, and daughter of Col. Lee Howard of this County. (Clay)

Died on the 23rd Jan 1879 ult, Mrs. MAGGIE ESTES, wife of J. B. aged 21.

Liberty Tribune, Jan 30, 1880: Mrs. Lucy Henshaw, wife of Frank Henshaw, died at the family residence in the northern part of this county (Clay) on Friday last. Aged about 50; buried at Mt. Zion Church, near her late home. She was daughter of the late THOMAS ESTES.

Mrs. Harrison Davis, a most estimable lady, and daughter of the late THOMAS ESTES, died on the 15th (October 1880) inst, aged about 50 years, and buried on the 16th at the family burying ground on the farm of her brother, WILLIAM W. ESTES.

Mr. BARTLEY ESTES died near this city on the 10th inst. (Liberty, Missouri, July 1880) and was buried at Little Shoal Church the next day. He was born in Fayette Co., Kentucky on the 31st day of March 1795. His father was a native of Spottsylvania Co., Virginia and settled in Ky. at a very early day and was a soldier in the Continental Army during the Revolutionary War. Mr. ESTES settled in Clay Co. 50 years ago and has resided here ever since. He had been a Mason over 50 years and was buried by the Order.

Liberty Tribune, 30 Sept 1881: Died near this city on Sunday night after a short illness, Mrs. KATE ESTES, wife of WILLIAM W. ESTES, and daughter of the late David Lincoln, aged about 48. Buried in the New Cemetery on Monday. Rev. Asa N. Bird, Minister.

Liberty Tribune, Jan 6, 1882: Circuit Court - BENJAMIN F. ESTES, Jr. against -- BENJAMIN F. ESTES, Sr., Mary E. Belcher & Harrison Belcher, her husband; and ABRAM ESTES, JAMES ESTES and LETTIE ESTES, minor children of JOHN ESTES, decd; and Laura Bowring, George Bowring, Annie Bowring, Nannet Bowring, Francis Bowring, and Charles Bowring, minor children of Wm. Bowring, decd.; James Bowring and _____ Bowring, his wife; Sarah Newby & Henry Newby her husband; Charles Bowring; also Dicey Haverty & Wm. Harverty, her husband; Chas. Married 10th Dec 1884 inst by Rev Mr. Perkins, Mr. ELISHA T. ESTES and Miss Etta Mosby.

8 December 1899 - LIBERY TRIBUNE:

WILLIAM W. ESTES, an old and highly respected citizen of Clay died at St Joseph Tuesday. Sent here for burial in the New cemetery. Another pioneer of the county gone. Came here with his parents when only six weeks old and lived to age 78. During the past year, his mind as well as his body became affected by old age and he was sent to the asylum at St. Joseph. He was born 7 March 1821 in Saline Co., Mo. and brought to Clay as an infant. In 1852 he was married to Miss Katherine Lincoln who died several years ago. One child, the wife of James M. Bevins survives them. Mr. Estes was one of a family of 6 children and he survived them all. His father, THOMAS ESTES was a native of Va. and came to Mo. in 1819. WILLIAM ESTES made the trip to Calif. during the gold excitement.

His first marriage was granted permission by his guardian, WILLIAM T. ESTES. I have the names of his children if anyone is interested in this line. I need date of his marriage to Lucinda Hamilton and names of her parents. Is it possible that M. C. ESTES was a nephew of Wm. T. ESTES ??? I also have a copy of Revolutionary pension application of THOMAS ESTES (sometimes spelled ESTICES). I would be happy to copy this for anyone interested for a fee of \$2.00 for 12 pages. Thomas was married to Cynthia ? on 1 July 1812 in Franklin Co., Tenn. He died 10 or 11 Sept in Lawrence Co., Tenn at age of about 72 years. He did not know his exact age. Other names mentioned were: Nancy Estes, age 58 (in 1835) and John Estes and an R. C. Estes. Anyone that is interested in this should write and I'll be happy to share."

JOHN ESTES (1812-1859)

In the Prairie Lea Cemetery at Brenham, Texas, there is a monument that bears the following inscription:

ELIZABETH OWEN ESTES

Born in Calloway Co., Ky Sept 24, 1822 & died Nov 22, 1905

JOHN ESTES

Born in Murfreesboro, Tenn. 1812- died May 1859

Of the ancestry of this couple, little is known aside from the stories that have come down from their son, John Estes and his sister, Mrs. Mary Emily Estes Rouse.

LEE MORE ESTES lived in Murfreesboro, Tenn. in 1812. He was a widower with children, married a widow with children, and in the course of time, with three sets of children in the home, some confusion arose that prompted John, one of the elder sons, to leave home.

John Estes left about 9 brothers in Tenn. It is known that two of them later came to Texas, David M. Estes, whose descendants lived at Weimar, and James, called "Jimmie" whose children, Mrs. Blanche Winslett, Mrs. Kate McAdams, and Tom Estes lived in Brenham. There was also a "Lee" and "Lou" in this family.

JOHN ESTES was a private in Capt. G. A. Wilson Spy Company, First Regiment of Gen. Armstrong's Brigade of Mounted Tenn. Volunteer. Enlisting July 1, 1836 at Murfreesboro, Tenn. and mustered into service at Fayetteville, Tenn. He served 6 months tour in U.S. service, in the Florida War, an uprising of the Seminole Indians. He was discharged at New Orleans on Jan 10, 1837. He was awarded a bounty land certificate calling for 80 acres. He settled in Washington Co., Texas where he married Miss Nancy B. Tom on June 21, 1840, and she died soon after the birth of her only child, JOSEPH LAFAYETTE ESTES. Date of her death is not known but court records indicate that John Estes was awarded guardianship of his infant son on Dec 29, 1844.

JOHN ESTES served as a private in the company commanded by Capt. Frank S. Early in the 1st Regiment of Texas Cavalry commanded by Col. John C. Hays in the War with Mexico. He enlisted near Point Isabel in June 1846 and was discharge Oct 3, 1846.

ELIZABETH and JOHN ESTES had seven children:

VIRGINIA REVOLUTIONARY PENSION APPLICATIONS, by John Frederick Dorman, Vol. 34. Sent by Fonda Baselt. Cont. from January 1984 issue.

ESTES, JOHN. S.8429.

11 Feb 1833. Lunenburg Co., Va. JOHN ESTES of said county, aged 77, declares he was drafted 1 Sept 1777 and marched from Lunenburg County under Capt. Edmund Broadnax in a tour of three months to Williamsburg where they joined headquarters and some time afterward they were marched to Little York where they remained until Dec 1 when the regiment was paraded and the colonel rode along in front with his hat off and discharged the whole regiment.

On 1 Jan 1781 he was drafted for three months and marched in a detachment to North Carolina where they joined headquarters commanded by Generals Greene and Lawson. He was in a short time detailed and sent back to carry some military stores to Prince Edward Court House, Virginia, and remained on extra duty until nearly the expiration of the tour. On 1 April he was discharged.

He was born 7 Feb 1756 in Louisa Co., Va., agreeable to a register kept by his father. He has lived in Lunenburg County ever since the war.

11 Feb 1833. Lunenburg Co., Va. Edward Willson of said county declares JOHN ESTES was drafted 1 Sept 1777 in a tour of three months and marched with him under Capt. Ed. Broadnax from Lunenburg County to Williamsburg. After serving there some time they were separated in different detachments.

JOHN ESTES of Lunenburg Co., Va., private in the company of Capt. Broadnax in the Virginia Line for six months, was placed on the Virginia pension roll at \$20 per annum under the Act of 1832. Certificate 12566 was issued 10 May 1833.

ESTES, LYDDAL. R. 3372.

13 April 1843. Troup Co. Georgia. LYDDAL ESTES of said county, aged 80, declares he is the person named in a certificate in his possession stating: "This is to certify that LYDDAL ESTES served under me Abraham Pen, colonel, and George Harstone, Captain, in Revolutionary War in 1781." The names of the officers were detached therefrom in consequence of the certificate's having been wet. He volunteered in Henry Co., Va. and joined Gen. Greene's command at the battle of Guilford Court House in North Carolina about 15 March 1781. He has resided in Troup Co. Ga. for five years.

26 April 1843. Charles M. Smith writes from Troup Co., Ga. that LYDDAL ESTES served in the battle at Guilford Court House, N. C. He now wears the marks of the enemy on his left thigh, which is apparent to all.

21 June 1843. Troup Co., Ga. LYDDAL ESTES of said county declares he volunteered as a private in July 1780 and was discharged in March 1781. He volunteered under Capt. George Harstone in Henry Co., Va. and the company was attached to the regiment of Col. Abraham Penn, commonly known as Penn's Mountain Volunteers of Henry Co., Va. He was stationed at Henry Court House to guard the magazine and guard prisoners of war. He was frequently engaged in carrying expresses.....

He was born in Amelia Co., Virginia in 1763. He has a record in his possession. Since the war he has lived in Henry Co., Va., in N.C. in South Carolina, and now in Troup Co., Georgia.

LYDDAL ESTES Claim, cont....

They marched to join Gen. Greene but did not effect it. He was in Guilford at the time of the battle but was not in the battle. He has a certificate stating: "This is to certify that LYDDAL ESTES served under me. Abram Penn Colonel and George Harstone Captain, Revolutionary War 1781".

23 July 1845. LYDDAL ESTES writes from LaGrange, Georgia, asking that the papers in his file be sent to Col. Pittman at Hinston, Heard Co., Ga.

15 March 1851. MARTHA (X) ESTES, widow of LYDDAL ESTES, writes from Troup Co., Ga. asking permission for A. L. Gage to examine the papers in the pension office.

Rejected; he alledged one term of six months. The Virginia militia tours never exceeded three months and that in which he was engaged in March 1781 under Capt. Hairston and Col. Penn is known to have been short of that limitation.

ESTES, ROWLAND (ELIZABETH M.). W. 1740.

27 July 1818. Fluvanna Co., Virginia. ROWLAND ESTES of said county, aged 59, declares he entered service as a private in February or March 1777 in the company of Capt. Richard Stephens in the 10th Regiment of Col. Edward Stephens and served three years laving a few months and quit service in consequence of a discharge now filed in the Auditor's Office in Richmond.

23 June 1823. Fluvanna Co., Va. ROWLAND (X) ESTES of said county, aged 64, makes a similar statement of his services.

He owns 34 1/2 acres in said county, two watches, an old horse, one axe and a parcel of books. He is a farmer and is in a great degree incapable of following his occupation from an injury to his back. His family consists of a wife, aged about 51 years, and four daughters, aged about 16, about 14, about 12 and about 10. His wife is crippled.

25 Aug 1823. Fluvanna Co., Va. ROWLAND ESTES declares he has disposed of no property since 18 March 1818 except some articles of small value which were applied towards the support of himself and family. He did not file a schedule until 1823 because he had found it so troublesome to comply with the requisites of the law and had been called upon so repeatedly to swear as he thought uselessly that he had concluded to endeavor to support his family as he had done before without being dependant on his country. But he has experienced of late the effects of age increasing upon him so fast and being sorely pressed for some debts by suit, he has found himself under the necessity of renewing his application. He has been compelled to surrender his property on taking the oath of an insolvent debtor in order to release his body from prison under an execution obtained against him for a horse which he purchased in order to try to make bread for his family but which from age and unsoundness proved useless to him after the purchase.

25 April 1828. Fluvanna Co., Va. ROWLAND (X) ESTES declares he either lost his pension certificate at or near Union Mills in said county or delivered it to John B. Magruder, one of the firm of Timberlake & J. & J. B. Magruder, merchants, to have drawn a power of attorney to draw one half year's pension. He has not since been able to find the certificate.

ROWLAND ESTES Claim..

14 July 1828. Charles Tompkins writes from Fluvanna (Co., Va.) that he is a near neighbor to ROWLAND ESTIS who draws a pension of \$96. ESTIS has property worth \$4000. He has near 700 acres on which he resides, 600 in Ohio, three young likely Negroes to work in the field, fifteen or twenty head of horned cattle, sheep and hogs. He is a notorious drunkard and remarkable troublesome in his family and neighborhood. He beats his wife and grown daughter and drives them off for a fortnight at a time. The pension enables him to buy more spirit. His white family is a wife and four grown daughters. His black is one likely man 25 years of age, one young woman and child, and one middle aged woman. He has attempted to put his property out of the way by a gift to his children.

6 Oct 1828. Fluvanna Co., Va. Charles Tompkins again makes the statements about ROWLAND ESTES property and Negroes and cattle.

26 Jan. 1829. Fluvanna Co., Va. Richard W. Wade declares he heard Charles Tompkins say he intended to stop ROWLAND ESTES from his pensic because he charged him with stealing a sheep and further intended to go before a justice and make oath that ESTES was in possession of a number of horned cattle, with four likely Negroes, which were laboring Negroes, and said "I'll fix him before I go to the western Country."

26 Jan 1829. Fluvanna Co., Va. Michael C. Wade declares he heard Charles Tompkins say Mr. ROWLAND ESTES had from 500 to 700 acres of land.....and would "show old ROWLAND how tell people about his stealing sheep."

26 Jan 1829. Fluvanna Co., Va. COLEMAN ESTEP declares the property above mentioned by Mr. Tompkins is in his possession and has been since 1818.

7 Feb 1786. Warrant 4106 for 100 acres was issued by Virginia to ROWLAND ESTES for three years' service in the Va. Continental Line.

7 Feb 1849. Caroline Co., Va. Aquilla Goodloe declares he was acquainted with ROWLAND ESTES from about 1787 until his death. He was married near the Spotsylvania line about the later part of 1797. Goodloe was present at his wedding. He thinks Parson Boggs married them. Her maiden name was ELIZABETH M. DURRETT. ROWLAND ESTES died twelve or fourteen years ago. They lived in Caroline Co. about two years and then moved to Fluvanna Co. where he died.

13 Nov 1849. Albemarle Co., Va. Isaiah Stout of said county declare he knew ROWLAND ESTES for about twenty years before his death in the spring of 1829. He resided about three miles from him. In 1828 ESTES was poor and in distressed circumstances.

28 Nov 1849. Fluvanna Co., Va. ELIZABETH M. ESTES declares that the Old Testament filed with her petition was in the possession of her family and of her husband from 1798. Some blank leaves in it were used as a family record. She knows of no other family record, her family being scattered in the western country. Her marriage was recorded on one of the blank pages but at her husband's death in 1829 the page was almost entirely worn out and a new leaf was sewn in upon which the marriage was recorded as it had been on the old leaf.

23 Oct 1798. The leaf was inserted and the copy made about a week or two after the death of her husband ROWLAND ESTES in 1829.

24 Feb 1850. Fluvanna Co., Va. ELIZABETH M. ESTES declares her husband ROWLAND ESTES resided in Fluvanna Co. about thirty years before his death, and previous thereto resided in Caroline Co., Va. Continued next page.....

ROWLAND ESTES Claim...

28 Feb 1850. Fluvanna Co., Va. ELIZABETH M. ESTES of said county, aged 76, declares on 23 Oct 1798 she was married in Caroline Co., Va., to ROWLAND ESTES of said county. He received a pension until about Nov 1828 when it was suspended in consequence of an affidavit of C. Tompkins. The affidavit was malicious and false and her husband had before his death prepared affidavits to prove it so, when he was arrested by his death. She applies for the arrearages due her husband, who died 17 Feb 1829.....

4 March 1850. Albemarle Co., Va. The Court certifies that ROWLAND ESTES residing in Fluvanna County about twelve miles from Charlottesville, died in Fluvanna County 17 Feb 1829 and left a widow, ELIZABETH M. ESTES.

6 Oct 1862. Albemarle County, Va. William Summerson, with John H. Wells his security, gave bond for \$300 as administrator of ELIZABETH ESTES.

3 May 1868. Albemarle Co., Va. Marion L. Harlow of Murray (Maury) Co., Tenn., aged 24, declares he is the son of GENNETTE ESTES who intermarried with Ransom Harlow. His mother was one of the three children of ROWLAND and ELIZABETH ESTES. The two other children were REBECCA ESTES who married Marcus Harlow and ELIZA W. ESTES who married William Summerson. ROWLAND ESTES died about 1847 and his widow ELIZABETH ESTES died 2 Oct 1862. He applies for arrears of pension due her. His object in making this petition is to obtain for Robert Woodfin, infant, now 6 months old, and his sister Norella Harlow and Richard Woodfin who reside in Limestone Co., Ala., his mother's share of the unpaid arrears. ELIZABETH ESTES was for several years preceding her death and during the entire period of the war in a state of dotage and of course entertained no political opinions. ROWLAND ESTES and ELIZABETH ESTES were residents of Albemarle Co., Va. Ransom Harlow removed to Limestone Co., Ala., after the death of his wife JENNETTE in Albemarle Co., Va. William Summerson and ELIZA his wife as well as Marcus Harlow are all residents of Albemarle Co., Va.

11 May 1868. Albemarle Co., Va. William Summerson make statement to above facts as to names of ROWLAND's children and where they now live.

10 March 1880. The Pension Office writes to the Post master at Charlottesville, Va. attempting to locate descendants of ELIZABETH M. ESTES, widow of ROWLAND ESTES. A New Testament containing a family record was filed in evidence, It is desired to return the Testament to some member of the family.

(March 1880) The Clerk of Albemarle Co., Va. writes that Rebecca Harlow, widow of Marcus Harlow, lives near Buck Egeland Creek and near the Fluvanna line. Mrs. Summerson and Mrs. Ransom, two other daughters, are dead; the latter removed to the west and died.

ROWLAND ESTES of Fluvanna Co., Va., private in the regiment of Col. Stephens was placed on the Virginia pension roll at \$8 per month from 27 ___ 1818 under Act of 1818. Certificate 6784 was issued Feb 1819.

ELIZABETH M. ESTES, widow of ROWLAND, private was placed on Richmond, Va. pension roll at \$80 per annum. Certificate 606 under Act of 1848 was issued 5 July 1850 and increased to \$96 per annum on 15 Sept 1851.
