JOHN MORRISON & DeLORMA BROOKS, admrs, with Jacob Watson & Joseph Maus security on \$800 bond.

Appraisers: JONAH ROBINSON, MICHAEL SHIRTS, CHARLES McDEVIT.  
Mentions support for widow & children. Valued at \$218.88  
Among the items set off for widow's support are: wheat, rye, hay, oats, 4 barrels containing 81 gallons of whiskey, cask containing about 9 gallons of gin, some bar furniture worth \$18, a cag, barrel containing about 1 1/2 bushel salt, 12 chairs & one pair of dog irons.

Separate accounts are included for Samuel Figgins with Leonard Louy, Daniel Harbaugh, JOHN MORRISON (these items include 3 pt coffee pot, 2 small cups, mending, kettle; the bill with Morrison amounted to 43.79, he paid back 21.85 in goods, whiskey & cash)

Items concerning a case titled Anthony Shaeffer VS DeLorma Brooks, surviving admr. of estate of Saml.Figgins, decd; in an action of assumpsit founded on a promisory note dated 7 July 1827 calling for \$65, due in 12 months.

Several receipts are included in packet; one is from JOHN WILLIAMS admr of MOSES MORRISON dec'd; some are notes signed by Samuel Figgins for sums borrowed.

Final account shows Jonah Robinson paid \$100 on an article, and \$148.50 on acct. Aggregate receipts totalled \$1190.61. Includes in Aug 1836, the sale of 20 acres of land \$395.

SAMUEL FIGGINS & ESTER MORRISON m 24 May 1816 by Azariah Hanks MG (1/250)  
 (she d/o Wm. Morrison who died 1821)

Died Wednesday last [1 Aug] at his res. 2 Miles below town. SAMUEL FIGGINS, INNKEEPER, of billious fever, leaving a wife & a number of small children to bewail their loss. Buried yesterday with Masonic honors in public burying ground. (OHIO PATRIOT 4 AUG 1827)

ANOTHER OLD SOLDIER GONE: We have just been informed of the death of Mr. James Smith of St. Clair Tp. The dec'd lived to an advanced age & was a soldier in the Revolutionary War. For a long time, he has resided in St. Clair Tp, much respected by the community around him. This is the third Revolutionary Veteran who has passed from amongst us within a short time. Not long since, we recorded the death of Philip Bowman of Green Tp, & a little while previous, the demise of JAMES FIGGINS of Wayne Tp. was announced. They were all staunch democrats & two of them continued upon our subscription list til the hour of their death. Honor to their memory & peace to their ashes. [Ohio Patriot 13 June 1845]

History of Columbiana Co. Oh, McCord, 1905, p840:

JAMES FIGGINS an old & respected resident of Wayne Tp where he was born in 1829, is the owner of a fine farm of 80 acres in Sec.28. The parents of Mr.F were JOHN & NANCY (WOLLAM) FIGGINS. JOHN FIGGINS was born in Westmoreland Co VA & was a son of JAMES FIGGINS, also a native of Westmoreland Co. The latter was a Revolutionary soldier & a member of the staff of General Stuben. For his services he was awarded a pension of \$8 a month. His last years were spent with his son JOHN on his farm in Wayne Tp where he died at the age of 90 years & both he & his aged wife were buried in the Lebanon churchyard. John Figgins survived his wife & died aged 75 years. The WOLLAMS were early pioneers of Columbiana Co & our subject's maternal grandfather was a teamster who transported goods to & from Phila. long before the building of any railroads over the mountains. He was a native of Pa & died in Wayne Tp aged 80y. JAMES FIGGINS of this sketch was named in honor of his paternal grandfather, the Revolutionary soldier whom he can easily recall. He attended the district schools in youth & grew up a practical farmer. When ready to settle down, he bought his present farm from his father. The land was originally entered by a Mr.McCOY & MR.FIGGINS has the first deed which bears the signature of Pres. Andrew Jackson. Mr F the elder entered a farm adjoining this one. All this land is fertile & well improved. In 1864 our subject enlisted for service in the Civil War In Co A 143 Regt OVI of which he was 1st corporal & color bearer & was mustered out in Sept of the same year, having taken part in the fighting near Petersburg. He belongs to the local GAR post; politically is Republican. Mr.FIGGINS married, first, to HANNAH KIRBY who was born in Lehigh Co PA. The 2 children of this marriage were JOSEPH & JOHN W. The former was born at East Liverpool in 1853 & died at Allegheny Pa in 1903. His widow still survives with 3 children, DANIEL, JAMES & RUTH, and lives in Iowa. JOHN W. married MAGGIE ROSEBURY & their children are CARL, PAULA & ETHEL. He is chief clerk in the RR shops at Columbus. Mr. FIGGINS married second, SUSAN KIPER who was born in Lehigh Co Pa.
