U.S. 2010 Census Form

The 2010 Census won't begin for another three years, but advocacy groups already are trying to add more questions onto the census form that will be sent to every American household. Every household in 2010 will get a shorter Census form, as required by the Constitution. This "short form" asks all members of every household their gender, age, race, ethnicity, relationship to the head of household and whether the home is owned or rented. There will be no "long form" in 2010, according to present plans by the U.S. Census Bureau. However, many special interest groups want to have their questions added. Maybe it is time that we review the purpose of the census. It may even surprise a few genealogists to learn that Congress never envisioned it to be a tool for genealogy purposes and never specified that each person's name is to be recorded. Instead, Congress specified that the population is to be counted every ten years. That's counted, not listed by name. The purpose is to provide statistics that are used to apportion seats in Congress. In later years, Congress has used census statistics to redraw political districts and to allocate federal funds. Over the years, many "extra" questions have been asked for a variety of reasons, ranging from property taxes and indoor plumbing to education, ancestry and commuting patterns.

1911 Irish Census Details Now Online

After a several year project by the National Archives of Ireland, in partnership with Libraries and Archives Canada, anyone may now search the 1911 census of Ireland by first or family name. The site contains the digital equivalent of 4,000 reels of microfilm and 3.5 million images. It currently holds records for Dublin only, but project organizers plan to add the rest of the country, as well as details of the 1901 census, next year. Each entry includes a person's education, religion, profession and place of birth. THE McHENRY COUNTY FRANCISCO FAMILY

Editor's Note: Over the years, MCIGS has acquired many loose papers and unbound family history manuscripts. During "spring cleaning" at the library, the MCIGS Library Committee decided that these manuscripts should be bound into hard-cover books to provide protection and preserve their contents. Unfortunately, some of the loose papers had already begun to crumble; others had faded ink and were barely readable; several had no margin space required for the binding process. In an effort to preserve the data in these documents, we decided to permanently remove them from the library and publish the data in the Connection Quarterly. All pertinent genealogical information, contained in the originals, has been reproduced here.

John FRANCISCO, his wife Elizabeth and their five children left New York 1816-1819. They moved to Cuyahoga County, OH near Cleveland. Their triplets were born there. John died 1828. Elizabeth and most of her children and their families moved to Jackson County, MI, west of Ann Arbor. They bought and sold farm land there. They also were brick and stone masons.

They started moving to McHenry County about 1844. By 1848, all of their families were living in McHenry County. Elizabeth and seven of her children are buried in McHenry County. I have no information where Sally is buried. Her husband has a headstone in Ostend Cemetery.

Abraham FRANCISCO died at the home of his son, Lyman FRANCISCO, west of this village, on Thursday, January 19, 1899, aged 93 years and four months. Abraham FRANCISCO was born in Pittstown, NY 19 Sep 1805. Was married to Barbara BROUGHT/BROTT and together they came west in 1844, settling in McHenry County, where he has since made his home. He was the second oldest of a family of twelve children; Mrs. Henry FOSDICK; Mrs. Zachariah RICHARDSON; Mrs. HOAG; Mrs. Anthony OVEROCKER; and Mrs. WHITLOCK, sisters and Peter and Chas. brothers, lived in this county. Of the above, Mrs. FOSDICK, Mrs. HOAG and Peter were triplets, and all lived to a ripe old age and raised large families. Mr. FRANCISCO was a stone and brick mason by trade and there are still quite a number of buildings in this village which were built by him among which is the old school building, now used by the congregation of the St. Mary's Church. In politics, Abraham FRANCISCO voted with the Whig Party until the organization of the Republican, when he espoused their cause, since which time he has been an ardent and enthusiastic Republican and cast his last vote in this village in the November Election, and was one of the voters who voted on that day whose combined ages were 677 years, which we named in the Plaindealer at that time. He had a family of nine children, seven boys and two girls, all of whom are alive but his two sons, Henry and Oliver, served in the War of the Rebellion, Henry being killed at Vicksburg. Abraham was a man honored and respected by all who knew him. He lived to a good ripe old age and leaves behind him a name that his relatives and friends can look back to with pride. His funeral was held from the residence of his son on Saturday last and his remains laid to rest in the Ostend Cemetery four miles west of this village.

Assessor Henry KEYES has occupied his elegant new residence and perhaps a little description of it would be interesting to readers of the Sentinel in Algonquin. Beginning with the upright, which is two stories high with eighteen-foot posts, we find on the ground floor a large and convenient room 14 x 16 feet. The sitting room is fourteen feet square with bay windows on the east side and the parlor the same size with folding doors connecting the two rooms. One bedroom downstairs, 10 x 12 feet connecting with the parlor by folding doors. The kitchen is twelve feet square and the dining room 12 x 14 feet. The upstairs contains a store room and three large bedrooms. The lower bedroom parlor and sitting room are finished in natural colors and hard oil finish while the kitchen and upstairs are cherry stained. Everything is convenient and neat and speaks well for the builders. Mr. KEYES and Charles SMITH of Crystal Lake and Ed MORTON of Algonquin who did the painting and handsome decorating. Thus is added another ornament to our town. We might add that the hallway leading from the main entrance is six feet square, the outside door having art glass in varied colors while the inside door has beveled glass. [Woodstock Sentinel 12 Dec 1889]
