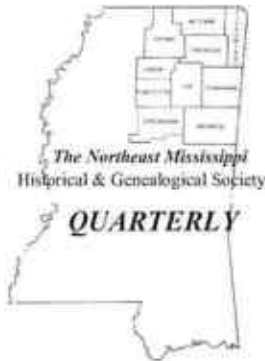

Oren Dunn City Museum Chronicles Tupelo's History

The Oren Dunn City Museum is home to a wonderful collection of historic buildings and Tupelo history. The late Oren F. Dunn, founder of the museum, had a vision to chronicle the region's history. Housed in a 1937 dairy barn, its collection focuses primarily on Tupelo and Northeastern Mississippi history. The museum highlights: Chickasaw

Indians, early pioneer settlement, 1936 Tornado, and Tupelo Agriculture and Industry. Outside there is a pioneer village, vintage railroad equipment and a fire truck, Dudie's Diner, a streetcar turned into a local eatery. The museum hosts various exhibits and events annually. The museum is located on W. Main St., Tupelo,

MS in the James L. Ballard Park.

The museum is open Tuesday -Friday 9 a.m. to 4 p.m., Saturdays 10 a.m. to 3 p.m. Sunday 1 p.m. to 5 p.m. (March - October). Closed on Monday. For more information, call 662-841-6438 or visit www.orendunnmuseum.org.

DEATHS

A.H. Frost died June 18, 1924, Baptist Hospital, Memphis, TN

Catherine Frost died June 14, 1933, W.R. Frost's home, Baldwin, MS

Ella Frost (Marfar) died Sept. 14, 1919, New Liberty Baptist Church, near Burnsville during Sunday services.

L.M. Frost died April 5, 1936 in a tornado that struck his home on Sunday night near Red Bay, AI killing he and his wife instantly.

Louis E. Frost died March 6 from a heart attack at his home near Booneville.
