William 1 Frye was a merchant of Lyme-Regis, Dorset, Eng. Wife Sarah Hill, daughter of James Hill, of Lyme-Regis. Children: William, Tristram, Mary. p. 495 Vol. 49 N.E.R.
 William 2 Frye, of Weymouth, had a sister Mary Harris. He married Elizabeth Humphreys, dau of Jonas and Frances (Cooley) Humphreys. He died Oct. 26, 1642. pa 386 Vol. 39
 Will dated 4-10-1642, proved 9-9-1643. p. 385 Vol. 2

William had a sister _____ Rawlins, and _____ Meigs.

Children: 1. Elizabeth, b. 2-10-1639, died May 15, 1694, m. Nathan Fiske
 2. Mary, b. 9-11-1641 m. Thomas Pierce. Both joined the church at Dorchester 10-5-1659. Suffolk Deeds Records, N.E.R. 2:385, 8:348, 9:171;39:230;49: Savages Dict., Boston Transcript Aug. 15, 1923, No. 533; Pope's Pioneer

William Frye bequeathe to wife and daughters Elizabeth and Mary, to Thomas Harris, Thomas Rawlins and John Meigs, his three sisters' youngest children. His widow m. 2nd Thomas Daggett.

#2736 (1) A.H.H. Jan. 15, 1938. FRY. William Fry, a resident of Weymouth, Eng., came to New England in the William and Francis, 1632; was a son of James Fry, Mayor of Lyme Regis, Dorset, Eng., 1603 and Judith, dau. of John and Thomazine Jourdain. Ref. Newton Gen. by E.N. Leonard, pp. 737-9; Hist. of Guilford by R.B. Smith, pp. 23-26; Virkus Comp. Vol. 5, pp 624, 768. C.H.R.

#2736---(1) A.H.H. Jan. 15, 1938. FRY. Additional note, Fry. The will of William Fry is given in New England Register, 2:385. William Fry of Weymouth to his wife, name not given; to two daughters Elizabeth and Mary; to Thomas Harris, Thomas Rawlins and John Meigs, his three sisters youngest children, "to each of them a kid." Deposed by Thomas Baley and John Burge before the court Sept. 9, 1643.

Mary Fry mar. Walter Harris of Dorchester and New London; had two sons, Gabriel Thomas. Thomas was lost at sea. B.L.B.

#2736---(1) A.H.H. Jan. 15, 1938. FRY. The answer given by C.H.R. March 12, is mislabeled. Mary Fry was sister to William who came in the William and Francis and d. 1642. Have been unable to check the reference, Newton Gen. and Hist. of Guilford but Virkus Comp. Vol. 5, states this William and son of William Fry and Sarah Hill, dau. of James. was James Hill, merchant, who was mayor of Lyme Regis, 1603, not James Fry. See "History and Antiquities of Lyme Regis" by George Roberts, 1834. The Visitations of Dorset show a William Fry but name of wife does not check. E.S.S.

#8183---(1) O.C.D. Jan. 25, 1941. HILL James Hill, b. abt. 1536, was Mayor of Lyme 1603; mar. 1559 Judith, dau. of John Jourdain of Royal Family of England. Sarah (2) b. 1572, mar. William Fry (Frye) of Weymouth, England; came on the William and Francis 1632. A.S.M.

THE WILL OF WILLIAM FRYE: 4 - (10) - 1643. This may be to witness & give testimony under the hands of these whom have hereunto subscribed their names that William ffrey of Weymouth who dyed the 26 of october, 1642, being sicke & weake in body.

To his wife after his decease his house & foure Acres of land being his home lot, & after her decease to his two daughters, Elizabeth & Mary.

To his two daughters 2 acres of mead & sixe acres of land lying by the mill, also to each of them a Goate.

To Tom Harris Thomas Rawlens & John Megg his three sister's youngest children, each of them a kid.

The rest of estate to wife.

Wm. Frye died at Weymouth 26 Oct. 1642 according to Farmer which is all we know of him. The inventory of estate as recorded 36 s, 2 sh, 11 d. p. 385, Vol. II, N.E.R.
