The researcher came up with:

I Dirk Volkertzsen - probably born Norway about 1595 - was in Hoorn - North Holland in 1621 - early immigrant to New Amsterdam - sold home on the east River Road in 1645 acquired 400 to 500 acres of land along "Normans Kill" adjacent to and somewhat north of the section later becoming Eushwick. On April 24, 1677 he conveyed all his Bushwick land to his sons and son in law and probably died about 1680 when he was 80 years old. Had married about 1632 Christine Vinge. Had several children, among them sons Volkert, Jacob and Phillipus.

2 Volkert Dircks (note haow names were reversed) baptised in New Amsterdam on Nov.15 1643 - inherited the bulk of his father's large property - married about 1665 Annetje Philips - he died prior to June 19, 1701, when land of his widow amounted to 90 acres. Of their children three were sons: Dirk born about 1667 Philip born about 1670(untraced) Nicholas born about 1672 (untraced)

3 Dirck Folkerts (Volkers) born about 1667, probably at Bushwick was listed in Kings County Census of 1698 in Bushwick, next to his mother, with wife and three children in the household. In 1701 Dirk and three others purchased 1200 acres in the Harlingen Tract at Millstone in Somerset Co. New Jersey to which he removed soon after the purchase. His later children were baptised in the Raritan Dutch Church. In 1719, Dirk and his brother Philip and Nicholas sold the 164 acres at Bushwick which they had inherited from this father and represented the last of the land acquired by their grandfather. On Nov. 4, 1752, Dirk Volkers, farmer of Millstone River made his will, He died July 22, 1754 in his 87th year. He had married (1) at Flatbush, Maria DeWitt and (2) in 1710, Jenneke Schouwten, (3) before Aug. 50, 1724, Geertje - who died Dec. 12 1759 in her 74th year. Both are buried at Weston Buring Ground East Millstone, N.Jersey.

Miller, went to Oregon in 1847 or 1849- his wife Mary died on the Oregon trail. His full name was James Monroe Fulkerson You said your James was James F. Fulkerson, my great great grandmether had brother James, I don't know what his middle initail was, but it could be your James F. Any information you can send me on James F. Fulkerson, I would Appreciate very much. My gg grandmother Rachel & Joseph Gray moved to Beford Co. Tenn. from Virginia in

1819, he bought land Bedford Co. 1820, they moved to Stewart Co. Tenn. in 1839 where he bought large tract of land, Rachel & Joseph Gray are both buried in the Rose Garden on the old home place in Stewart County. My mother was born and raised there also. The land is still in the possession of my mothers sister who lives in Tennessee.
