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## A FUQUA LINE IN VIRGINIA

THE FIRST FUQUAS IN AMERICA WERE SAID TO HAVE BEEN FOUR BOYS OR YOUNG MEN, HUGENOTS, THE FAMILY WERE SAID TO HAVE BEEN IN THE COURT OF THE FRENCH KING, BUT BEING OF THE PROTESTANT FAITH, WHEN THE EDICT OF NANTES WAS PROCLAIMED, THEY WERE AMONG THE THOUSANDS WHO WERE ABLE TO FLEE WITH THEIR LIVES BETWEEN 1659 AND '89.

THE FOUR FLED TO HOLLAND AND GILLAUME OF GILL (WILLIAM) ARRIVED IN VIRGINIA CA. 1685. AND WHILE HE WAS SAID TO HAVE FIRST FLED TO SOUTH CAROLINA, AN ILL-FATED SETTLEMENT, WE FIRST FIND HIM IN HENRICO COUNTY, VIRGINIA,

THE FUQUA NAME WAS NORMALLY SPELT FOUQUET IN FRANCE AN EXCHANGE PROFESSOR TO THE UNIVERSITY OF MICHIGAN TOLD ME, (CHECK THE FOUQUET FAMILY NEAR MARSAILLED, FRANCE. THERE IS SOME FAMILY HISTORY IN FRANCE AND THEN OF THE FAMILY IN AMERICA BEGINING WITH GILLUAUME FUQUA IN THE COMPENDIUM OF AMERICAN GENEALOGY BY VIRKUS, V. #5, P. #333- HE FLED DIRECTLY FROM FRANCE TO SOUTH CAROLINA, WHERE CONDITIONS AND DISEASE WAS SO BAD THAT BY 1670 HE HAD MOVED TO HENRICO COUNTY, VIRGINIA, WHERE HE MARRIED JANE, DAU. JOSEPH AND MARGARET (HUMPHRIES) EYRE, V. COUNTY COURT NOTE BOOK BY R.A. BROCK, V. 4-7, PAGE 10 (PAGE 32 WAS FROM 1677 TO 1739). WM/ HUMPHRIES CAME TO AMERICA CA. 1650/ THE EYRES WERE QUITE PROMINENT IN VIRGINIA AT AN EARLY DATE. THOSE FRENCH WHO SURVIVED DISEASE, STARVATION AND INDIAN ATTACKS FLED TO VIRGINIA, VERY LARGELY, MANY TO MANIKIN TOWN NEAR RICHMOND, VIRGINIA. WHERE THE MAJORITY OF THOSE FRENCH WHO HAD FLED FOR RELIGIOUS BELIEFS HAD SETTLED. THE ORIGINAL RECORDS OF THESE HUGENOTS ARE IN BAD SHAPE - MANY OF THE EARLY RECORDS ARE MISSING FROM THE CHURCH RECORD BOOK.

MANY OF THESE SETTLED ON THE SOUTH SIDE OF THE JAMES RIVER - A FEW IN GOOCHLAND COUNTY. WHERE THERE - ALSO, THEY MADE A LARGE CONTRIBUTION TO AMERICAN HISTORY.

THE MAURY, FONTAINE, MARYE, JACQUELIN, LEGRAND, SAMPSON, DUVAL, LATANE, GAURE (FORD), BONDURANT AND OTHER NAMES ARE NOTED IN VIRGINIA HISTORY, LIKE MAXEY. THE REVOCATION OF THE EDICT OF NANTES IN 1685 DURING THE REIGN OF LOUIS XIV COST FRANCE HEAVILY IN THE ARTIFICER CLASS OF PEOPLE. THE SOUTH SIDE OF THE JAMES IS NOW POWHATTAN COUNTY.

JEAN FFAUQUERARAN AND WIFE AND TWO CHILDREN WERE AMONG THOSE MENTIONED IN THE HUGENOT, BY THE HUGENOT SOCIETY PUB. #5, 1931, P. #33, A DESCENDANT, JOSEPH M., BECAME A PARTNER IN FORQUERAN, PRICE & TEMPLE 429 E. BROAD & 206 N. 5TH STS. MR. TEMPLE SHORTLY AFTERWARDS WITHDREW - JOSEPH M. DIED NOVEMBER 9, 1911. HE MD., 1871, A MISS PENDLETON.

THE FIRST FRANCOIS SAMPSON OF MANIKIN TOWN, PRINCE WILLIAM PARISH, PATENDED LANDS IN GOOCHLAND COUNTY MARCH 24, 1725, NAMING WIFE, BRIGETTE, ETIENE (STEPHEN), HIS ONLY SON, AND FOUR DAUGHTERS, PRISCILLA (MRS. NEW, WITH SON WILLIAM; ANNA MRS. FUQUA-FOUQUET, AND SON, JOSEPH; SARAH (MRS. MAXEY WITH SON JOHN, AND JUDITH (MRS. CROUCH, A SON, RICHARD.

BRIGETTE'S WILL, PROBATED 17 MAY, 1757, ANGLICIZED HER NAME TO BRIDGET SAMPSON - HER SON, STEPHEN, MARRIED MARY WOODSON AND WAS CAPTAIN IN THE GOOCHLAND MILITIA IN 1714; HE MARRIED (2), ELIZABETH, DAUGHTER OF REUBEN THORNTON, PROBABLY OF HANOVER COUNTY, VIRG<sup>A</sup>.

JOSEPH FUQUA RECEIVED A GRANT OF 350 ACRES IN GOOCHLAND (NOW IN CUMBERLAND COUNTY,, VIRGINIA, 12 SEPTEMBER. 1753 \*ON THE SOUTH SIDE OF THE JAMES RIVER BETWEEN DEEP CREEK AND MUDDY CREEK.

PATENT BOOK 15, P. 121, LAND OFFICE, RICHMOND, VIRGINIA: "GEORGE THE SECOND, ETC. - "TO ALL ETC., KNOW YE FOR DIVERS CAUSES AND CONSIDERATIONS, BUT MORE ESPECIALLY FOR AND IN CONSIDERATION OF THE SUM OF THIRTY-FIVE SHILLINGS OF GOOD AND LAWFUL MONEY FOR OUR USE PAID TO OUR RECEIVER GENERAL OF OUR REVENUE IN THIS COLONY AND DOMINION OF VIRGINIA, WE HAVE GIVEN, GRANTED AND CONFIRMED AND BY THESE PRESENTS DO GIVE, GRANT & CONFIRM UNTO JOSEPH FUQUA ONE CERTAIN TRACT OR PARCEL OF LAND CONTAINING THREE HUNDRED AND FIFTY ACRES LYING AND BEING IN THE COUNTY OF GOOCHLAND AND ON THE SOUTH SIDE OF THE JAMES, TO-WIT: BEGINING AT A WHITE OAK, STEPHEN HUGHES CORNER, RUNNING THENCE ON JOHN MADDOX' LINE NORTH SIXTEEN DEGREES WEST 286 POLES TO POINTERS, THENCE ON NICHOLAS COX'S SOUTH SEVENTY FOUR DEGREES WEST 106 POLES TO A PINE, THENCE ON A NEW LINE SOUTH THREE DEGREES, EAST 218 POLES TO POINTERS, THENCE ON STEPHEN HUGHES' EAST 256 POLES TO THE FIRST STATION. WITH ALL ETC., PROVIDED, ETC. IN WITNESS, ETC. WITNESS OUR TRUSTY AND WELL BELOVED WILLIAM GOOCH, ESQUIRE, OUR LIEUTENANT GOVERNOR AND COMMANDER IN CHIEF OF OUR SD. COLONY AND DOMINION AT WILLIAMSBURG. GIVEN UNDER THE SEAL OF OUR SD. COLONY THE TWELVETH DAY OF SEPTEMBER, ONE THOUSAND SEVEN HUNDRED AND THIRTY-THREE, IN THE SEVENTH YEAR OF OUR REIGN. WILLIAM GOOCH, L.S.

IDEM, P. 860 JOSEPH FUQUA OF CHARLOTTE COUNTY FROM STEPHEN FORD (FOARDE, FAURE), HUGENOT OF HALIFAX COUNTY, VIRGINIA, 1772, 120 ACRES.

JOSEPH WAS THE ONLY SON OF WILLIAM FUQUA - HE HAD SEVERAL SISTERS.

BUCKINGHAM COUNTY, FORMED IN 1761, WAS FROM ALBEMARLE AND APPOMATOX COUNTIES, AND ALBEMARLE WAS FROM GOOCHLAND IN 1744, HENRICO WAS AN ORIGINAL SHIRE. SO THE JOSEPH FUQUA, SR., OF BUCKINGHAM MUST HAVE BEEN THE JOSEPH FUQUA OF THE CUMBERLAND COUNTY GRANT. MARY E. WRIGHT OF THE VIRGINIA STATE LIBRARY WAS A GR. GR. DAUGHTER OF JOSEPH, SON OF WILLIAM FUQUA OF CUMBERLAND COUNTY (OFTEN PEOPLE WERE LOCATED IN BOTH COUNTRIES, SHE WROTE); HER GREAT GRANDFATHER RESIDED IN BUCKINGHAM COUNTY; SHE HAD LAND GRANTS AND TAX RECORDS ON HIM AND HIS FROM 1782 TO 1812 OF CUMBERLAND COUNTY. "I HAVE A COUSIN, MRS. MINNIE WRIGHT BARRETT OF DALLAS, TEXAS, A GENEALOGIST OF THE WRIGHT FAMILY OF BUCKINGHAM COUNTY, VA. DELMOUR FUQUA, A GR. GR. SON OF JOSEPH WAS WRITING A GENEALOGY OF THE LINE WHEN HE DIED A FEW YEARS AGO (LETTER OF 22 APRIL, 1950). HIS RESEARCH COVERED FRENCH CORRESPONDENCE (V. BELOW \*\*; HIS WIDOW REMARRIED. MRS. COMPTON OF ASHLAND IS A DAUGHTER OF DR. ASBURY CHRISTIAN OF LYNCHBURG, VIRGINIA. (SHE FURNISHED THE JOSEPH AND WILLIAM FUQUA GRANTS FROM PAT. BK. 15, P. 121). ARCHIVES, CHARLOTTE CO., VA., P. 108; MARY DUDGEON SELLS WILLIAM FUQUA, 1772, 168 A., CHARLOTTE COUNTY WILLIAM AND JANE'S JOSEPH MARRIED ANNA SAMPSON.

"GEORGE 11, BY THE GRACE OF GOD OF GREAT BRITAIN, FRANCE AND IRELAND, KING DEFENDER OF THE FAITH, ETC. TO ALL TO WHOM THESE PRESENTS SHALL COME, GREETINGS: KNOW YE THAT FOR DIVERS GOOD CAUSES AND CONSIDERATIONS OF THE SUM OF FORTY SHILLINGS OF GOOD & LAWFUL MONEY FOR OUR USE PAID TO OUR RECEIVER GENERAL, ETC. ETC. WE HAVE GIVEN, GRANTED AND CONFIRMED AND BY THESE PRESENTS FOR US, OUR HEIRS AND SUCCESSORS, DO GIVE, GRANT AND CONFIRM UNTO WILLIAM FUQUA ONE CERTAIN TRACT OR PARCEL OF LAND CONTAINING FOUR HUNDRED AND FOUR ACRES LYING AND BEING IN THE COUNTY OF BRUNSWICK ON THE NORTH FORK OF THE ROANOKE RIVER, BEGINNING AT MA(TY)LOCK MAYES CORNER ON THE RIVER, THENCE ALONG HIS LINE NORTH 94 POLES TO HIS CORNER HICKORY, THENCE NORTH 84 DEGREES EAST 80 POLES TO A SMALL WHITE OAK; THENCE SOUTH 51 DEGREES EAST 84 POLES TO A SMALL HICKORY, THENCE SOUTH 87 DEGREES, EAST 56 POLES TO A SCRUB WHITE OAK, THENCE SOUTH 20 DEGREES, EAST 26 POLES TO A HICKORY, THENCE SOUTH 59 DEGREES, EAST 300 POLES TO A BLACK OAK BELOW THE LICK BRANCH, THENCE SOUTH 31 DEGREES WEST 106 POLES TO A HICKORY ON THE RIVER AT THE UPPER END OF WARD'S ISLAND, AND THENCE UP THE SD. WITH ALL WOODS, UNDERWOODS, SWAMPS, MARSHES, LOW GROUNDS, MEADOW, FEEDINGS, AND ALL HIS DUE SHARE OF ALL VEINS, MINES AND QUARRIES, AS WELL DISCOVERED AS NOT DISCOVERED, WITHIN THE BOUNDS AFORESAID, BEING PART OF THE SAID QUANTITY OF FOUR HUNDRED AND FOUR ACRES OF LAND AND THE RIVERS, WATERS AND WATERCOURSES THEREIN CONTAINED, TOGETHER WITH ALL THE PRIVILEGES OF HUNTING, FISHING, HAWKING, FOWLING,

AND ALL OTHER PROFITS, COMMODITIES AND HEREDITAMENTS APPARTAINING; TO HAVE, HOLD, POSSESS AND ENJOY THE SD. TRACT OR PARCEL OF LAND AND ALL THE OTHER THE BEFORE GRANTED PREMISES AND EVERY PART THEREOF. WITH THEIR AND EVERY OF THEIR APPURTENANCES, UNTO THE SAID WILLIAM FUQUA AND TO HIS HEIRS AND ASSIGNS FOREVER TO THE ONLY USE AND BEHOOF OF HIM THE SD. WILLIAM FUQUA, HIS HEIRS & ASSIGNS FOREVER. TO BE HELD OF US, OUR HEIRS & SUCCESSORS OF OUR MANOR OF EAST GREENWICH IN THE COUNTY OF KENT IN FREE AND COMMON SOCCAGE AND NOT IN CAPITE OR BY KNIGHT'S SERVICE. YIELDING AND PATING UNTO OUR HEIRS AND SUCCESSORS FOR EVERY FIFTY ACRES OF LAND AS SO PROPORTIONATELY FOR A LESSER OR GREATER QUANTITY THAN FIFTY ACRES, THE FEE RENT OF ONE SHILLING YEARLY TO BE PAID ON THE FEAST OF ST. MICHAEL THE ARCHANGEL, AND ALSO CULTIVATING AND IMPROVING THREE ACRES PART OF EVERY FIFTY OF THE TRACT ABOVE MENTIONED WITHIN THREE YEARS OF THE DATE OF THESE PRESENTS/// PROVIDED ALWAYS THAT IF THREE YEARS OF THE FEE RENT SHALL AT ANY TIME BE IN ARREARS AND UNPAID, OR IF THE SAID WILLIAM FUQUA, HIS HEIRS & ASSIGNS DO NOT WITHIN THE SPACE OF THREE YEARS NEXT COMING AFTER THE DATE OF THESE PRESENTS, CULTIVATE AND IMPROVE THREE ACRES OF EVERY FIFTY OF THE TRACT ABOVE MENTIONED, THEN THE ESTATE HEREBY GRANTED SHALL CEASE AND BE UTTERLY DETIRMIONED, AND THEREAFTER IT SHALL BE ALWFUL TO AND FOR US, OUR HEIRS AND SUCCESSORS, TO GRANT THE SAME LANDS AND PREMISES WITH THE APPURTENANCES UNTO SUCH OTHER PERSON OR PERSONS AS WE, OUR HEIRS AND SUCCESSORS, SHALL THINK FIT. IN WITNESS WHEREOF WE HAVE CAUSED OUR LETTERS PATENT TO BE MADE.

SALUDA BAKER EUQUA MD. DR. WILLIAM HENRY BROWNE CHRISTIAN AT THE HOME OF HIS AUNT, SUSANNA CHRISTIAN, SECOND WIFE OF MAJ. WILLIAM POPE DUVALL, HER UNCLE, STATED FAMILY HISTORY. THE MAJOR HAD SENT DR. CHRISTIAN TO JEFFERSON MEDICAL COLLEGE, PHILADELPHIA, PA., BUT HE APPARENTLY DID NOT GRADUATE.

McREYNOLDS WAS THEN SHERIFF OF CAMPBELL COUNTY. I WOULDN'T SHAVE THE PAPER FOR THE AMOUNT I OWED MISS FUQUA, CA. \$1040 IN THE SETTLEMENT OF ACCOUNTS, \$1,000 TO \$1100. CHRISTIAN WANTED FOR \$400 TO \$600 IMMEDIATELY... BY 1832 McREYNOLDS WAS A MAGISTRATE FOR JEFFERSON COUNTY, KENTUCKY.

"CHARLESTON," WHERE FRANCES ANN CHRISTIAN SAID SHE WAS BORN, WAS DOUBTLESS IN "LOWER CAMPBELL COUNTY," V. D. BK. 15, -/ 352 DATED 12 APRIL, 1826: "SELL TRACT FOR \$1350. IN SD.
