Both candidates declined the nomination, and on April 1, 1840, another nominating convention was held at Albany, N.Y.:

Nominated for President—James Gillespie Birney, N.Y.

Nominated for Vice President—Thomas Earle, Pa.

This newly formed political party advocated abolition of slavery in the District of Columbia, as well as abolition of interstate slave trade, and generally opposed slavery to the fullest extent within constitutional powers.

At this "national" convention, the name Liberty Party was adopted. The nominees declined the nomination but over 7,000 votes were cast for them in the popular election.

This was the first national convention to adopt the unit rule by which all the votes of a state delegation are cast for the candidate who receives a majority of the state's votes.

Harrison received 79.60 per cent (234 votes—19 states) as follows: Conn. 8; Del. 3; Ga. 11; Ind. 9; Ky. 15; La. 5; Me. 10; Md. 10; Mass. 14; Mich. 3; Miss. 4; N.J. 8; N.Y. 42; N.C. 15; Ohio 21; Pa. 30; R.I. 4; Tenn. 15; Vt. 7.

Van Buren received 20.40 per cent (60 votes—7 states) as follows: Ala. 7; Ark. 3; Ill. 5; Mo. 4; N.H. 7; S.C. 11; Va. 23.

For the vice presidency the 60 Democratic votes were divided as follows: Johnson received 48 votes, Tazewell received 11 votes, and Polk received 1 vote.

WILLIAM HENRY HARRISON

- was the first President to die in office. He died on April 4, 1841, in the White House.
- was the second President elected from a state other than his native state.
- was the fifth President born in Virginia.
- was the last President born before the American Revolution. He was born February 9, 1773.
- was the only President whose father was a signer of the Declaration of Independence.
- was the oldest President inaugurated. He was 68 years and 23 days old when he took the oath of office.
- was the first and only President who studied to become a doctor. He was regularly enrolled in the Medical Department of the University of Pennsylvania and completed sixteen weeks of a thirty-two week course.
- served the shortest term as President, from March 4, 1841, to April 4, 1841.
- was the only President whose grandson (Benjamin Harrison) also became a President.
- was the first President to lie in state in the White House.

ADDITIONAL DATA ON HARRISON

HARRISON ARRIVED BY TRAIN

William Henry Harrison was the first President-elect to arrive by railroad at Washington, D.C., for his inauguration. Harrison left Baltimore, Md., February 9, 1841, on his sixty-eighth birthday. He boarded a Baltimore and Ohio Railroad train and arrived at Washington, D.C., where he registered at Gadsby's Hotel.

HARRISON'S PROPHETIC FAREWELL

In a speech delivered January 26, 1841, at Cincinnati, Ohio, Harrison said: "Gentlemen and fellow citizens. . . . Perhaps this may be the last time I may have the pleasure of speaking to you on earth or seeing you. I will bid you farewell, if forever, fare thee well."

INAUGURATION

William Henry Harrison, the oldest President inaugurated, took the oath of office on Thursday, March 4, 1841, on the east portico of the Capitol. The oath was administered by Chief Justice Taney. Harrison rode a white horse to the Capitol, refusing to wear hat or coat despite the cold and stormy weather. He read his 8,578-word inaugural address, the longest on record, taking about one hour and forty-five minutes.

After the ceremony, he led the inaugural parade to the White House. Numerous floats depicting log cabins and cider barrels were highlights of the parade. Great crowds flocked to the White House.

In the evening, Harrison attended three inaugural balls, one known as the "Native American Inaugural Ball"; another on Louisiana Avenue in a converted theatre known as the new Washington Assembly Room; and the third the People's Tippecanoe Ball at Carusi's Saloon between 10th and 11th Streets on C Street, attended by a thousand people who paid ten dollars each.

Harrison caught cold at the ceremonies and was prostrated by a chill on March 27, 1841. He died of pleurisy fever (pneumonia) at thirty minutes past one on Sunday morning April 4, 1841.

THE FIRST LADY

Anna Symmes Harrison, the wife of William Henry Harrison was taken ill one month before the inauguration and did not accompany her husband to Washington. Mrs. Harrison intended to follow later but was not able to go to

Washington during her husband's brief term. Harrison's daughter-in-law, Mrs. Jane Irwin Harrison, the wife of Colonel William Henry Harrison, Jr., accompanied the President to Washington and acted temporarily as mistress of the White House. There was practically no social activity at the White House in the short Harrison presided there.

Carter Bassett Harrison of Virginia, who served in the Third, Fourth, and Fifth Congresses from March 4, 1793 to March 3, 1799, was a brother of William Henry Harrison.

John Scott Harrison, a Whig representative from Ohio in the 34th and 35th Congresses from March 4, 1853 to March 3, 1857, was a son of William Henry Harrison.

Benjamin Harrison, a Republican senator from March 4, 1881 to March 3, 1887 and President of the United States from March 4, 1889 to March 3, 1893, was a grandson of William Henry Harrison.

His wife Hannah is interred by him. They left 2 sons, Benjamin & Henry. The latter is the founder of the Harrison family of Brandon, a man of fine talents and a judge of one of the courts. He died Sept 24th 1732 and was buried in Cabin Point Churchyard.

Benjamin settled at Berkeley and was a man of distinguished talents - a lawyer; Speaker of the House of Burgesses. He married Elizabeth dau. of Lewis Burnett of Gloucester by John Beard. One son Benjamin One dau. Elizabeth. He died aged 37 years from drinking cold water, after playing a game of Crick. Ball.

Benjamin the son lived at Berkeley, He added Loyalty to the family estate. He married the eldest dau. of ~~Mary~~ ^{Mrs. Betty} Parker.

The 1st of this line, which is distinct from the James & John Harrisons, was Burr Harrison, who was baptized in England 1637, died 1706, and married Mary, widow of Edward Pind. One of his sons, Thomas, b. 1665 called Thomas of Chippewarman, was Justice and Recorder for Prince Georges County from 1741 to 1746, in which year he died. His son Col. Burr Harrison, b. 1699, mar. 31 July 1722. Ann Barron, by whom he had issue, 10 children. The above arms are on a seal attached to a deed at Stafford Co. given by Col Burr Harrison. They are similar to the arms of the Harrisons of Westmoreland and Yorkshire.

It is the sincere hope of the compiler that the recipient of this work will be helped in his genealogical research. It is felt that some of the names herein will fit into the many problems one finds in searching for Harrison lines. This data is the result of endless research and correspondence in an effort to establish the parents of Robert Henry Harrison, a wagonmaster under General Greene in the Revolutionary War about 1778. He was married second to Mary Wallace Williams, widow of Colonel James Williams, who was killed at the Battle of King's Mountain. Family rumor persistently relates him to Benjamin Harrison ("The Signer") and the presidential line of Harrisons. This has not been substantiated to date. Some of these notes may not be without error. Credit and sources are given where possible. Your queries and family data for future reference and printing are most welcome.

THOMAS HARRISON came to America from Cumberland County, England in 1763. He first settled in Chester Co., Pa. and married Sarah Richards in 1764. No date is given as to when he left Philadelphia, Pa. and settled in Augusta Co., Va. He was born 29 Aug 1741 and died 5 Nov 1815. Sarah Richards was born 1744 and d 12 Dec 1812. The date of their marriage was 21 Jun 1764. They had the following issues:

Land Grant Records at Raleigh, N.C. show that a grant was made to Thomas Harrison, Sullivan Co., N.C. in 1782. One was made to Joseph Harrison in Iredell Co., N.C. in 1792, and a grant to Robert Harrison in Cumberland Co., N.C. in 1807. These records do not show that Thomas Harrison, the father of Joseph Harrison, ever left Augusta Co., Va. They only show that one Thomas Harrison was given a land grant and he may or may not have been the father of Joseph Harrison from whom the known Harrison families descended. (This information is from the family records of Mr. Grady Keith of Marietta, Georgia.)

Mr. John H. Harrison of 1062 Mt. Pleasant Ave., Columbus, Ohio 43201 is seeking parents of Jeremiah Harrison who m Rebecca Ramsey in Oglethorpe County, Georgia 19 Nov 1796. He writes the compiler as follows:

"As nearly as I can determine, my most remotely identified ancestor was Jeremiah Harrison who m Rebecca Ramsey, 1796, Oglethorpe Co., Ga. Then there was Noah Ramsey, whom I assume to have been Jeremiah's bro-in-law. Moe Ramsey m Elizabeth Dearing, 15 May 1810 in Wilkes Co., Ga. There was also a Noah Ramsey in Columbia Co., Ga. in the 1805 Land Lottery. On 24 Aug 1810, Noah Ramsey bought 202½ acres in Jasper Co., Ga. from Joshua Moses of Washington Co., Ga. Jeremiah Harrison was already in Jasper Co., for he appeared there as Petit Juror for 1808 to 1810.

In 1811, Noah Ramsey and Jeremiah Harrison of Jasper Co., Ga. were sued for non-payment of a promissory note by Aaron Springfield. On 23 Jan 1823, Jeremiah Harrison sold 101½ acres of land to James Adair.

"My James Harrison (gr-gr-grandfather) m Nancy Chaffin in Jasper Co. on 1 May 1817. Since there were other Harrisons in the county at the time, I am assuming that Jeremiah Harrison was his father and Noah Ramsey, his uncle. My problem is to determine which of the many Harrisons in the original Wilkes Co., Ga. and its later subdivisions, was the father of Jeremiah Harrison and which of the many Ramseys was the father of Elizabeth and Noah Ramsey. There was a Ramsey line which inter-married with the presidential line of Harrisons, but I know very little about them.

"In the old series of DAR Lineage Volumes, I found three parties listed who claimed descent from the Edward Harrison, Revolutionary Soldier of Wilkes and Hall Counties, Georgia. According to these lineages, Edward Harrison was born in England. Whether he was related to the other colonial families is uncertain. There was more travel between the colonies and England than we fully realize, so he could have been the son of a colonial born while his father was visiting in England, or who had returned there for a bride. This is just one line of speculation to be considered. However, I am not overlooking the strong physical resemblance between the descendants of our line and those descendants of Thomas Harrison of Chester County, Pennsylvania and Augusta County, Virginia, who still reside in Georgia."

Page 45: "Harrison Mayors of Chicago - Robert Carter⁶ Harrison left "Clifton" in 1806 with his family, slaves, farm equipment, and animals, emigrating to Ky. He settled on a farm about seven miles from Lexington, probably on land given his father, Carter Henry⁵, for Rev. War activities. His son, Carter Henry⁷ built a home there, "Clifton" which is still standing. His son, Carter Henry⁸ left in 1855 for Chicago where he was active in politics, being elected to Congress and later mayor....He was assassinated in 1893 during the World's Fair. William Henry Harrison was the hero of the Battle of Tippecanoe, a member of the House and Senate and the first minister to Colombia. Appointed Governor of the Indiana Territory, he moved to Indiana and became the ninth president of the United States and was inaugurated in 1841. His was the shortest term of any president, as he died of pneumonia one month later, but his wife lived the longest of any first lady and was the only woman to be the wife of a president and the grandmother of one.

Abstracts from a letter from Mildred Truditt, 1817 South Eighth Street, Trenton, Ohio 45638, who is seeking data on Jonathan H. Harrison, born Baltimore, Md.

"My great grandmother was Susanna Harrison, daughter of Jonathan H. Harrison. She was born 23 Oct 1823, Baltimore, Maryland. While yet a child she moved with her parents to Portsmouth, Virginia where she made her home until coming to Ohio in 1856. She married 3 Mar 1842 to Smith Cannon Herbert, Sr. of Portsmouth, Va. who was born 20 Sep 1818, probably Va. and died 16 Mar 1895 at Jeffersonville, Indiana and was the son of Peter and Elizabeth G. (Luke) Herbert. Susanna died 23 Mar 1897 at Jeffersonville, Ind. Children of Susanna and Smith Cannon Herbert were: Smith Cannon, Jr.; Elizabeth G.; Charles; Susanna or Susan; Chent?; Lucy; and possibly others."

"Now I have what is called the Kentucky line of Harrison: John and Thomas Harrison, brothers, were born in Virginia near Fairfax Courthouse. They came to Kentucky c1785 and settled in Fleming County, Ky. John, the elder, married Miss Seybold and moved to Lewis County, Ky. They settled on Little Fork of Cabin Creek; John Harrison's children were: (1) Burr J. Harrison; (2) Cuthbert; (3) Bartley; (4) Alfred; (5) Elvan; (6) Rebecca; (7) Mary; and (8) Mabel, (d young). Alfred; Mary; and Rebecca emigrated to the west; the others remained in Lewis Co."

"Burr Harrison, son of John, born 31 Dec 1794; died at age 82. His children were: Alfred; Andrew, Jr.; John; Bartley; George who died young; Malinda; Lucinda; Alice A.; and Mabel; who also died young. Alfred, son of Burr, born 19 Dec 1821; married Colilda Johnson on 7 Apr 1845 - She died (no date given) and he married her sister on 15 May 1853 (second wife's name not given). Alfred Harrison's children: (1) Virginia who married Albert Cox and had 8 children; (2) Sarentha, who married W. F. McKellup and had four children; (3) Alice A. who married Henry Staley and had one child; (4) Henrietta who married George Sanders and had two children; (5) Phoebe E. who married J. W. Rand and had three children, one of them named Ed; (6) Nellie J. who married Bernice Reeder."

"The Obituary of Alfred Harrison:

'One of the county's best known citizens, Alfred Harrison, passed away on January 23, 1902. He was born 1821 and had been County Surveyor since he had attained his majority. His grandfather, John Harrison, came to Lewis County, Kentucky from James River County, Virginia, and was a first cousin of President William Henry Harrison. He worked at surveying as a young man under John P. Fell who made the first map of the town of Vanceburg, Lewis County, Kentucky in 1859. Probably no man ever knew as much about Lewis County property lines as did Mr. Harrison, who was in the long course of his profession, probably enjoyed the acquaintance of practically everyone in the county. The late Ed Rand was a grandson and we had occasion to make a like statement as to his vast knowledge of property lines, land marks, etc. at the time of his lamentable passing last year. Mr. Harrison was the father of Mrs. Nellie Harrison Reeder, sole survivor among six children."

HARRISON FAMILY RESEARCH

Some Descendants of Robert Henry Harrison, Revolutionary Soldier and wife, Mary Wallace Williams (widow of Col. James Williams, killed at the Battle of King's Mountain): His son Dr. Jesse J. Harrison was born 12 Sep 1791, Greenville, South Carolina and died 25 Nov 1860. He is buried at Sanders Chapel, a short distance from Union City, Obion County, Tennessee. Dr. Jesse J. Harrison married first, a Miss Wilson and had a son, Isaac and a daughter, Mary W. Harrison, who was called Polly. She married Joel Donegan (Dunnigan).

Dr. Jesse J. Harrison married second to Margaret Ann Hulsey, daughter of Major Elijah and Sarah Naomi (Choate) Hulsey. Margaret Ann Hulsey was b 15 Dec 1806 at Milledgeville, Baldwin County, Ga. and died 23 Mar 1897, Columbus, Colorado County, Texas. She was known as "The Mother of Doctors" - at least three of her sons were prominent as such in their area of residence. The following children were born of this marriage:

Dr. Robert Henry Harrison, eldest son of Dr. Jesse J. Harrison was b 13 Nov 1826, Gainsville, Ga. in Hall Co. He is buried at Columbus, Colorado Co., Texas, date of death unknown. He m 6 May 1856, Mattie Towle of Shelby Co., Tenn. Little is known of this family except that they came to Texas about 1878. They had the following children:

NOTE: A check of the 1880 census for Colorado Co. Tex. may show data on the above family. For the sake of clues which may be helpful, the following abstracts are from Goodspeed's History of Texas, 1894. Subject: "Robert Henry Harrison, M.D. - Born in Gainsville, Ga., 13 Nov 1826, a son of Jesse and Margaret (Hulsey) Harrison. The mother, living with her son, Dr. Harrison in Columbus, Texas has reached the age of 87. Her father, Major Elijah Hulsey, was an officer in the War of 1812 and was a participant in the famous Battle of Horseshoe Bend. Jesse Harrison was a son of Robert (Henry) Harrison who was an American soldier of the Revolution and was a second cousin of General Harrison of Virginia. (To date, this has not been proved)

"Jesse Harrison in his younger days was a planter and upon his removal from his native state of South Carolina (Greenville), followed that occupation. He was married in the Palmetto State, but his wife, _____? only lived long enough to bear him two children: Isaac Harrison and Mary, who married a Mr. Donegan. (NOTE: According to Mrs. Steve Martin, 512 North 4th, McAllen, Texas 78501 this was Mary W. "Polly" Harrison (1814-1890) who married Joel D. Dunagin (1808-1897). Mrs. Martin is a descendant.) Jesse Harrison married 2nd Miss Hulsey and moved to Gainsville (Hall Co.) Ga. where he gave his attention to gold mining for some time. He then began studying medicine in Columbus, Ohio and after attending lectures in Philadelphia, Pa., began practicing at Saundersville, Tenn., a small place near Gallatin in Sumner County. He later pursued this calling at Clarkesville, Tenn., Nashville, and Troy in Obion Co., and was living in the latter place at the time of his death in 1860, at age 67. His wife (Margaret Ann Hulsey) was born in Milledgeville (Baldwin Co.) Ga. and ever since 1842 has been a worthy and consistent member of the Baptist Church. She became the mother of eight children: (See page 41) Dr. Robt. H.; Dr. John B. of Union City, Tenn.; Margaret, who is the deceased wife of Walter Irvine McDaniel of Columbus, Texas; Van Huston, a physician of Clarkton, Dunklin Co., Mo.; Nancy, who is the wife of Frederick Fleming of Cameron, Texas; Betty Prouty, who is the wife of Robert T. Bond of Union City, Tenn.; and Jesse J. Harrison, Jr. who is the District Clerk of Colorado County, Texas.

"Dr. Robert Henry Harrison attended schools at Clarkesville, Tennessee and the John Tyler High School in Kentucky, but near Clarkesville, Tenn., and bore off the honors of his class at the age of seventeen. He practiced medicine with his father, Dr. Jesse Harrison at Troy, Tennessee from 1846 to 1850, then to Memphis and in addition to practice became Professor of Materia Medica and Therapeutica.

"After three years, he went to Holly Springs, Mississippi and after a time, bought property in Shelby County, Tenn. and retired from practice, opened a mill and engaged in the mercantile business. At the opening of the Civil War, he organized a heavy artillery company for duty at Fort Pillow which he commanded....."

JOHN BATES HARRISON, M.D., son of Dr. Jesse J. Harrison was born 6 Jun 1828 in Hall Co., Ga. and died 28 Aug 1899 at his home on the corner of Harrison and Wey Streets in Union City, Obion Co., Tenn. He married 1 Oct 1849 at Beach Campground Church in Sumner Co., Tenn. (Between Gallatin and Hendersonville) to SARAH ANN JOYNER, b 10 Mar 1827, Sumner Co., Tenn. and died 13 Mar 1917, at Union City, Tenn. She was the dau of John L. and Margaret Ann (Dunnigan-Donagin) Joyner. Their children were:

1. Jesse Joyner (Dick) Harrison, b 9 Nov 1850 near Troy, Obion Co., Tenn. and died 19 Jul 1919. He married Bettie M. Roberts, 9 Dec 1872.

John Bates and Sarah Ann (Joyner) Harrison were the parents of twelve children. Five died in infancy - Tennie died when she was 30.

Robert Henry (Bob) Harrison's first wife, Mollie Inman died when their child was born which did not survive. He then married second, Pearl Splean Childers (widow of W. W. Childers whom she married 22 Dec 1887 by E. D. Harris, M.G.) She and Mr. Childers had one son, George Bell Childers who d 19 Sep 1960 in McKenzie, Tenn. Robert Henry (Bob) Harrison and second wife, Pearl, had one son, Robert Henry Harrison, Jr. who, according to Polly Massengill Brinkerhoff of Union City, was seriously injured in an auto accident - he recovered and two years later was instantly killed in another accident. She also said that Robert Henry (Bob) Harrison married a third time (name not known) and had a son, Edwin Harrison. Robert Henry (Bob) was living in Oklahoma when his mother died in 1917.

Thomas Edwards (Ed) Harrison was named for Dr. Thomas Edwards, a well-known eye specialist of Obion County and friend of John Bates Harrison. Ed married, first, Annie M. Lownsbrough, dau of Thos. H. C. and Martha A. (Fruett) Lownsbrough. She was born 15 Jul 1872. Thomas Edwards Harrison married 2nd Ella Hale on 28 Jan 1902 by R. M. Walker. They had one child, Evelyn Harrison. Thomas E. (Ed) was living in Colorado in 1917.

MARGARET TENNESSEE HARRISON (1852-1882) (No. 2 on page 43) dau of John Bates and Sarah (Joyner) Harrison married 28 Nov 1868 to Joseph Willis Nailling, born 24 Mar 1844; died 23 Jan 1925; son of William Austin and Lucy Ann (Evans) Nailling. Their children:

1. Charles Edward Nailling, b 21 Aug 1870, Obion Co., Tenn.; d 6 Mar 1893, not married.
2. William Austin Nailling, b 23 Jun 1872, Obion Co., Tenn.; d 6 Sep 1952. He married 5 Sep 1895 to Ima May Cary - (See paragraph of notes below).
3. John Bates Nailling, b 29 Dec 1877, Obion Co., Tenn. He left there at an early age. It is not known if he married. At this time he would be well over 90 if still living.

Margaret Tennessee (Tennie) Harrison was 13 years old when she married Joseph Willis Nailling - he was 24. She died of tuberculosis when 30. Her son, William Austin, was only ten when his mother died. At that time he determined to become a doctor. At 19 he purchased a drug store at the site of the present Red Star Drug Store at Main and Division Streets in Union City. Several years after his marriage he entered the University of Nashville for "pre-med." He graduated from Vanderbilt in 1900 and passed the State Medical Board in 1899. In 1912 he erected the first hospital in Obion County. He operated the Nailling Hospital until 1945 and continued his practice until 1949. He married Ima May Cary, b 1 Nov 1872, daughter of George and Mary (Turner) Cary, on 5 Sep 1895 at Combs Springs, between Union City and Hickman, Ky. They were the parents of the following children:

- (1) Ima Cary Nailling m 12 Mar 1919 to Frank R. Ring of Newton Highland, Mass. They had two sons and two daughters: Mrs. John Alden Lane; Mrs. Gardner Wood; Frank Ring Jr., all of Boston; and William Nailling Ring of Durham, North Carolina. Mr. Frank Ring Sr. died 19 Jul 1958.
- (2) Mary Margaret Nailling, b 13 Oct 1898; d 1910 at Dawson Springs, Kentucky.
- (3) Mary Arden Nailling, married 6 Jun 1953 to Charles Herman Scates.
- (4) William Austin Nailling Jr. m 1 Feb 1952 to Miss La Vanche Watkins, daughter of Mr. & Mrs. Thomas McCoy Watkins, at Memphis, Tenn. by Rev. In July, 1958, he attended a meeting of the American College of Surgeons in Stockholm, Sweden the first week of July and represented the southeastern United States at internat'l Cancer Congress the second week in London. His wife's name is not known but they have nine children.
- (8) Benjamin Nailling, birthdate not known - died in infancy.

ELIZABETH (BETTIE) HARRISON (1860-1940) (No. 4 on page 43), daughter of John Bates and Sarah (Joyner) Harrison married in Union City, Tenn., 16 Oct 1875 to John Edwin Massengill, brother of William Z. Massengill. John Edwin was born 7 Jun 1853, and died 11 Jul 1894. He is buried in old City Cemetery at Union City, Tennessee. He was the son of William Porter and Martha M. (Boothe) Massengill. Elizabeth (Bettie) Harrison Massengill married second to Reuben (Rube) Green, who died in Tampa, Fla., 3 Dec 1941 at age 82. She died 8 Nov 1940 at Tampa, Florida.

The following are notes received from Mrs. Seth Harper of Union City, Tennessee: According to Massengill Records: John Edwin must have been the son of William Porter and Martha M. (Boothe) Massengill. They married 15 Dec 1846. William Porter was born 20 Mar 1819 in East Tennessee; died 8 Mar 1877 (Came to West Tennessee in 1867 and practiced medicine). Martha M. Boothe was born 13 Feb 1825; and died 28 Jun 1854.

John Edwin Massengill was born 6 Jun 1853 (tombstone has June 7th 1853) He married Elizabeth (Bettie) Harrison on October 16th, 1875. Uncle Johnie, as the family called him, worked for the Wrought Iron Range Company and he and Aunt Bettie traveled all over the country - it is not known whether their children were born in Union City, Tennessee or elsewhere.

Love Massengill, the youngest of their four children, lived to maturity. She was a beautiful woman, with pretty eyes and beautiful blonde hair. She married Oscar Turner of Dyersburg, Tenn. and was living there, probably, when she died. She and Oscar Turner had two children: Dixie and Oscar Turner, Jr. Love was only 27 when she died; she is buried in old City Cemetery, Union City, Tenn.

Obituaries:

"Love Massengill, born 27 June 1888 in Rockwell, Indiana, married Oscar Turner, April 12th, 1905. She died in Memphis, Tennessee, Saturday 19 June 1915, after an illness of two weeks. She had two children, Dixie and Oscar Turner. Her funeral was conducted at the home of Mr. and Mrs. W. Z. Massengill and she was buried in the City Cemetery." (Union City, Tennessee)

"Rube Green, 82, former resident of Union City, died 3 Dec 1941, in Tampa, Fla. Mr. Green has been an invalid for the past year. He leaves his daughter, Mrs. Willow Thrash of Tampa, Florida. His wife, the former Bettie Harrison Massengill, died a year ago."

Guy Sandmyer Nailling, second son of Ina Harrison and Willis J. Nailling was born 6 Mar 1891 in Union City, Tenn. He was married to Grace Spann of Tiptonville, Tennessee on 12 Sep 1912 in that city (Lake County). He died 28 Apr 1957, age 66, in Miami, Fla. DR. VAN HUSTON HARRISON, physician, surgeon, and druggist of Clarkton, New Madrid Co., Mo. was born 22 Jul. 1834, Sumner Co., Tenn., son of Dr. Jesse J. and Margaret Ann (Hulse) Harrison. They located in Sumner Co., Tenn. where Dr. Jesse practiced his profession until 1844 when they moved to Obion Co., Tenn. where he resided until his death in 1860.

Van Huston Harrison grew to manhood in Obion County and was educated in the Troy High School. He began studying medicine under his father at an early day and took his first course of lectures at Memphis Medical College during the winters of 1854 and 1855. From 1855 to 1857, he practiced his profession in New Madrid County, Mo. and then went to Union City, Obion Co., Tenn. where he remained until 1859.

He then returned to New Madrid County and in 1861 received the appointment of Assistant Surgeon in the First Missouri State Guards. At the end of six months he was examined and commissioned surgeon of the Confederate Service but his health being very poor at this time, resigned in 1862 and took up his residence in Clarkton. In 1868 and 1869, he attended Missouri Medical College at St. Louis and was graduated from that institution. He engaged in the drug business in 1867 and carried a stock of drugs almost continuously with his practice.

In 1862, he married Roxanna Stokes (See Stokes family below) and they became the parents of nine children:
