ROELOF JANSEN' b c 1595, Marstrand/Maesterland, a village on an island of the same name which is now in Goteburg Och Bohus (Gothenburg), Sweden, an historic section of Norway which was ceded to Sweden in 1658; d 1636/7 when he "got wet in a cold rain, catching a cold from which he quickly died" at Harlem, NY; m intentions |Apr|623, Amsterdam, Holland, to ANNEKE (b c 1605, Flekkoroy, Norway; d 19Mar1663; buried Middle Dutch Church Yard, Beaver St., New York City) d/o Tryntje JANS/JONAS of Maesterland, a midwife in New Amsterdam; she m/2 Mar1638 Dominie Everardus Bogardus by whom she had four children. At the time of the marriage of Roelof and Anneke, they lived at the St. Tunis Gate in Amsterdam, Holland, where he was a seaman. He sailed from the Texel on 21Mar1630 in "de Eendracht"; arrived in America 24May1630 with his wife and three daughters. He assumed the name of Roelof Jansen Van Maesterlandt. They lived for a short time in New Amsterdam; then went to what is now the city of Renssalear, NY, where he worked on the deLaets farm on the east bank of the Hudson River, near Mill Creek (Norman's Kill) for \$72 a year. He also carried on trade with the Indians. There is a stream in what is now Columbia Co., NY, called Roelof Jansen's Kill. On IJuly1632 he was appointed schepens and got a "black hat with silver bands" to wear to denote the office. In April 1634 he was replaced as farmer under uncertain circumstances. Some sources say he "deserted"; others that he had served most, if not all, of his regular period of employment. Records show that Van Rensselaer complained about Roelof's management of the farm. On 20July1632 he complained hat Jansen had "grossly run up accounts in drawing provisions" and said that he thought Jansen's wife, her mother, and her sister "must have given things away." In any event, it seems that Roelof was not a successful farmer and was in debt to the Patroon Van Rensselaer when replaced. The debts were later cancelled. Roelof, his family, and his mother-in-law moved to New Amsterdam about 1634 where he was an employee of the West India Co. In 1636 he received 62 acres of land lying along the East River which formed a sort of peninsula between the river and the swamps which then covered what is now Canal St. and West Broadway in New York City. He erected a farm house on his land and died soon after. With her second marriage, Anneke became the first Norwegian "predikantsvrouw" (pastor's wife) in New York. She is described by Jan Evjen as a "small well-formed woman with delicate features, transparent complexion, and bright, beautiful dark eyes." He also says that she had a "well balanced mind, sunny disposition, winning manners, and a

No doubt Doud n easier and more affluent life in her second marriage, but her second husband, Bogardus, was "a fearless outspoken person" and their years together were filled with controversy and lawsuits. He was returning to Holland to answer charges against him when his vessel, "The Princess," entered the Bristol Channel by mistake, struck a rock, and sunk with 60 persons aboard. After his death, Anneke was burdened with debts and had several small children. They lived withher daughter Fytje and her husband Pieter Hartgers On 23Apr1652 Pieter Hartgers agreed to pay ground rent of four beavfor a time. ers for a lot in Albany, the patent for which was given to Anneke Bogardus. She built a house and remained there the rest of her life. In 1654 she obtained from Gov. Stuyvesant a patent in her own name on the land on Manhattan Island that she had inherited from her first husband. Years after her death she became famous when her descendants initiated litigation claiming ownership of real estate on Manhattan Island that had belonged to her. They claimed that Trinity Church had illegally acquired title and that the property belonged to her descendants. The land in question was rated in 1972 at a value of some three million dollars. The courts ruled that Trinity Church had legal title. Roelof Jansen's daughters took the surname Roelofs; his sons, Roelofszen; none were called Jansen.

JOHAN^a (Tryntje/Katherine Roelofs¹) ANNEKE JANS² (ROELOF JANSZEN)

(OHAN^a m TRYNTJE/KATHERINE ROELOFS (d before 17Aug1649). Johan was a given name, Teutonic in origin and ususally transliterated by the Dutch to Jan, Johannes, or Jonas. It is not believed that he came to America. His wife was a widow called Tryntje Jonas when she came to New Amsterdam where she served as the official midwife for the West India Co., beginning in the second half of 1634. Her full name was Tryntje (given name) Roelofs (Patronymic, or father's given name) Jonas (possessive surname based on given name of husband) van Maesterland (place name, usually based on the birthplace. Therefore, Tryntje (Roelofs) Jonas Van Maesterland was probably born in Marstrand, now in Sweden, but then part of Norway, to a father whose given name was Roelof. J. H. Innes in his NEW AMSTERDAM AND ITS PEOPLE says that she "was duly sensible of the dignity and importance of her office, which she exercised with great independence." It appears she stayed some time with her daughter Anneke in the colony of Rensselaerswyck. On 4Feb1644 she obtained a grant of land from the West India Co., a lot on Pearl Street where she built a house. On 15Sep1644 her son-in-law, Bogardus, brought a suit in her behalf for another "small piece of ground." The West India Co. owed her money at the time of her death, which her daughters claimed. She died soon after 21Sep1644 because her name no longer appears in the records after that date. The order of birth of her children is uncertain.

Issue: 1 Marritje/Mary Jans; will proved 22Ju161678; m/1 Tyman Jansen (b 1603; d before 1646). For several years from 1633, or perhaps earlier, he was the leading shipwright in New Amsterdam; he received land in 1642 and 1643 which covers the site of the present court house of Queen's County and its vicinity, in Long Island Citv. She m/2 9Sep1646, New Amsterdam, Dirck Corneliszen van Wensveen, probably s/o Cornelis Leendertsen; he was a carpenter who died about 1648. She m/3 20July1649, New Amsterdam, Govert Loockerman (d 1671), a widower with two small daughters. Loockerman came to New Amsterdam in 1633 as assistant cook on a yacht; served as clerk in the office of the West India Co.; was a fur trader; became one of the richest men in the province of New York. Marritje had a daughter Elsie b c 1633/34 of her first marriage; and a son Cornelis bp 17Feb1647, d 1678 of her second marriage. She was a member of the Dutch Reformed Church.




Dear "Cous

Introduction

If you were to visit a major library like the Library of Congress in Washington, D.C. or the Family History Library in Salt Lake City, Utah, to research your family history and genealogy, the immediate sight of rows upon rows of books and card files, with available microfiche aids and indexes. might make you want to give up before you start! It seems there are just too many items to look at and you wonder "where do I start"? Eventually, of course, the library patron does become familiar with the card files and internal library practices but the diligent family researcher will spend countless hours looking for small tid-bits of information. Using the BOGARDUS surname, for example, many thousands of individuals will be referred to in many thousands of records - but "which ones". The surname index in all genealogical libraries will point the direction to quite a few books and records which can be consulted but these will represent only a very small fraction of the total number of library items that are likely to contain the information you're looking for. The fact is, pure and simple, one must literally consult hundreds of potentially applicable books and records to determine whether each one might contain an item that you are seeking.

During the past 25 years, I have visited scores of genealogical libraries around the country, including the Library of Congress, National Archives and National Library of the D.A.R. in Washington, D.C. and the Family History Library at Salt Lake City; and have corresponded with several hundred others. In my search for information about Anneke JANS and the BOGARDUS and BROUWER families, I have had access to many thousands of items of material in the form of published books, unpublished (but filed) manuscripts and loose papers, microfilm and microfiche records, periodicals, charts, pamphlets, etc. To the extent that each contained a reference to Anneke JANS or to any BOGARDUS or BROUWER individual, I made an attempt to identify the item by title, author, date, Vol. and page number and have tried to acquire the pertinent extract pages or full copy of the more important items when such were available. My correspondence with numerous libraries around the country also sought to determine their holdings as pertains to Anneke JANS and the BOGARDUS and BROUWER families and many items were obtained without visiting the library in person.

The purpose of this publication is to provide to those many descendants of Anneke JANS and the BOGARDUS and BROUWER families a research aid which now lists many hundreds of published items - - most of which are not readily identified in any library's card file when looking for JANS-BOGARDUS-BROUWER data - - that I have found to contain varying degrees of information pertaining to these families. It is <u>not</u> complete - nor will it ever be! There are just too many items of material in too many libraries to be reviewed, but it is a beginning. I have had access to many unpublished items as well, but since they would not be generally available to most individuals, they are not included in this publication. Also, not included are references to published church baptisms and marriages; indexes; queries; city directories and census records; cemeteries; wills and other public It is expected that extracts from some of these items will be published records. Keep in mind, also, although this publication may assist many in later. finding the family information they are seeking, the data obtained is Secondary Material and should be used with great caution.

With regard to the BROUWER family, for the purpose of this bibliography, I have attempted to identify only those publications which I believe pertain to the descendant families of Adam BROUWER BERCHOVEN. As is well known, there were other BROUWER-BROWER-BREWER progenitors and if published items clearly pertained to these

other BROUWER-BROWER-BREWER families, they were <u>not</u> included. Finally, the items in this bibliography that pertain to Anneke JANS and the BOGARDUS family will contain an internal mention of their connection to Anneke JANS or BOGARDUS but there are many, many other published items (not included herein) that would no doubt continue the family lines in succeeding generations. It would be virtually impossible to identify all such inter-related published material.

For the placement of the items on each page (A-Z), I have entered each according to the first letter of the applicable surname, predominant location or the subject (noun) of each item rather than to list each item according to the alphabetical listing of the author's last name. The "Remarks" column includes brief comments as to where pertinent data is located within the article, significant errors, etc. Some are less exact than others but should nevertheless aid the researcher to some degree. The following abbreviations were also used in some "Remarks" entries:

- NYGBR New York Genealogical & Biographical RECORD
- GMNJ Genealogical Magazine of New Jersey
- NGSQ National Genealogical Society Quarterly
- TAG The American Genealogist
- DSSA Dutch Settlers Society of Albany
- DAR Daughters of the American Revolution

An entry in the column "AJ" signifies that the specific item contains material pertaining to Anneke JANS and her children or descendants from her marriage to Roelof JANSEN; an entry in the column "BO" pertains to any reference to a member of the BOGARDUS family; and an entry in the column "BR" would pertain to probable descendants of Adam BROUWER, using the surnames BROUWER, BROWER or BREWER. The use of the asterisk (*) signifies that the described ancestry of Anneke JANS being descended from William "the Silent" or the WEBBER family, is in error. The following codes are also used:

- 0 No genealogical data is contained in the item; only name references.
- M A minimum amount of genealogical data can be found in this item, ranging from only the identification of husband and wife and possible childrens names or perhaps a date of marriage, etc., up to approximately 20 names and associated information along a particular family line.
- A An average amount of genealogical content. Between 20-50 identifiable names and associated data.
- E An extensive amount of genealogical data. Above 50.

Where does the story of Anneke JANS really begin? Most authors of historical manuscripts, articles and books on the early settlement of New Amsterdam have seldom discussed her family origin but some have cautiously implied that she was descended from William "the Silent", Prince of Orange, who was later William the Tenth of Orange and William the First of Holland. William "the Silent" was born in 1533 and was married four times. In addition to the legitimate children by each of his wives, the "legend of Anneke JANS" indicates that he also married clandestinely or morganatically to someone whose name seems not to be known and that two children by this union were given the surname WEBBER. It is thus alleged that a son by this illicit marriage, Wolfert WEBBER, married Tryntje JONAS, the known mother of Anneke and of other children named Wolfert, Marritje and Arianetje. Records have proven that Marritje was a sister of Anneke but no evidence has proven that she had a brother Wolfert or a sister Arianetje. It is then claimed that Anneke WEBBER married Roelof JANSEN and thereafter was known as Anneke JANS. Numerous published items, many in the possession of this author, have unwittingly and without proof, thus woven an intricate and detailed family relationship among the early WEBBER-SYBRANT-SELYNS-COCKS-WALLIS families to conveniently strengthen the legendary descent of Anneke JANS from the royal line of William "the Silent". This article will not lend credence to this fabrication by expounding upon these family relationships and it is hoped that future generations of Anneke JANS' descendants will truthfully recognize this legend as "early American folklore". There is not one single thread of evidence to support the descendancy of Anneke JANS from William "the Silent".

Notwithstanding the above, Anneke JANS was a very real person although her fame was not attributed to any personal degree of importance during her lifetime. It should also be noted, incidentally, that there were a considerable number of JANS, JANSE and JANSEN families of this time period - with many daughters named Anneke or Annetje - but there is no evidence of any relationship to the Anneke who is the subject of this article. Nevertheless, millions of Anneke's descendants have become almost mesmerized by illusions of great wealth which surfaced long after her death in 1663, steming from the disputed title to 62 acres of land she inherited from Roelof JANSEN in early New Amsterdam and now the heart of New York City; and compounded by stories of fortunes found in European banks left by her royal grandfather to her seventh generation descendants. More on the disputed ownership of the New York City property later . . . but, "who was Anneke JANS; where did she come from: and what was her station in life"? From the Amsterdam (Holland) Reformed Oude Kerk marriage intentions of April 1, 1623, it is recorded that Roelof JANSSOON, born in Maesterland (Marstrand on the island of the same name in Goteburg Och Bohus, Sweden . . but in Bohuslan, Norway until 1658), a seaman, aged 21 years, having no parents (to grant parental permission), assisted by Jan GERRITSZ., his nephew, residing $3\frac{1}{2}$ years at the St. Tunis gate, on the one part; and Anna JANS, born in Vleckere, in Norway (Flekkeroy on the island of the same name in Vest Agder, Norway), aged 18 years, assisted by Trijn ROELOFFS,

her mother, residing at the same place, of the second part. The marriage record of Roelof JANSZ. and Anna JANS was dated April 18, 1623 in the records of the Amsterdam Reformed Niew Kerk. It has been concluded by some that the given name of Anneke JANS' father was Johan, Jan or Johannes. The first three children of Roelof JANSZEN and his wife, Anneke JANS, are recorded as being baptized in the Amsterdam Lutheran Church as follows: Lijntje, bap. July 21, 1624; Sara, bap. April 5, 1627; and Trijntje, bap. June 24, 1629.

Roelof JANSZ. (hereafter referred to as JANSEN) was among the first immigrants to New Amsterdam and was commissioned in 1630 to farm land in the new colony of Rennselaerswyck for \$72 a year. Roelof and Anneke, their three children, a party of colonists and probably Anneke's mother and sister, set sail for New Amsterdam aboard the ship "Eendracht" March 21, 1630. Roelof and Anneke were parents to two additional children while at Renselaerswyck, their daughter Lijntje having previously died before their arrival in New Amsterdam, namely: Sitje, born about 1631 on "de Laets Burg" farm in Rennselaerswyck and Jan, born about 1633 at the same place. The family resided and worked at Rennselaerswyck until about 1634, or a little later, when they moved to New Amsterdam. Their sixth child, Annetje, born in New Amsterdam about 1636 probably died as a child sometime after 1642. In 1636, Roelof was granted thirty-one morgens of land (62 acres) lying along the East River, which formed a sort of peninsula between the river and the swamps then covering the sites of Canal Street and West Broadway. It is this land that eventually was disputed by subsequent generations of Anneke's descendants as being improperly conveyed to the Trinity Church Corporation. Roelof JANSEN died shortly after his arrival in New Amsterdam and in March 1638, Anneke JANS, then a widow, married Domine (Rev) Everardus BOGARDUS. Domine BOGARDUS had previously arrived in New Amsterdam in April 1633 aboard the ship "de Soutberg" to succeed the ministry of Jonas MICHAELIS, thus becoming the second ordained minister in America.

The 62 acres of land which Anneke inherited from her first husband, Roelof JANSEN, acquired the name "Domine's Bouwerie". United in English days to another "Company's Bouwerie and granted a patent from the Colonial Governor, Lord Cornbury, in 1705, acting for Queen Anne of England, this questionable conveyance of the original property of Anneke JANS became the basis of repeated and hotly contested lawsuits initiated by her descendants to claim their apparent legitimate part-ownership. As recent as the 1920s, when the property was then considered to be worth "billions", some descendants of Anneke JANS were still attempting to obtain favorable settlement from the courts, having been denied restitution in past generations. Nationwide "Anneke JANS BOGARDUS Heirs Association" chapters were established to help finance the legal costs involved and questionable lawyers obtained millions of dollars from gullible, presumed descendants, based upon undocumented or questionable genealogical evidence. Needless to say, none of the lawsuits were ever settled in favor of the descendant "heirs". To study the facts again today, however, one could conclude that the heirs of Anneke JANS were treated unfairly but it is also plainly clear that no such lawsuit should ever be initiated again.

Although the colorful heritage of the BOGARDUS family is principally traceable to the legend of Anneke's "royal" pedigree, albeit illigitimate, or to the factual claims by her descendants against the Trinity Church Corporation, the history of Domine BOGARDUS is certainly not without interest. Because it is known that he attended school in Woerden, Holland, it was long accepted that he was born there in 1607. From early records, it was also known that he was enrolled as a student at the University of Leiden on July 17,1627 and that on September 9,

1630, before he had finished his studies, he was sent by the Consistory of Amsterdam to Guinea (in West Africa) as a Comforter to the Sick. In 1632 he returned to Amsterdam, and, having been examined and ordained for the ministry, he was asked by the West India Company to go to New Amsterdam. On July 15, 1632, he was appointed and signed his name to the agreement as "Everhardus BOGHAERDUS", having latinized his given name of Evert and surname of BOGAERT, being the custom of the period upon matriculation. Records also indicated that he had a brother named Cornelis and that his father's name was Willem. In this regard, as recent as 1969, the documented ancestry of Domine Everardus BOGARDUS was completed by Mr. P.H. Bogaard, of De Meern, Utrecht, The Netherlands, and subsequently published in "de Halve-Maen", the quarterly publication of The Holland Society of New York. The article, entitled "Dutch Ancestry of Domine Everardus BOGARDUS", traces the family line to the early 1300s through the names of BOGAERT, UTEN-BOEMGAERT, BOTTERMAN and HEY; reflects the parents of Evert to be Willem Jansz. BOGAERT and his second wife, Susanna Adriaensdr. van RUTEVELD; and that he was presumably born in Veenendaal, Holland, rather than Woerden, in 1607. This lineage has been questioned, however, and it is expected that further documentation will be forthcoming in the near future. Some facts are unquestionably true, however, For example, after his father's death, probably shortly before Feb. 13, 1616, Evert lived in an orphanage at Woerden and also became a tailor. On June 13, 1622, it is recorded that he was stricken by serious illness which for some time deprived him of his powers of speech, hearing and sight. After miraculously regaining his speech on September 17, 1622, during the singing of Psalms, he resolved to become a minister if he should fully recover. This he did on Jan. 21, 1623, after suffering another attack three days earlier. A man of complicated character, Domine BOGARDUS experienced many difficulties during his ministry in New Amsterdam, especially in his relationship with the Director's General Wouter van TWILLER and the latter's successor, William KIEFT. The well documented accounts of the colonial New York era contain many references to the trials and experiences of these individuals. Following numerous denunciations by both Director General KIEFT and Domine BOGARDUS upon each other, the Director General and council offered to submit their respective charges to impartial judges. Domine BOGARDUS, however, preferred to defend himself before the Classis of Amsterdam and on Aug. 17, 1647, both Director General KIEFT and Domine BOGARDUS sailed aboard the ship "de Princesse" for Amsterdam. The ship was wrecked during a violent storm in the Bristol Channel, off the coast of Wales, and although some members aboard survived, both the Director General and the Domine were drowned on September 22, 1647.

Anneke JANS' fame rests on property and progeny. Her descendants are now estimated to number in the millions and future generations will be no less interested in proving their pedigree to this illustrious ancestor, via the children of her first husband, Roelof JANSEN, or her second husband, Domine Everardus BOGARDUS - - or both, as has already been done. The children of Anneke JANS and Roelof JANSEN were surnamed ROELOFS for the five girls and ROELOFSZEN for the one boy, although only Sara, Trijntje (Catrina) and Sijtje are known to have left producing families of their own. None were surnamed JANSEN. Principal allied families descending from these children are: KIERSTEDE, VAN BORSUM, RODENBURG, VAN BRUGH, HARTGERS, BAYARD, KIP, TELLER, TRAPHAGEN, DE WITT, DE KEY, ROSENCRANS, WYNKOOP, ELMENDORF, SCHOONMAKER, LOW, STOUTENBERG, SLEGHT, KONIG, RYCKMAN, MANCIUS, VAN VLECK, DOREMUS, VAN GAASBEEK, TEN EYCK, DU BOIS, VAN BUREN, VAN RENSSELAER, TEN BROECK, SCHUYLER, GRAVENRAEDT, LIVINGSTON, WENDELL, LANSING and GANSEVOORT. The children of Anneke JANS and Domine BOGARDUS were all born in New Amsterdam and baptized in the Reformed Dutch Church, although the baptism of their first son, Willem, was apparently performed before the first recorded baptism on Sept. 25, 1639. In addition to Willem, born 1639, Cornelis, Jonas and Pieter were baptized on Sep. 9, 1640, Jan. 4, 1643 and Apr. 2, 1645, respectively. All were surnamed

BOGARDUS although only Willem, Cornelis and Pieter left children who produced families with descendants living today. Principal allied families via these children are: BROUWER/BROWER/BREWER, QUACKENBUSH, DEMAREST, DRAKE, BOVEE/BOVIE, STAGG, PEARCE, KINNEY, DIRCKSZEN, VIELE, VAN DEURSEN, VAN SCHAICK, BUCHANAN, VAN BUREN, LOTTRIDGE, ELLSWORTH, VAN NESS, VANDERCOOK, DE DUYSTER, VAN TYNE, PUDNEY, OAKLEY, HOUGHTALING, VAN ALSTEYN, SUTPHIN, HALSTEAD, ELMENDORF, LOW, SLEGHT, VAN DER WERKEN, CLAW, HUYCK, SICKLES, VAN TASSEL, TERBUSH/TERBOSS, BRANDOW, VAN VECHTEN, BRONK, WYNKOOP, DECKER, BRATT/BRADT, GROESBECK, DE WANDELAER, PROVOOST/PREVOOST, FERRIS, LOUNSBERRY, GARDENIER, DU BOIS, CHOLLET, CONCKLIN, FANCHER, SCHERMERHORN, WILSON, WESTCOTT, PALMER, TOMPKINS, VAN WAGENEN, HALLENBECK, SHARP and VOSBURGH. The above family names, however, comprise only a fraction of those which have been identified.

The "Anneke JANS and Everardus BOGARDUS Descendants Association" was formed by the author as an informal organization to keep alive the interest in these ancestors and to create a common bond of friendship among their descendants. Over the past 25 years, many thousands of descendants have shared valuable family information and, as a result, the Descendants Association has been able to help a countless number of "Dear Cousins" to prove their family lineage. It is believed that the Association's library of material is now, by far, the largest collection of published and unpublished data pertaining to Anneke JANS and the BOGARDUS family availabe in the world and it is hoped that it will continue to expand in the years and generations to follow. In this regard, this publication is the first of several that are intended to be published and all who may have an interest in their family history and/or the perpetuation of this effort are encouraged to correspond.
