

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
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THE JONES FAMILY

By Lacy R. Jones, Jr.

(Editor's Note: Lacy Jones, Jr., a former resident of Newport, has traced his Jones family back to Darling Jones who was born in Wake County, N.C., in 1825, probably the descendant of another Darling Jones who fought in the revolution. Darling and his family moved to Greenfield, Tenn., where he is buried in Highland Cemetery, but it is Newport, Arkansas, that five generations of the Jones family consider "home." Three generations have lived here and are buried at Walnut Grove Cemetery, Darling's son, Dr. John Miller Jones, his grandson, O.E. Jones, great-grandson, Lacy, and great-grandson, Lacy R. Jones, Jr., all lived in Newport, Lacy R. Jones, Jr., has been running genealogical records and collecting family stories for some time. The following is an important addition to The Stream of History.)

John Miller Jones was born July 3, 1846, to Darling and Margaret Jones in Greenfield, Tennessee. Little again is known of his early years. It has to be presumed that he grew up on his father's farm. We know he could ride a horse pretty well because at the onset of the Civil War, at the age of 16, he joined up with the Confederate forces and rode in Gen. Nathan B. Forrest's cavalry (Company H) known as "Forrest's Old Regiment, Tennessee Cavalry." His unit was under the command of Col. D.C. Kelly, John rode with Forrest throughout the war. He fought in the battles of Shiloh and Chicamauga. One war story that he shared with his children and has been passed down concerned his horse. Apparently he had brought his own horse "Kirk" when he joined up. This horse was shot out from under him in one of the battles. He decided that what the Yankees had taken away, they should repay. He and a friend from his hometown, who had also lost his horse in this battle, decided to steal across enemy lines at night and "borrow" two new horses. This horse, now named "Kirk II," not only lasted John throughout the rest of the war but also long into his future medical practice. He didn't relate many more stories of his war experiences, but, he must have seen a lot of suffering. After his unit was surrendered and paroled in



Gainesville, Alabama, on May 11, 1865, John left for home "the rightful owner of one horse" according to his parole papers. The friend with whom he had stolen the horse, had been killed in a later battle, and John felt an obligation to stop by his friend's home in Greenfield and tell his family about his death. It was there, in the Patterson home, that John met his future wife, Nancy Carolina "Callie" Patterson.


John attended "Normal School" until 1868, and then enrolled in the University of Nashville Medical School (now known as Vanderbilt). He graduated in 1871 or February of 1872, it is not clear. (His diploma is in the possession of Dr.O.E. Jones III). He named his first son Oscar Eve after one of his favorite professors, Paul Eve.

He moved to Augusta, Arkansas, after graduation and set up his practice. Apparently Callie waited for him throughout his medical school, for they were married on February 29, 1872, in the home of Gilbert B. Patterson, with the Rev. J.M. Baxter officiating. They lived in Augusta for about five years. While there, a daughter, Nora Elizabeth, was born.

In November 1878 a group of people representing the town of New-port approached now Dr. Jones about moving his practice to Newport. The town had no doctor, and the railroad was coming through the town. This would mean the town would grow and so would his practice. He and Callie moved to a house on the corner of Second and Beech streets in Newport. The house, a landmark in Newport, burned to the ground on July 18, 1930. It was still being called "the old Dr. Jones residence" when it burned. Dr. John was very instrumental in the settlement and growth of Newport.

In 1880, an associate, Dr. James O. Bell, and wife Amanda were living with the Jones family. (James and John may have known each other back in Tennessee as there are many Bells in Weakley County, Tenn.) John's daughter, Minnie Bell, may well have been named after Dr. Bell. On May 15, 1880, fire destroyed two blocks of Newport. Dr. Jones had his first office and drugstore destroyed in the fire. The new office, and probably the old, was located on Front Street, with the office above and the drugstore below.

His career in Newport was distinguished by public service. He was president of the school board for 25 years; president of the Jackson County



Medical Association in 1894; county judge of the probate courts; president of the local bank; pillar of the Methodist church: Worshipful Master of the Elks (Jackson Lodge 191, charter member 8/14/1882.); member of the Woodmen of the World; member of the Tom Hindman Camp, United Confederate Veteran; president of the local band; Royal Arcanum; and Knights of Honor.

After moving to Newport, four more children were born to the Jones family: James Laviticus was born July 26, 1874, died April 16, 1916; Minnie Bell (Tilghman), born November 11, 1876, died January 3, 1956; Oscar Eve, born November 30, 1878, died July 14, 1923; and Hazel Jones (Moore), born May 6, 1891, died May 11, 1935.

One of the stories told and passed down through the family concerned Dr. Jones' horse, Kirk II (the one he stole in the war). The doctor's office was located on the second floor of the building on Front Street. The hitching post was on the street directly in front of the building. Although many people came and went to the doctor's office, Kirk knew the footsteps of Dr. John. Upon hearing him coming down the stairs, Kirk would paw the ground, neigh and raise his head in anticipation. Another story concerned Dr. John's sense of humor and his tendency to pull the occasional prank. The town drunk would occasionally fall asleep on the doorstep of the doctor's building. Dr. John would haul him into the buggy and deposit him in front of the house. He would tell the drunk to knock on the door and tell Mrs. Jones that the doctor said to take him in and let him sleep it off. Of course Callie would give him a piece of her mind when he returned home, but, he would explain that he had to keep the man from harm, didn't be? Surviving pictures of Dr. John show him to be of slim stature, dark hair, heavy mustache, and in earlier years, he had a small goatee beard. Later pictures show that he gave up the beard. He also wore glasses.

A mysterious note was found in Dr. Jones' desk after his death. It had obviously been important to him, else why would he have kept it so long? Handwritten in elaborate script, it said "Sacred to the memory of the Crusaders and Carpet Baggers who undertook to rule Newport but got a death blow on Jany 2nd 82. Born July 1st 1882, age 6 months. Peace to thy ashes." One can only draw personal conclusions from this.

Nancy Caroline Patterson Jones (Callie to all those who knew her) was born on the seventeenth of December 1850 in Greenfield, Tenn. Her parents were Gilbert and Mildred Patterson. The Patterson family was originally from Wake County, N.C. A large contingent of them moved to Tennessee and settled in and around Weakley County. She fell ill of muscular rheumatism and was an invalid in the last eight years of her life. She had led an active life in the community affairs and church work for the Methodist Church. Pictures of her show a striking woman, attractive, with dark hair that she wore on top of her head. Later pictures show a tendency towards heaviness. When she died, the schools were dismissed on the day of her funeral. Dr. John, although ill with a cold, insisted on attending the funeral services and died only five days after his wife, from pneumonia. They rest as they lived, side by side, in the family plot in the Walnut Grove Cemetery in Newport.

THE JONES FAMILY


Second Installment

(Editor's Note: The last issue of the Stream of History, Fall 1995, told the story of Newport's first doctor, John Miller Jones, who moved here from Augusta with his family in 1878. One of Dr. Jones' children, O.E. Jones, became a doctor and returned to Newport to practice with his father. This second installment tells about Dr. O.E. and his brother, James, and sisters Hazel, Minnie Bell and Nora Elizabeth (Norene), who lived in Newport and some of whom are buried here.)

The Jones Children

Hazel K.Jones (Rememberences from Carolyn Moore Denty) was born May 6, 1891, in Newport, Ark, when her mother Callie was 41 years old. Her eldest sister, Nora, had just been married and so Hazel had almost been left out of the picture. Very much the baby of the family, she soon became the "pet" of the whole town. Callie became an invalid soon after her birth, so Hazel was pampered and petted by everyone. She had a pony and cart and one day when driving down Front Street, the pony broke into a brisk trot. "Save me! people, save me!" she cried, and some gentleman ran out and quieted the pony. The big "runaway" was reported in the Newport paper. One day at age six, she walked into the local hardware store which featured a little red chair in the window. She had 13 cents in her purse, and announced to the owner that she wished to buy the chair. He. knowing that Dr. Jones would let her have anything she wanted, solemnly took her money and charged the balance to Dr. Jones' account.

She graduated from Buford College School of Music, located in Nashville, Tenn. (Not many young people, especially women, went to college in those days, but *all* of Dr. Jones' children were given college educations.) She married Duncan Lewis Moore, a salesman for the Rose Dental Supply Company. They lived in Little Rock, Ark. They had one child, Carolyn



Moore (Denty), born June 13, 1911. They were divorced when Carolyn was but two years old. She later remarried. Hazel died at the age of 44, May 11, 1935 and is buried in the family plot in Walnut Grove Cemetery.

Minnie Bell Jones was born November 4, 1876, Augusta, Arkansas. In the Jones Bible is preserved the wedding invitation to the Tilghman-Jones wedding scheduled for November 1, 1894. Yet Minnie and Lacy Tilghman were married in the home of Dr. Jones on the night of October 31st, Halloween! Could this have been a hallowed prank? Did they show up the next day to meet the wedding guests, or did they not show up causing a real stir? No one knows.

As a young woman, Minnie was truly beautiful. In later years, however, she gradually took on the appearance of what she was — a prim, hardworking, strict Methodist. Her sense of propriety caused her to fight often with her sister, Hazel, whom she regarded as far too frivolous. (She apparently thought that Hazel had divorced Doc Moore for trivial reasons.) Unlike Norene, Minnie did not testify on Hazel's behalf during the divorce proceedings.

Her sense of duty meant that she was always the family member who could be counted on to take care of someone. Carolyn Moore lived with Minnie and Lacy during the school year from the age of five to the age of 12, and permanently after that. Minnie tried her utmost not to spoil Carolyn, Whenever the latter would request anything, Minnie's automatic and quick response was "NO." Lacy, however, would automatically answer "YES," so Carolyn usually got her way.

Her primness often caused humorous incidents when she lived with the Denty family in later life. Once when several boys were visiting with Jo Denty, one asked where the bathroom was. Making his way there, he encountered the redoubtable Aunt Minnie who asked: "Young man, where do you think you're going?" "To the bathroom, Ma'am," he answered somewhat meekly. Minnie replied: "Young gentlemen do not go to the bathroom in young ladies' houses! Good-bye!"

In the best Victorian tradition, her prudishness may have masked a sensual side for whenever she and Lacy had to be parted he wrote her passionate, tender letters and poems; and certainly, they remained very much in love until his death in 1936. Her strictness, also, was a thin veneer on a very loving nature for she read to Carolyn literally for hours on end.

She produced every children's classic as if by magic. It is only now, in adulthood, that those who knew her realize that she must have gone to the trouble to go to the library to obtain the books. Not the act of a hard, callous woman. Minnie was also one of the world's great cooks. She never wrote down her recipes, relying on a pinch of this and a pinch of that. No one can duplicate her wonderful caramel cakes that she was known for.

Minnie and Lacy built a house at 1917 West 21st Street in Little Rock, Ark., not long after their marriage. A large imposing house, it was quite big enough to house the young Denty family until 1947 when they moved to Hot Springs. Minnie and Norene, living alone in the big house after that, were miserable, so finally the two families were again merged under one Denty roof. This caused some problems since it was hard for Minnie, having been mistress of her own household for so many years, to give way in the running of any house. Occasionally she would throw tantrums by crashing pots and pans in the kitchen. Rarely, she would threaten to leave. But, of course, she never did.

Minnie died of "coronary thrombosis", a complication of pneumonia contracted after she insisted on walking through the snow to have her hair done at the local beauty salon. (Like all the Jones children, once she had made up her mind to something, nothing could dissuade her!) Until then, she had been extraordinarily healthy and energetic. She died at the Denty home in Webster Groves, Mo., and was buried next to her beloved Lacy in Roselawn Memorial Park in Little Rock. (Authors' note: I believe it was Lacy Tilghman from whom the name Lacy was given to my father, Lacy Redman Jones, and subsequently to me.)

Nora Elizabeth Jones was born February 14, 1873, at Augusta, Arkansas. Though called "Nora" throughout her childhood, she insisted on being called "Norene" during her college days. She got her way. She was a strikingly handsome woman with a superb figure who always dressed stylishly. One story is that she never had children for fear of ruining that figure; another claims that she simply never wanted children to cramp her lifestyle. The truth is probably a little bit of both, for she certainly had been both vain and headstrong. It was no doubt typical that, due to error or design, the 37 year old Norene was recorded on the 1910 census as 28! It was also predictable that her dearest friend had been a "Floradora Girl."

In old age in Webster Groves she rarely left the house. Convinced that her beauty was gone, embarrassed that she could not dress more fashionably, she preferred not to be seen by anyone.

She supposedly married five times, being left a widow all but the last time and growing wealthier with each husband. Her first husband was a "railroad man" named T.D. Kinman. She went by the name of Yerger in her later years, second husband "Will" Yerger being not only the longest-lasting, but the most beloved, certainly the most talked about. She married him about 1907, it being his first marriage. They lived in Lake Village throughout their marriage, a town that Will had practically founded and promoted throughout his life. Each year on her birthday and their anniversary, Will would present her with a new diamond. Needless to say, she eventually had a great many. Will died in 1920.

Norene testified for Hazel in the latter's divorce action against Duncan Lewis Moore Whether from sisterly devotion or personal knowledge can only be guessed. "Doc" and "Hazelle" did live with the Yergers, however briefly, in the spring of 1910.

In Lake Village, Norene always had horses and dogs. She was reputed to be able to ride even the most unruly horse and her gentle mastery over her father's spirited animal has already been told. In her later years, living as she did in Little Rock with Minnie and in Webster Groves with the Denty family, she was denied the pleasure of riding. But her love of animals was always evident, not only in her treatment of the family dogs and cats, but in her daily feeding of birds and squirrels, the latter growing so unafraid that they would eat out of her hand.

In Webster Groves, Norene became an avid Cardinal baseball fan. Every night during the season, she would retire to her bedroom to listen to Harry Carey describe the play-by-play on the radio. She kept a written and detailed account of all the "stats" — hits, runs, errors, strikes, balls, you name it. Unfortunately, she often became so embroiled in these details that, when asked, she often couldn't tell you the score!


Apparently very healthy throughout life, Norene began to fail somewhat after Minnie's death in 1956. About 1960, she fell and broke her hip, her mind going quickly after that. The last six years of her life were spent in nursing homes, mainly in Valley Park, Mo., a victim of Alzheimers. On

her death certificate, the cause of death was given as "cerebral arteriosclerosis" with "arteriosclerosis heart disease" a contributing factor.

Little is known about the life of James Leviticus Jones. The only thing that I can pass on is from the remembrances of Carolyn Denty. "A handsome and debonair young man was, I understand, the 'Beau Brummell' of Newport. I have pictures of him always surrounded by young ladies." He attended college in St. Louis where he became a good and close friend of Frank Rand (later Rand Shoes, Inc.). Frank Rand was a groomsman in James' wedding. James married Katherine Morrison, on September 3, 1902, at St. Paul's Episcopal Church, Newport, at 8:00 p.m. Katherine was the eldest daughter of Capt. and Mrs. T.E. Morrison. A few years later, they moved to Tucson, Ariz., because of his ill health. He died and is buried in Tucson, They had no children.

Oscar Eve Jones was born in the old family residence at the comer of Second & Beech streets, in Newport, Arkansas, on November 30, 1878. His middle name was given him after his father's favorite professor in medical school, Dr. Paul Eve. I don't know anything about his growing up years; however, like all of Dr. John's children, he went to college. He obtained a BA at the University of Arkansas, and went on to become a doctor like his father. He graduated from the Vanderbilt Medical School in Tennessee (his father's alma mater), graduating "with high honors." After graduation, he went into joint practice with his father.

On August 6, 1902, he married Francis Redman. Her obituary states "since childhood they had been infatuated each with the other, which grew beautifully into ties of love stronger than death itself." They were married in a very elaborate ceremony at the Methodist Church in Newport, where she was very active. The write-up of the wedding in the paper was voluminous describing every floral arrangement, all who were in attendance and also described the entire wedding ceremony. It must have been quite a "todo" there in Newport. They resided at 619 Walnut Street. Dr. Jones volunteered for the army during World War I, but never saw action as he was still a member of the Reserve Medical Corps at the end of the war.



Oscar and "Fannie" (her nickname) were the parents of two children: Oscar Eve, Jr., born June 20, 1905, and Lacy Redman, born July 15, 1910, both in Newport.

Fannic was apparently quite involved in the church and was a highly respected woman in her community. Pictures that I have of her show a portly woman, the type of woman one would expect to be a great "granny." I feel a loss at not having known her as my grandmother. I have the newspaper clippings of her obituary. Many expletives were written about her such as, "A saint has fallen, a friend has gone and a home, a church and community is bereaved in the passing away of Mrs. Fannic Redman Jones," and "Every church in the city was represented by some member of its congregation (at her funeral)."

Some of the offices she held were: superintendent of social services for the Missionary Society, Sunday School teacher for the first year juniors, chairwoman for the department of personal service in the W.C.T.U. (she probably is looking down on me now shaking her head in disapproval), chairwoman of the committee for the physical examination of the children for the School Improvement Association, had charge of the Wesley House located near White River. Fannie died in her home on July 12, 1921 and is buried next to her husband, Dr. O.E. Jones in the family plot at Walnut Grove Cemetery in Newport.

Fannie had a brother, S.P. Redman, about whom nothing is known, a sister, Minnie Redman and her father was Parmenas Flocker Redman (d. 7-16-1901). Minnie was to serve as "grandmother" to the Jones' two sons, Oscar, Jr., and Lacy, and to their children as well, Minnie and Harry G. Brandenburg moved into the Jones family home after the death of Fannie to help with the house and the raising of the two children. Minnie was known as "Auntie" and her husband, Harry, as "Uncle" to us all. (They were married on June 13, 1903). Dr. Jones had planned to attend a veterans convention, and a few hours before train time announced that he would like to take a nap and to wake him in two hours. When Auntie attempted to wake him two hours later she found that he had died in his sleep. They later determined it was his heart. He died only two years after losing Fannie. He was only 44 years old.

HON. SPENCER C. JONES

HON. SPENCER C. JONES, president of the Montgomery County National Bank of Rockville, is one of the most influential and progressive business men of this section of Maryland.



The parents of our subject were Rev. J. H. and Elizabeth (Clagett) Jones, natives of Halifax County, VA;, and Montgomery County, MD, respectively. The father, who was born December 14, 1798, died Dec. 29, 1871. He was a Baptist minister and located in Rockville in early manhood, this being his first pastoral charge. He remained here from 1821 to 1845; then went to Frederick City, Maryland, where he preached up to 1866 and from that time until his death he resided in Montgomery County. The parents of his wife, James and Susanna (Hawkins) Clagett, both natives of this county, were from old families here, their ancestors having settled in the county prior to the Revolution.

The paternal grandfather of our subject, Major Charles Jones, was born February 2, 1758, in Ireland, and upon account of political views he was obliged to leave his native land in 1793. He died in October 1811. He and his wife, Prudence (Hawkins) Jones, are buried in the Congressional Cemetery at Washington. He was a son of Thomas and Hannah Jones, the former a son or Robert Jones, who was a native of Wales, and who removed to Ireland in 1690.

Spencer C. Jones was born in Rockville, MD, July 3, 1836, and here passed the first nine years of his life, then removing with his family to Frederick City. He enlisted in the First Maryland Confederate Cavalry and served from t; he organization of that command to the close of the conflict, participating in innumerable hard and daring campaigns and battles. Prior to his enlistment he had been arrested as a symmpathizer with the Confederacy and was held as a prisoner for eight months, being at various periods in the city jail at Baltimore, at Fort McHenry and Fort Delaware.

For two years after the close of the war Mr. Jones engaged in teaching school in Texas, but upon t;he adoption of the state constitution of 1867 he returned to his old home in Maryland.

Served as State's Attorney 1871-78; Clerk of the court of Appeals of Maryland for twelve years; State Treasurer of Maryland for 6 years. In May 1898 was elected mayor of Rockville, which office he now holds in addition to that of president of the Montgomery County National Bank of Rockville.

Spencer C. Jones married 21 December 1871, Ellen, daughter of John and Elizabeth Stewart (Buchanan) Brewer. They have one daughter, Elizabeth, who was educated at Hollins's Institute, Virginia. Mrs. Jones died in July 1876.

# Hamilton County

### JULIUS M. JONES

Among the vanguard of early settlers of Hamilton County, few have borne a more conspicuous, useful or honorable part than Mr. Julius M. Jones.

When the writer first came to Webster City, late in February 1857, Mr.Jones was sawyer in the old steam-mill that stood on the east side of the town, near Bank street, just east of the track of the C. & N. W. RR. He owned a small interest in this mill which he had bought on time. First and last the old mill did some very good work. It was there that the business life of Mr. Jones began.

NOTE: Virginia McComas is one of our dedicated genealogists "out there". She has responded to many queries and provided help when she can from her extensive Jones collection.

She would like to hear from those of us who have Jones roots in the earliest-formed Kentucky counties. The following carefully documented data gives just a glimpse of her knowledge in this area. She can take most early Kentucky Jones lines back to their origins in the East and looks forward to hearing from many of us! F.R.N.

FLEMING COUNTY, KY - John Jones m. Nancy Turner 1788

This was before Fleming County was formed, the record is not in Bourbon or Mason counties, either. If John Jones was about age 22 [born 1766], he would be a contemporary of the first three Joneses in that county before it was formed: Col.John Jones; James Jones, Sr.; and Col. Thomas Jones. Stephen Jones b. York, PA, about 1755 arrived Feb.1792 as did Ann, estranged wife of Ignatious Jones. The following information is fully documented.

Some of the earliest childrens' marriages in Kentucky were:

- 1. James Jones m. Polly F. (Mary Finley) Donaldson of Clarke Co., KY, d/o Gen. John Donaldson, stepson of Col. John Fleming for whom the county, river, and town were named, first surveyor of Fayette County, born PA 1735 (not VA as claimed in Kentucky.) Col. John Fleming's ancestors were in Penn. during the 1600's.
- 2. Col. Thomas Jones son of James Jones, Sr.; m. sister of Gen. Donaldson went 1827 to Marion County, Indiana.
- 3. James Jones, s/o Stephen Jones, Sr. m. Rhoda Hammonds, d/o John Hammonds
- 4. Jane Jones m. Joseph Belt, Flemingsburg; Jane was d/o Col.John Jones, sister of Ann Jones [b.1780 WVa, d.Keokuk, IA 1865] who married Simeon Smith 1799 in Flemingsburg. Col.John Jones lived before 1783 in Fayette County (then in Fleming County). When did his wife die in Flemingsburg?
- 5. Jane Jones m. Anthony Swaim in Flemingsburg, s/o Isaac Swaim (NY line; went from NY to Berkeley, WV);
- 6. John Jones m. Eliz. Tribby, d/o Wm. Tribby
- 7. John Craig Jones, son of Col. John Jones, m. Hannah Swaim, d/o Isaac Swaim

Jane was d/o James Jones, Sr. (above) of Flemingsburg & Indiana.

8. John Burk Jones, s/o James Jones, Sr., m. Mary Sousley

Pioneers of Kentucky, continued:

- Jonathan Jones, s/o Wm. B., gr.s/o Stephen, Jones, Sr. who married in Harford, MD 1780 Sarah Bennington and moved to Kentucky in 1792;

p.949 - George H. Jones, born 25 Dec 1823 Caldwell Co., KY, son of Robert Jones (1791-1873) of Kentucky and Eleanor S. Hays (b.Maryland); Robert Jones was in War of 1812. At age 4, with his parents, George H. Jones moved to Montgomery County, MO, then 1834 to Callaway Co., in 1847 to Hannibal, MO. He married 1851 Mary Draper, b.1831 in Hannibal, daughter of Zachariah G. and Eleanor (Briggs) Draper.

p.521 - SAMUEL JONES, M.D., a native of Harrison County, Ohio, was born 26 April 1826. His father, James Jones came originally from Delaware, but was reared in Pennsylvania. His mother, formerly Susan Dickerson, was born in Pennsylvania and grew up in Ohio. Samuel was third of nine children. He spent his youth and early manhood in county of his birth, educated West Bedford, Ohio, academy. Studied medicine under Dr. R. N. Waddell, of Nashville, OH, and practiced under him for 18 months; graduated 1857 Cincinnati, OH, Medical College. To Clinton, MO; practiced until 1873 when he was ordained a minister of the M.E.Church. Rode circuit for the church Huntingdale, Brownsville, Aullville and finally Clinton. Gave up church duty due to wife's ill health; in 1878 resumed practice of medicine. Dr. Jones married 1846 Miss Sarah A. Brown, a native of Ohio. One child, George B. Jones. Mrs. Jones died 9 July 1849. He married again, 14 Feb 1850 Miss Mary Johnston, also of Ohio. Four children: Robert E., James O., Thomas H. and Edward I. W. Jones.

p.521 - I. N. JONES served in Federal army for four years; came 14 June 1872 to Henry County; publisher <u>Clinton Advocate</u> until March 1878. Appointed postmaster at Clinton, re-appointed in 1882.

p.735 - SAMUEL H. JONES, M.D., born Warren County, MO, 27 Nov 1837, son of John Jones, an old practitioner of Warren County, who settled here 1818 from Kentucky. He was assassinated [year not legible in my xerox copy. FRN]. He had tried to have the laws enforced against evil doers, and at the hands of such men he received his death. Samuel's mother, formerly Minerva B. Callaway, was a daughter of Flanders Callaway, prominent among the pioneers of Missouri, and who married the daughter of Daniel Boone, thus making Dr. Jones the great-grandson of the famous hunter. A portion of the original stone that was placed at the head of Daniel Boone's grave is now in Dr. Jones' possession. At his mother's death, when he was but sixteen years of age, he went to Franklin County and lived with a brother. Attended DesPaine's College in St.Louis, and in 1857 began to study with Dr.Powell at Marthasville, Warren Co., MO. In 1859 he attended the St.Louis Medical College, graduating in 1861. Began practice at Miller's Landing. He married in St.Louis, Miss Cynthia A. Griswold, who was born 8 Feb 1843.

Entered service in the army at Osceola, made asst. surgeon under Dr. Dorsey in Col. Johnson's Regt., Parson's Brigade. In 1864 removed to Williamsburg, Callaway Co., MO; 1870 to Henry County, located 7 miles west of Clinton. In 1878 opened a drug store; also dealing in stock and grain. His wife died 8 March 1880. He has seven living children: Lee; Archibald N., Carolina A., Sallie P.; Harvey; Jeffie; and Daniel B.

JAMES JONES

The President's Grandfather

From: "James Jones of King George County, Virginia: 1739", by George H. S. King, F.A.S.G., <u>National Geneal</u>. Society Quarterly (1962?) p.46.

Mr. Coldham's findings show that George Hatcher, a blacksmith, was transported to Virginia in January 1739 and sold for seven years to Mr. James Jones, an undertaker or builder of King George County. Jones died in April 1744 and in September his widow and executors sold Hatcher to Charles Ewell of the same parish.

In his autobigraphy, President James Monroe (1758-1831), said that he was named for his maternal grandfather, James Jones, who "emigrated from Wales" and settled in King George County near the courthouse. Though President Monroe was born after the death of his grandfather James Jones, he was intimately acquainted with his uncle, the Honorable Joseph Jones (1727-1805), judge of the General Court of Virginia. Joseph Jones "son and heir of James Jones of Virginia, Gentleman, deceased," was admitted to the Inner Temple 7 December 1749, migrated to the Middle Temple 2 May 1751, was admitted a Barrister 21 June 1751. Shortly thereafter he returned to Virginia and began a long and interesting career. As an educated man, he must have known his father's birthplace and passed this information on to his nephew and ward, James Monroe.

James Jones of Hanover Parish was described in contemporary records as a bricklayer, carpenter, undertaker (house builder), and ordinary keeper. By purchase and patent he acquired considerable property in the counties of King George, Orange (later Culpeper), and Fauquier. He died testate in 1744 in King George County. His will was recorded in the now-lost Will Book No.1, 1721-1752. Its provisions, however, are recited in several surviving deeds. It was presented for probate by his widow and executrix Hester (or Easter) Jones on 1 June 1744, and there is a detailed inventory of his handsome estate in Inventory Book No.1, 1721-1744, pages 306-313. Included in the inventory of white indented servants was "a smith, 21 months to serve" and appraised at 8 pounds. This was certainly George Hatcher.

Confirmation of Monroe's statement that James Jones came from Wales is suggested by the names which Jones gave to several of his negro slaves:

Glamorgan, Haverford, Pembrooke, Brecknock, and Swansey, Swanses is a portain FORNI/
Glamorganshire, in which are located the towns of Haverford, Pembrook, and FORNI/
Brecknock.

JAMES RILEY J. JONES (1841-1915)

James Riley J. Jones, son of Nancy [Greening] (1811-1855) and Lewis Jones (1801-1875), was born on 11 June 1841 in Boone County, Missouri. He had three sisters and three brothers.

When the War Between the States (Civil War) began, James R. J. Jones enlisted on 17 March 1861 as a Private in Captain Harvey G. McKinney's Company, Major's Regiment of Mounted Men, Missouri State Guard, C.S.A. Military records at the Missouri State Archives show that Private James R. J. Jones being paid for six months from 17 March 1861 to 17 November 1861 at \$11.00 a month plus 40 cents per day for use of his own horse during this time of service.

On 20 December 1861, James R. J. Jones and his brother, George N. F. Jones, were captured in Boone County, Missouri, along with eight other Confederate soldiers by the Union Army. They were taken to Palmyra, Missouri, and tried by Military Commission. Charges cited were:

- 1) giving aid and comfort to bridge-burners, and
- treason against the United States Government.

Regarding the first charge, a party of men on 20 December 1861 had burned and destroyed two railroad bridges at Sturgeon and Long Branch, and portions of the railroad track and sundry cars upon the North Missouri Railroad. The Military Commission found three of the captured soldiers guilty and they were sentenced to be shot to death. James and his brother, George, along with three other Confederate soldiers were also found guilty of these charges, but were to be retained in custody. These soldiers were later transported to City Point, Virginia, where they were exchanged for Union prisoners of war.

While at Petersburg, Virginia, James R. J. Jones had a tintype made while in his Confederate Army uniform. On 25 March 1863, Private James R. J. Jones was paid \$224,00 for his back pay for military service in the Confederate Army according to his military records.

James and George Jones were transported to the Trans-Mississippi Military Department for the defense of Vicksburg, Mississippi. Company Muster Rolls show that James R. J. Jones was under the command of Capt. H. G. McKinney's Company (H), 5th Regiment Missouri Infantry, C.S.A. Company H Muster Rolls show that James R. J. Jones was in the hospital at Vicksburg from April through July 1863. On 4 July 1863, the Confederate Army surrendered to the Union Army, and Private James R. J. Jones was paroled at Vicksburg, Mississippi, on 20 July 1863.

James R. J. Jones apparently returned to Boone County, Missouri, and married Mahala Jane Barnes (1843-1899) on 10 April 1864 in Perche Township, Boone County, Missouri.



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On 9 October 1866, they purchased a 40 acre farm near Dripping Springs in Section 28, Perche Township, Boone County, Missouri, from his mother-in-law, Louisa A. Barnes, for \$300.00. The Missouri 1870 Agricultural Census of Boone County lists James Jones as having 20 acres of improved land and 20 acres of woodland. The present cash value of the farm was listed as \$300.00 and value of farm equipment at \$10.00. James Jones had one horse, one milk cow and eight swine. The value of stock was listed as \$150.00. His crops included 300 bushels of winter wheat, 100 bushels of Indian corn, 300 lbs. of tobacco, 30 lbs. of wool, 25 bushels of Irish potatoes, \$50.00 of orchard products, value of animals slaughtered at \$100.00. The estimated value of all farm products was given as \$400.00.

Mahala (Barnes) and James R. J. Jones had the following eight children:

- 1) Anna Laura, born | April 1865,
- 2) Lee Andrew Jackson, born 1 December 1866.
- 3) Lewis Franklin, born 30 July 1868,
- 4) James William, born 11 December 1871,
- 5) Martha Ellen, born 15 June 1874,
- 6) Mary Louise, born I October 1875;
- 7) John David, born 26 May 1878, (twin),
- 8) Dora Belle, born 26 May 1878, (twin).

Mahala (Barnes) Jones died on 26 October 1899 and was buried in the Dripping Springs Cemetery near their farm. The 1900 Federal Census of Missouri indicates that James R. J. Jones had purchased a home in Columbia, Missouri. Two of hissons: William and John David were also living in this household along with John David's wife. Onn C. Tucker.

In 1905 James R. J. Jones decided to relocate at El Dorado Springs, Missouri. He hoped that the benefits of the spa would help his health. His obituary mentions that he suffered a chronic malady for several years. His death certificate states that he died from tuberculosis.

While living at El Dorado Springs, James R. J. Jones met and married a widow, Frances (Cooper) Graves. on 31 December 1905. James R. J. Jones was listed in the 1910 Federal Census of Missouri as living in Box Township, Cedar County, Missouri. His occupation is given as Farm Laborer who owns his own truck garden. It also indicates that James R. Jones was a survivor of the Confederate Army. James R. J. Jones died on 15 February 1915 at the age of 74 years and is buried in the El Dorado Springs City Cemetery. His wife, Frances (Cooper) Graves Jones died on 28 March 1919 and is buried beside her husband, James.

The author who is a great grandson of this Confederate Veteran arranged through the United States Department of Veterans Affairs for a military marker to be placed on James Riley J. Jones grave. This was accomplished in March, 1995, and the bronze marker reads:

James Riley J. Jones, PVT. Co. H. 5 Regt MO INF Confederate States Army Jun 11, 1841 - Feb 15, 1915

The Southern Cross of Honor is also included on the military marker.

The Jones Family of Monroe County, Ohio

The story of the Jones family in Monroe County, Ohio, began in 1796. In that year, Ephraim and Phoebe Jones removed to this county from their home in Pennsylvania.

According to early histories of the family, **Ephraim Jones** was born in Wales. A recently discovered pension application for Ephraim refutes that statement. His wife Phoebe testified that Ephraim was born 12 August 1751 in Woodbridge, Middlesex, New Jersey. As of this date, the ancestry of Ephraim has not been identified, but early histories given by descendants of Ephraim's son John stated that Ephraim came to America with brothers. The brothers were Loyalists and only Ephraim sided with the colonies in the war. One brother is said to have had his land confiscated in Baltimore. There has been no evidence found to date that supports these stories.

On 19 July 1773, Ephraim married Phoebe Harned in Woodbridge and a few years afterwards moved to Northumberland County, Pennsylvania. While Ephraim and Phoebe were beginning their married life, great changes were happening on the political landscape. Ephraim was called up to service as the American Revolution began. In 1832, Charles Atkinson of Monroe County recalled the service of Ephraim. Atkinson said that Ephraim served under Capt. John Morrisson and his service involved boating provisions up the Susquehanna River. Atkinson stated that Ephraim "stuck to his country while the war lasted and did not leave his post like many others done during the 5 or 6 years that the war lasted in that quarter."

In the pension application, Phoebe testified that in the first part of the Revolutionary War, they moved to Sunbury, Northumberland, Pennsylvania, and Ephraim served first in the company of Captain John Black in the Regiment of Colonel Hartley. The company went up the west branch of the Susquehanna River and was quartered in a waste house. In the next tour, he was in the company of Captain John Morrison under General Sullivan. She recalled that he also went on several scouting parties against the Indians.

Following the Revolution, the family remained in Northumberland County where Ephraim worked as a shoemaker. At some point the family began its migration west. It is most likely the Jones family migrated with other family and friends. Just eight years after the first settlement in the Northwest Territory occurred at present day Marietta in 1788, the Jones family arrived in the area which is now Monroe County. Ephraim was

These obituaries were donated by William Webb. recorded on an 1800 tax list as living in Newport Township.<sup>4</sup> There are no early records to identify their first home, but it was probably near the mouth of Sunfish Creek.<sup>5</sup>

According to Phoebe's affidavit in 1832, the family remained in Monroe County except for two years when they lived on the "east side of the Ohio River in the state of Virginia." A few years after their arrival, the family followed Sunfish Creek further into the interior of the county. Hardesty's History of Monroe County stated that in 1815 Ephraim built the first log cabin on Crane's Nest Fork in Green Township.

Ephraim and Phoebe may have had as many as ten children, but not all have been identified. Their oldest child was John Jones. He was born in 1774 in New Jersey. John lived at Bull Creek, which is in present-day Wood County, West Virginia, from 1792-1800. About 1794, he married Lillie Benjamin and they had four children: Margaret (who married Charles Atkinsons), Phoebe (married Leonard Coleman), Ephraim B. (married Martha Clark) and Jonathan. The family moved to Licking County, Ohio, about 1800 and Lillie died there shortly after Jonathan's birth.

John returned to the area and settled across the river from Sunfish. From 1802-1815, he lived near present-day Proctor, Wetzel County, West Virginia. During that time he married Sarah Hurd. He and Sarah had at least 8 children. The known children are Nancy (George Spellman), Johnson L. (Lydia Schofield), Huldah (John Greathouse), Owen (Catharine McFadden) and Lillie Jane.

John returned to Monroe County about 1815 and lived in Salem Township until his death in 1852. During those years, he served as an associate judge, ran a grist mill, and married for the third time to a woman named Deborah.<sup>6</sup>

Nancy, wife of Nathaniel Hall, is a probable daughter. Nathaniel and Nancy were living next to Ephraim in the 1800 tax list of Newport Township. The father and brothers of Nathaniel resided in Muncy Township, near Ephraim's family. Also in 1804, the Halls are living near the residence of John Jones in Licking County. According to the 1850 census, Nancy was born in 1776 in New Jersey.<sup>7</sup>

A second son of Ephraim and Phoebe may be Abraham Jones who was born 17 Feb 1780 and died in 1838 in Monroe County, Ohio. Abraham did not appear to have any children with his wife Mary, whose last name was possibly Vandevanter. He first appears in Monroe County records in an 1821 land deed. Abraham and Mary are buried in the Jones Family Cemetery in Laings, Green Township.

Asher Jones, born about 1785, is possibly another son of Ephraim and Phoebe. He was listed as serving in the Ohio County, (West) Virginia, militia between 1808-1810. In 1813, he married Mary (Polly) Coleman in Belmont County. He purchased land in

Ohio did not achieve statehood until 1803 and Monroe County was not formed until 1813. Newport Township of Washington County included a large portion of present-day Monroe County.

Monroe County in 1815 and 1817, but appears in the Belmont County census in 1820 and 1840. In 1830, he is enumerated in Switzerland Township in Monroe County. Sometimes around 1841, Asher Jones and family moved to Lewis County, Missouri. He does not appear in the 1850 census with his family, which suggests he died before that date. Among his children were: Charlotte, Sheldon, Jacob Charles, Sarah A., and Leonard C. A biographical sketch of Jacob Jones in 1887 said "... he was the eighth of ten children born to Captain Asher Jones and Mary (Coleman) Jones, the former of Welsh ancestry, and born in Virginia in 1785. The grandfather was a spy in the Revolution, and some years after settled in Ohio as a farmer...."

The next son of Ephraim and Phoebe was Samuel Jones born about 1792 in Pennsylvania. He first appears in land records in Monroe County in 1811. He married Cisner Hamilton and had ten children: Hamilton, Asher, Lewis, Abraham, Jackson, Nancy, Samuel, Sarah, Elizabeth, and Benton. Samuel owned a sawmill and settled in Green Township, Monroe County. He, along with Abraham, was listed with Ephraim as an early settler in that township. The last record of him is in the 1850 census. After this date, most of his family disappears from Monroe County records. Some of them moved to Illinois where two of the sons left biographical sketches in a county history with information on the Jones family. Whether Samuel went west with his children or died in Monroe County is not known at this time.

James Jones was born 12 October 1800 in Ohio Township, Monroe County, Ohio. 10 Some researchers debated whether James was the son of Ephraim because of the large age difference between the oldest son John and James. However, the James Jones family Bible identified the parents of James Jones as Ephraim and Phoebe Jones. 11

James married Catharine Drips on 13 Jan 1825. According to Catharine's obituary, the marriage took place in Greene County, Pennsylvania, which is where she was born in 1805. James and Catharine settled in the area of Adams and Green Townships in Monroe County. They had ten children: Phebee (George Walters), Daniel O'Connor (our ancestor), Elisabeth Ann (Isaiah Winland), Susanna (died as a child), Clarinda (Elias Shriver), Mary (died as a child), Amanda Jane (Isaac Winland), Stephen H. (Margaret Howell), James Stanton (Mary Jane Howell), and an unnamed daughter who died at birth. All of the daughters of James and Catharine moved to lowa with their husbands and children.

James died 28 Aug 1870 in Adams Township. Catharine died eighteen years later on 28 Sep 1888. Her obituary read:

OBITUARY - Oct 1888 - Catharine Jones, aged 82 years, 10 months and 11days, departed this life at her residence in Adams Township, Monroe County, Ohio. The deceased was born in Waynesburg, PA, born Nov. 19, 1805. At the age of 20, she was united in marriage to James Jones who shortly afterwards emigrated to Monroe County, Ohio, where they resided until her death. She was

the mother of ten children, four of whom are living. She was ranked amongst the best of mothers, always endeavoring to put forth all her power to influence the young to shun all appearances of evil. In the course of a long life she had won the esteem of all who were personally acquainted with her. For many years she had been afflicted with an unknown disease, the pains of which she bore with all calmness and fortitude, until death released her. Her body was placed in the Grassy Knoll Cemetery to which place her husband preceded her some eighteen years ago. M.J.W.<sup>12</sup>

James and Catharine's son, Daniel O'Connor Jones, was born 20 Sep 1827 in Laings, Monroe County. In 1850, he was living with the Isaac Atkinson family in Adams Township. Isaac was the grandson of Daniel's uncle John Jones. On October 20<sup>th</sup> of that year, Daniel married Sarah Ann Wilkinson.

Sarah was born 13 Dec 1832 in Belmont County, Ohio, to Joel Wilkinson and Jane Reed. Sarah's grandparents were early settlers in Belmont County. Her paternal grandparents, John and Ama (Small) Wilkinson arrived around 1805 from New Jersey. Her maternal grandparents, Amos Reed and Jemima Kennard also came to Ohio before 1810. Amos was a Revolutionary War veteran, serving in the New Jersey line under Captain Thomas Yard. He enlisted in 1776 or 1777 at Trenton and was discharged at Easton, Pennsylvania, at the close of the war.

Following their marriage, Daniel and Sarah remained in the Laings area. About 1870, they moved to Jackson Township, Monroe County.

They were the parents of eleven children. James Harvey (Lucy Stine), Joel (Martha Thomas), Catharine (1. William Rush, 2. Earnest Hartlieb), Mary (Philip Potts), Samuel Grimshaw Jones (Mary Belle Rush), Amanda Jane (George Potts), Caroline (Isaac Eddy), Ruth Ellen (Jerd Shook), Margaret (Walter Priest), Sarah Marinda (died at the age of 5), and a still born daughter.

Sarah died at the age of 45, perhaps from complications of the birth of her last child, which died at birth. She was laid to rest at West Union Cemetery in Perry Township. Daniel died 10 years later.

OBITUARY: 1888 - Died of consumption on the 15th inst., at his house in Jackson Township, Daniel Jones, aged 60 years, 4 months, and 25 days. The deceased was born in Green Township, Monroe County, Ohio. He was a good citizen and was respected by all who knew him. He was ever kind as a father, and leaves a large family to mourn his departure from them. He also leaves an aged mother, one brother and three sisters. At an early age, he united with the Church of Christ and was buried with Christ in baptism, to arise and walk in the newness of life.

He lived a consistent Christian life from the time he united with the Church until the pale messenger of death laid a heavy hand upon the Father and Brother. His remains were interred in the West Union Cemetery, where his faithful wife preceded him some ten years ago.

Blessed are the dead which die in the Lord from henceforth, yea saith the Spirit, that they may rest from their labors and their works do follow them. He did not fear to die for

Samuel Grimshaw Jones was born 1 Feb 1860 in a home near Laings. He was named for the doctor who delivered him, Dr. Samuel Grimshaw. Samuel married Mary Belle Rush on 20 Mar 1890. She was the daughter of Slater Benson Rush and Prudance Morris. Samuel and Mary had the following children:

Charles Manford (Leota Farmer), Lewis Webster (Bertha Wright) Evaline (Charles Yost), Nola Belle, Amelia Jane (George Schoonover), Fred William (Eva May "Kate" Hayes), Linza Joel (Nona Jones), Nona Rhea (Clennon Snell).

Samuel and Mary raised their family on a farm in Jackson Township. Their son Fred and his wife Kate purchased the adjoining farm. For the past 212 years, there have been nine generations of the Jones family who called Monroe County home.

Keeping Up With The Jones's

Hennen Records:

Griffith Jones was born ca 1695 in Wales. He is considered the ancestor of the Jones families who settled in Greene County. About 1750 he joined the Welsh Tract Baptist Church Meeting in Pencador, New Castle County, Delaware. It is believed that this was about the time Griffith Jones and his family came to the colonies.

His son Robert Jones was born March 20, 1743, probably while the family was still in Wales. He married Jane Bolton who was born in New Castle County, Delaware on July 6, 1744. Both Robert and Jane Jones were living in Greene Township, Greene County by 1773 when their names appear on the membership list of the Goshen Baptist Church at Garards Fort. They settled on a branch of Big Whiteley Creek. Here on April 15, 1785 Robert received a warrant on a tract of land called "Patriot's Grove" while Jane secured a patent on another tract, "Lion's Head," in her own name.

Robert Jones died in Greene Township on April 15, 1809. His wife, Jane, died in Greene Township on July 26, 1826. They are both buried in the Garards Fort Cemetery. Letters of Administration in the estate of Robert Jones were granted April 19, 1809 to Benjamin Jones and John Jones. A Bond in the amount of Nine Hundred Pounds was signed by Benjamin Jones, John Jones, George Reynolds and Lewis Evans in the presence of Robert Whitehill, Jr. The inventory of the estate was made on June 6, 1809 by Abia Minor and George Evans, and included 2 yoke oxen, 19 head cattle, 4 head horses, 21 head sheep, 28 head hogs, 18 bushel rye at John Hank's mill, 40 bushels at Henry Jackson' mill. The value of the inventory totaled \$1,202.28. The widow had reserved items from the estate totaling \$159.92. Robert Jones had in his lifetime entered into an agreement with William Kelly to work on his farm, to find him in everything [provide room and board] and to have a two-thirds share of what he raised. Two horses and two plows were reserved for that purpose out of the appraisement of the estate. He had also agreed with Lewis Evans to find him feed for two horses, only one-third of what he raised belonged to the estate as he would find board etc. for himself and William Kelly, and work his own horses.

 BETHIA<sup>5</sup> JONES (John<sup>4,3</sup>, Josiah<sup>2</sup>, Thomas<sup>1</sup>) was born probably at North Castle about 1741, and died on 13 March 1811, aged 70.<sup>62</sup>

She was baptized as an adult, and joined the Stamford Congregational Church 18 Mar 1764, on the same day as did her brother Josiah, and Peter June, and one month before her marriage. 63

"JOHN HAIT of Pound Ridge and Bethia Jones of Stamford" were married at the New Canaan Congregational Church on 19 April 1764.<sup>64</sup> John Hait was a son of Job and Elizabeth (Lockwood) Hait / Hoyt, born 25 March 1733 in Stamford.<sup>65</sup> This branch of the family generally used the spelling Hait or Hoit, rather than Hoyt. John Hait's sister Mercy Hait married Bethia Jones' first cousin Ebenezer<sup>5</sup> Jones Jr., see below.

John's father Job "Hoit" was among a group of eleven "lawful heirs of the patentees named in the patent granted by the Gouvernor and Company, of ye said Colony of Connecticut for the township of Stamford and as such being proprietors of that part of of the land lying within the bounds and limits of said patent & northward of the line lying between the sd province [of New York] and colony...." who released their claim on the Pound Ridge lands of the "East Patent"

above the 8-mile line to James Delancy and Lewis Johnson on 10 December 1745.<sup>66</sup> Job Hait's grandfather Joshua "Hoyte," who died in 1690, had been one of the patentees named in the Stamford Patent of 1685.<sup>67</sup>

The will of John Hait of Pound Ridge was made on 12 September 1797 and probated on 10 January 1799. He mentioned his wife Bethia, left his real estate to his sons Silvanus, Joseph, Stephen, John and Jonas, and also mentioned his daughters Sarah and Elizabeth. 68

- 7. JOSIAH<sup>5</sup> JONES (John<sup>4,3</sup>, Josiah<sup>2</sup>, Thomas<sup>1</sup>) was born probably at North Castle, probably about 1743-1744. He died at Stamford on 7 March 1796, and his gravestone there at the High Ridge Cemetery gives that date of death and his age as "42" years, giving a calculated year of birth of 1754.<sup>70</sup> This must have been an error in subtraction. He was baptized as an adult at the Stamford Congregational Church on 18 March 1764,<sup>71</sup> indicating that he was certainly more than ten years old at that time. Furthermore, he is listed on the Stamford Tax List of 1771 not impossible, but also not likely for a 17-year old! These records indicate that he was born at least by 1750, and perhaps as early as 1743.

His wife was SARAH SMITH, daughter of Amos and Sarah (Blackman) Smith of North Stamford, born 6 September 1752. 72 On 29 June 1774, Josiah Jones and Sarah Jones his wife sold a parcel of land along the Stamford Mill River "which was set to her out of the Estate of her Honoured Father Amos Smith late of Stanford deceased." She outlived Josiah by 35 years, died on 28 February 1831, "AE 76 yrs," and is also buried at High Ridge. 74

John<sup>4</sup> Jones "of Stamford" gave him an 8-acre portion of his land at High Ridge, with a dwelling house and barn, for "fatherly regard, love, and good will" on 19 January 1775. This deed was recorded at Stamford on 1 April 1797 (after Josiah's death), and it appears that the recorder originally wrote the year of the deed as "1795," and then wrote the numeral 7 over the numeral 9 to correct an error. Since the father identified himself as of Stamford, and we know that John Jones had moved over the line into Pound Ridge at least by the time of the 1790 census, and since a later deed, see below, refers to this land as already in Josiah's possession by 1792, this deed was certainly made in 1775 rather than 1795.

Josiah Jones served as a private with Capt. Reuben Scofield's Company, 9th Connecticut Militia Regiment, from 18 June to 18 July 1779, and again from 20 April to 20 November, 1780.76

Josiah Jones appears in the 1790 Census of Norwalk/ Stamford with two males under 16 and four females.77

On 21 April 1792, John<sup>4</sup> Jones, then of Pound Ridge, gave another two pieces of land to his son Josiah, again for love and good will, as part of the general disposal of his Connecticut property to Josiah and John<sup>5</sup>. The first parcel was 26 acres and "the dwelling house where he doth live," and therefore probably included, for some reason, the 8+ acres and house given in 1775. The second piece included 37 acres, and adjoined other land already in Josiah's possession.<sup>78</sup>

On 17 April 1798, the estate of Josiah Jones was distributed to his children Amos, Smith, Isaac, Sarah, Hannah, Abigail, and to his widow, Sarah. The son Amos Jones had left the Stamford scene as a debtor, and soon after this distribution was made, Amos' creditors appealed to the courts for relief, and his portion was confiscated and distributed to Abraham Scofield Jr.,

Amos Smith, Joseph Gray, Taylor Sherman of Norwalk, Ananias Weed and Enos Jones (his uncle) in payment of debts and costs. <sup>80</sup> This process was completed, with Amos apparently still living but "absconded to parts unknown," on 23 October 1809. <sup>81</sup>

The Stamford Probate Court ordered the distribution of the widow's dower on 13 Jan 1832, to the children of Josiah Jones, named Amos, Smith and Isaac Jones, Sarah Allen, Hannah Lockwood, and Abigail Thompson. The distribution was then more specifically made on 22 Feb 1832 to Hannah, wife of Lewis S. Lockwood, the heirs of Smith Jones, deceased, the heirs of Amos Jones, deceased, and Isaac Jones, who purchased the interests of Sarah Allen and Abigail Thompson.<sup>82</sup>

Additional information on his children is found in the distribution of the estate of Smith Jones on 27 March and April 10, 1810, to his "sisters and brothers" Abigail, wife of Seth Stevens, Hannah, wife of Lewis S. Lockwood, Sally, wife of Joseph Allen, Isaac Jones, and Smith Jones, a son of Amos Jones a deceased brother. 83

Children of Josiah<sup>5</sup> and Sarah (Smith) Jones, probably born at Stamford, order very uncertain, but based on the order of naming in estate documents:<sup>84</sup>

8. JOHN<sup>5</sup> JONES (John<sup>4,3</sup>, Josiah<sup>2</sup>, Thomas<sup>1</sup>) was born say 1761, probably very near the Eight Mile Line. His family is extensively documented by materials collected by descendants, and now preserved at the New Canaan Historical Society (NCHS) in the Jones family folder, and in the "Jones Collection" of Miss Miriam Elliott Jones (1892-1974), and at the Stamford Historical Society (SHS) in the Jones section of the Edith Wicks Genealogical Collection.

He married Nancy Dan, born 26 February 1762 at Stamford, who had been born at Stamford on 27 April 1731, daughter of James Dan. The estimate of the year of John's birth (about 1761) is partially based on this knowledge of his wife's age. No date or place of death has yet been found for either John or Nancy (Dan) Jones.

"John Jones Jr." was enumerated in Pound Ridge at the time of the 1790 census with two boys under 16 and two females. 94

According to the introduction to the Jones Collection at the NCHS, 95 "This branch of the family lived in Pound Ridge and about the time John Jones, a last maker, came to New Canaan, two of his older brothers went to Ohio..." This statement refers to the children in this family (including John<sup>6</sup>), listed below.

On 31 August 1811, John Jones and Nancy his wife (her X mark) sold their property in Pound Ridge, "being the place where we now live," containing 40 acres more or less and bounded by the state line, to Elnathan Weed. 96

Whether or not he moved away in 1811, he was again listed (and for the last time) in Pound Ridge in the 1820 Census, age 45+, and it appears that his wife had died before that time. 97

This marriage comes from the NCHS Jones Folder. The Lurene Claycamp Notes report that Sylvester "married his brother's widow," which appears inconsistent, and is probably a result of confusion about Sylvester's son's marriage and not his own.

All dates are from a copy of what appears to have been family bible entries, not otherwise identified, NCHS, Jones family folder. The names and birthdates of eleven of their children are also given, along with the dates of death of seven of the children.

perhaps the single person, female, age 16-26, who was living with John Jones (her father) in Pound Ridge at the time of the 1820 Census. 115

ENOS<sup>5</sup> JONES (John<sup>4,3</sup>, Josiah<sup>2</sup>, Thomas<sup>1</sup>) was born at Pound Ridge 1 March 1765.<sup>116</sup>
 He died 29 July 1836, probably at High Ridge, and was buried at the Pound Ridge Cemetery.<sup>117</sup>

According to MacKenzie, he married on 7 January 1790, MARY SCOFIELD, who was born 20 August 1770, and died 24 December 1817. Some Jones family members, however, refer to his wife as being named "CATHERINE \_\_\_\_\_." And, the use of the given name Smith as middle names for two of his children is not yet explained. Perhaps additional information will resolve this discrepancy, or two marriages will be discovered.

Although MacKenzie identified Enos Jones as a brother of John<sup>5</sup> and Josiah, I was unable to find any vital, land, or probate record proving that relationship. Fortunately, however, a family record was located at the Stamford Historical Society that confirms the relationship. A grandchild of John<sup>5</sup> Jones and Nancy Dan wrote the following words in an undated letter to another family member:

"Grandfather Jones [meaning John<sup>5</sup> Jones] had brothers in Connecticut, but I only heard my father speak of one, Uncle Enos Jones. I was partially acquainted with some of his children, the oldest was Harry. Died an old bachelor. One of his sisters married and had a family, lived at Pound Ridge, Conn. [sic.] There were three sons. Elbert came to Illinois. One daughter remained single."

On 15 December 1797 (therefore after the time of the death of their father John<sup>4</sup> Jones), John<sup>5</sup> Jones of Pound Ridge sold a 20 acre parcel in Stamford at the state line (the northern boundary was described as "the highway that goeth from Dan's Mill to the highway by James Jones," therefore being the lane which followed the state boundary) to Enos Jones for £ 85 New York money. <sup>121</sup> No relationship was stated, but the land was certainly part of the John Jones homestead.

The parcel adjoined land already in the possession of Enos Jones on the West.

Consequently, it appears that Enos had earlier come into possession of the choice land along High Ridge Road from the Stamford real estate of John<sup>4</sup> Jones, but apparently Enos never recorded his deed for this property at Stamford. Since John was so careful to provide for Josiah and John<sup>5</sup> in other gifts, and since the properties were contiguous in the High Ridge / Dantown area, we may assume that Enos had also received land from his father at some earlier time.

The only other purchase recorded for Enos Jones in Stamford was of a 32+ acre parcel from John Davenport Jr. and James Davenport on 28 November 1796. The exact location of this land is not clear from the description, but it appears to be closer to North Stamford rather than in Dantown or High Ridge.

On 5 March 1836, Enos Jones transferred 60 acres of land and buildings bounded West by a highway (probably High Ridge) and North by the road from High Ridge to "Cock's Mill," and another 14 ½ acres of woodland, to his sons Henry Jones and Watson Jones. 123 On this same date, Enos Jones also transferred another 18 acres of adjoining woodland to his son Elbert Jones, being the East part of a tract containing about 32 acres 124 Also on this same date, Enos Jones transferred about 12 acres in Pound Ridge, bounded westerly by a highway (probably High Ridge Road) and surrounded by land of Abraham Jones Jr. and Daniel and Jesse Jones, to his son Ezra Jones. 125 Enos Jones was obviously making sure of the future of these properties as he neared the end of his life.

His will, also dated 5 March 1836 (the date of the above deeds) and probated 20 Aug 1836, made additional provisions for his children Henry, Watson, Polly wife of Elihu Dan, Tammy Jones, Emeline wife of Joseph Ballac, and Ezra. The executor was to be his son, Henry. 126

No information has been found regarding the identity of his wife, and the children (apparently at least one boy and one girl) of Samuel<sup>5</sup> Jones have not yet been determined.

11. Reuben<sup>5</sup> Jones (Thomas<sup>4</sup>, John<sup>3</sup>, Josiah<sup>2</sup>, Thomas<sup>1</sup>) was born at Stamford on 22 April 1748. The date of his death has not been determined, but was certainly after 1807 when he made a quit-claim deed with his wife, Sarah, 145 and before 5 December 1814, when Sarah Jones released her right of dower in his estate (see below).

He probably married first MARGARET SOUTHERLAND, born 2 March 1741/42 in Stamford, the daughter of Charles Southerland, a neighbor in Dantown. I have not been able to find a primary source reference for this marriage. It was reported, however, in an answer to a Hartford Times genealogical column query on 20 December 1947, and seems to have been based on immediate family records. There is no question that his first wife was named Margaret, since Elinor, Reuben, Thomas, Mary, Lydia, and James, children of Reuben and Margaret Jones of Stamford, were baptized at St. John's Episcopal Church in Stamford on 28 July 1785.

Reuben Jones was listed in the 1790 census of Stamford/Norwalk with two males under 16 years and four females. 149

He later married (2) SARAH \_\_\_\_\_, surname not yet determined. On 5 December 1814, Sarah Jones (her X mark) released her right of dower in the estate of Reuben Jones late of Stamford, deceased, to Reuben Jones, Thomas Jones, Nehemiah Burtis & Nelly his wife, Asher Weed & Lidia his wife, Selleck Scofield & Margaret his wife, and Frederick Dan & Mary his wife.

On 11 January 1815, Thomas Jones of Stamford (Reuben's son Thomas<sup>6</sup> in the list below) received rights to a 3 acre piece "formerly owned by Reuben Jones...deceased" in Dantown by Quit Claim deed from Reuben Jones, Frederick Dan, Mary Dan (her X mark), Selleck Scofield, Margaret Scofield, Nehemiah Burtis (his X mark), Nela Burtis (her X mark) Asher Weed and Lydia Weed. 151

This couple are the writer's ancestors in this family, but I have been unable to clearly identify Deborah. I believe she was a Selleck since she named a son Selleck Jones. I further believe she was the Deborah Ann Selleck who was baptized at St. John's Church in Stamford on 24 Oct 1776, the daughter of Abraham Selleck and his second wife, Anna or Abigail Rogers, but am still unable to prove that relationship.

Derived from New Canaan Land Records 17:512, which is a deed from Emily Jones of New Canaan to the heirs at law of Nathan Jones, deceased, dated 12 Jul 1875. Most dates and other data from New Canaan VR's and High Ridge Cemetery inscriptions.

Elihu Selleck did have a wife named Mary Jones (family records of Judith Green Watson, Springfield, VA, based on family bible records and letters, communicated in personal correspondence, 3 Oct 1993.) In the 1810 census of Pound Ridge, Elihu's wife Mary was listed as age 39 years (1850 US Census, M423:614, Pound Ridge, Westchester Co., NY, 155), which would place her later in this list of children if she was indeed the same person.

Squire Jones served several times in the Revolutionary War. He enlisted in Capt. Platt's Company, Col. Holmes New York Regiment, from June 1775 for 8 months. He joined Capt. Joseph Hoyt's Company, Col. Webb's Connecticut Regiment, for one year, and then served the following three years in Capt. Hogan's Company of Light Dragoons, Col. Sheldon's Connecticut Regiment, and was discharged in June 1783. 170

His widow's pension application is among those that are most useful to the genealogist, because actual pages from their family bible were submitted as proof of her relationship, and her children. We find from this application that she had a child, aged three, at the time she was married. That child (Mary) was listed in the family bible entry at the head of the list of children of Squire and Polly Jones. She may or may not have had a previous marriage, and it is not entirely clear that Squire Jones was the father of this first child.

He was probably the Squire Jones who appeared in the 1790 census of Ballston, Albany County, NY with three females (total) and three males under 16 years. 171

According to the Pension Application, they also lived at Gainsville and Perry in Genesee County, NY.

His wife's name was Lydia \_\_\_\_\_, as given in the baptismal record of their child in 1785.

Not much is known about this Thomas Jones, and he may have moved out of the area. I have not found mention of him in any Stamford or Pound Ridge land or census records.

The names of his wife and one child are found in a baptismal record from St. John's Episcopal Church in Stamford. Henry Jones, son of Thomas and Lydia Jones of Old Pound Ridge, was baptized at St. John's on 28 July 1785, along with six children of his brother Reuben, and several other relatives and friends. <sup>173</sup>

1779, 175 but since his father had died before 1790, was known simply as Ebenezer Jones in the 1790 census of Pound Ridge. 176

He married MERCY HAIT / HOYT, daughter of Job and Elizabeth (Lockwood) Hait, <sup>177</sup> sometime prior to 10 March 1773, when Ebenezer Jones Junior and Mercy his wife of Old Pound Ridge joined in a deed at Stamford disposing of land which had come to the children of Job Hait / Hoyt "from our Honored Grandfather Joshua Hait late of said Stamford, dec'd or from our honored Father Job Hait late of Sd Stamford but last of Old Pound Ridge Dec'd or from our Uncle Joshua Hait late of Sd Stamford Dec'd." Mercy had probably died prior to 1830, when the oldest female in the household of Ebenezer Jones was listed as age 50-60 years.

MacKenzie incorrectly assigned Mercy Hoyt's marriage to Ebenezer s father, assuming that he (Ebenezer<sup>4</sup>) would have been identified as "Ebenezer Jr." in 1773.

This Ebenezer Jones was probably the person of that name who was a corporal in Capt. Scofield's and Capt. Lewis's Companies in Col. Thaddeus Crane's Regiment during the Revolution. 180

Eardeley's notation attached to his transcription of Ebenezer's gravestone identified him incorrectly as the son of Benjamin and Mary Holly. Both MacKenzie and Eardeley, two experienced genealogists, were misled by the similarity of names of persons on the two sides of this Eight Mile Line. The reoccurrence of the names Benjamin and Ebenezer in the Stamford and Pound Ridge records have provided a fertile field for speculation and error. The surname Jones is common enough, but in this case, the confusion is compounded by the use of identical given names in the various families.

Ebenezer<sup>5</sup> and Mercy (Hoyt) Jones had one boy and 6 females with them in 1790. The 1800 census shows 1 male child 10-16 years, who is probably Ebenezer<sup>6</sup>, and 1 girl 0-10, 3 girls 10-16, and 1 girl 16-26, in addition to the parents, both 45 and over. Although we can find no certain record of <u>any</u> of the children's names, the following very inadequate and incomplete list is proposed as a start on this family:

Abraham had married (2) MARY prior to 19 November 1828, for on that date Abraham Jones (his + mark) and his wife Mary Jones (her + mark) of Pound Ridge sold undivided half interests in 15 acres in Pound Ridge bounded "Southerly by the Cross Road," to Abraham Jones Jr. and to Jesse Jones in two

separate deeds.<sup>205</sup> In return, and at the same time, Jesse Jones and Abraham Jones Jr. gave their father a life lease on the same property.<sup>206</sup>

Abraham Jones was listed next door to his father in law Thaddeus Seymour in the Pound Ridge Census of 1810. 207

He resided in Pound Ridge at the times of the 1790, 1810, 1820 and 1830 Censuses, but was enumerated in Stamford in 1800. On 13 June 1799, John Davenport Jr. of Stamford had sold a parcel of 23+ Acres to Abraham Jones of Pound Ridge for \$1,108., and the property was immediately mortgaged back to Davenport for the same amount. The property was described as being at "Chestnut Ridge," and "bounded northerly partly by sd Davenport's land & partly by the line dividing between the states of New York & Connecticut, Easterly by John Seeley's Land, southerly partly by Enoch Stevens Land & partly by land this day conveyed by me to Jacob Stevens, Westerly by Jonathan Waring's Land." Abraham Jones "of Pound Ridge" made a quit claim deed for the same Stamford property to the same John Davenport Jr., again for the exact same amount, on 4 October 1813 (from the census evidence, he had probably been back in Pound Ridge before 1810.)

Two large Jones families of Pound Ridge, almost certainly headed by grandchildren of Ebenezer<sup>4</sup> Jones, have not yet been definitely placed. I believe the two heads of these families (Alexander Jones b. 1805, and Nathaniel Jones, b. abt. 1806) may have been children of James<sup>5</sup> Jones, brother of Ebenezer<sup>5</sup>, Abraham, Sylvanus, and Lewis Jones, Ebenezer<sup>4</sup>'s other sons. They are being discussed at this point because two "extra" male children appear in the household of Jesse and Deborah Jones at the time of the 1810 census, whom I believe may be these two young boys (the census gives a total of 5 boys under 10 years in Jesse's family (1810 US Census, M252:37, Pound Ridge, 207a). Since James Jones is not listed in 1810 (or later), he may have died just before this census was taken, and the young children absorbed in the home of close relatives — two older first cousins, Jesse Jones son of Abraham<sup>5</sup>, and Deborah Jones daughter of Ebenezer<sup>5</sup>, who had married each other. James Jones and his wife Sarah had sold their 16-acre homestead in Pound Ridge to Jared Fancher on 5 Nov 1806 (Westechester Co. LR's, N:525.) Jared Fancher was Esther (Seymour) (Fancher) Jones' son from her first marriage, and therefore Jesse's half brother. Until they can be located more precisely, these two

Lewis<sup>5</sup> Jones (Ebenezer<sup>4</sup>, John<sup>3</sup>, Josiah<sup>2</sup>, Thomas<sup>1</sup>) was born probably at Pound Ridge, say about 1768, based upon the date of his marriage, and the fact that he was named last among the sons in Ebenezer<sup>4</sup>'s will. According to MacKenzie, he died at Pound Ridge in 1804.

He married SARAH/SALLY MASTERS at Stamford on 9 May 1790.<sup>222</sup> He was enumerated in Stamford/ Norwalk in the 1790 Census, with only himself and one female in the household.<sup>223</sup> The family was back in Pound Ridge at the time of the next Census in 1800.<sup>224</sup>

The Jones Family

Dr. A.J.W. Headlee Records:

Griffith Jones Sr. lived in Willis Town Township, Chester Co., Pa, where he is listed on the tax records for 1765 as having 150 acres, 2 horses, 3 cattle, 19 sheep and one servant. At the same place and date Thomas Jones had 80 acres with stock and Robert Jones had 100 acres with stock. In 1767 the name of David Jones joins the three with 42 acres but no stock. It is believed these four men were closely related, either brothers or father and sons.

Griffith Jones was probably born before 1740 according to calculations taken from the 1790 U.S. Census, and died before March 22 1800 as indicated by deed records. By the time of his death he had accumulated 5 tracts of 400 acres each near the village of Enon, which is located on the boundary of Greene and Washington Counties, Pa. These tracts were warranted February 25 1785 and were named "Buckhorn Ridge", "Turkey Rust", "Big Lick", "Laurel Point", and "Limestone Quarry." The deeds give considerable personal information about this family. On March 22 1800 Isaac Jones of Willis Town sold ¼ share to Griffith Jones of the same place, and the deed named the sons of Griffith Jones, deceased of the same place. It also states that Griffith Sr died leaving five children, his son Samuel having died without issue, and that Isaac and Griffith Jr were still living in Willis Town in 1800.

One deed dated December 8 1825 by G. W. Jones, Thomas Jones and Thomas Sermon and wife Hannah is to Griffith Jones Jr of Greene County, Pa. Another deed is from Elizabeth Withy of the City of Philadelphia to Griffith Jones of Greene County. She is identified as the daughter of Griffith Jones Sr., and her husband appears to have died before the date of the deed. This deed grants her share of Griffith Sr's estate and is signed by Griffith Jones Withy, Attorney. There are many other deeds showing the relationship of the children of Griffith Jones Sr.

Griffith Jones Jr., born about 1772, married a woman by the name of Rachel. They had a daughter born in 1799 who married Samuel Leslie; Mary Ann born 1801, died in 1838; Morrison born 1805 married Rebecca; Jefferson E. born 1807, married Elizabeth and died in 1891; Elizabeth born 1812, died in 1838; John born 1818; Samuel born 1820 married Anna Maria Spears. They were the grandparents of Mary Jones Headlee [Mrs. A.J.W. Headlee].

The will of Griffith Jones Jr., written June 1 1842 was probated December 28 1844. The residue of his estate was given to sons Morrison, John and Samuel, and they were named executors. John and Samuel requested release from acting as executors and Morrison acted alone. Samuel P. Jones estate record at Waynesburg states that he died January 12 1876 and his son, Leslie B. Jones was the executor. It was necessary to sell 23 acres of land to settle the estate.

Morrison, Jefferson, John and Samuel, all sons of Griffith Jones Jr., were listed on the 1850 Greene County Census, Richhill Township, and were living in Enon. Many members of the Griffith Jones Jr family are buried in the family cemetery at Enon.



In the Name of god Amen I Morgan Jones of the state of pensylvania and County of green and Duncard Township Beeing wake of body but in perfeck mine and Memory Taken in Consideration the Mortality of Man and knowing that all men once must die Doeth this Seventh Day of December in the year of our Lord one thousand Eight Hundred and Eighteen Make this my last will and Tastament Disalowing and Disanuling all former wills and Tastaments Ratifying and Conforming this my Last will Firstly I recommend my Soul to god who gave it and my Body to the grave not doubting but to Receive the same the grate Day of Resirection my Body be Decently Interd at Disaeson of my Executors and as for such worldly affrerts as god had Blessed with I Dispose of them in the following Maner all my just Debts to be first paid firstly I Bequeath to my Son Morgan Jones five Dollars and my Bigg Morgant Bible secondly I Bequeath to my Son Owen Jones five Dolers and all my Wearing Aparrel and To my son David Jones I will an Bequeath the plantation whereon I now liveth In green County State of Pensylvania supposed to Contain one hundred and Seventy acres Be a more or less on his paying unto the hands of my Executors four hundred Dollars in good coirent passing money of the state of Pensylvania at or before the firs Day of May in the year of one thousand Eight hundred and Twenty six for the use of the Heirs of Samuel Jones to be alid out by Execurs for the purches one qurter Section of land in the Ohio or Indiana for Danial Jones Son of Samuel Jones Disesed and the Remainder to be paid to Elisbeth Jones Deaughter of Samuel Jones Dissessed and if the said Daniel Jones and Elisabeth Jones Bothe should Die before the time of payment then my Beguthment to be void But if Daniel Jones or his sister Elisbeth Jones Shall be Alive at the time of payment I Bequeth to them, forther I Bequeth to my son David Jones all my Farming utentialls and one fether Bed and Furnitur whereon he formerly slept on Before he was Maried, and all Remainders of my Estate whatsoever in Notes bonds and housell Furniture Cattle horsis hoggs sheep at my death to be aprised and Sould The Money therof to be Devided aquely to all my children both Men and Women allso that my Executer shall Erect at my grave Head Stones and fut stones with the Same Memorial as the text of my family has - and I do hereby Nomanote Archibald McCain and my son Morgan Jones Both of State of Virginia and County of Ohio and Isaac Buckingham of the state of pensylvania and county of green to be my Lawfull Executers Sined and Ackowloged the Date Above Ritton to be my Last will and Tassement Morgan Jones Senr
