Everyone agreed that we had a very good time and we plan to have this again next year - but next year we will remember to bring fans and mosquito spray.

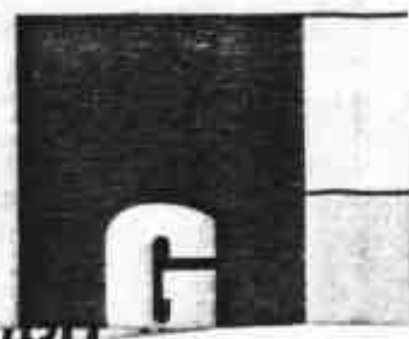

The Thomas D. and Margaret Kelly Family New Testament Bible was published in 1854 by T. K. Collins, Jr. No. 8 North Sixth Street, Philadelphia. A photocopy of the title page and the contents of the family data, pages not numbered, were shared with James Haas by another family member. All dates are after the publication date of the Bible with the exception of the birth dates of the father and mother of the bride.

[A below hand written note, as written, was included with the Bible.]

"This Bible Belonged to my mother in 1856 was taken over the Plains to California in 1863 by wagon and settled at Danville Contra Costa Co where we lived two years went to Sanfrancisco got on a steamer for Panama & New York back to Quincy Illinois 1865 Moved to Mo Nov 8-1879

Charles B. Kelley was a child of Thomas D. and Margaret Josephine (Forsyth) Kelly the Bible record couple. According to other printed family information, Thomas D. and Margaret Kelly were married October 10, 1954 in Adams County, Illinois.
