The plaintiffs respectfully show to the Court: -

I. That Jno. H. Kendrick died testate in the County of Cleveland on May 9th, 1907, seized and possessed in fee simple of the following tract of land lying in No. 3 Township - Cleveland County, N. C. to wit: Lying on Buffalo Creek above the Quinn & Hamrick mill tract on West side of creek: Beginning at a stone and pointers formerly a hickory, Kendrick's corner on East side of a small branch, thence N. 50 E. 110 poles to a stake in the middle of Buffalo Creek, thence down the creek as it meanders S. 41 E. 26 poles to a stake in the creek, thence down the meanders of the creek 130 poles to a stake in the middle of the creek where the old line crosses, thence with the said old line N. 10 W. 13 ½ poles to a stone and pointers on the Mebery old line, thence with said line N. 73 E. 14 poles to a maple on East bank of the branch, thence N. 36 W. 20 poles to the beginning, containing 19 ½ acres, being that tract deeded him on Nov. 10th 1897 by W. B. Lowery and wife, by deed recorded in Book "FF" of Deeds, page 612, of the Register's office of Cleveland County, N. C.

II. That said Jno. H. Kendrick left him surviving his widow, Hannah C. Kendrick, and nine children, to wit: Mary A. Wilkins, Joe Kendrick, Eliza Bumgardner, Lee Kendrick, Wm. Kendrick, Robt. Kendrick, Amelia Camp, Thedia Wiggins and Margaret Wilson, and two grand children, to wit: Margaret Miller and Laura McMahan, who were the only children of his deceased daughter, Sarah J. Bragg, who died prior to his death.

III. That said Jno. H. Kendrick left a last will and testament which was duly probated on May 11th, 1908 and recorded in Book "3" of Wills, page 336 of the Clerk's office of Cleveland Superior Court, and by said will he devised his real estate as follows: Item 1st. I will all my real estate to my wife, Hannah C.

Kendrick so long as she lives, and after her death I want it disposed of according to the laws of my State."

IV. That Hannah C. Kendrick, wife of Jno. H. Kendrick, died in the month of January 1908.

V. That the plaintiffs, Robt. Kendrick, Mary A. Wilkins, Wm. Kendrick and Margaret Wilson, and the defendants, Joe Kendrick, Margaret Miller, Laura McMahan, Eliza Bumgardner, Lee Kendrick, Amila Camp and Thedia Wiggins are the owners of, as tenants in common, and seized and possessed of the tract of land described in paragraph I foregoing, each of said parties owing one undivided one-tenth thereof, except Margaret Miller and Laura McMahan, each of whom owns an undivided one-twentieth thereof.

VI. That the plaintiffs desire actual partition of said tract of land, but owing to the small acreage therein, the number of parties in interest and the character of the land, they aver that actual partition cannot be made without injury to the parties in interest, and that it is for the best interest of all the parties in interest that said land should be sold for partition.

VII. That Chest Kendrick is the wife of the plaintiff, Robt. Kendrick, J. J. Wilkins is the husband of Mary A. Wilkins, Lula Kendrick is the wife of the plaintiff, Wm. Kendrick, Thos. C. C. Wilson is the husband of Margaret Wilson, Sallie Kendrick is the wife of the defendant, Joe Kendrick, Margaret Miller is the wife of Joe Miller, Laura McMahan is the wife of Geo. McMahan, Milton Bumgardner is the husband of Eliza Bumgardner, Ola Kendrick is the wife of defendant, Lee Kendrick, and is living separate and apart from him as plaintiffs are informed and believe, Edner Camp is the husband of Amelia Camp, Jno. Wiggins is the husband of the defendant, Thedia Wiggins; that Joe Kendrick is a non-resident of the State of North Carolina and his whereabouts are unknown to the plaintiffs; that Margaret Miller and husband, Joe Miller and Laura McMahan and husband, Geo. McMahan are non-residents of the State of North Carolina, and are residents of the State of South Carolina, as plaintiffs are informed and believe.

Wherefore, plaintiffs pray that the lands aforesaid be sold for partition, and that the proceeds arising there from, after paying the costs of said sale and this proceeding, be distributed to the parties in interest according to their respective rights and interests as hereinbefore set forth, for the appointment of a commissioner to make sale of said lands, for publication of summons as to the non-resident defendants, and for other and further relief.

In the name of God Amen, I **Thomas Kindrick** of the County of Cleveland and State of North Carolina, being of sound mind and memory but considering the uncertainty of my earthly existence, do make and declare this my last will and testament in manner & form following, that is to say:

First...That my executors (hereinafter named) shall provide for my body a decent burial, suitable to the wishes of my relations & friends, and pay all funeral expenses, together with my just debts, howsoever & to whomsoever owing, out of the monies that may first come to their hands as a part or parcel of my estate:

Second...I give and bequeath to my wife **Sarah Kendrick** all my household and kitchen furniture during her life, also the use of all my stock of every name & kind and at her death the same to divided as (hereafter named)

Third...I give and bequeath to my daughter **Nancy Selena Kindrick** one half of all my household and kitchen furniture at the death of my wife, also one cow and calf, and four head of sheep.

Fourth...I give and bequeath to my daughter **Anna Manilla Kindrick** one half of all my household and kitchen furniture at the death of my wife, also one cow and calf and four head of sheep.

Fifth...I will and desire that the residue of my estate be sold on a credit of twelve months by my executors, and all the debts that are owing to be me to be collected and equally divided among all my children to wit: **Mary, John, Selina, Margaret, Elizabeth, Larkin, William, Thomas & Anna Malilla Kindrick.**

Lastly...I do hereby constitute and appoint my trusty friends & sons **William Kindrick & Thomas Kindrick** my executors to all intents and purposes to execute this my last will and testament according to the true intent and meaning of the same and every part & clause thereof, hereby

revoking all other wills and declaring them void by me heretofore made. In witness whereof I the said Thomas Kindrick, do hereunto set my hand and seal this 3rd day of February 1846

The witnesses to said will both being dead the handwriting of **A. H. Hughes** was proven in open court by **A. L. Elliott** also the handwriting of **R. Champion** the other witness was proven by the oath of **G. M. Green**

My g-g-grandmother, Margaret Wilson, was the daughter of John H. Kendrick, who was the son of Larkin Kendrick, who was the son of Thomas Kindrick. Grandma Wilson died when I was about nine years old so I have limited memories of her. She was thin and apparently about five feet six inches or maybe more tall, but I don't ever remember ever seeing her standing up she was always in a straight-backed rocker. I only remember attending a few Wilson family reunions and she set there watching all her descendents while her daughters waited on her. Grandma Wilson had thirteen children, my g-grandmother Fannie Wilson Patterson Tritt was her oldest child and the younger children were younger than my grandfather, Billy Patterson.

Grandma Wilson's brother, Bob Kendrick, was a deputy sheriff for Cleveland County and he had an interesting reputation as a tough deputy. Some people said he was just mean, other said he was both tough and fair. I never knew him, but I'll bet I would have enjoyed him and listening to some of his stories.
