Thomas Knipe was the sixth of the eight children born to John and Ann Knipe of Casterton, Westmoreland County, England, then a part of the parish of Kirkby Lowdale. These children are all registered in the church at Kirkby Lowdale as follows:

Thomas Knipe and Agnes Briggs (dau. of Edward) were married May 9, 1810 and lived at Houshold where he was a carpenter. Four children were born to them there, registered as

In May of 1816 they picked up these four children, bade farewell to relatives and friends and all familiar scenes and faced forth to make a new home in a far-away land. The approximately 100 mile journey to Liverpool must have been made by wagon or other private vehicle, as there were no railroads in England yet.

From Liverpool to Quebec was a four month voyage on a sailing vessel, and sad too, for on June 17 little John died and was buried at sea. From Quebec the trip up the St. Lawrence River evidently was from station to station as an old expense account shows the fare was paid that way as far as Erie, Pa.

From Erie to Pittsburg must have been a tedious journey, for there was yet no road through the forest. Here the record ends, but it is fair to suppose they came down the Ohio River on a flat boat, as was the custom of the time, and were met at Cincinnati by brother John (already in Ind. at least since 1811) and made the rest of the journey to Wayne County, Ind. by wagon, as was also the custom of the time.

(This is all we know of the trip from England, and how we wish we knew more! In later years great grandmother Agnes wrote the whole story in her Bible for posterity, but sometime since the turn of the present century a grand-son, more generous than rowdy, cut it out and gave it away. All effort to trace it has failed, and tho' the Bible is well-preserved, that page's stub is a constant reproach.

Thomas worked for John and lived on his place for a few years, then in 1825 bought 60A. Quarter acre in Wayne Co. for \$100.00. In 1829 he sold this, and then Elston Knipe bought from John and Barber. Charles C. Latta described as Gr 1/4, sec. 11-15-11 in Posey Twp., Fayette Co., Indiana. This was on Nov. 6, 1829, and he paid \$100 for it.

He first built a log cabin house, as was the custom of that time, then after a few years, probably 1832, built a substantial brick house several rods southeast of the cabin. The older sons, Thomas and Liberal, were in their latter teens and, like their father, were already quite skilled in the use of tools, so proved efficient helpers. The bricks were made by the family from clay found on the farm and the sons carved the quite ornate walnut woodwork and turned the spindles for the beautiful walnut staircase. The house was one and one-half stories high, with five rooms and a hall on the first floor and two rooms above. Each first-floor room had a handsome fireplace with beautiful facing and mantel, and on each side a cupboard from floor to ceiling.

One fine day in October 1935 this well-preserved house was visited by S.D. Knipe, 81-yr-old grandson of Elston Knipe above, his son Thomas Knipe, and Florence Knipe Stewart, grand-daughter of the above mentioned Edward Knipe, and S.D. provided from his splendid memory most of those facts concerning the building of the house. He was thrilled by the excellent workmanship and the splendid architecture he found throughout, and he was happy to find it in such perfect condition as to seem recently built. The Wayne Trust Co. of Cambridge City had recently acquired the place and had freshened the house by a new green roof and by painting the brick walls (red). He drank from the original well, still doing faithful service, and S.D. Knipe pronounced the water as good as it was in his childhood. The original log barn was still in use and the only one on the farm.

At the time of his death Thomas Knipe owned 620 acres of land in Fayette and Rush counties, Indiana, all acquired by his industry and thrift during the twenty-two years since he came to America. Also personal property which sold at public auction for a total of \$1866.60 at a time when first choice sheep sold for \$4.00 per head, corn in the field \$4.00-\$4.62 per acre and a haystack \$3.25-\$4.00

Kirkby Lonsdale 3 January 1841

Dear Daughter

I received your melancholy letter of the 8th of November last and am very sorry to hear of the loss you have sustained by the death of your dear Husband. Death makes no exceptions with regard to country or climate. I am sorry to say it has made two inroads into our family here. Your Uncle Matthew Hopkins died on the 20 December 1839 of old age and your Brother John Briggs died in November last in a decline and has left a widow and four children. The three first by his former wife are now with their Grandfather Robt. Browness in Middleton and the youngest with its mother. Mr. Rowlinson Riggins died about last Candlemas and has left about £3000 amongst John Rowlinson's children and an annuity of £20 per annum to John and remainder of his property to the Tomlinson's. As to my health it is only indifferant. I am now at present confined to my room but hope in a short time to be able to get down stairs. I am very weak of body and lame.

With regard to the disposal of your Uncle's property. He bequeathed the house and garden we live in to me and the little house up the street to my Wife and the remainder of his effects to his sister Betty Hopkins for life and then to be divided amongst your cousins the Wilsons that are living when old Betty dies. I have not yet seen your brother William Knipe but hope to do so soon. I will send the letter to him now I can spare it. They are quite well for anything that I know. I suppose you will know of the death of The Rev. Mr. Knipe his wife his daughter Mrs. Preston and her husband Mr. Preston they are all dead. I have also to inform you that Mr. Howell has sold the Underly Estate and the new Mansion House to Alderman Thompson of London a native of Grayrigg in Westmoreland he will enter into possession sometime in the spring of 1842. It is now a very large estate extending from Kirkby Town end to the Old Town. Inn Estate including Deanshiggin which he bought some time ago. Your Cousin Wm. H^oason's are gone

to live at Austwick Hall it is a large Farm and they are farther off so I do not see them so often.

Dear daughter when your husband's affairs are brought to a close be so good as to inform me how you are situated. I should like to know as soon as you are competent to communicate it to me. Please be rather explicit and give me all particulars. You must excuse my short letter as I cannot now write myself my hand shakes so. Give my love to all my Grandchildren and accept of the same yourself hoping your affairs will turn out more to your advantage than you are aware of
