1,000 kinfolk get together

FLORIAN, Minn. (AP) — More than 1,000 descentures of an immigrant couple guthered in this time prairie hannet yesterday, rallying round their Pollish name and live generations of American heritage.

The celebration was three years in the making, and Florian, so small its population is set listed by mop makers, was overron with kinfolk who proched tests, slept in cumpers and baoked into mouse 50 miles from tests.

"It was a nice day," said Wands Grazzes Kurnia, 85, a second-generation family member who fives unthe original homestead and has 45 grandchildren and 60 great-grandchildren.

"I don't expect to see another than it," she said. An exact count of the throng was not qualitable.

The family counts 1.742 direct descendants of Albert and Hedwig Kurma who left Poland for America in 1881 and eventually brought a 160 acre form here for \$486 in time for apring planting in 1885.

At the Catholic Mass, the five generations, including 728 members of the clan who still reside in nurthwestern Minnesuta's Marshall County, merged their voices in Pulish and English for "Faith of Our Fathers." "We Cather Together" and "America."
