

THE LAVENDER HOME, located in Wakulla County, Florida, possibly on land along the Leon County line. There is a clearing still there with palm trees and evidence of a homestead that has been demolished and cleared away. An old home that is very similar to the above house has been found near Sutton Cemetery, shown on map page 12. It is situated on land that was purchased by Robert Winter Lavender in 1860. Land transactions do not give details of a house, but other records are being studied. In the above photo, taken around 1905-06, from the left, my mother, Leila Viola Horne Lavender with her daughter, Mary Lorena Lavender. The black girl may have been Lillie Roxey, the family cook. Then Minnie Lee Lavender, and from family reports, we believe that the boys are William B. Dickey and Johnnie L. Lavender. On the porch, from left, Ida Francenia Allen Lavender Dickey (she married Pearce Harris later on) with her husband at the time, William Edgar Dickey who is holding his young son, Palmer Dickey. Others on the porch have not been identified.

The Lavender land once belonged to Seminole Indians in the year 1804 and was acquired by settlers. It became known as a part of "Forbes Purchase." A land patent, registered in Land Patent Office in Washington D.C. was given to Colin Mitchell.

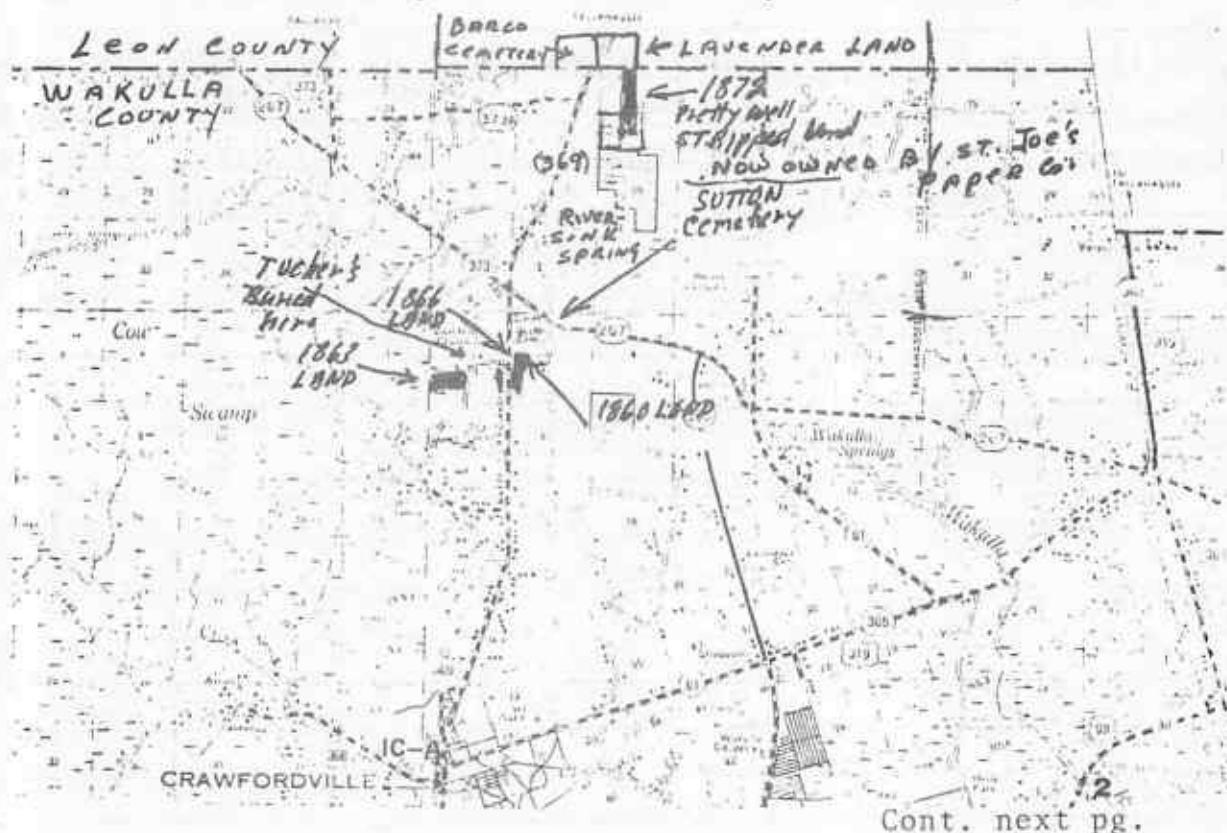

Daniel Lavender

Daniel Lavender, son of John Lavender and Nancy Patrick Lavender (Agness Fitzpatrick Lavender) was born April 16, 1827, in Sumter District, South Carolina, and died December 30, 1862 while serving in the Civil War. He was married to Flavilla Newell McIntosh, born August 13, 1825 and died December 19, 1895. They had five daughters: Jane McIntosh Lavender who married Lewis Green; Mary A. Eliza Lavender who married Samuel Clemence Turbeville; Frances N. Lavender; Alice Lavender who married Offie Green, and Ella R. Lavender who married James Thaddeus Gibbons. Daniel Lavender is buried at the New Zion Methodist Church Cemetery, Clarendon County, S.C.

The following are copies of notes which Daniel Lavender wrote with lead pencil on the fly leaves of a pocket Bible four days before his death in Georgetown, S.C. of pneumonia. These copies were obtained by the submitter about twenty years ago from Mr. George William Green.

Georgetown Dec. 26, 1862

My Dear Wife,

I try to write you a few lines in my Bible, in all probability the last you will get from me in this world. Try, my dear, and meet me in heaven. I have so lived that I have strong hopes of getting to Heaven myself. So, my dear, I bid you farewell.

My Dear Father

Georgetown, S.C. Dec. 26, 1862

I am quite sick. I think I am going to die soon. I pray you to take care of my wife and dear little children. I want you to have me carried home and bury me at New Zion Church. So farewell my father. Meet me in Heaven.

Clytie's Lavenders

I'm sure you heard about the bad weather we had here last Friday and Saturday (May 20-21, 1983). We had eight tornadoes on the ground at the same time. The wind was 125 mph and 7 inches of rain fell within 5 minutes just before the weather station was blown away. I saw hail stones as large as golf balls, stacked in places 3 feet deep. It rained and hailed for 45 minutes. I lived through a tornado that made a big change in my life. I lost my family, the house and everything in it. All I had left was the clothes I had on, and was a kid of 15 in the middle of the Depression. Other people were having a hard time as well, too hard to take in another mouth to feed, but with GOD I made it. I know how quickly you can lose everything so want to share my Lavender material through the LAVENDER LINE. I know that this publication not only goes to all the subscribers, but to libraries and genealogical societies. I have documents for all of it, or have talked personally with the individuals mentioned in the report that follows and will be continued.

As an introduction, I am a retired nurse, born January 24, 1920 in New Orleans, Louisiana, daughter of Albert G. Felder and Bertie Lee Harrell, both of Amite County, Mississippi. I married Roger Monroe Lavender, descendant of Bryan Lavender, March 8, 1958 at Central Baptist Church, Port Arthur, Texas.

Roger Monroe Lavender was born July 3, 1914 in Pike County (City of McComb) Mississippi. He attended school there until June 1924 when he and his family moved to DeQuincy, La. He finished in the top of his class on May 21, 1930, at the age of 15 at DeQuincy High School. He went into carpenter work where he excelled. He moved to Texas in 1941, worked for O.W. Collins Construction Company of Port Arthur, Texas, as a Superintendent. The Company built many churches, banks, schools, office buildings and did extensive work in all the refineries of Southeastern Texas and West Louisiana. After O.W. Collins retired, Roger worked for Bella Construction Company of Beaumont, Texas, for 18 years. He retired in April 1980, after 50 years of work. He was voted the "Outstanding Carpenter of Southeast Texas."

William Monroe Lavender, our only child, was born October 21, 1958 in Park Place Hospital, Port Arthur, Texas. He started school September 1964 and was in the second grade by his 6th birthday. He was in the top of his class all through school, in the school band, Cub and Boy Scouts, won many First Place Awards in Math and Science. Graduated Magna Cum Laude in the top ten of a class of 609 graduates on May 29, 1976, Thomas Jefferson

High School, Port Arthur, Texas. In WHO'S WHO OF AMERICAN HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS. Was offered scholarships from 34 of the largest universities. He took the Merit Scholarship from Rice University, Houston, Texas. Graduated May 10, 1980 with a degree in Physics and Astronomy, was elected to Sigma Pi Sigma & Physics Honor Society. William left for Stanford, California, where he started work June 1, 1980, as a research assistant at SLAK research center, Stanford University, and will be working on his PhD. William Monroe Lavender started working on his Lavender family history in the summer of 1974. He spent many hours in researching each record, to be sure that the facts were as true as possible.

ROBERT LAVENDER, Pvt. from CAMDEN SOUTH CAROLINA MILITIA LOYALISTS in 1780. In 1782 was a First Lt. and was paid Feb. 11, 1782. In same book, a refugee from North Carolina asking for help was MRS. SUSANNAH LAVENDER. Many of these people went to Canada.

In State Census of Mississippi, 1820, only LAVENDER was FELIX LAVENDER, age 26-45, 1 male under 10, 1 female 16-26, 1 female under 10, living in Natchez, Miss.

John W. Lavender...

John W. Lavender was born "8th 1837" in Fayette County, Tennessee, the son of Joseph Lavender. Joseph Lavender had six living children in 1853: John W. Lavender, the oldest, Joseph Lavender, Jr., Sarah Lavender, the oldest daughter, and three other children. The father, Joseph Lavender, Sr., became a widower around 1849 when his son, John W., was age 12. In 1853 Joseph Lavender, Sr. moved with his family of six children from Tennessee to Arkansas where he purchased a farm near Austin, then in Praire County, Ark., and resided there for about four years.

Being the oldest, John W. Lavender kept house about three years while his father worked, until his father remarried (around 1852 or 1853) "a splendid good woman who liked the care of children but had none living." In Arkansas, the children walked five miles to the log cabin Baptist Church where the Baptist Preacher Hodge preached certain Sundays. A Sunday School was organized by a Mr. Hoggard on Joseph Lavender, Sr.'s farm where John W. Lavender and his sister taught Sunday School, reading and other subjects.

John W. Lavender worked as a carpenter in Washington, Hemstead County, Ark. and then in Mt. Ida, Montgomery County, Ark. until 1861. He "enrolled" along with his brother, Joseph Jr., in the Confederate Army on 17 July 1861. They were both members of Company F., 4th Ark., Infantry, CSA. Co. F was involved in several battles and many lives in the company were lost. John W. Lavender was a courageous and innovative soldier and became the Captain of this Company. After many campaigns, in 1864, he was taken prisoner and sent to Johnson Island in Lake Erie. In June 1865, he returned home and resumed the carpentry work at Benton, Arkansas.

In 1867, John W. Lavender married Mary Elizabeth Ray at Benton, Arkansas. In 1869, he built the house at 1021 West 6th Street in Little Rock, Ark. where he lived the rest of his life. Before John W. Lavender died in 1921, he had written a one-hundred and forty page manuscript of his war experiences, including some brief family remarks. His writing, a resource in Civil War history and the source of this writing, was published

in 1956 as THEY NEVER CAME BACK, The War Memoirs of Captain John W. Lavender, C.S.A. The Story of Co. F., Fourth Arks. Infantry, CSA (originally known as The Montgomery Hunters.) As told by the Commanding Officer, Capt. John W. Lavender, CSA. Edited by Ted R. Worley and D.R. Perdue. Printed by The Perdue Co., Pine Bluff Arkansas, c. 1956.

A closer review of this book may reveal more family information and does reveal courageous dedication of Company F.

In 1807, Waightsstill Avery as "agent" pays taxes for Captain William Lavender, acres, no polls, no slaves, and the heirs of Benjamin Lavender, no polls, no slaves. He pays the same tax in 1808 and 1809. 1810, 11, 12 and 13 are missing. In 1814 he again pays taxes for William Lavender and the heirs of Benjamin Lavender, the same amount, 250 acres each.
