His business is now quite extensive and prosperous, and he enjoys the confidence and respect of all his German friends, especially, and is looked upon as one of the solid business men of the city. October 8, 1868, Joseph Fischer married Amelia Kirchgessner, daughter of Sebastian and Genoveva Kirchgessner of Adrian, by whom he has had three children as follows: George Wilhelm, born in Adrian, November 30, 1869, Helen Louisa, born same place November 8, 1872, died April 13, 1877; Edwin Joseph, born same place June 8, 1879. Mrs. Amelia Fischer was born in Buchen, Baden, Germany, March 6, 1844, and came to America with her father in 1849, and settled in Monroe, where she resided until 1866, when she came to Adrian. Her father was born in Buchen, Germany, in 1800, and died in Adrian, in April 1874. Her mother was born in the same place, in 1804, and died there in 1848. She was the mother of twelve children, three of whom reside in Adrian, three in Monroe, and one in Manchester. Two have died in this country. [For Joseph Fischer's family relation see Jacob Fischer's record in this book.]

Ontario county N V October 12 1819 His field, Ontario county, N. Y., October 12, 1819. His father, William Lawrence, was born in the State of New York, December 8, 1789, and was a farmer in Ontario county. He was a soldier in the war of 1812 and died in Rochester, N. Y., March 20, 1864. In the year 1808 William Lawrence married Miss Sela Thompson, of West Bloomfield, N. Y., by whom he had six children, Willis T. being the fourth child. Mrs. Sela Lawrence was born in Providence, R. I., April 5, 1794. Her parents were pioneers of Western New York, were three months on the road with ox teams, from Providence, and finally settled on the Genesee Flatts, a large tract of country then owned by General Wadsworth, extending from Geneseo to Rochester, and about thirty miles in width. William Lawrence's farm was situated near Geneseo village, and was known as the "Big Tree Farm." Mrs. Sela Law-rence died in Adrian, February 24, 1871. William Lawrence was a descendant of John Lawrence, who came to this country from England and settled in Monmouth, New Jersey, his wife

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being Miss Mary Townley, Willis T. Lawrence, at the age of eight years was bound to a farmer in East Bloomfield, N. Y., until he was twenty-one, but after four years service, he ran away on account of bad treatment, being whipped and overworked. Shortly after he ran away, he was attacked with typhus fever, and was sick during the winter. In the spring of 1832, he went to work for his physician, on his farm, and worked three years for one shilling per day to pay his doctor's bill. In 1835 he found employment in a woolen factory at \$5 per month, but after about one year the factory failed, and his next employment was making Windsor chairs, in Peck and Nash's chair factory in West Bloom-In 1837 he got employment in a blacksmith's shop in the same village, and in 1838 he again went to work on a farm for Stephen Tinker, of Lima, Livingston county, and afterwards took charge of Widow Leach's farm in the same township, receiving eighteen dollars per month and board,—good wages for those days. That fall, having saved about \$20, he went to Lima village, formed a partnership with an acquaintance, and started in the grocery business. He went to Rochester, invested his \$20 in goods, and got credit for \$30 more. He sold out the following spring for \$300, and went to work in Slab City on a brick yard, for one dollar per day. In September, 1840, he went to Rochester, where he soon engaged in the grocery and boating business, and became largely interested in a packet line on the Genesee Valley Canal, between Rochester and Danville, and a line of freight boats between Buffalo and New York. He finally sold out his boating interest, went to West Bloomfield and opened a large general store, In 1853 he built the Lawrence Hotel (now Brackett House) at the N. Y. C. depot, in Rochester. In 1855-6 he was elected assessor of the Second ward of Rochester. In 1854 he built a large brick block in Oswego, N. Y., which, soon after its construction was destroyed by fire, involving a great loss, as there was but little insurance. April 1, 1863, Mr. Lawrence sold his property in Rochester and Oswego, to James Brackett, and purchased the Brackett House, in Adrian, together with the Prairie Cottage farm, and considerable western property, and has resided in Adrian mostly Since Mr. Lawrence has been a resident of since that time. Adrian, he has been an active man in many respects. He has owned much valuable property, has improved it and added to the wealth and beauty of the city. He purchased the residence prop-erty now owned by Ira Metcalf, overhauled it, and erected a very large brick barn. He next purchased the Litchfield property, in the south-eastern part of the city. He surveyed it and expended \$1,200 in fencing it, and finally sold it to the Low Manu: Whitneys Hiet of Bring

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facturing company for \$50,000, \$10,000 cash, \$20,000 in company bonds, and \$20,000 in stock in the company. He was one of the directors, and also one of the building committee. He was one of the principal projectors and heaviest stock holder in the erection of the Masonic Temple, in Adrian, and was one of its trustees, and President of the Board of Trustees for four years, and chairman of the building committee. In 1869 Mr Lawrence went to Grand Rapids and leased and furnished Sweet's Hotel, one of the largest in the State, then just completed. After running the house for six months, he sold his lease and furniture for \$50,000, and again returned to Adrian, and for a short time was engaged in the livery business. He next purchased the Rowley farm, on Railroad street, which he owned for several years. In 1878 he purchased the ground so long and familiarly known as the Lenawee County Fair grounds. He has greatly improved this property, and has expended in actual outlay, over \$18,000. He has creeted new buildings, fences, etc. Every person in the county will remember the sad disaster—the fall of the grand stand, which had just been erected, and was still unfinished. Mr. Lawrence has twice been a candidate for the State Legislature, and once been a candidate for Mayor of Adrian. He has served four years as alderman of the Third ward of Adrian, and two years as chairman of the committee on streets, doing excellent work throughout the city. For more than twenty years Lenawee county has been strongly Republican in politics, but when he was a candidate for the Legislature, be greatly reduced the majority which had usually been given to the Republican candidates. He is an indefatigable and thorpolitical campaign, and very seldom anything but a forlorn hope against worker in a fails when there is October 11, 1841, Willis T. Lawrence married Jane Adelia Jackson, daughter of Hezekiah and Lovina Jackson, of Rochester, N. Y., by whom he had one daughter, Louisa F., born February 1844, in Rochester, now the wife of John W. French. Mrs. Adelia Lawrence was born in Towanda, Bradford county, Pa., October 11, 1824, and died in Rochester, N. Y., May 14, 1846. Hezekiah Jackson's father, Nathaniel Jackson, was born in Goshen, N. Y. Lovina Jackson was born in Montpelier, Vt., June 21, 1787. She was the daughter of Nathaniel Carpenter, a prominent man, who was one of four brothers who came from England in 1780, being the heirs of a large property in England, which is now in chancery. There is also a title of countess in the family, May 25, 1847, Willis T. Lawrence married Miss Marion Wadsworth, daughter of Joseph and Polly Wadsworth, of Pittstown, Rensselaer county, N. Y., by whom be has had two children, as

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follows: Marion Sela, born in Rochester, N. Y., May 15, 1848, now the wife of D. A. Whitney; Erin Hickok, born in the same place, December 31, 1849, and died October 12, 1850. Mrs. Marion Lawrence was born in Pittstown, N. Y., August 27 1829. Her father was born in Bennington, Vt., February 15, 1795, and died of cholera, in Rochester, August 17, 1864. February 19, 1817, Mr. Wadsworth married Polly Haskins, daughter of Azariah and Eliza (Potter) Haskins, of Pittstown, N. Y. Mrs. Polly Wadsworth was born in Pittstown, May 15, 1799, and died in Rochester, April 18, 1861.

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ORNELIUS BANCROFT was born in Lockport, Niagara county, N. Y., August 27, 1830. His father, Neley Bancroft, was born in Auburn, Worcester county, Mass., May 22, 1799, where he resided until after he was married. In the fall of 1827, he moved to Lockport, N. Y., where he purchased a farm and resided until 1835, when he came to Michigan and located land on section 18, in Rome, this county, settling on his land in October; he immediately put up a log house, 18x26, and made it very comfortable to pass the winter. The only inhabitants for a distance of four miles west, and half a mile east of him were the wolves, deer and bear, who asserted their rights, and made bold their attempts to scare or drive him away, by their hideous howls and frequent visits. He did not build a fire place in his house, for he was told that a large stove could be got in Adrian, and as soon as possible he went "to town" and purchased the first cook stove that was ever set up in the western part of the county, which cost \$39.87. He cleared up sixty acres of land, built good buildings, and set out a good orchard, which he raised from seed brought from New York. He was one of the men who organized the township of Rome: also, the first school district and first Baptist church, and assisted in building the first frame church in the town, of which be was a member. He resided on this farm until his death, which occurred July 7, 1879. Nevember 1, 1827. Nelsy Banco & married

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December 4, 1852, to Ann Moore, of Bradford, Orange county, Vt., who now resides on the old homestead. Cornelius Bancroft came to Michigan with his parents in 1835, and has lived in Lenawee county ever since. He was the only child of his parents, and now owns and resides upon the farm his father located from the government, forty-five years ago. He was only five years old when he came to Michigan, and has no knowledge of any other home. Although he was young when he came here, he remembers very distinctly that Michigan of to-day is not what it was when he first saw it. He always lived with his parents, and assisted his father in clearing up the land, and appreciates fully what has been done to bring the county to its present proud position, of being one of the very best in the State. The present generation will never realize what their parents and grand parents have undergone here, seeming to think that everything was always about as it is now; but happily, perhaps, for them that they do not know all that was endured and overcome. He remembers one instance that happened to his father while coming from Toledo to Adrian with his goods and family. The day was warm and he had taken his coat off and laid it upon the wagon, but it slipped off and was never found. In one of the pockets of this coat were one hundred dollars, nearly all the money he had with him. A thorough search and enquiry was made, but neither the coat nor the money was ever recovered. Following this was the loss of cows and oxen by disease. At three different times an ox died, breaking up the team, and finally the climax came by the burning up of the house and all its contents, March 18, 1841. To show the true friendship and sympathy of the people in those days, it is proper to record that friends and neighbors to the number of nearly one hundred turned out a few days after the fire and nearly completed a new house in one day, the timber being taken from the stump and one side hewed. Company came in after the new house was occupied, and a wide board laid across a barrel was the table, but the food was relished, and the visit was enjoyed just as much as if the furniture had been carved and polished mahogany. May 27, 1855, Cornelius Bancroft married Harriet M. Moore, daughter of William C. and Lucinda W. (Wells) Moore, of Union, Branch county, Mich., by whom he has had nine children, as follows: William W., born February 20, 1856; Mary E., born October 3, 1860; Rosa E., born March 25, 1863; Wallace G., born May 15, 1865; Herbert O., born May 15, 1867; Sarah A., born August 14, 1869; George H., born May 6, 1873; all born in Rome, and all at home; two died in infancy. Mrs. Harriet M. Bancroft was born in Bradford, Orange county, Vt., September 11, 1835, came to Michigan with her parents in

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unfinished. He lived with a neighbor—Mr. Goodman—for six weeks. He moved into his new house in December, and in February it took fire and burned up, with all its contents. This occurred while Mr. Jeffery was off in the woods hunting deer. In 1863 his large house burned, with considerable loss of household goods. In 1876 his large barn was burned with all its contents, including two horses.

ILLIAM A. WHITNEY was born in Shelby, Orleans county, New York, April 21st, 1820, and in June, 1828, came with his parents, to Adrian, Michigan. His father, Capt. James Whitney, was born in Warwick, Orange county, New York, February 10th, 1783. In 1801, on foot, and alone, he went to Romulus, New York, where he married, November 9th, 1806, Mary Frisbie, who was born in New Haven, Connecticut, June 11th, 1786, daughter of Abel and Rebecca (Hayes) Frisbie. They dwelt in Romulus till the spring of 1814, then moved to Shelby, New York, where they bought, of the Holland land company, two hundred acres of land, on what was known as the Holland Purchase. Here he resided until the year 1827, when he sold his farm and the same year came to Adrian, Michigan, where he purchased four hundred acres of land, on the west side of the River Raisin, all now within the city limits. He returned to Shelby the same fall, where he remained through the winter, and in the spring of 1828, moved, with his family, consisting of eight children, to his new, wilderness home, where he arrived about the first of June of that year. He lived in Adrian until the year 1833, when he sold his farm there, and soon after purchased another, containing eight hundred acres, surrounding Sand lake, in the town of Nottawa, St. Joseph county, Michigan, where he dwelt till 1839, when he again sold, and moved to Moulton, Allen county (now Washington, Auglaize county), Ohio, where he died, August 11th, 1851; his wife died August 28th, the same year. They were buried in Fort Amanda cemetery, at Amanda, Allen county, Ohio, William A., the subject of this sketch, was the sixth child and fourth son. lived most of the time with his parents, until he was eighteen years of age, when he went to Atrica, New York, in the employ of Messrs. Elias T. Stanton and David Scott, as clerk, in a dry goods store, where he remained for two and one-half years, when he returned to Adrian, and continued in the same business until the fall

September 14th, 1847, he married Miss Ellen Maria Bixby, daughter of David and Laura Bixby, who settled in Adrian in the year 1827, and were among the very earliest settlers of then town of Logan. Mrs. Ellen M. Whitney was born in Albion, New York, April 6th, 1825. December, 1847, Mr. Whitney engaged in hotel keeping, and opened, in Adrian, the New Franklin hotel, which he kept about one year, when he sold out, and again engaged in the mercantile trade, which he continued most of the time until the year 1858. In the spring of 1859, the year the first stone pavement was laid in Adrian, he was elected to the office of city recorder, and was re-elected in the spring of 1860, and held the same till April, 1861. In the fall of 1862 he was elected register of deeds of Lenawee county, and took possession of that office January 1st, 1863. He was re-nominated, and elected, in the fall of 1864, and held the office two years more, his second term expiring January 1st, 1867. He was a clerk, from about that time until the spring of 1869, with the Michigan State Insurance Company, when he was appointed postmaster of Adrian, which position he held for four years, from May 17th, 1869, to May 17th, 1873, when his term of office expired, and he engaged in the printing business, and founded the Adrian Daily and Weekly Press, which business he followed until April 5th, 1878, a period of nearly five years, when he sold out. He is the father of two children, as follows: Dwight A., born in Adrian, Michigan, June 21st, 1848, married, at Grand Rapids, January 25th, 1870, Miss Marion C. Lawrence. Her parents are Willis T and Marion Lawrence, now of Adrian. They have one child, named Lena B., born in Adrian, April 21st, 1873. Dwight A. Whitney is now the manager of the Lawrence hotel. Fannie Lee Whitney was born in Adrian, July 16th, 1859, and was married, December 18th, 1878, to O. F. Berdan, a violinist, composer, and, at present, music publisher, in Adrian. Mr. Whitney being one of the earliest pioneers of Adrian, has always felt a proud interest in the prosperity and history of the same, as well as of the whole county. In November, 1867, he wrote the early history of Adrian, extending from 1825 to 1835, which was published, at that time, in the Adrian Daily and Weekly Times. February 17th, 1875, he wrote the first call for a county pioneer meeting, which met on the 27th of the same month, and organized the Lenawee County Pioneer Society, and he was elected its first secretary, which office, with the exception of one year, he has held ever since, without compensation. the year 1879 he, in company with Mr. Richard I. Bonner, canvassed the county of Lenawee, and made biographical sketches of the early pioneers, and published, in book form, Whitney & Bon-

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ner's History and Biographical Record of Lenawee county, Michigan. Mr. Whitney and his brother, Abel, are, at the present time, the oldest male residents of the city of Adrian. They descended from Henry Whitney, who came from England to America about 1649, and settled at Southold, Long Island.

ON. HENRY HART, son of Herman V. Hart, was born in Albany, New York, January 28th, 1818, where he was educated for a civil engineer in the old Albany academy, conducted by Professor Henry, late of the Smithsonian Institute. Washington. After receiving his education he commenced the practice of his profession on the preliminary survey of the Albany and Boston railroad. In August, 1837, he came west, seeking his fortune as civil engineer. Arriving at Monroe he presented his credentials to Levi S. Humphrey, Esq., the Commissioner on the part of the State for the Michigan Southern railroad, and at one was assigned a position with an engineering corps which was then operating in the neighborhood of Jonesville. He continued in the field until the final location of the road was established, and was then assigned charge of the final location and construction of that road, between Adrian and Monroe, which position he held until the completion of the road to Adrian, about the year 1840. In the fall of the same year he formed a co-partnership with Abel Whitney, and commenced the business of selling dry goods in Adrian, which co-partnership continued about two years, Mr. Whitney retiring at that time, and Mr. Hart continued in the business almost uninterruptedly from that time until the year 1866. During that time he was appointed special agent of the post-office department for the States of Michigan, Wisconsin, Minnesota and Northern Illinois, which position he held for about six years. He was elected Mayor of Adrian in the year 1859, and held the office for one year. In the year 1866 he was elected Secretary of the Michigan State Insurance company, of which he was one of the organizers, in the year 1859, and from that time until his death, remained in the same position. At a called meeting of the citizens of the county, in 1865, for the purpose of organizing a soldier monument association, he was elected President, and remained in that position until the monument was completed in 1870. He devoted much time and energy in raising the necessary funds.

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he took possession and ten acres of it were plowed for the first time by him, and in addition he has cleared about six acres. He is engaged in general and dairy farming and at the present time has sixteen head of fine cattle. In politics Mr. Hayward has always been a Democrat, but has never sought public office. He is affiliated with the Methodist Episcopal church of Merenci. On June 28, 1888, he was married to Miss Abbie Bucher, daughter of Philip and Rebecca (Emerick) Bucher, who were also residents of Seneca

township.

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Calvin Adolphus Lawrence, a prosperous and prominent farmer of Hudson township, was born July 31, 1843, at Jaffrey, Cheshire county, New Hampshire. He was the son of Sylvester B. and Mary (Emery) Lawrence, who were also born in the same place, the father on Feb. 9, 1813, and the mother on July 29, 1820. Sylvester Lawrence was a son of Ithemer Lawrence, who was born near Jaffrey and followed the occupation of farming. Ithemer Lawrence's name will live as long as the records of the Revolutionary war are intact, as he enlisted with a New Hampshire regiment and fought through that great struggle. He returned to his farm and there passed away. Sylvester B. was educated in his native village and later followed the occupation of his father, that of farming. Some of his father's military spirit must have been inherited by him, for he became a colonel in the New Hampshire state militia. At a later period he worked at the butcher's trade. In 1857 he came to Michigan and located in Medina township and was there two years; he then moved to Hudson township, where he acquired a farm of 400 acres and it was there he died. Jan. 3, 1869. His wife had preceded him in death, having passed away April 27, 1863. To them were born nine children: Henry S., who was killed in the battle of Fredericksburg; Albert J., deceased; Calvin A., subject of this review; Charles Z., of Cleveland, Ohio; Loren A., deceased; Clara, deceased; Sidney, postmaster at Hudson, Mich.; Effie B., widow of George Moore and a resident of Hudson township; and Mary, wife of John A. Dillon, of Hudson township. Politically Sylvester Lawrence was a Republican and he held office in New Hampshire, having been elected highway commissioner and supervisor. Both Sylvester Lawrence and his wife were associated with the Methodist Episcopal church. Lawrence, the subject of this sketch, received his early education at Medina Academy and the Hudson High School. He began working on the home farm and remained with his parents until the death of his father, when he inherited sixty acres of land, to which he added 210 acres by buying out the other heirs. He built all the buildings and has erected for himself a beautiful home. He has followed a line of general farming and raises fine stock cattle. In politics he belongs to the Republican party and has been supervisor for one term. His family gives support to the Baptist church, of Hudson, and he belongs to the Masonic lodge of that city. On Sept. 6, 1882, he was united in marriage to Miss Lizzie Kingsley, daughter of Dwight and Elizabeth (Hitchings) Kingsley, of Clayton, Mich. To them have been born four children: George,

who died in infancy; Fred, Frank and Dolph. Mrs. Lawrence's father and mother were natives of Massachusetts and came to Michigan about 1850, locating at Clayton. Dwight Kingsley was a member of Company I, Ninth Michigan artillery, and served from 1862 to 1865. He was a Republican in politics, a member of the Baptist church, a Mason, and a member of the Grand Army of the Republic. He moved to Fitzgerald, Ga., where he died March 18, 1908. Elizabeth Kingsley died in Clayton, Sept. 29, 1888.

James Gahagan, a prosperous farmer, now retired, was born at LeRoy, Genesee county, New York, Feb. 5, 1836. He is the son of James and Ellen (Doyle) Gahagan, both of whom were born in County Westmeath, Ireland. James Gahagan, Sr., came to this country in the early '30s and located in the state of New York. He followed the mason's trade in the latter state, and in 1840 came to Michigan and acquired a farm of eighty acres, to which he added from time to time until he had over 700 acres of land, all cleared and improved. This was in Medina township, but in 1858 he moved to Hudson township and continued to reside in that township for the remainder of his life, retiring from the farm and moving to Hudson village, where he died in March, 1881. His wife had preceded him in death many years, having died while they were living on the old homestead. James Gahagan, Sr., was, in politics, a Democrat, and he held various offices, among which was notary public, and he was a school director for many years. He was a member of the Catholic church. To him and wife were born twelve children: Thomas, who lives in Medina township; John, deceased; Mary, widow of Peter Edwards and a resident of Hudson; James, Jr., subject of this review; Ellen, deceased; Margaret, widow of Patrick Fitzpatrick; Peter, who was a soldier in the Union army, and was killed in the battle of Gettysburg; Daniel, deceased; Joseph, residing in Hudson; Michael, who resides in Toledo; Annie, wife of John Lennon, of Palmyra; and Francis, deceased. James Gahagan, Jr., was the fourth child and received his early education at the parochial school of Catholic Hill in Medina township. He began life working on his father's farm and continued there until 1861, when he inherited a forty-acre farm in Medina township and continued to operate the same until 1866. He then went to St. Charles county, Missouri, and for a period of sixteen months remained in the latter state, returning to Michigan in 1867, again locating on the place he had left before going west. He continued on this farm until 1877, when he purchased a farm of eighty acres, near Hudson. He greatly improved this last farm by building a new house and other buildings and extensively tiling and draining the land. His tract comprises eighty acres and he followed a course of general farming, but at the present time he is living a retired life. Politically Mr. Gahagan belongs to the Democratic party and has held various public offices, having been school director for three or four terms, and he has been treasurer of the school board for three terms. He is a member of the Catholic church at Hudson. On Nov. 27, 1869, he was married to Miss Catherine Cavanaugh, daughter of Morris Cavanaugh, of Bronson, 49-2V

THE HAME

Of Learence, as a personal and family name, it is sufficient to say, as to the orthography, that it is now almost universally spelled and written Learence, and not Learence or Learence, as formarly was the case.

The derivation of this name of non may be traced to the latin word Laurup, - Lauruntius. Its signification has been thus given on the Town Records of Hinghes, Mass, first page: "Christian names for non now most used with the signification, Learence, - flourishing like a bay-tree,"

ARCHRISHOP LAWREDICE.

The first individual of this name who lived in England, yet ascertained, was Learence, the monk. Collier, in his Dictionary, has the name Learence. In Harris's "History of Kent," it is Learence. He came from Italy with Austin, who was sent to Britain for the propagation of Christianity in the island.

Upon the death of Austin, he succeeded him to the Archbichopric of Canterbury. He is said to have been both learned and plous; and, at his death, was burked in the Abbey of St. Austins, A. D. 916.

JOHN LAMESTICE, OF WATERTONS, MAIS.

The lineal amostry of this stock of Laurences in America, now found quite memoras in New England and other parts of the country, has been at length very satisfactorily assertained. As traced and determined, it originates in and derives from one ROEER LAURENCE, of Lancachire, England; bern, probably, as early as A.D. 1150, and the amoster of the earliest families of the name in England. Attending his severeign, Richard Goour de Lion, to the war of the Grusades in the Holy Land, he so distinguished himself in the slege of Acre, that he was lenighted "Sir Robert of Ashton Hall," and obtained for his arms, "Argent, a cross reguly gules," A.D. 1151.

The arms of Sir Robert of Ashton Hall, conferred by Richard I., namely, "Argent, a cross raguly gales," were also those of the Lengashire brunch consmily, thus.

Also, "No beareth Ermino, a cross reguled gules, by the name of Learness, of Learneshiro." "Hagaled" is a term used "to represent the rough-hour stone of a tree from which the brunches have been rudely lopped."

Proceeding with the successive generations of ancestry, we have in order of time, the first, Sir Robert Laurence, of Achten Hall.

THE SECOND GRIEGATION.

Respecting the name "Learence" and "Jashington," it may be noted, that Learence Washington, a brother of the first President of the United States, was one of the earliest proprietors of Houst Vernon.
