aged 9 weeks and one day  
(Susan Lawson Stockdale died \_\_\_ November 1916 at Fremont, IN. Stephen  
Stockdale died there a few years later)

An old newspaper clipping pasted into the Bible under the death of  
John Lawson in 1864 reads:  
LAWSON. John Lawson member of Company E, 2nd Ohio Regiment was  
born in Taylorsville September 13 1827; was captured in the battle  
of Chickamauga September 1863, and after ten months imprisonment  
died at Andersonville, Ga July 28 1864. He was a member of the  
Methodist Episcopal church for several years in which he proved  
himself to be an Isrealite in deed and in his regiment a true sol-  
dier for his country. A wife and several children mourn. -W Adamson
