In Detroit, 2001, marks the year we will celebrate the history and culture of Detroit in recognition of the 300<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the founding of the city. *Detroit 300, Inc.* – an independent not-for-profit organization – has been organized to oversee the implementation of programs, celebrations, and observances for the city's Tercentennial. Headed by Board Chairman Edsel B. Ford II, a 41-member commission serves to coordinate *Detroit 300* policies and activities. We are excited about the prospect of bringing international attention to the pride and joy we share in our region's past, present and future.

In recognition of the significance of *Detroit 300*, we are partnering with civic, business, educational, cultural and religious organizations throughout Southeastern Michigan and Essex County in Ontario to organize and celebrate various aspects of our rich and diverse history. Partner Programs can be exhibitions, festivals, special events, publications, lectures, tours, performances, or other ways of expressing the Tercentennial. As a member of our Partner Programs, you will receive:

- Recognition as an official event of the Tercentennial along with the right to use *Detroit 300's* Partner Program logo.
- Marketing support via *Detroit 300's* schedule of events and celebrations in brochures, the *Detroit 300* web site, media releases, advertisements, and other promotions.
- Crossover audience marketing as *Detroit 300* will link Partner Programs with similar themes to encourage attendance and public participation.

Since it is a significant aspect of our regional history, Auto Heritage will be a special focus of our promotion campaign. I am hosting a meeting of Auto Heritage groups to discuss *Detroit 300*, in general, and Partner Programs and related activities, which may be of interest to your organization. Although the official deadline to apply for Partner Programs status is not until December 15, 2000 – we are providing special incentives for those that apply by January 15, 2000. These incentives include tourism packets and special media releases.

The meeting will be held at 2:00 p.m., Thursday, December 2. We will meet at the *Detroit 300* offices in the Albert Kahn Building, 7430 Second Avenue, Suite 310 in Detroit (New Center Area at the corner of Lothrop and Second). You can park for two hours for free in the Crowley's lot on Lothrop between Second and Woodward.
