

This compilation of Looker family data is the result of bringing together information and research from a number of different people, knowing that each person would want to know about the findings of all the others.

I am sending copies of this material to each person who contributed material if the address is obtainable. After receiving corrections and additions, hopefully within a month, from those contributors, my goal is to make a final revised compilation. Then I plan to place copies in the libraries of the Fairfield County Genealogical Society, housed in the Historical Room of the Fairfield County District Library, 219 North Broad St., Lancaster, Ohio 43130; and of the Licking County Genealogical Society, P.O.Box 4037, Newark, Ohio 43055-8037, library in Room 107 S.E. corner lower level at 743 East Main St., Newark, phone 614-345-3571, open Tues-Wed-Thurs-Sat 1-4 pm; the Pataskala and Pickerington town libraries; and, of course, to members of our family. If the contributors do not object, I would like to also provide copies to the Genealogy Room of the Ohio State Library, 65 South Front St. (downtown) Columbus, Ohio, and to the Mormon Family History collection. I have appreciated so much material placed in libraries and otherwise made available that I have used, and would like in turn to make my contribution.

While typing these pages I was fortunate to receive more information. This will be incorporated into my next revision along with corrections and additions from the above contributors:

1. Hazel Morey's daughter Joanne Mustoe, 3101 26th Ave.N.E., Norman, Oklahoma 73071, accompanied and assisted Hazel in her genealogical research and has the information found. Hazel had shared all her data with David Bowers. Joanne kindly made copies of several pages Hazel made summarizing her research. I made additional copies of these pages which appear as an appendix at the end of this compilation.
2. New material came also from Marie K. Arrington, Rt.3 Box 118, Broadway, VA 22815, the author of Mountain Valley People which is out of print at this time. She provided copies of 29 pages of a booklet, "The Family of Thomas Looker" by Vera Ross Boyatt, 1305 Big Springs Rd Maryville, TN 37801, compiled October 1989. This booklet is full of information which I will try to summarize in the Addenda section starting on page 41, but any Looker researcher would want their own copy of the original. Anyone researching colonial records would probably want to compare experiences with Joanne Mustoe and Vera Boyatt. Marie Arrington also sent a copy of "The Henry Cowan Family of Virginia", information collected by Frank B. Lamb of Birmingham, Michigan, and compiled by Maude Pinney Kuhns, Perry Highway R D 2, Waterford, Pa. This booklet mentions a number of people named Looker.
3. Betty Cook has sent a lot more information on the family of 2C1c.Mary Pickering Swayze.
4. Lucretia Arthur has sent a lot more information on her family which does seem to be correctly placed under 2B7b. Her research on colonial and other early Looker family members introduces some new elements and ideas. See Addenda section, Number 4.

This is your copy to keep. Presumably the genealogical society will photocopy the final revised copy for you when I get it to their library. This Looker data may be part of a Pickering genealogy.

To describe the central Ohio area: Violet Township, Fairfield County (county seat Lancaster to the southeast), in which Pickerington is located; is bordered on the north by Truro Township, Franklin County, in which is Reynoldsburg; and on its east Etna Township, Licking County, which contains the villages of Wagram and Etna. Etna Township is bordered on the north by Lima Township, Licking County, which contains the villages of Summit/Summit Station and Columbia Center. The town of Pataskala is east of Columbia Center with county seat Newark further east. Columbus stretching from north to south borders the entire aforementioned area on the west and covers most of the rest of Franklin County.

Dovel Memorial Cemetery is the old part of Violet Cemetery in Pickerington.

Silent Home Cemetery is the old town cemetery in Reynoldsburg. Glen Rest Cemetery established c1940's is outside of Reynoldsburg to the east.

Information publicized concerning the 175th Anniversary Celebration of Pickerington, Ohio in 1990 including its Official Commemorative Booklet of 50 pages; 2. Everton Publishers of THE GENEALOGICAL HELPER (P.O. Box 368, Logan, Utah 84321) computerized family files and "Roots Celler"; and 3. from a number of family descendants.

Other possible sources of information: A book about the history of Augusta County, Virginia, and one about the Shenandoah Valley of Virginia, both of which are available in various genealogical society libraries. The Harrisonburg-Rockingham Historical Society, P.O. Box 716, Dayton, Virginia 22821 has an extensive library and many books for sale about families of the area including a book by Geneva Brubaker: "Spitzer-Jones, Frank and Lydia, Ancestors-Descendants 1322-1989." Allied families include King, Wean, Lokey, Orebaugh, Gordan, Wine, Archart. 1989, 79 pages, hard cover, \$20.

History: In 1557 Thomas Trumbull, who owned a great deal of property in downtown London died and left half of it to his daughter Johanne who had married Emmanuel Lucar. Thomas Trumbull (the only other heir) died unmarried and willed his half of the Trumbull estate to his sister and her family. It is said that the Lookers once gave some land to the city of London to be used as a park. If it is ever not used as a park, it is to revert to the Loker heirs. The Lookers seem to have come first to Sudbury, Massachusetts in 1639. Some Looker family members then lived in Providence and Newport, Rhode Island. The exigrant Lookers were associated with Roger Williams, and at least while they lived in Newport, R.I. were Seventh Day Baptists. Some were then in Gravesend, Long Island, then New Jersey, then Shenandoah Valley, Virginia. Mark Lucar helped found a Seventh Day Baptist Church in Providence, R.I. The early Lookers in Virginia were definitely Quakers. Many early court records, before and after 1800, referred to "Thomas Looker, the Quaker" and "James Looker, the Quaker." They were father and son. It is possible that old Thomas first came to the Shenandoah Valley with a large migration of Quakers in 1738. Mrs. Burns-Mrs. Morey family owned items said to have been used by the Dunkards in Virginia in their religious services. The only church in Tenth Legion, Virginia, where the Lookers and Laytons lived, is a Church of the Brethren (Dunkard) and historians say that it was built in 1844 on the site of a former Quaker meeting house. (Most of this history came from Hazel Morey's research.) There were four Looker (brothers?) serving in the Revolutionary War from New Jersey: Othniel, Nathaniel, Eleazer, and John or Johnson. There were others with approximately the same name. Mrs. Morey said their family had a sword which their ancestor used in the Revolution.

Pedigree and/or chronology: Thomas Trumbull died 1557 had a daughter Johanne who m Emmanuel Lucar lived London, England. Had 5 children: Emmanuel, Mark, Luke, John, Martha. A brother or cousin of Henry Loker, or some other "Looker" remaining in England was perhaps the ancestor of Robert Luckey who came to America in 1753 and resided in the counties of Cumberland, Westmoreland and Washington in Pennsylvania. He is the subject of "Arnold-Luckey Family Ties" by Rev. Leonard Wilson Arnold and Ethel Zwick Luckey, a book in the genealogy section of the Fairfield County District Library in Lancaster, Ohio.

Othnel Looker from an encyclopaedia: "Othnel Looker was born Oct. 4, 1757 on Long Island,

New York. After his father John's death, his mother moved to Hanover, Morris County, New

Jersey. He enlisted May, 1776 and served as a Private throughout the Revolutionary War.

(Perhaps there is genealogical data on him in D.A.R. files.) "He received a land grant

for his military service and moved in 1804 to Hamilton County, Ohio. He served as acting

governor of Ohio from April 14 to Dec. 8, 1814, after Governor Meigs' resignation to accept

the position of Postmaster General. Governor Looker then resigned to accept the office

of United States Senator. The next governor was Thomas Worthington. Othnel Looker

later went to Palestine, Illinois where his daughter had married into the prominent

Kitchell family. He is buried there.

Valley later than Thomas. Descendants of these two men refer to each other as cousins.

In 1756 Thomas Lokey, along with Jacob Wooly (Woodley) and Valentine Sevier, are recorded as landowners in the Shenandoah Valley (from Settlers by the Long Gray Trail 1 Harrison, page 182). Ruth Bisplinghoff found that Thomas Looker "the Quaker" in 1767 sold son James 421 acres, adjacent to Valentine Sevier, patented 1749 in "Rockingham" County, Va. In 1769 he bought land from Zebulon and Margaret Harrison, patented 1730; delivered to son James 1769 (from Chalkley: Annals of Augusta County, Virginia). The whole area of the Shenandoah Valley began as Augusta County. In March 1778 a part of Augusta Co. became Rockingham Co. Thomas Looker could have had sons or grandsons in the Revolutionary War, could check 1 files. On the Rockingham Co. personal property tax list for 1787 the only Lokeys listed are Thomas and John, who could have been either brothers or father and son. They are listed Militia Company Area 11 along with William "Pickeren" and Jacob Woodley. The tax assessor called on Jacob Woodley April 7. He called on John and Thomas Lokey and William Pickeren all on April 16. Thomas Looker wrote his will on May 29, 1794 and died testate 1795. His land, given to son James in 1768, "now" given to James' son-in-law Abraham Bowers in 1813. The Index to 1810 Census of Virginia for Rockingham Co. shows no Lookers at all, but the families of Lokey there are: on Roll 22-John; on Roll 25-Sarah, John, William; and on Roll 27-Margaret, James. Thomas Looker The Quaker's will lists 3 children:

Abraham and Ann's descendants have through the years received much recognition in Pickerington, and continue to be in demand to ride in parades etc. In honor of the 175th Anniversary of the founding of Pickerington a new gravestone in Violet Cemetery for Abraham and Ann Pickering was unveiled on Sept. 15, 1990 by descendants of two of their children, Jonathan Pickering and Mary Pickering Swayze. The new headstone was provided by the Pickerington-Violet Township Historical Society. The 1820 Census lists in the Abraham Pickering household 1 male under 10, 2 aged 10-15, 1 around 20, and 1 female about 20 in addition to the parents.

He could have been the teamster.)"

This must be 3. John rather than Thomas "Quaker"'s son 2B. John because the latter so far is not known to have had a son named James.

"James Knox Polk Pickering reportedly did not serve in the Army of the Confederacy during the War between the States, but he did take cattle into the mountain valleys to hide them from the Northern Armies," says Robert Moore in his booklet "The Descendents of James Knox Polk Pickering son of James and Mary Looker Pickering and Barbara Anna Rebecca Shirley daughter of Zacharia and Mary Koontz Shirley", an 1983 update, 22 pages. Gene Houser of Pickerington has Cleo Richter's memorabilia. She or someone had told me she had a Looker family Bible. She told me she had old letters and that her father had kept notes with dates of events.

2. Another family tradition: In 1550 a person named Looker owned a fishmarket at the foot of London Bridge.

3. The Vera Ross Boyatt history begins in Burres, St. Marrie, Essex, England with the family of Robert Loker d between 1563 and 1592 and wife, Lucye (Riddlesdale) who d Feb. 3, 1592/3, and the children Danyell, Henry and "the other children" who may include John Loker baptized Aug. 16, 1566 and "Edward, whose daughter Rebecca was baptized in 1630." The just-mentioned Henry baptized Feb. 7, 1566/67 became a glover, married Elizabeth and he died around 1630 in Burres, England. Their children were Henry the eldest, John, Bridget and Ann the youngest. "Between 1631 and 1639 Elizabeth Loker came to Mass. with her children and many of the relatives." Henry b before 1618, d Oct. 14, 1688 Sudbury, Mass, m Hannah Barber. Here the names seem to start reshaping with those on page 1 of this Astrid Pickering compilation.

The Boyatt data includes a great deal of work reporting and interpreting records in Burres, St. Marrie, Essex, England; Sudbury, Mass.; New Jersey; Maryland; and Smith Creek, Rockingham Co, Virginia.

4. Lucretia Arthur's research introduces a new possibility of family immigrants: brothers Gove (1633), Jacob and Pieter (1642) Lokermans/Lockerman's from Turnhout, Antwerp, Holland to New Netherlands (New York).

From The History of Rockingham County by J.W. Wayland: "Muster roll of Rockingham soldiers: Commonwealth, 10th Virginia Cavalry: privates: Thomas Loker, David Loker, Rash Looker.

From Virginia Revolutionary Warrants by Samuel M. Wilson: "Revolutionary soldiers & sailors of Commonwealth of Virginia to whom Land Bounty Warrants were granted by Virginia for Military services in the War for Independence. Official records in the Kentucky State Land Office at Frankfort, Kentucky." Warrant 320 for William Locke, warrant 395 for Joseph Locke, warrant 3557 John Locke. Lucretia Arthur's research adds the names Locke, Lock, Locker, Locher, Losher to the list of possible spellings of the name.

5. David Bowers genealogy on page 2 prior to Thomas Looker "The Quaker" is based on a great deal of research. However proof of specific parent to child links between the generations has not yet been established.

Addenda (continued):

6. Back to Boyatt data, this time on Thomas Looker "The Quaker". She says Thomas Looker came to Smith Creek, Rockingham Co., Va "around 1732. He was to have obtained title to his first Valley land from old Mr. Burden who was the son of Benjamin Burden, an assemblyman with William Looker of Elizabethtown, N.J., and had made improvements on the land before 1735." She explains how with the changing of county lines, the land 2.Thomas gave his son James was in Shenandoah Co. She describes the location of Thomas Looker's White House "still standing in the 1940's at Tenth Legion...near...intersection of the Broadway Road with old U.S. 11. The area was also known as Long Meadows. I have tried to find the house (1989)...estimate...would have been on the cross road west from Bethlehem Church and destroyed by 1-81." She says Thomas Looker was b c1700, m before 1733, wife's name unknown. She probably died before 1769 because she did not sign the deed for land given to son James. Children: John c1736-1813 married Margaret __, James c1741-1813 m Frances, Grace b before 1733 d c1800 m Jacob Woodley. Thomas Looker died at Smith Creek, Rockingham Co., Virginia.

7. More on Mathews family, see 2B2., page 5. Boyatt data says under the subject of Smith Creek, Rockingham Co. places, her page 9: "Lotus Grove built in 1820 on US 11 north of Harrisburg. It was built by Dan Matthews son of Solomon who was a Pennsylvania Quaker living in Rockingham Co. before the RW. He had an iron works on Linville Creek 'Mount Ery'; and a forge on Smith Creek near Lacy Springs as Spring Forge. Hanna Matthews married Hiram Martz. p A county survey Book 8:102 1814-16 The road from Kreigs Mill on Linville Creek to go in a straight line its whole course thru the land of B. Salvages, John Houtman, Solomon Matthews, Widow Reeves, Michael Summers and Colo Jn Koontz's mill on Smith Creek." On Boyatt page 16: "May 1813 Daniel Pickering became guardian of William Mathews, son of John. John Loker became guardian of Ann Matthews, dau of John in April."

3C.Elizabeth's second husband John Pitt d 1828 from flu according to a letter written by John Cowan reproduced in Frank B. Lamb's research.

8. In trying to locate farmland of 2C5.Jonathan Looker (page 14). The land map of Violet Twp. Fairfield Co. 1866 shows an S. Looker (grandson Sirus?) has 150 acres northwest of Pickerington west of Route 256, west of and bordering A. French farm, and northwest of J.B. Dovel 239 acres. S. Looker also? has 76 acres south of Pickerington bounded entirely on his west by J. Dovel land and entirely on his east by J. Ricketts land.

9. It is still uncertain exactly who the ancestry of 3D1.Thomas Looker who married Sarah Reeves is. Is page 5 or page 25 correct? In support of 3D1.Thomas in fact having different ancestry from the children of 2.Thomas Looker "The Quaker":

First:Nellie Burns' father said the family was in Elizabethtown, N.J. immediately after the Revolutionary War. Thomas "Quaker" was well established in the Shenandoah Valley long before the Rev.War. So maybe 3D1.Thomas was descended from a Looker who came to Rockingham Co. much later. Second:Another possibility-Boyatt data tells about a Thomas Looker d c1724 who m Francis Asquit lived St.Mary County, Maryland and had sons Thomas and William. Son Thomas received inheritance from about three different sources, was same age as Thomas the Quaker and she says "The Maryland land would have been close to one of the main routes to the Valley." This Thomas could be the ancestor.

Third:In the 1700's and 1800's it seemed to be almost an ironclad custom for parents to give their children family names, with the first children receiving the names of their grandparents usually. Also as the paternal family name was preserved through the generations as the last name, the names of the maternal lines were very much preserved in the children's first names. For example see the names of children of all the daughters of 2C.James "Quaker"Looker.

From Boyatt data:"1808 Apr 20. Original minutes:Archibald Loker, orphan of Thomas Loker dec, came into court and made choice of Henry March as his guardian who is also appointed guardian for Darcus, David, Thomas, Polly, John, and William Loker, children of the said Thomas Loker decd, who with security entered into bond as the law directs." (March is sometimes Martz.) This along with records of administration of 3D1.Thomas' estate, verifies the names of the younger children of Thomas and Sarah. Records indicate they also had a daughter Margaret who perhaps died before her father. Three -or four- of these given names, Archibald, Dorcas, David and Margaret, are names that records so far indicate were never used by the known descendants of 2.Thomas Looker "Quaker." This could all be Sarah Reeves' influence, or could establish that her husband

3D1.Thomas had somewhat different ancestry from the descendants of 2.Thomas. Sarah's parents were John and Margaret. Did the names Archibald, Dorcas and David come from her ancestors or Thomas'? Finding earlier occurrences of these names in families in the Shenandoah Valley could help fill in missing ancestors. The remaining data combines information from Boyatt research and from Settlers by the Long Gray Trail.

Boyatt data gives the name Margaret to wife of 2B. John b 1735-40. Maybe some other John Look in mid-1700's Shenandoah Valley had a wife Margaret since the name does not appear again in as of 2. Thomas' or 2B. John's descendants. It does appear in 3D. Thomas' family but of course was also the maternal grandmother's name.

Boyatt page 10 data says about 2. Thomas the Quaker: "he is said to have married Dorcas Alexander of Long Meadow. This is doubtful. Dorcas...to young" to be mother of Thomas' children. "Alexander of Long Meadows appears to be in Staunton, not Harrisonburg area." Perhaps it was 3D. Thomas she married especially since he has a granddaughter named Dorcas.

Settlers... page 201 mentions Archibald Alexander in August, 1754 who "was an agent of Borden and had given Bowyer power to sign deeds to Borden's lands." His brother Robert Alexander is mentioned on p. 149. Page 236 says: "July 16, 1776, the first Court of Augusta County under the Commonwealth of Virginia was organized. The justices were Samuel McDowell, Sampson Mathews, and Archibald Alexander... In August, Alexander was recommended to Governor Henry for High Sheriff and on November 19th, qualified as such..."

Also living in mid-1700's in the Shenandoah Valley were Archibald Hopkins and Archibald Huston mentioned respectively on pages 148 and 187 of Settlers...

Boyatt data: "In 1734 Benjamin Allen, Riley Moore and William White came from Monocacy in Maryland to 12 miles south of Woodstock on the North branch of the Shenandoah River.

O. d Apr. 14, 1885. (Samuel could be a grandson of 2C9.Joseph.)

Genealogical Soc. newsletter, The Licking Lantern, Summer 1980, p.80-48). Could Michael be a brother of Darilas? Beside Ellen was Boyer (Bowyer?) residence.

Clell was a WWI veteran and had 4 children: Charles (Jir) of Reynoldsburg, Elden (Ike) of Alexandria, Mrs. Frank (June) Ford of Wagram and Mrs. Donald (Norra Jean) Brush of Mayflower Add. Leon was a retired employee of Pennsylvania Railroad and had a son Wayne E. Stires of Columbus. Information from obituaries.

23. Flora Looker-Mink Street news Sept. 30, 1886 her sister Emma Headley of Kirkersville is visiting. Summit news 1889 Flora sold a farm she owned on Broadway (Broad Street also called Route 1). Must be referring to wife of 3D1i7. John. No! See 2C9a4. Lafayette Looker.

24. Jersey news: Emma Looker went to the Coshocton Fair with Mrs. B.B. Harrison in 1886. Emma mentioned again in 1896.

25. Jersey news: H. Estella Looker went to Ada, Ohio to attend school in 1888. She entertained young friends at her home at R.B. Harrison's in 1890. She was engaged to conduct school at Jersey for the coming year in June, 1892. She was referred to as a teacher at Jersey Apr. 5, 1900.

26. Columbia Center March 1894: J.W. Looker house fire. This was attributed speculatively to 2C9a. James Looker page 19. This J.W. is more likely one of the older sons of Unidentified Looker Number 13 who was living in Columbia Center.

27. Reynoldsburg news July 28, 1892: "Thomas Lokey the 'renowned sculptor' and indefatigable fly- ing machine inventor was seen on our streets last week."

LOCKER FAMILY TRADITIONS

1. The family name is Looker, but Loker and Lokey were used interchangeably in Virginia.

(This is certainly true. Sometimes all three forms of the name were used on one page of a legal document! It was also written Lucar, Lucra, and Luker, in New Jersey and in England. The earliest spelling I could find is Lucar.)

2. The Lookers are from London, England, and came to the Shenandoah Valley by way of New Jersey.

(This seems to be true. There were Lookers in Sudbury, Massachusetts, in 1639. Our line seems to begin with one William Looker, brewer, who sold land in Jamaica, Long Island, in 1676, and was an original proprietor of Elizabeth, New Jersey. This William Looker's daughter, Ann, married Benjamin Wade on Long Island about 1670, so he was probably there much earlier than 1676.)

3. The Lookers were originally Quakers, then Dunkards, and then Universalists.

(This is all true. The immigrant Lookers in Massachusetts were associated with Roger Williams, then fell out with him, and for a while were Seventh Day Baptists in Newport, Rhode Island. The early Lookers in Elizabeth, New Jersey, were Presbyterians. The pioneer of the family in the Shenandoah Valley was referred to in many court records before and after 1800 as "Thomas Looker, the Quaker". It is possible that Thomas came to Virginia with a large migration of Quakers in 1738, though the first record of his living there so far is 1742...Our family once owned communion glasses (resembling crystal wine glasses) said to have been used by the Dunkards in Virginia. There is also a pitcher, said to have been used in feet washing, and a "Lamb's broth bowl", into which they dipped bread. The Bethlehem Church in Tenth Legion was a "free" church until 1851, used by Dunkards (Church of the Brethren) and others, including Universalists. Historians say that it was built (1844) on the site of a former Quaker meeting house; someone said that Thomas the Quaker had given the land...My great-grandfather, William Looker, was said to have attended the Universalist church in his later years. His obituary says: "He never connected himself with any church, but he was strong in the belief in the holiness and happiness of all mankind which he supported by liberal contributions.")

4. The Lookers once gave some land to the city of London to be used as a park. If it is ever not used as a park, it is to revert to the Looker heirs.

(Sounds like a tall story, but I have found that Lookers did once own a great deal of property in "old London". In 1557 one Thomas Trumbull, a prosperous fish merchant, left it to his daughter Johane, who had married Emanuel Lucar.)

5. There were three or four Looker brothers who served in the Revolutionary War "with General Washington". (Didn't everybody?) Our branch of the family had a sword which our ancestor used in the Revolution.

(There were several Lookers - by whatever spelling - who served in the Revolution from New Jersey and from Virginia. Haven't been able to prove a connection yet.)

6. Our family is related to Othniel Looker, the only Revolutionary soldier to serve as Governor of Ohio. He was speaker of the senate when Governor Meigs resigned in 1814, and completed the unexpired term. He ran in the next election, but was defeated by Thomas Worthington.

(At the moment, it appears that Othniel's father and Thomas the Quaker's father were brothers. We are getting close!)

7. That there were two Looker brothers who came early to the Shenandoah Valley. One was a prosperous farmer who was constantly acquiring more land. The other one was a teamster who owned very good horses and wagons, and carried loads of lumber and other merchandise through the Valley to Roanoke, Atlanta, and/or Pennsylvania. Our family has a cow bell said to have been used on these trips to warn other vehicles that someone was coming up or down the mountain on the other side.

(Thomas Looker the Quaker apparently was prosperous, and there is much evidence that he bought land often. There was a John Looker there at the same time with no record of his owning land. He could have been the teamster.)

8. That the Lookers once owned some land in "Elizabethtown, New Jersey" (it was called that until about 1760) and because of some dispute over their claim, they had given up and moved to Virginia. Our folks said that when they left Virginia (1854) that they went first to New Jersey to see if they could claim their land, or receive money for it.

(The Lookers were indeed early settlers of Elizabeth, and bought more property until just prior to the death of one William Looker (called a vintner) in 1717. In 1718 "the town books were craftily stole" after it was discovered that two agents of the British crown were selling the same land twice. In 1729 the original owners and/or their descendants hired lawyers and surveyors to prove their rightful ownership. This agreement was signed by one Thomas Lucor, who we hope is our Thomas the Quaker!

Also, I found a record of some kind of controversy over the land in Elizabeth which reads as follows:

(Genealogical Magazine of New Jersey, Vol. 29, p. 95)

I would guess that "conEL" refers to the controversy over the lands in Elizabeth; this dispute was in the courts for many years. I have written to the Essex and Union County courthouses, and they say that they do not have these records. I asked at the New Jersey State Historical Library in Trenton when I was there, and they knew nothing about them. If we could find these records, they would go far towards proving descent from the original owners. And there might be further record of this if our folks did indeed go there in the 1850's.)
