Descendants of Alexander Mackintosh

McIntosh was my mother's maiden name, so I was intrigued early on by being a member of a "clan". As a young teen I began asking questions regarding my grandfather's family from Prince Edward Island and Scotland. I kept track of the sixteen aunts and uncles and over thirty five cousins, unaware that this was "genealogy".

According to family tradition and an article published in The Patriot on 4 July 1895, Lodevick Mackintosh immigrated from the Isle of Skye in 1831 with his sons Roderick, John, Donald and Alexander. Additional research has uncovered possible daughters and a wife, Christy. They settled in the Stanchel area called Strathalbyn. My great grandfather was Alexander Mackintosh who married Flora Cumming. No record of their marriage has been located. They had one know son, Charles Cumming Mackintosh who was born in 1839. Again, no record has been located, but the census records indicated he was born on PEI in that year. Charles Cumming married Sarah Ann Bell in 1872 and they had twelve children, all born in Victoria. One of these children was my grandfather. Two of these children died young and only two remained on the Island.

 CHARLES CUMMING³ MACKINTOSH (ALEXANDER², LODWECK¹) was born 10 June 1849 in Stanchel, Queen Co., Prince Edward Is., Canada, and died ca. 1925 in Victoria, Prince Co., Prince Edward Is, Canada. He married SARAH ANNE BELL 31 Dec. 1972 in Victoria, Prince Co., Prince Edward Is, Canada.

Whit was the first to leave the Island in 1900. He joined the NWMP at 23 years of age and served two years in the Yukon during the Klondike. After 1902, he was a trapper and miner in the area around the Kluane Nation Park near Haines Junction. He was located in several directories for that area from 1909-1923. He apparently moved to California ca. 1922 to join my grandfather in his butcher shop for several years. There was a rumor in the family that while in the Yukon, Whit married an "Indian Princess", but there is no evidence of this. When Whit was in Huntington Beach, Calif., he lived much of the time with his brother, John William and his eight children. One of the incidents which may have caused Whit to return to the Yukon in the 30's was told by a cousin. Whit was working in the cooler at the slaughter house when the big earthquake of 1933 hit. Everyone got out of the slaughter house except Whit. My grandfather had often told his brother if he didn't stop drinking and get saved he would wind up in hell. When he was missed, a couple of young men went looking for him. They finally went to the cooler, where it was very black as there were no lights or windows. They found Whit lying on the sawdust floor murmuring "Jack was right - I'm in hell!" He had a quarter beef on top of him and lard cans would roll over him every time he attempted to get up. When he did get out, he staggered down the road saying, "I'm going back to the Yukon!" And he did. But, not before he married a schoolteacher named Dorothy MacFarlane from Anaheim in 1934.

Upon reading the census for Victoria of 1891, I came across a Brenton Lea who was a neighbor of the Macintoshes, so assume this son was named after him. There is little known about Brent except what was mentioned above and that he left PEI soon after my grandfather. No one seems to have heard from him since then, although there have been rumors passed around as to his whereabouts. Around 1961 when JW and my grandmother and aunt were traveling to PEI for a visit, they stopped at a motel in Santa Rosa, NM. When the man at the desk saw Pop, he asked if his

name was McIntosh. When asked why, he stated there was a man who had died in town a week before named McIntosh who was a "dead ringer" for Pop. JW never asked about him further. When I did research there years later, I could locate no record of him being buried in that town. Brent is also mentioned in his brother's obituaries as living in Seattle or Calif. in 1939. Two stories my grandfather told about Brent as a kid: The Macintoshes' grandparents (Alexander Mc and Flora Cumming) lived with them for many years before their deaths in 1898 and 1900. Brent was reported to have collected rabbit droppings and given them to his grandmother telling her they were pills. Another time, Brent fell out of the hayloft and was knocked unconscious. They laid him out for dead on the kitchen table, but he revived (obviously). I'm in the process of trying to read a book of postcards put together by Alexander, then Charles McIntosh to see if there might have been word from Brent at some time.

He was referred to as "the short one" by his nieces and nephews. He may have been named after his Uncle James Bell. There were also several Douglases in the family. Of course, Cumming was his grandmother's maiden name. Nothing is know of his childhood, except for being in the same house in Victoria where they all grew up. He moved to Bishop, CA in 1913 as described by my grandmother, "our brother Doug comes directly to us from PEI". He also worked in the meat business with his brothers and was a soldier in WWI. We believe he was injured with mustard gas and suffered with it's effects the rest of his life. Doug married a lady named Bessie sometime in the 20s or 30s and my mother remembers them singing together while packing sausages in the meat packing plant. They worked for my grandfather, who stated, "they were happy because they were making \$30 a week between them". They apparently were divorced and had no children. Doug died at a Naval Hospital in Long Beach, CA January 8, 1949 at age 53 years. It is not believed he ever returned to PEI.

She was born July 20, 1884 and was the only daughter to leave the island. My grandfather was apparently very protective of his sisters and watched with an eagle eye those who dated them. They had a slaughter house connected to their property behind the house in Victoria, and when a lad didn't meet JW's ideas for a good prospect for his sister, he would toss cow's feet over the house onto him! One fellow blew out the light at the front of the house. JW brought out another one and mentioned to the guy that he must not me aware of the rules of the house. He never came back. JW could only have been a teenager himself! When Gertie was in her mid-20's, her brothers in California asked her to come and keep house for them. This was around 1910 or 11. She met and married a grocer who dealt with her brothers in their meat business and lived in San Francisco. They were married in July 1913. She and Joe Irvine had a girl and boy before Joe was killed in a car accident in 1917. The baby was only 2 months old. I have many snapshots of the John Macintoshes and Gert's family camping and playing together. She never cut her hair, but always had it wrapped around her head. I have a picture of her combing her hair just before she died at the age of 96 years in 1980. Compared to her other sisters, she was quite tall and stately. Some of her nephews from PEI remember that she would bring them a whole case of pop when she visited (in the 40s). They thought she was rich and elegant, and she did appear so. She never remarried, but followed her brothers when they moved from northern to southern California. Gert was described by a long-time friend as being "warm, friendly, gentle and humorous." Her daughter-in-law mentioned she was always very devoted to her kids and they to her. Her daughter died in 1971 without children. Her son, Joe, died in 1994 leaving a wife, one son and 5 grandchildren.

Interesting Scene in the Isle of Skye

Submitted by George F. Sanborn, Jr., F.A.S.G.

From the Caledonia Mecury, as copied by The Cape Breton Advocate, 15 September 1840. Located by Mr. Sanborn at The Beaton Institute, University College of Cape Breton, Sydney, NS MG 15, 19 B2.

"For the last fortnight Uigg Bay in the parish of Snizort in Skye has presented a scene of much interest owing to two transports being anchored for the purpose of removing forever from their native hills and glens several hundred souls for the islands of Prince Edward's and Cape Breton, North America; the natives sensible of the many disadvantages arising from a superabundant population, and no doubt dreading the recurrence of a similar destitution to that of 1836 and 1837 having voluntarily resolved in great numbers to emigrate to Her Majesty's colonies in the already mentioned Islands; consequently for the last three months there has been a great movement for this purpose in the northern parishes of Skye, and probably no fewer than 700 souls came to the determination of leaving their native Isle under the agency of Archibald MacNiven, Esq., of Tobermory. The general appearance, cleanliness and comfort of the vessels provided by MacNiven reflect much credit to his skill and attention, and prove that he spared neither trouble nor expense in getting them fitted out for the accommodation of the poor Hebrideans. The transports are: the Nith of Liverpool, Captain Shaw, and the Rother of Sunderland, Captain Hall. The former is a splendid new ship of about 650 tons register, having about 100 berths capable of accommodating 400 full passengers. The latter is a beautiful brig of about 325 tons register, with about 40 berths, which are sufficient for 160 full passengers. On the morning of the 14th instant (August) the Rother weighed anchor with her complement of passengers, for the custom-house at Tobermory, and the Nith was to follow in a few days."

The Rother of Sutherland probably went to Prince Edward Island direct.

The Nith of Liverpool entered at Sydney, Cape Breton, Monday, Sept. 7th, 1840, and cleared for P.E. Island the following day. She carried 473 passengers, 73 more than the Caledonian Mercury said she had berths for. 193 of the passengers were for Cape Breton.

According to some of those who were passengers, the *Nith* made her trip across the Atlantic in just three weeks. That being so, she must have left Tobermory (or Uigg Bay) on August 17th.

Additional features include many pages of valuable data concerning McIntosh soldiers in the Revolutionary and Indian Wars, Confederate soldiers in the Civil War. The comprehensive 18-page index includes the names of hundreds of McIntoshes, their allied families, and their geographical habitats. Important addenda to previous volumes is given, with appropriate volume and page references. All in all, a most important and valuable book for those with McIntosh antecedents, interested in their Scottish heritage, no matter what part of the U.S. or Canada they originated.

Vol. I John McIntosh of Bedford, N. H. and His Descendants
This volume gives a history of the early immigrant as a Scottish Highlander foot soldier from
Inverness, who came over with Fraser's 78th Regiment of Foot, and fought with Wolfe at Louisbourg and Quebec, before settling in Bedford, N. H. His descendants went first to Vermont,
and then later spread out all over the United States.

The genealogy carries down both the male and female lineages to 1965, with over 1100 descendants. Scottish marriage records, deeds, and other documents are printed in the Appendix. Maps are included showing locations of family homesteads in N. H. and Vermont. Index,XII+80pp

Vol. II Families Bearing the Name McIntosh in New England
This genealogical compendium is divided into two sections, the first extensively compiling
data on the descendants of John McIntosh of Dedham, Mass., who came over in the mid-1600's as
a Cromwellian prisoner, and worked at the Saugus Iron Works, before settling in Dedham. One
of his descendants was Ebenezer McIntosh, Captain-General of the Liberty Tree, who fomented
trouble for the British at the Tea Party, and in other resistance riots.

The second part relates to 30 or more other early New England McIntosh families who settled in various areas of the region. Included is a separate section of Marriages and Deaths recorded at the State House Archives in Boston. Index, 73pp

Vol. III McIntosh-Mackintosh Families of Scotland and America Canadian and American lineages are compiled from family records supplied by living descendants throughout the United States and Canada, as well as data from bible records, county histories, allied genealogies, manuscripts, censuses, state vital records, obituaries, land records, and dozens of other sources.

This book is important for those descendants of immigrant Scots who came to America in the 18th and 19th Centuries, settling in North and South Carolina, Georgia, Kentucky and Tennessee, since published knowledge of these McIntoshes has been limited, due to sparse Colonial records. McIntoshes all along the Atlantic seabcard as far north as Nova Scotia, are included, and those who migrated as far west as California.

An interesting McIntosh family in this volume is the one of John McIntosh, who propagated the famous McIntosh apple, and resided and raised his family in Dundela, Ontario. Index, 100pp

Vol. IV Genealogical Records of McIntosh Families in U. S. and Canada The many lineages contributed by McIntosh genealogists nation-wide make this and the other volumes encyclopaedic in range, and include indispensable records for anyone researching McIntoshes in their ancestry. This fourth volume has many Canadian families, as well as American, plus an important section devoted to hundreds of McIntosh marriages gleaned from parish archives in Scotland, and covering the difficult period of 1700-1800, where original parentage is hard to trace. There is also a section on Jacobite deportations to the American Colonies, as a result of Scottish resistance to English rule. Index. 118pp

he Society of Mayflower Descendants was organized in New York City on December 22, 1894. The General Society was organized in Plymouth, Massachusetts on January 12, 1897. It was in that year that the history of Plymouth written by Governor William Bradford and entitled "Of Plimoth Plantation" was returned to America. The history had been found in Fulham Palace in London. Several prominent officials, including United States Senator George F. Hoar, had petitioned the Consistory Court of the Diocese of London for its return. The Mayflower Society is currently engaged in the "Five Generations Project" which will culminate in the publication of the genealogical descent of all Mayflower passengers down approximately to the time of the American Revolution through male and female lines. Among the many well-known members of the Mayflower Society through the years are President William Howard Taft, Sir Winston Churchill, Governor Winthrop Rockcfeller, Governor Nelson Rockefeller, General Leonard Wood and Admiral Alan Sheperd.

OBJECTIVES

To perpetuate to a remote posterity the memory of the Pilgrim Fathers. To maintain and defend the principle of civil and religious liberty as set forth in the Compact of the Mayflower.

To discover and publish original matter in regard to the Pilgrims together with existing data known only to antiquarians.

To authenticate, preserve and mark historical spots made memorable by Pilgrim Association.

To cherish and maintain the ideals and institutions of American freedom, and to oppose any theories or actions that threaten their continuity.

Descendants over eighteen years of age of a passenger on the Mayslower, on the voyage that terminated at Plymouth, Massachusetts in December 1620, are eligible for membership.
