Forward

The author, Bobbie Purdue, granddaughter of Mary McCreight (Maddock) Roberts ("Mae"), conducted several oral interviews between 1978 and 1983, beginning when Mae was 81 years old. 'Leaving Home' is a summary from the interviews of Mae's life until she left Ireland in 1909. Mae now lives in Canoga Park, California.

Leaving Home

Even on this chilly December evening, Londonderry looked somehow friendlier than she ever expected. Not that she'd seen it often, but today it would be the last view she'd have of her homeland. She clutched her porcelain mug tightly in one hand, a box of linen hankies tucked under her arm. The old ship *Furnessia* was lumbering imposingly before her in the harbor.

The possibility of change had always been part of her life, but twelve year old Mae Maddock never imagined such an uprooting as this. When she was six months old, illness claimed the life of her mother, Mary Jane. For her father, William, the loss of his wife was the latest in a series of tragedies the family had endured. Having married in 1885 in the Parish Church of Newtownards, amidst protest from Mary Jane's father, Samuel McCreight, that left her disinherited, William and Mary Jane left for a new life in America. Their new home of Pittsfield, Massachusetts proved to be one of mixed blessings and sorrows. Twin daughters born in 1887 died the following year of cholera. Soon after, a son, Samuel, was born and the couple decided to return to Ireland. After their resettlement in the Belfast area, the family grew to include three more children, Lizzie, William and Mae, before Mary Jane died.

Grief-stricken William had difficulty carrying on. There were reports that he drank heavily. He moved frequently, occasionally leaving the children with various relatives. Although his income as a tenter was good, it was difficult to care for four young children alone. William was undoubtedly grateful for the help he received from his family. There were several offers of help from his five sisters and four brothers, but William eventually kept the oldest three children with him, leaving Mae with his mother, Isabella (Darragh) Maddock, in Belfast. Aunt Annie McCreight, of Newtownards, had promised her dying sister that she would take care of Mae, but she wasn't married at the time and soon decided that there was no place for a baby in her life. Uncle James Maddock and his wife, Lizzie, took her for awhile, but Lizzie's mother cautioned against keeping Mae because Lizzie might have her own little girl someday. So Mae became the ward of her grandmother who welcomed her with loving but weary arms. Gramma was a widow who had raised ten children of her own and was already raising her granddaughter, Jinny Murphy as well. Gramma became the most stable figure in Mae's early childhood.

Mae was still a toddler when her father's youngest sister, Isabella, was engaged to marry to Albert Bingham. Albert dearly loved Mae from the beginning and told Gramma not to worry, that when he and Isabella were married they would take good care of Mae. And he did, as long as he was around. But everyone it seemed wanted to go to America, and Albert could not resist the temptation. Even when Isabella refused to go along, it didn't deter him. His own daughter, Vi, was about two years old when he left Ireland to find work as a bricklayer in Watertown, New York.

Isabella, being the youngest daughter, had promised the family that she would take care of her aging mother. So for seven years, she, Mae and Vi lived in Belfast with Gramma and Jinny.

In 1909 Albert suffered a severe injury when he jumped from a train in New York and lost a leg. He needed and wanted his wife and children in America. Isabella always wanted to go and made plans for the journey.

Gramma believed there would be a brighter future for Mae in America than with her in Ireland. Although Mae's sister Lizzie later criticized her Aunt Isabella and Gramma for "turning Mae against her own father" and sending her off to America without his permission, Mae knew that wasn't true. Gramma had asked her daughter, Margaret, to talk to William so there would be no complications when Isabella took Mae out of the country. She sent letters to William requesting his permission, but he never answered any of them. He just didn't seem to care about her. After all, he had never paid a penny of her support and, in fact, on a visit from Scotland had not even recognized her as his daughter. Mae believes that he somehow blamed her for her mother's death since Mary Jane was weakened from childbirth when she became ill.

So Mae didn't want to go to America and leave Gramma, who had been like a mother to her, but the choice was not hers.

Comment

'Mae's Ellis Island Experience' is in her own words, edited sparingly. It is a transcription of a recording made 30 Nov 1979 of Mary McCreight (Maddock) Roberts by her granddaughter, Bobbie Purdue.

Mae was twelve years old when she came to the United States with her Aunt Isabella and cousin, Violet Bingham ("Vi"), arriving at Ellis Island December 29, 1909 on the ship *Furnessia*.

This is how she remembers the experience. . .

Mae's Ellis Island Experience

. . . At that time they took you out in a little ferry to Ellis Island. I don't know if we were supposed to go there or not. There was some kind of a mix up, because we got in to Ellis Isle and I don't think we were supposed to go over there at all. And nobody told us anything. That's why I was hoping right then that they would send us back. We got into this great big room. There was one young Englishman there and he shouldn't have been there either. He was very nervous and upset about it. My aunt was being very calm. I know we stayed there one night; now whether we stayed there longer I don't know. I can't remember spending more than one night in that room where they had all the hammocks. Everybody slept in one room and they had these hammocks, there were three or four of them stacked up. And there were all these people that didn't speak (English). It scared me half to death! They didn't bother Vi, but they scared me because they didn't speak English. And I thought they were very strange people. (laughs)

There was one woman that was talking to my aunt and I know now that she couldn't speak English, but she was trying to tell my aunt to watch her pocket book and get up on the top bunk. We sat on that bunk all night. We didn't go to sleep. You know we went down to a nice big dining room. When I think of it now, I'd love to go through the same thing again, just for fun. They had a nice big dining room and it was really set with nice white table cloths and they had an apple at each place. And before you could get seated, my apple was grabbed. Vi grabbed hers and held it. I didn't care whether I ate or not though. They grabbed the bread. The bread was put out on plates and you were supposed to pass it or take a piece. But some of those people grabbed that bread off there. Well, of course that almost threw me into a fit.

I had a little mug somebody had given me just before I left Ireland. Well, I carried it all the way because I used my own mug. Talk about habits, I'll still use my own mug! (laughs) I had this little mug and used that for everything, even aboard ship! And I had it at Ellis Island. I could go get a drink of water. I was over there going to get a drink of water and this man came over and I guess he wanted to use my mug - Vi said he did. But I was so (upset) I threw it at him! (laughs) I ran back to my aunt and then along comes this young Englishman and he had asked my aunt (something). He had seen his uncle on the dock. My uncle couldn't come to meet us on account of his leg wasn't quite healed. But he had

sent all the papers and everything for us. But this Englishman had seen his uncle. He didn't know why he was there and he was very nervous. He went over to my aunt and said, "You know, I hear that there's a whole boat load of red Indians coming in." (laughs) That's all he needed to say. I opened my mouth and I screamed at the top . . . I guess I was having hysterics and didn't know it. My aunt couldn't stop me.

There was a man sweepin' the floor and he came over and said, "What's the matter with the wee girl?" He was Irish, Irish tongue at any rate. He says, "What's the matter with the wee girl?" and my aunt says, "I don't know, but if we don't get out of here, whatever they want to do with us, if we don't get out of here, I think she's going to be awfully sick. And he said, "What are you doing here?" My aunt said, (laughs) "Well, I don't know." (laughs) And so he says, "Well, I'll see if I can do anything for you." He went out of the room and it wasn't long 'til a man came out and called us. We'd never have been called if it wasn't for him I guess. When they called out names, they took us up to this great big room where there's a bunch of men sitting around the room and they ask us different questions. Now they say that this country - like on the Statue of Liberty - "We welcome the poor. . ." how was it, ". . . from all countries." They did not! Maybe they did when they needed people badly, but now that was a long time ago. When we came over you had to have a certain amount of money and prove that you were not goin' to be a dependent on the country. You had to prove that before you get in. And somebody had to sponsor you. Uncle Albert brought me in as Mae Bingham, his adopted daughter. That was on his citizenship papers. But my aunt entered me in school as Mae Maddock. Mae Bingham doesn't exist because I never went under that name.

There was a young English woman that was on the boat with us and she had two or three little children. She had been put in another room, the same as we, without anyone to speak to. We were marching through to go to the dining room when I saw her. I thought, "Oh, there's a friend." I left the line and ran over to her, but a great big colored woman came up, took me and told me I was to stay in line and go and I said, "Don't touch me. Don't you dare touch me!" And I slapped her and she didn't [touch me]. (laughs)

Then we get up in this big room and they're sittin' around the table, and I think most of 'em were Irishmen. My aunt started to take an - oh, that's why I was hopin' they'd send us back, because there was a young man, I think he was Italian, and his brother was there too, to claim him. I don't know how his brother got over there, but his brother was there. And he had bank books showing how much money he had in thousands of dollars. They didn't let him through. They sent him back. Some reason they wouldn't let him in. And it wasn't for lack of money, 'cause his brother was there showing money. There was somethin', some reason. When we got to the table I thought, "Oh boys, we're goin' back home. I'm gonna see Gramma." (laughs) And ah, we got up to the table and my aunt starts to tell 'em and to show them and they said, "Oh, we've got all these papers and we can always trust an Irish woman!" And out we went. They took us and put us on a train [to Watertown, New York].

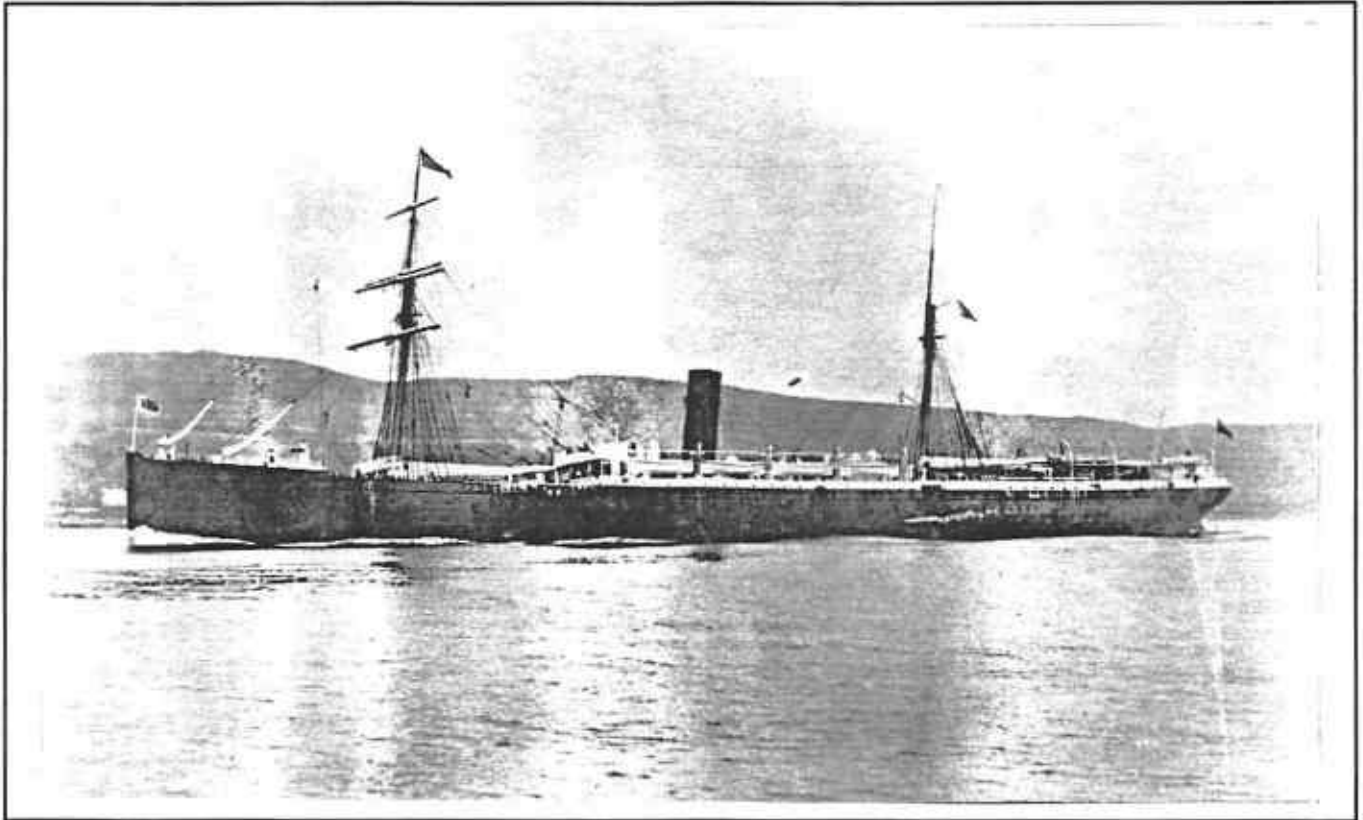

Built by Barrow Shipbuilding Co., Barrow-in-Furnesa, England. Tonnage: 5,495. Dimensions: 445'x 44'. Single-screw 14 knots. Compound engines. Two masts and two funnels. Iron hull. Maiden voyage: Glasgow-New York, January 27, 1881. Converted to single funnel in 1891; re-engined with triple expansion type. Made her final voyage to New York in 1911. Broken up by British shipbreakers in 1912.

Summary of Information

A copy of this document was obtained October 17, 1987 at the National Archives and Record Administration, Washington DC, film # T 715 roll 1395, Passengers Arriving in New York December 28, 1909 to... It is list 50, two facing pages with a total of 29 vertical columns of information.

The *S.S. Furnessia* sailed from Londonderry on December 19, 1909 and arrived at the Port of New York December 29, 1909. The printed heading says "This Sheet for Steerage Passengers," but Mae remembers going second class. Isabella Bingham is listed on line 11 with Violet [Bingham] on line 12 and May Maddock on line 13. Isabella's name is crossed out the entire width of the two pages and re-entered on the last blank line, number 28. The information entered appears to be the same in every column with two exceptions noted below. May Maddock is also crossed out on line 13 for most of the width of the page.

Isabella is thirty years old, Violet seven and May eleven. All are females, able to read and write, of British nationality and Irish race. Their last permanent address is Belfast, Ireland. Isabella is married. Their nearest relative is Mrs. Maddock, 29 Ribble Street, Belfast. Their destination is Watertown, New York. Passage was paid by self for Isabella, mother for Violet and Aunt for May.

Column 16 states: Whether in possession of \$50, and if less, how much? Isabella, \$10; for the children a line is drawn through. None had ever been in the United States before; they are going to join Albert E. Bingham at 134 Boone St., Watertown, Isabella's husband, Violet's father and May's Uncle. They were never in an institute for the insane, supported by charity, in prison or an almshouse. Nor was any of them a polygamist, anarchist or coming to labor. They are in "good" mental and physical health and not deformed or crippled. Isabella is 5'2" tall, dark complected with brown hair and hazel eyes. Violet has black hair and blue eyes [actually are brown]; May, brown hair and brown eyes [actually are blue]. No height is given for the children and none has any marks of identification. Isabella was born in Banbridge, Ireland, the girls in Belfast.

The exceptions are: on line 11 it says Isabella paid for her ticket herself and has \$10; on line 28, her husband paid for her ticket and she has \$8. [Perhaps line 28 was added the second day after she had spent some money, possibly for meals.]

Record of Aliens Held for Special Inquiry

Summary

This form followed the list of passengers for the the *S.S. Furnessia* on National Archives film T715, roll 1395. It states: *S.S. Furnessia* (Anchor Line) arrived 12-29-09. It is typewritten with additions in long hand. There are twenty-one names listed in twelve family groups. Three people are listed as deported. Isabella and the two children are listed as group 7 from Manifest 50, No. 28. The Cause of Detention states "LPC." This notation follows eleven of the twelve groups, with "Med. Cert." in addition on three, and "Dr. Cert." in longhand on one more. The inspector is "Alexander" and it appears it was 1:00 p.m. They were admitted 12/30, page 146, Sec'y "Ld" (secretary?), at "2". They had three breakfasts, six dinners and three suppers.

There is a following page (not copied) that lists thirteen people who were apparently detained until met by relatives. The commanding Officer of the ship was John Black; Dr. J.B. Wright, the surgeon. The ship left Glasgow on December 18, with more passengers boarding there than in Londonderry.

Analysis:

According to Steve Tilly, Archivist, Washington D.C. (202-523-3223), LPC stands for Likely to become a Public Charge. It appears that anyone who stated that they had less than \$50 were listed as LPC.

[This film also showed the ship *Madonna*, from Naples, arrived in the port of New York the same day.]
