J. H. WYATT Passed Away Last Tuesday

J. H. Wyatt, 62, and a resident of Lampasas for 21 years, died at the family home in the south part of town, Tuesday afternoon, May 12, at 2:45 o'clock. He had been sick for two years, but able to be out a part of the time during that period. Funeral services were at the home of Mr. and Mrs. Tad Parsons, Wednesday morning at 11 o'clock, the Rev. Wm. Harry Moore, assisted by the Rev. E. C. Lamber officiating. Burial was in Oak Hill Cemetery. Pall bearers were: Tom Childers, Campbell Seale, Clyde Hetherly, B. C. Greeson, Harry Porter and R. S. Nichols. Mr. Wyatt was born at Florence Oct. 31, 1873. In 1894 he married Miss Bennie Nowlin of Corn Hill; the couple later moving to Burnet County and in 1915 to Lampasas. He was engaged in blacksmithing all his life and was widely known over this entire section. He was honest, honorable and upright, and treated his fellowman like he wanted to be treated. He was liked by all who knew him and as long as he was well he always had some jocular remark to make to people when he saw them. He had been a member of the Baptist Church since he was a young man. Surviving the deceased are his widow; father, C. D. Wyatt of Lampasas; four children: Mrs. Tad Parsons, Collie and Floyd Wyatt of Beaumont and Murray Wyatt of Lampasas; five sisters: Mrs. R. H. Barber of Lampasas, Mrs. Cora Wyatt Votaw of Beaumont, Mrs. W. A. Barnes of Corpus Christi, Mrs. Jim Guthrie of Burnet and Mrs. John F. C. D. Wyatt Died Here Tuesday Afternoon  
(Lampasas Record)

C. D. Wyatt, 93, passed away at the home of his daughter, Mrs. H. R. Barber, Tuesday, October 12, at 12:30 p. m. While he had not been in pain or sick, due to advanced age he had been confined to his room and bed for two and a half years. He had been able to raise up and drink two glasses of water just a few hours before his death.

Funeral services were from Briggs-Gamel Funeral Home Wednesday afternoon at 3:00 o'clock, conducted by the Rev. J. E. Fuller, pastor of the Methodist Church. The Masons took charge following the service and conducted the burial rites in Oak Hill Cemetery.

Collin Dennis Wyatt was born at Ft. Scott, Arkansas, May 9, 1850, but was brought at the age of six months to Williamson Co., Texas, by his parents. There he grew to manhood and married Miss Nannie Marrs, January 11, 1872. They continued to live in that county where they reared 12 children, later moving to Bell and Burnet counties for a time and then to Lampasas about 23 years ago. Mrs. Wyatt died here February 14, 1926 and since that time he had lived with Mrs. Barber most of the time and for the past eleven years all the time.

As a young man he was known over this entire section for his hand-made saddles and harness, he maintaining a shop at Florence for many years. He was also a cowboy and went up the trail with cattle on several occasions passing through what is now Lampasas before there was any town and when the water was deep enough at times to swim the cattle and horses. Later, he raised livestock and farmed, till his advanced age prevented him from work. While Mr. Wyatt was a Christian man and lived a devoted life, he never joined a church. He had been a Mason for many years, his membership being originally at Corn Hill Lodge.

Being active in this section in the 70's and earlier, Mr Wyatt had lots of experience with the Indians and was engaged in several encounters with them. He related many facts in connection with Indian activities in his later years which took place in these counties.

Surviving the deceased are 8 children: Mrs. H. R. Barber of Lampasas, Mrs. Cora W. Votaw of Beaumont, Mrs. W. A. Barnes of Corpus Christi, Mrs. J. H. Guthrie of Burnet, Mrs. J. F. Crawford of Bertram, J. K. Wyatt of Corpus Christi, Romeo Wyatt of Burnet and Shelby Wyatt of Bertram; 29 grandchildren, 24 great-grandchildren and 2 great-great-grandchildren.

Schulze, pastor of First Methodist Church, officiated with the following service. Pall bearers were: Joe Cox, Clyde Hetherly, Clyde Northington, Kyle Oliver, Omar Brown and Harry Key. Arrangements were under the direction of the Briggs-Gamel Funeral Home and interment was in Bear Creek Cemetery, Bertram. Mrs. Barber was born Oct. 31, 1872 in Williamson County and resided there and in Burnet County until moving to Lampasas in 1918. She had lived here since that time and had been a member of the Methodist Church since childhood. She was employed for 22 years by Sebertfitt-Andrews and Stokes Bros. drygoods stores and for the past 10 years had assisted her daughter, Cora, in the operation of Cora's Gift Shop. Preceding her in death were two sons and her husband, who passed away in 1918. Survivors include three daughters: Mrs. Narrel Landers of Maryneal, Texas; Mrs. Audrey
