Mr. Massey was born Dec. 31, 1915, in Wisconsin to Monroe and Grace Roberts Armfield. Following his father's death, he was raised by his mother and stepfather, Harry Massey. He moved with his family to California and graduated from Van Nuys High School. While in school he was active in the ROTC program and joined the Civilian Conservation Corps. While serving in CCC, he was severely burned in an accident. Following his recovery, he took up photography at the Art Center in Los Angeles.

He married Edith Louise Seidel on Jan. 28, 1935, in Los Angeles. He served as a photographer in the U.S. Navy during World War II. Following his discharge, he worked for Mergel Studios in Los Angeles and later specialized in photojournalism doing hunting, RV travel, and gardening stories for magazines. He did several articles on Palouse Falls, Lyons Ferry and the Walla Walla Sweet Onion Festival. These stories were published in Trailer Life, Field & Stream and Shooting Times.

Mr. Massey enjoyed gardening with his wife and while in California they maintained a large garden in Terra Bella. They were active in the Farmer's Markets. He enjoyed traveling throughout the Western States camping, hunting and fishing. He also enjoyed woodworking.

He is survived by his wife at the home, a daughter and son-in-law, Carol and Daniel Anderson of Dayton; a son and daughter-in-law, Bob and Trinidad Massey of Reno; a sister, Lottie Becker of Portland; five grandchildren and numerous nieces and nephews.
