A Benjamin InInvail on 1793 Hancock Co., GA Tax List and shown buying sundry items from estate sale of William Reddock in Hancock Co., Ga 1798.

William McInvail and wife, Elizabeth of Green Co., GA deeded land in 1793. His estate administered by Edmund Crowder in Hancock Co., GA Sep 1795.

A Turner McInvail listed as Tax Defaulter in Oglethorpe Co., GA, Capt. Robert's District in 1797.

Records of Estates, Halifax Co., NC, V. II shows a James McInvale marrying Mary Mitchell, widow of William Mitchell who died in Brunswick Co., VA, leaving Will dated 14 Feb 1763.

NC Taxpayers 1700-1786 shows a James McInvale and Joanna McInvail in Bute Co., 1771

Randolph Co., GA Marriages: David McKenvil to Mary Southwick 9 Feb 1838.

Soldiers of the South by Clark, Granville Co., NC shows John McIllvail, Sgt. 1754.

Now to the Bush family. My William, b. 1645, md. c1670 to Martha--they of Isle of Wright Co., VA and on to Chowan Co., NC. I haven't personally done research on this family, but have a copy of the book, "The Bush Family," by Elizabeth W. DeHuff. If you don't have access to it, I'll be happy to look up your names.

PREFACE

This paper is the beginning of a chapter for a possible future book on some of the Bush, Stanford, Mc Invale and related families of the South. It is brief and in most places sketchy as to the documented relationships of individuals. I am still researching and will be happy to assist those attempting works on the descendants of James Mc Invale of Virginia or any early Mc Invale. Anyone doing further research should ignore the spelling variations in the name and beware of inaccuracies in ages and birthplaces in census data. It is my hope that this "preview" will encourage someone to do further documentation.

My interest in this family stems from the fact that my paternal grandmother, Mary Elizabeth (Stanford) Bush, and her sister, Lola Ethel (Stanford) Mc Invale, raised families near each other in Ellisville, Mississippi. This short work is dedicated to Ethel Mc Invale and her family.

The origin of the name Mc Invale is not clearly documented in the numerous reference books on European and American family names. Only one book on the surnames of Scotland by the New York Public Library gives anything close--MacInwill. According to this source, Alexander McInwill was one of the tenants of Wester Micras (Mecray) 1539, and Gilcallum McEwin, McInvill, or McInveill was a tenant of Cartequhossin, Islay, 1541. The data came from The Exchequer Rolls of Scotland (1264 - 1600) Volume 17 pages 616, 637, and 659. These volumes were published in Edinburgh from 1878 to 1909. This could be the same family that came to America.

It is quite possible that McInvale is a more recent misspelling of some other name. A family name of McIlvaill in the 1840 North Carolina census suggests that it might be a variation of McIlvain, which is Scots Gaelic for the son of the fair lad, or the son of a servant of Saint Beathan. You will notice that if the "L" and "N" are switched you have McInvail.

Another possibility is that it is a variation of McVail (McPhail, McPhall, McFall, McFail, etc.) which is Scots Gaelic for the son of Paul. By stretching your imagination and twisting your tongue, you could think it a possible variation of McCampbell. No matter which explanation seems best, the variations in the name in the United States since the 1770's indicates that spelling was not a prerequisite of either citizenship or census taking.

James McInvale was born before 1761, probably in either Virginia or Great Britain. The earliest record that I have found is in

the Williamsburg Virginia Gazette¹ where, on December 18, 1779, James McInvaill of Brunswick County offered a reward for two runaway slaves. In the Book of Marriage Bonds of Brunswick County,² Virginia (1750-1810), on January 27, 1782, James McInvale (of age) obtained a marriage bond for Jane Stainback, daughter of Francis Stainback, deceased.³ Then on April 25, 1786, James McInvale obtained a bond to marry Mary Woodrough. They were married on May 5, 1786, by John King, a Baptist minister, who listed them as Mackenvaille and Woodruff. The second marriage bond suggests that either Jane died after their marriage, or they never married.

On February 25, 1782, in Brunswick County, a court held to adjust claims for property impressed or taken for public service in the Revolutionary War, listed "McInvailes" as one family who "gave" supplies.⁴ This could be James, his father, or both. No McInvailes are known to be veterans of the Revolutionary War.

In the list of Virginia taxpayers (1782)⁵ James was in Brunswick County and was taxed for one white tithable and three slaves over 12. Thus, he was either unmarried or widowed. No McInvailes are listed in any of the 1790 census indexes, nor in the 1810 Virginia census. However, James could have moved to Kentucky, Georgia, or Tennessee (territory) since these censuses were either lost or unrecorded.

Jumping ahead sixty years to the 1850 census*, I found a James

*This was the first census to list names of other family members, exact ages, and birthplaces.

McInvale living with his son John in Talbot County, Georgia.⁶ James was born in North Carolina about 1768. John was also born in North Carolina about 1797. His wife was named Lydia, born about 1803 in North Carolina. They had two daughters, Nancy (age 18) and Elizabeth (age 6) and a son, Marion (age 6.) (The index for the 1800 census of North Carolina listed no McInvaless.) This James was probably not the James McInvale of Virginia, since he would have been 14 at the time of the marriage bond. It is possible that they were father and son, but more likely, they were at best, uncle and nephew. James (age 45+) first appeared in the Georgia census data in 1820⁷ in Jones County with his wife (age 45+), two sons (age 18-25), and three daughters two ages, one (10-15) and one (under 10). Earlier in the 1805 land lottery of Georgia, a John McInvale had two blank draws.⁸ To be eligible for two draws he had to be married and a resident for at least one year. In the 1830 census⁹ a John C. MacInvale (age 50-60) was in Campbell County with a wife (age 50-60), four sons--one (15-20), two (10-15), one (5-10), and a daughter (5-10). Another son, James (20-30)¹⁰ lived nearby with his wife (15-20) and daughter (under 5). In the same year, a Robert McInvale (age 30-40) lived with his wife (20-30), one son (under 5), and one daughter (under 5) in Jones County.¹¹ Nearby, James McInvale¹² (age 15-20) headed a family of four younger sisters, all under 16. This is obviously the son of James of 1820. In Randolph County was a John McInvale¹³ (age 30-40), his wife (20-30) and three children, a male and a female (under 5) and a female (5-10). In the 1832 land lottery a John McInvale drew for land in Stewart County. Then in 1840 in

Campbell County, Georgia, John C. McInvale lived near a son Giles.¹⁴

By 1850 Robert McInvail¹⁵ (age 49) lived in Houston County, Georgia with his wife (age 38), and son William (18), and two daughters, Frances (16), and Emily (14). Robert was born in Georgia and was probably the son of John (1805) or James (1820). Robert died about 1853.^{16A} Next door lived a single son, James M. McInvail (age 22) born in Georgia.^{16B}

Meanwhile, John C. McInvale had moved to Talladega County, Alabama.¹⁷ He was possibly the brother of James of Talbot County, Georgia (1850) and probably the John of the 1805 lottery. He was born in North Carolina about 1780. It would appear that his father lived in the wilderness area of North Carolina that became Tennessee territory in 1784. This would explain why no McInvaless are in the 1790 North Carolina census. John C. lived with his wife Susan. Nearby¹⁸ was John D. McInvale, probably a son, who was born in Tennessee about 1813. His wife Elizabeth was born in Georgia about 1812. They had seven daughters, Emily (age 12), Anna 11, Mary 8, Adaline 6, Nancy 4, Elizabeth 3, and Cynthia 1. They were all born in Alabama, so they must have moved there ahead of the rest of the family about 1838. Another son of John C., Giles^{19A} born about 1817 in Tennessee, lived nearby with his wife Mahala, born about 1820 in North Carolina, three children born in Georgia: John W? (age 10); Elizabeth 8; Sarah 6; and four more born in Alabama: Nathan 4; Jane 3; Gilis 2; and Isaab 1. Thus, Giles moved from Georgia between 1844 and 1846.

One additional "McInvale" appeared in the 1830 census of Jones County, North Carolina.^{19B} Turner McInvail (age 50-60), lived with his wife (age 50-60), and the following members of his household (children and grandchildren) males: 1 (under 5); 2 (15-20); females: 2 (5-10); 2 (20-30); and either his or his wife's mother (age 70-80).

In the 1860 census of Talladega County, Alabama, there were two McInvale families:²⁰ G. (Giles) McEnvale (age 43), born in Tennessee, his wife N.M. (Mahala?) (age 36), born in North Carolina, children J.W. (John), E. (Elizabeth), S.A. (Sarah), L.N. (Nathan), J.M. (Jane), G. (Gilis), and I.B. (Isaab) from the 1850 census, plus new children: W.J. (male, age 9), N.S. (female, age 7), and T.R. (male, age 3). These three were born in Alabama. Nearby was a J. McEnvale (age 20) born in Georgia, a laborer, and his wife S. McEnvale, (age 17) born in Georgia. This could be the son of Giles (J.W.) counted again in a neighboring farm (see J.W. 1880 Alabama.)

In the 1860's there were nine "McInvaless" who were in the Civil War²¹ for the South:

Jesse McInvale (McInvail), Private, Company B, 44 Mississippi Infantry

James McInvale (McInvail, McInvall), Private, Company C, 7 Tex. Infantry

John D. McInvale, Private, Company A, 29 Alabama Infantry

John W. McInvale (McInvail), Private, Company A, 29 Alabama Infantry

Nathan McInvale (McInvail), Private, Company A, 29 Alabama Infantry

John McInvale, Private, Company E, 4 South Carolina State Troopers

John M. McInvale, Private, Company F, 27 Georgia Infantry

Wm. B. McInvale (McInvall), Private, Company A, 14 Battalion,
Georgia, Light Artillery

Private, Capt. Howell's Company,
Georgia, Light Artillery

Private, Capt. Havis' Battery,
Georgia, Light Artillery

W. H. McInvale, Private, 27 Georgia Infantry

Most of these names are familiar. Of those that are not, W. H., William B., John M., John W. and Nathan are undoubtedly children of McInvales in earlier censuses. John of South Carolina is probably related to Turner of North Carolina or James of Virginia. Jesse is probably a son of one of the Georgia McInvales and moved to Mississippi close to the beginning of the war. No McInvales were in the 1850 Mississippi census.

According to the (limited) 1880 Soundex* there were only three "McInvale" families in Alabama and none in Georgia. J. W. McEnvail, age 40, born in Georgia, lived in Lineville in Clay County.²²

This was John, the ten year old son of Giles in the 1850 census and John W. of the 29th Alabama Infantry. His wife, W.S.J., (age 38), was born in Georgia. They had a daughter, H.A. (age 16); a son, J.W. 16; a daughter, M.J. 13; and five more children whose sexes were not indicated on the census: M.E. 11; J.T. 9; J.M. (Joseph Marion?) 5?; S.E. 3; S.D. 5 months. Also in this family was the father of Mrs. McEnvail, Nathail Mainair, (age 78) born in North Carolina. The second family was that of John Mackinvale,²³ (age 24), born in Georgia, living in Starlington in Butler County with his wife Martha (age 32) born in Louisiana. Their children

were Luca 2, born in Alabama and Mason L., a three month old daughter. The third family was Wesley McInval,²⁴ (age 27) born in Alabama. He and his wife, Nancy (age 20), born in Alabama, lived in Polkville in Calhoun County. They had a son, Thomas 1.

In the 1880 Soundex for Mississippi, John McInvale²⁵ (age 30, born in Mississippi) lived in DeSoto County with his wife Jennie (age 19, born in England) and two daughters, Jesse 5 and Lizzie 5 months. John is probably the son of Jesse of the Civil War.

In Georgia in 1900 there were two McInvale families. N.T. McInvale,²⁶ born August, 1836, in North Carolina, lived in Taylor County. Nathan, son of Giles (1850 Alabama census), was born in Alabama in 1846 so there might have been another Nathan. The Alabama Nathan was in the Civil War. N.T. of Georgia was probably descended from James and/or John of Talbot County, Georgia, 1850. He lived with his wife Eliza F., born May, 1842, in Georgia, and two sons, Charles D. 27, and Robert N. 24. Next door was probably another son, John W. McInvale.²⁷ John W. was born in Georgia in June 1871. He lived in Taylor County with his wife Georgie, born in Georgia in January 1880, and two daughters, Gertrude 3, and Tressie 4 months.

There were no McInvales in North Carolina or Florida in 1900, but there were twelve "McInvale" families in Alabama. In Butler County was William H. McInvale,²⁸ possibly the son of Robert, born in Georgia in February, 1828. He lived alone, but next

door was a probable son, William E. McInvale,²⁹ born in Alabama, May, 1870. He lived with his wife, Mary, born in Mississippi, February, 1870, and their children Early S. 8, Annie 6, Joe 5, and John 3. Also nearby in Butler County there was another possible son, J. W. McInvale.³⁰ He was born in Georgia in December, 1862. He lived with his wife Annie (born in Alabama in 1866) and children Lillian 12, Lidia 10, Marion 9, Mattie 7, and Lenard 2.

Three other families lived in Clay County, Alabama in 1900. John W. McInvale,³¹ born in 1862 in Alabama, lived with his wife Arazina, born 1862 in Alabama, and children George W. 19, Henry L. 16, Velmar 14, Giles H. 12, Dora L. 8, Lilla D. 6, and Napoleon E. 2. John W. was probably the son of J.W. in the 1880 census, and the grandson of Giles. The second family was that of Joel D. McInvale,³² born in Alabama in July 1862. He lived alone near John W. Third was Dink McInvail,^{33A} born in Alabama in November 1885. He lived in Fox Creek with his uncle, Henry C. Wats, and his family.

Thomas K. McInvale^{33B} lived with his wife Emma in Talladega County. He was born in Alabama in 1854 and was probably a son of Giles or John D. She was born in Alabama in 1868. Their children were Idas 12, Thomas 11, Joel G. 9, Hettie M. 5, and Etta S. 1. Nearby in the same county lived Nathan McInvale,^{34A} born in Mississippi in 1866. He could be a son of Jesse of the Civil War Mississippi Infantry or Nathan of Alabama. His wife Ann was born in Alabama in November 1869. Their children included daughters Leoda 13, and Elsie 7, and a son Arthur 4.

In Monroe County (near Butler County) lived Martha McInval,^{34B} born June, 1848 in Louisiana. She was the wife of John Mackinvale of Butler County in 1880. In Chilton County, Jasper McInvale³⁵ (born February, 1852 in Alabama) lived with his wife Marena. Their children were Isaac born 1874, Willie, Mattie, George, Tommie, Birty, Lula, and Florence.

The Fort Crawford Cemetary³⁶ in Escambia County, Alabama, has three tombstones of McInvales:

William and Lula could be husband and wife or both children of Jasper of Chilton County, 1900 (Willie and Lula).

Meanwhile in St. Clair County there was a John McInvale,³⁷ born in Georgia in 1839. This was probably the J.W. of 1880 Clay County, son of Giles. He lived with his second wife Nancy, born in Alabama in 1860, and their children George W. 19, Martha I. 17, Hattie 10, Arra 8, Minnie 7, Eddie 4, and Perry 6 months. Nearby lived his son Joe (Marion)³⁸ born February, 1877 in Alabama and his wife Bettie (Elizabeth Sheppard)³⁹ born in Alabama in March, 1883. They had no children in 1900, but a son, John Walter was born September 14, 1901 in Ellisville, Mississippi. A daughter, Maybell was born in 1904. She married Will Lowe of Ellisville, Mississippi and had a daughter Billie Jean and a son Buddy.

John Walter McInvale was raised in Ellisville and in 1919 married Lola Ethel Stanford (Copeland). They had five children:

Walter Cecil, born May 16, 1920 in Ellisville; Katherin Ophelia, born December 12, 1921 in Warrington, Florida; Joseph Marion, born January 25, 1924 in Pensacola, Florida; William Thomas, born in Laurel, Mississippi on September 1, 1927; and Betty Ruth, born on February 28, 1934 in Laurel. John Walter McInvale was stationed in Florida in the Navy in the early 1920's.

Walter Cecil McInvale⁴⁰ married Jean Whitehurst of Ellisville and had a daughter, Debbie. Katherin McInvale married William Dennis Nicholes. They had three girls: Gloria, Margret, and Ethel Joyce, and a son, Sammy, who drowned at age 7. Joseph Marion McInvale married, first, Betty Myrick of Ellisville in 1952. They had no children. Joe was divorced and remarried DAVISIA (Doris) (Estersohn) Nowahowski. Doris was a widow with a son Joseph. William Thomas McInvale married and had a son, Randy, by his first of three wives. Betty Ruth McInvale married J.C. (Click) Rush of Ellisville. They had two sons, John and George.

Lola Ethel Stanford (Copeland) was born in Groesbeck, Texas on February 6, 1900. Her mother, Katherin Elizabeth (Adams) Stanford died soon after Ethel was born. Her father, William Isaac Stanford, was born in Texas about 1869. In 1880 he lived in Robertson County,⁴¹ Texas with his father J. W. Stanford (born in Georgia about 1846), his mother Mary (born in Louisiana), and his sisters Emma (born about 1873), M.D. (born about 1875), Martha (born about 1876), and Lizzie (born about 1878).

The William Stanfords had another daughter, Mary Elizabeth,⁴² born in Groesbeck, Texas on January 6, 1898, and a son James William

born on September 22, 1894 (probably in Texas). After the death of his wife in 1900 William Isaac Stanford kept the son and "gave" the young girls, Elizabeth and Ethel, to a childless neighbor family, the Copelands, in accordance with a deathbed promise. John Abney Copeland was born in Alabama. His wife Lucy Ophelia (Hurst) was born in Choctaw County, Alabama on October 12, 1855. She was the daughter of William Hurst, born about 1810 in South Carolina, and his wife Mary E., born about 1823 in Alabama. In the 1880⁴³ census of Choctaw County, Alabama, William and Mary Hurst lived with their five children: John W. was 30, Emily F. 28, Lucy O. 25, Benjamin 19, and Mary V. 16. All were born in Alabama and unmarried. Next door⁴⁴ was another son James E. Hurst age 30 and his wife Jane age 30.

Soon after receiving the two girls, the Copelands moved back to Choctaw County, Alabama.⁴⁵ John died a few years later. Lucy and the girls moved to Ellisville, Mississippi about 1919. She died in Ellisville on April 9, 1939, on the bank of a nearby creek, fishing with her "grandchildren" the Bushes and McInvaes.
