CAPTAIN JAMES MOORE by Josephina Parker Kinney

My ancestor, James Moore, progenitor of The House of Moore, migrated from Ireland to Chester County, Pa. in 1726. He married Jame Walker in April of 1734. He had ten children of whom Captain James Moore was the 5th, born in Chester County. Captain James Moore married Martha Poage and settled in Abb's Valley, Virginia, where he formed and raised horses. He served as a private soldier under Gen. Andrew Lewis at the battle of Point Pleasant on Oct. 10, 1774, and on April 3, 1778, was commissioned a Captain of Militia on the waters of Bluestone. On March 15, 1781, he and his company of riflemen did valiant service at the battle of Guilford Court House under Gen. Matheriel Green, William Campbel, Colone).

In July, 1786, a party of forty-seven Indians of the Shawnee tribe came into Abb's Valley. On the morning of the attack, Captain Moore, who had previously distinguished himself at Alamance, was at a lick bog a short distance from his house salting his horses when two men who were at work in the field saw the Indians coming down the hill toward Captain Moore. He was shot through the body and died immediately. Two of his children who were returning home from the spring were killed about the same time. The hired men fled to spread the alarm and the Indians then sacked the house and took his wife, a hired gir and four other children captive. With the exception of the hird girl and Mary Hoore, they were all killed by the Indians. The oldest son, James, had previously been kidnapped by the same group of indians at about 1:00 P. H. on September 7, 1784. He remained in captivity until Oct. 1789 and returned to his home in Taxowell County three years after the murder and captivity of his father and family.

The Daniel Whitmore, the son of John and Mary Durnell Whitemore, was born both 6, 1758 in Daldwin, Haine, On April 16, 1782 he married Anna Te, daughter of Jeremiah and Mary Hill. In the 1840 censes of Lensioners, Daniel Whitmore was listed as aged 81, residence Inity, Heldo County, Maine, and as liveling with Jesse Whitmore. His service was as a private with the Massachusetts Line. An index of Revolutionary War Pensioners living in Maine showed Daniel was then 75 years old and living in Maido County. He had lived at Gorham, then Unity, He had 10 children. He died in 1846. A biography of Walworth County, Wisconsin in 1892 for his grandson indicates that Daniel at age 16 took part in the Dattle of Bunker Hill. The grandson was named Joseph Chitmore.

- 2. Daniel's sen Joseph Alva Whitmore was born at Gorham, Me. on March 12, 1787. He married Hannah Call of Dresdin. They were pioneers of Spring Prairie, Walworth County, Wiscensin, and he died thereon Date, 25, 1965. They had 12 children.
- 3. Abigail A. Whitmore was born Nov. 7, 1814 in Maine. In January 22, 1834, at La Porte County, Indiana, she married Dr. Ansel Asa Hemenway (13:6-1895) the son of Asa and Susanna Clark Hemenway. Abigail christened the town of Spring Prairie, Wisconsin. She died on June 14, 1902 at Eugene, Oregon and is buried in Dikhill Cometery. They had 7 children.
- 4. Or. Stacy M. Hementay was born Jan. 13, 1836 at Pieassant, Indiana and died Feb. 19, 1914. He served in the Civil War from Illinois and later also as full Regimental Surgeon for the Wist, U. S. Colored Troops. He later served as the physician for the Yaim & Indians in Klemath Falls, Oregon. His second wife was Charlotte T., daughter of Oliver H. Stanley and Mancy Ann Hatfield, pioneers of Siskiyou County, Callifornia in 1853. They had three sons.
- 5. Claudius Galen Hemenway was born harch 18, 1889 at Olene, Klamath County, Oregon. He married Alice Stowe who was the daughter of Elias Ma de aid Alice Celina Snyder Stowe. They had six children. He died March 5, 1932.
- 6. Vera Rosy Hemenway was born Feb. 1/1, 1918 at Redding, California. She married Bus F. Lander in 1936 at Red Bluff. They have five sons.
- 7. Marvin Leo Lander was born at Red Bluff in 1939.

The oldest son, James, had previously been kidnapped by the same group of Indians at about 1:00 P. M. on September 7, 1784. He remained in captivity until Oct. 1789 and returned to his home in Tazewell County three years after the murder and captivity of his father and family.

James Moore was married three times and had twelve children. John Shannon Moore, my Great-Great-Grandfather was the tenth. His daughter, my Great Grandmother Hargaret Moore first married James P. Ackerly who was enlisted in the Confederate Army on March 15, 1862, but died of yellow fever in May of the same year. They had one daughter, my Grandmother Ella who came to California with her mother and step-father, James Lewis Paxton in 1869 settling in Fort Jones. Ella married Isaac Lee Baker the day after they purchased a hotel in Etna on April 1, 1878. Hy mother, Maude Baker Parker was the third of five children born to this union.

EXTRACTS FROM ADDRESS OF PRESIDENT COOLIDGE TO THE GRADUATING CLASS, UNITED STATES NAVAL ACADEMY, JUNE 3, 1925

"You will be a constant testmony throughout your lives that America believes in military preparation for national defense, for the protection of the rights, the security and peace of her citizens.

"Under our institutions each individual is born to sovereighty. Whatever he may adopt as a means of livelihood, his

real business is serving his country,

"The great body of the American people will, I hope, always be devoted to civilian life. Their main purpose has been
and will be the maintenance of an honorable peace. It may not
have occurred to some of you, but I feel warranted in asserting it to be true, that your success lies in giving a very large support to the civilian life of the nation and to the promotion of the public peace.

"In all progress and advance it has never been possible to maintain the first essential of security without a background

of military force.

"It is my firm conviction that the duty of national defense, like the general duty of citizenship, should be broadly extended and borne by all of our people.

"The true spirit of American institutions requires that

each citizen whould be potentially a soldier.

"It is exactly because we wish to keep our standing forces small that the average citizen must give some attention to military affairs.

"Though ultimately I believe peace will prevail, I have too much knowledge of the history of mankind and too much experience with the traits of human nature to date to assert

that we shall never again be engaged in war.

"It is known of all the world that we have no present or traditional enmities, that we covet no territory, harbor no imperialistic designs, and are not arming ourselves with the expectation of attacking or being attacked. The power of our arms is not only consistent with, but ought to be regarded as an additional guaranty of the peace of the world."



THE MOORE'S OF CENTRAL VIRGINIA

A short biographical sketch on the Moore families of Albemarle, Amherst, Bedford, Buckingham, Campbell, Fluvanna, Louisa and Orange Counties before 1830 with some additional data on where they came from and where they moved on to.

INTRODUCTION

Extensive research has not been done to detenine from where the various Moore families originated or from what County they lived prior to moving to the Central Virginia area. One of the Moore families came from King William Co; one came from Person Co, N.C.; one probably came from New Kent Co; and they moved on to such places as Surry Co, N.C.; Franklin Co, Tenn; Melson Co, Ky; etc. The author is available for further research on any of these families and would be interested in knowing of any errors or additions or deletions. If you can add additional descendants, or ancestors, to any of the charts the information would be appreciated. All submissions of information will be acknowledged promptly. All queries with SASE will be answered.

A secondary mission of the search was to link Olive Moore who married Polly Chandler in 1808 in Fluvanna County to one of the families. This has not been done. There was also an Olive Moore of Campbell County who married Sally Gregory in 1792 and has not been linked. Olive and Polly moved on to Kanawha County, W. Va. Descendants of other Moore families in this study followed a similar migration path. John Jackson Moore, son of Benjamin, Chart 8, was one such family. Further research is needed. Charts organize by family the Moore's we have been able to identify.

It would seem advisable to provide a chronological listing of sources from which the data in the Charts was drawn. However, the practicality of time and space do not permit such an extensive undertaking. Extant records of the Counties involved provided much of the data. Published genealogies also gave us much valuable data. And, in some cases, the presence of only one such named individual led to the assumption that this was the person in question. There are interesting findings that link many of the families; however, there are many individuals on the Appendix not linked to any family. Benjamin and Jesse are given names that appear in several families. The Hardware River and Moores Creek are prominent with several families.

And we have not researched the 9 brothers who (by legend) Immigrated to Philadelphia in 1739/41 from Ulster, Ireland, stepped into a nearby tavern and ordered a big bowl of punch. Toasting a colorful past, and a promising future they started down the Appalachian Trail to the Carolinas and opportunity.

They 'sojourned' in Augusta County for a number of years on the way; however, that will have to be another story.

BACKGROUND

My own Moore family starts with Jesse Allen Moore b. 5 Jul 1802 [Family Bible] [Tenn.] His Father was born in M.C. and his Mother in Pa. [Census] He married, 19 Jan 1823, Elizabeth ____. Five children were born in possibly Tenn, Ky and Ill. A daughter's obituary says she was born in 1828 in Ky. Jesse Allen Moore 2d married, 1835, Sarah 'Sally' (Hayes) McColgin Vaughan (her third marriage) in Hamilton Co. Ill. Five children were born to this union including my Grandfather Jesse Allen Moore, Jr 30 April 1841. Jesse Allen Moore, Sr served in the Blackhawk War and in 1889 was 1 of 2 known surviving veterans in Hamilton Co. His son Jesse Allen, Jr served in the 6th Illinois Cavalry Lof "Grierson's Raiders" and John Wayne's "Horse Soldiers" fame. 1 Jesse Allen Moore, Jr married Sarah Jerusha Jones on 17 Apr 1864 while home on furlough from the Army. My Father, Elvis George Moore, born 8 Oct 1982, Married Hary Delphia Lawrence 10 Hay 1919 at Mattoon, Ill.

In early research on the Moore family I discovered a manuscript, "The Moore's of the Globe," relating the life of Jesse Moore of Albemarle Co, Virginia who married Alley Johnson and moved to North Carolina in the late 1700's settling on the Johns River near Lengir. Legend has it that son Daniel came back to Virginia and wooed and won his childhood sweetheart, Rebecca Stone, the fairest maiden of the Blue Ridge. When his younger brother, Jesse, came of age his Nother made him a new suit and he returnd to Virginia and married Elizabeth Stone, Sister of Rebecca, and returned home with his Bride and her Father. The legend further states that Jesse, Jr., when 78 years of age rode on horseback to Galesburg, ill to visit a son or grandson who had also married into the Lawrence family. The reader can readily understand my interest in researching the Moore family of Central Virginia.

The Moores of Central Virginia

CHART 4 JOHN W. MOORE

The JOHN W. MOORE family appears to be a rather influential family. According to legend, this was the O'Moore family of Ireland. Three Brothers came to America. One served as Lawyer for the Governor of Virginia while one, John W. received a 5000 Acre Patent in Albemarle County, Virginia. I' is most likely that this family was in New Kent County prior to the time a John Moore was appointed as Clerk of St. Martins Parish in Hanover County in 1722 where his family lived on Allen's Creek. From here they moved to their home in Louisa County (now Albemarle) just beyond Castle Hill in the shadows of the Southwest Mountains. The first wife speculation, Mary Jouett, is based on the first recorded evidence of John W. Moore in Albemarle County, 1745, when he was appointed as Executor for the estate of Matthew Jouett. John was then listed as of Hanover County. In 1747, John W. leased his neighboring 426 Acre farm to Rev James Haury for the price of one peppercorn per year. A short time later, he sold the farm to Rev. Maury for a pittance.

In 1752 it would appear that John W. moved his family to the Charlotesville area where he had acquired considerable land. He is listed as of St. Anns Parish, Albemarle County in 1752. He had also purchased 800 Acres on the North Side of the James River on Totier Creek which he sold on 13 Aug 1752 to Arthur Hopkins for 60 pounds. Whether the family ever lived on this farm is unknown. His Will was dated on 29 Jul 1777. At his death he owned land in Albemarle, King William and Louisa Counties. King William may have been a stopover before or after New Kent County and may be a clue to where the family lived before coming to Hanover County.

John W. Moore was a large land holder. These holdings covered various areas of Albemarle County. The 800 Acre on Totier Creek mentioned above was at Scotts Ferry Inom Scottsvillel just west of land owned by Jesse Moore in Chart 1. John W. gave 2 parcels of land on Moores Creek and Biscuit Run to his son John, Jr.; 600 Acres on both sides of Moores Creek to daughter Frances and husband John Henderson; Ithese properties on Moores Creek is very close to where Benjamin Moore, Chart 8 lived, and just a few miles Morth of Stephen Moore on the Hardware River, Chart 3.1 400 Acres in Louisa County to son Matthew; land NV of Charlottesville to daughter Elizabeth and husband, Tucker Woodson; and land in ME corner of Albemarle (probably his old home place) to his daughter Mary and husband, John Clark, son of Micajah Clark of Cedar Creek. He also sold one of his many lots in Charlottesville to Peter Marks in 1776. John W. Moore had come a long way from his days as Clerk in St Martins Parish.

JOHN W. MOORE

Matthew Moore, oldest son of John W., moved to Surry County, NC, where he became a very wealthy man. John, Jr moved to Georgia. On 13 April 1790, Mary Lewis, widow of Col Charles Lewis, leased 1400 Acres to her Son-in-law, Edward Moore, who had married their daughter, Mildred. Also on 27 Dec 1790. Charles Wingfield sold [?] 250 Acres to William Moore during the life of Mary Lewis Wingfield, Wid of Col Charles Lewis. Edward Moore witnesed this sale. Wood's History of Albemarle suggests that William Moore who married 2 May 1808 Mary G. Marks, was probably a son of John W. not mentioned in the Will. The date of the marriage, 1808, does not give us any explanation for the 1790 land transaction, Mary Lewis Wingfield to William Moore. A book published in Philadelphia is reported to record the birth of a John W. Moore in Albemarle County in 1777 who may possibly be the son of John Moore, Jr who was born circa 1750. This John V. had a son Villiam, 61804, Va who married Lucie Browning in 1831 and had a son John James b1834, Va who married Alice Elizabeth Harbinson in 1867 and had a son, Hugh, born 27 Apr 1887 in Prescott, Kansas. For more information on this family please see the article by Clarence L. Hewitt, Jr in The Magazine of Albemarle County History, Volume Thirty, 1972.

CHART 5 FRANCIS NODRE

There is not a lot to tell about this Moore family. Primarily because adequate research has not been done in Orange County. Host of the data for the Chart came from manuscripts or books; or other researchers. And there is very little evidence of any connection to the other Moore families in this report. The family of William Moore and Rebecca Hite Smith is covered by 'The Moores of Virginia and Kentucky,' by Charles Schoene.

It is quite possible that FRANCIS and Augustine [of Chelsea] were related. Augustine had a son Bernard who married Anne Catherine Spotswood and became Administrator for the Spotswood estate - a full time job from the extent of land holdings, etc. There were land transactions between Bernard and members of this family, and Francis did have 2 Grandchildlren named Bernard.

CHART 5 [Cont'd] FRANCIS NOORE

Harbin, son of Francis, did not remain in Virginia. His family migrated to Washington County, Kentucky. Host of the childlren were married in Virginia. Baughter Sally married Shadrack Clark, who I believe was of the Micajah Clark family and possibly a brother or close relative to Capt John Clark who married Mary, daughter of John W. Moore, Chart 4. The Wills of William and Harbin, sons of Harbin, are recorded in Washington County, Kentucky. William apparently left cochildren, mentioning only a nephew; while Harbin, Jr had 8 children including a Jesse, who had died before 1815 with no children. [Harbin gave Jesse's Horse and saddle to others in his Will.]

Col Francis, son of Francis, was prominent in Orange Count and his children married into other prominent families such as the Terrills and Prices. Son Reuben's first wife, Anne Terrill, is reportedly a descendant of Augustine Moore, but we do not have a clue to which Augustine. Bernard, oldest son of Col Francis, married Catherine Price in 1770, and after his early death, Catherine married his first cousin, Reuben, son of Harbin. I do not know whether Reuben went to Kectucky or not.

CHART 6 CAMPBELL COUNTY MOORES

This article will be one of brevity. My main Campbell County Moore families have been Charted on other Charts leaving several 'unaccounted' individuals and families that have not been further identified. My main reason for including them at all is the record of Olive Moore who married in 1792 to Sally Gregory and the possibility of a relationship to Olive Moore of Fluvanna County who married Polly Chandler in 1808. It is very possible that some of these Moores belong to other Charts included herein. Any information on these Moores will be greatly appreciated.

CHART 7 WILLIAM MOORE

Here we have yet another John Moore from King William County. Probably most famous for marrying the widow of Francis Conway, Rebecca Cattlet, whose daughter, Nelly Conway, married Col James Madison, and was Mother of President James Madison. John and Rebecca were Godparents of the President to be. Their son, William, came to Orange County where he died in 1802. William's only known son was John, bc1770, who married Frances Barbour. [Richmond Times, 1905]

CHART 8 BENJANIN MODRE

The Benjamin Moore family is about the only one of the Moore families covered by this report that can be traced back for several generations to the Immigrant ancestor, Thomas Moore. It is also quite unexpected that a family like the Benjamin Moore family would move into such close proximity to other Moore families like William and John W. [Charts 3 and 41 unless there existed some family relationship. However, no relationship is currently visible. I expected to find that Col. Stephen Moore of NY belonged to the same family as Benjamin but that is apparently not the case. See Chart for Book on family.

Benjamin moved his family from Essex Co, NJ to Virginia about 1792, when he purchased land on Moores Creek just South of Charlottesville on the Lynchburg Road. Benjamin was listed as of Albemarle County and his son, Isaac, as of Augusta County. This may indicate that they had been in the area for a year or two before the land purchase. After Benjamin's death in 1826, there was a long Court battle over the estate. The administration was handled by his son, Isaac, until his own death in 1833 when Isaac's son-in-law William Estes took over and completed the settlement.

Son, John Jackson, had moved to West Virginia, while Samuel had passed away in 1832. Samuel's son, Isaac, may also have left a Will in Albemarle County in 1840. It does not appear that there were many Moore descendents left in this area after Benjamin's death. This was only another stepping stone on their way to Kentucky, Tennessee and West Virginia.







This Appendix will serve a dual purpose. First, and foremost, it will list all the essential data found on the Moore family of Central Virginia. It will further serve as the Index to members of the Moore family covered herein, giving reference to the Chart on which they may be located. Absence of a Chart [CHT] number indicates that we have been unable to identify which Moore family the individual is a member of. While in pursuit of members of the Moore family in Central Virginia we often came across data identifying County or State where the family originated or migrated to. Therefore, our list of Counties is somewhat larger than originally anticipated.

Circa [cal dates. All dates listed as ca [i.e. 1765 cal only indicates the approximate date of the event [marriage, birth, etc.] based on available information. These dates are not to be interpreted as absolute or without the possibility of error. On the other hand, they have proved to be quite valuable for identifying different generations and have often proved to be quite accurate. In some instances the data was taken from the IGI of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints, which gave us the idea for the format used. IGI is the International Genealogical Index.



THE McLAUGHLINS.

DESCENDANTS OF WILLIAM MOORE, WHO SETTLED IN NEW BRUNSWICK ABOUT

There was still another family of prominence, in fact any notice of the neighborhood, or of the loyal families described. would be incomplete without mention of the McLaughlins. only one family, but the name appears prominently in the history of New Boston, N.H., from whence this one came. Their names were Joseph, James, Zachariah, Robert, Laughlin, Thomas, Betsey (mrs. William P. Scott) and Anna (Mrs. Barney McCann). With a native shrewdness and humor, and lithe and muscular, they were first and best in all games of amusement, especially if punctured, as was usually the case, by a modicum of old Jamaica as in early days, and of New England or Medford when their season came; and a dance, a piling frolic or a barn raising, was the occasion of their Skilled in all the work of the farm and the forest, they were always in request for building barns and out houses, ox-yokes and sleds, -- camps for the men and hovels for the oxen in the lumber woods. But though competent as indicated, I do not recall among them one skilled joiner, blacksmith, or of other trades. Zach. McLaughlin, the younger of that ilk, at the age of ten or a dozen years, called upon Aunt Ruthy one morning in the fall of the year, when the frost did not accord with his thin raiment and bare "Why Zach., haint ye most froze?" said Aunt Ruthy. "It is a bit cold," Zach., replied, as he stooped over the glowing coals of backlog and forestick. "Yes, Zach., it is a pretty cold morning, and now, which will you have, a piece of bread and butter or a cup of rum?" "I thank ye, Aunt Ruthy, I'll take both!"

THE WILL OF WILLIAM MOORE--Copied from the Records of Rockingham County, by his great-great-grandson, 135 years after its date, is as follows:

"In the name of God Amen the sixth day of November in the year of our Lord God 1739, I William Moor (sic) of Londonderry in the Province of New Hampshire, being very sick and weak in body, but in perfect mind and memory, thanks be given unto God therefor (sic), calling unto mind the mortality of my body and Knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die, do make and ordain this my last Will and Testament, That is to say principally and first of all. I give and recommend my Soul unto the hands of God that gave it, and for my body I recommend it to the Earth to be burried (sic) in a Christian Like and decent Manner, at the discrition (sic) of My Executors Nothing Doubting but at the General Reserection (sic) I shall Receive the same again by the mighty Power of God and as touching Such Worldly Estate where it hath Pleased God to bless me in this life I Give Bequath (sic) and dispose of the same in the following Manner and form Imprimis I Give and Bequath (sic) to Martha my dear Beloved wife my Lands Goods and Chattles by her to be Posessed (sic) and Kept Together for the use Benefit and Maintainance (sic) of her and my Beloved

Children, which Lands they are to Labor and be obedient to her and She as in Duty bound to Learn and Instruct them as God Shall Enable her Enduring life but and if it Should please God to Call her hence then the boys that are under age to be bound out to Item the Lands goods and Chattles which shall or may be at her Decease to be sold and made into money I do Leave and Bequeath unto my beloved Sons George Moor (sic) Thomas Moor (sic) Allen Moor (sic) and William Moor (sic), in Equal parts and Portions one hundred and Twenty Pound being Exampted (sic) and Given to my well Beloved Daughters. Item to my Beloved Daughter Jane Christy, I Leave and Bequeath Twenty Pounds and to my Beloved Daughter Betty Moor (sic) I Leave and Bequath fifty Pounds and to my Beloved Daughter Hary Hoor (sic) I Leave and Bequeath Fifty pounds and if either Betty or Hary Should die Without Issue her part to be given to the other and Likewise my Beloved sons if any of them Should die without Issue their part to come to their Brethren, I Likewise Constitute make and ordain Allen Anderson and Samuel Anderson my only and sole Executors of this my Last will and Testament, and do ratify and Confirm this and no other to be my Last Will and Testament In Witness whereof I have Set my hand Seal the day and year above Written.

Date of death on tombstone, 15th January, 1739, probably should be 1740.

Of the wife Martha it is only conjectured, that her name was Anderson; nothing is known of her life or the time of her death.

Of the sons, George remained in Derry and his descendants are now (1880) represented there by three families, among them that of George Moore, 2d, Esq.

Thomas deeded his share of his fathers estate to George in 1745 and from thence all trace of him is lost.

Allen sold his right in his father's estate to George in 1747 and with William before the year 1756 settled in New Boston, N.H.; as appears by a "census" of that year taken for the proprietors (of Boston, Mass). Allen owned a large farm there, and lived and died unmarried. He adopted his nephew Thomas.

William settled on the farm now owned by Calvin Fuller, in the south part-of New Boston, and about the year 1785, with his large family moved to New Brunswick, then, and yet remaining a British Province.

Of the daughters, Jane Christy is supposed to have been the maternal ancestor of the Peter, James, and John Christy who settled in New Brunswick about 1783-4 or 5, and whose representatives yet remain there, --of the family now represented by the venerable David Miltimore Christie of Dover and of the family yet remaining in New Boston.

Jessie Moore and his brother John Levi Moore moved to Tennessee to live. Then Jessie and John Levi left Tennessee at the same time. Jessie moved to Texas. He settled on a farm two miles south of Forney, TX. (Information provided by Mazine Moore Winstead, probably from "Levi Moore Descendents, 1802-1975".)

CHILD 2 - John Levi MOORE-155

John Levi Moore was born in Georgia, according to Mazine (Moore) Winstead. John Levi and his brother Jessie moved to Tennessee to live; it is not known just where he lived in Tennessee. Then Jessie left Tennessee and moved to Texas, where he settled on a farm about two miles south of Fourney, TX. At the same time, Levi left Tennessee and moved to Alabama, to the south side of the Alabama River near Brenton, which is near Selma, AL. Levi married Sarah Ann Johnson, daughter of Dan Johnson, while living in Alabama. He and his wife left Alabama and moved near the eastern line of Leake County, Mississippi. His wife was not happy in Mississippi so they moved back to Alabama. They later moved back to Mississippi again, where they stayed.

Levi had 14 children by his first wife, Sarah Ann (Johnson) Moore; two by his second wife (name unknown); and eight by his third wife, Mary Elizabeth (Wilkerson) Moore. Levi was 55 and Mary Elizabeth was 23 years old when they married. A daughter of Levi's, Sallie (Moore) Townsend, married Ike Wilkerson, a brother of Mary Elizabeth; Sallie had first married J. Norris Townsend.

Levi is buried at Ebenezer Cemetery. About 3 or 4 years before William Ellis (Willie) Moore died, on January 21, 1975, at the age of 96 years and 10 months, Willie bought new tombstones for his great-grandfather, Levi, and for his grandfather, Nathan Moore, and had them put on their graves at Ebenezer. Willie, son of William Henry Moore, is buried there, as is William Henry.

The charter members of the Ebenezer Primitive Baptist Church, which was organized September 16, 1865, were:

Levi's birth date as shown on his tombstone was 1802, which was also the date shown in the family bible. However the 1870 census shows him to be 63 years old, which would put his birth date in the year 1807.

Your inquiry regarding the Moores is greatly appreciated. Unfortunately, I have been unable to make any connection to my known Moore line and the Moores in North Carolina.

Enclosed you will find family group charts on Moore and James Yancy Moore. James Yancy Moore is my direct ancestor - my great great grandfather. The children of the unknown Moore were disclosed in an estate settlement in Hinds County, Mississippi as you can note from the The dates of birth of the children, except documentation. for James Y. Moore which is known, were based on dates in the Censuses in which I found them listed. The birth date of Mary Moore which you believe to be about 1800 would be about right for being a member of this family. Since she died well before Nathaniel Moore, she or any of her children might not have been included in probate as interested parties because their whereabouts were not known. other hand, she may not be a sister.

You will also note in the documentation under James Y. Moore that a Mrs. Clara Jacobs felt that an Elias Moore was a brother of James Y. Moore. If so, I have not been able to find a tie in. So far, my searches have been fruitless. I have not been able to determine if the elder Moore moved from North Carolina to Tennessee with his children or possibly elsewhere. I will keep you in mind as I continue my search for a connection to the North Carolina Moores. Similarly, I would appreciate any leads that you develop.

FOUNDERING OF THE BATES FAMILY

Submitted by Thomas Bell, Oxton, Cheshire

In the March, 1933, issue of Sea Breezes, I noticed in the remarks column of the Roll of Honour of Bates' vessels, that the Bates Family foundered off the African Coast, the crew being rescued by the British India, in 1870, and as I knew Captain Christian, who commanded the latter vessel, intimately, I think perhaps your readers would like to learn, as told me by Captain Christian, how the rescue was made.

The British India was on a voyage from Sydney, New South Wales, to Rangoon with ballast. When about three weeks out, Captain Christian retired as usual in the afternoon for a snooze: he dreamt that a ship was in distress. The dream rather impressed him, and on coming on deck mentioned to the Mate the substance of it, and at the same time told him to keep his eyes open in case any vessel needing help should be in the neighbourhood. Nothing, however, was reported.

That night the dream was repeated, but clearer, with the addition that women and children were in great danger, as the vessel was sinking. In the morning, he again made enquiries as to whether any flares had been seen during the night, the reply being given in the negative. The dream was repeated again in the afternoon.

Convinced the dreams were not ordinary ones.

Captain Christian was now convinced that the dreams were not ordinary ones, so he sent one of the apprentices aloft to see if anything could be observed, but to no effect. However, later on, towards sunset, he sent him aloft again, and the lad reported what he thought might be a floating large whale on the horizon, right off the port bow. Captain Christian then went aloft himself, and by the aid of his glasses made out a large dismasted ship. The course was at once altered and the boats were made ready for use, all hands employed.

The wind being light, it was early in the morning before they reached her, and found the dismasted ship was the Bates Family, outward bound for Australia with emigrants to the number of 269, which included a number of women and children. The vessel was leaking badly, beyond the control of the pumps, caused by the wreckage being hurled at the hull during the storm. There was eight feet of water in the hold.

All were finally saved, and some provisions and bedding etc. were salved, but before long it was seen that the vessel was settling down, and sank before more supplies could be secured. With such a large number of additional mouths to feed, it was deemed necessary to put back to the nearest port in Australia. The passengers were accommodated in the 'tween-deck, fortunately empty at the time through the ship not having any cargo aboard. Had not Captain Christian been notified by a dream, the probabilities are that all aboard the Bates Family would have met a watery grave. In those early days, it might have been a week or a month before a vessel would pass that way again.

Captain Christian, as his name implies, was a Manxman, his father was Vicar of

Malew. He was educated at King Williams's College with the intention of entering Holy Orders, but through a strange perversity of fate, choose the sea as a career.

A most intellectual man

He was a most intellectual man and could read both Latin and Greek books, and took an interest in his apprentices, having classes in which he instructed them in navigation. It was a boast of his that during the whole of his career he never required to ask the latitude of any ship, though he had been scores of times requested to do so by other ships.

After a long and most adventurous career at sea from 1834 to 1884, being fifty years of service, he retired to his modest home in Tranmere.

Honest to a fault, teetotaler and a faithful servant to his employers, he passed his time quietly at home, patiently awaiting the summons from the Great Captain of the Port, which at last came, and his spirit crossed the bar as the tide reached its full on February 2nd, 1896, aged 78.

CHARLES MOORE AND ISABELLA CANNELL

My great great grandmother Isabella CANNELL was born at Douglas on 4th September 1808 the daughter of James CANNELL and Esther CHRISTIAN who were married at Braddan on 7th June 1807. Isabella met and married Charles Moore who was according to his attestment papers born in County Leitrim Ireland circa 1799. Charles was confirmed at Colchester Essex in 1813.

Place and date of their marriage is unknown as it is recorded only as England on any subsequent certificates, likewise Charles parentage is so far unknown, it is thought his father was also in the British Army.

Charles joined the British Army which led him to France, West Indies, Portugal, Australia and East Indies. He was discharged to the Isle of Man in June 1840, taking with them their children Charles, Sarah and Robert. Two further children were born at Douglas - Albert Sydney baptised 23 May 1842 and Henry William baptised 28 March 1844.

Charles and Isabella stayed on Isle of Man until 1847 during which time Charles was Publican at Ivy Cottage St. Annes Castletown. The British Army called for Army Pensioners as Volunteers to come to New Zealand for defence purposes in return for a cottage and an acre of land. The family sailed from Gravesend to NZ in April 1847.

Family sources have passed down a story that Isabella's parents were devastated that she was going to live so far away and it is believed that in their Will she was left an amount of money on the proviso that the family return to the Island to live which they never did.

The photographs are of paintings of Charles MOORE and Isabella CANNELL perhaps one of your readers will know something of the family. I believe Isabella CANNELL had siblings: Margaret CANNELL born 17 November 1811, Robert CANNELL born 18 December 1814 and Ann Elizabeth CANNELL born 19 Jan 1819 and there quite possibly are others. I believe their father James CANNELL's parents to be Robert CANNELL and Margaret CALLISTER who were married on 2 May 1778 at Malew with siblings Thomas bapt. 9 March 1783 at Malew and William bapt. 27 May 1792 at Braddan.

I would be interested to know if the I'vy Cottage St. Annes, Castletown still stands today?

GENEALOGY IN THE ISLE OF MAN - PART 2

The Manx, like the other Celtic peoples, maintained a strong interest in family history and relationships. At an early period, such knowledge was essential for establishing title to land, but as we have seen, by the fifteenth century, written records of land tenure were being kept on the Island. Families passed on their genealogy as an oral tradition, but only in a handful of cases was anything recorded for posterity. A few other stories relating to the origins of families and their surnames can probably be classed as 'folk etymology'.

During the mid-nineteenth Century, a few middle-class Manxmen of antiquarian leanings took up genealogy. The foremost was Paul Bridson, whose manuscript notebook containing pedigrees of notable Manx families survives at the Manx Museum Library. In the late 1800's Arthur W. Moore, a Cambridge History graduate published a few family histories in a local Church Magazine.

Early in the present century, Edmund Goodwin (1844-1924), a Peel man, devoted years to a collection of genealogical material relating mostly to families from the west of the Island, and spanning a hundred years or so. Later, William Cubbon, (1865 - 1955) a great Manx scholar, bibliophile, and enthusiast, was the leading figure in Manx family history studies. In 1922, Cubbon realised a burning ambition, and became the first Secretary and Librarian of the newly established Manx Museum. He was responsible for building up the Manx National Library and Archives, which now has a near-complete collection of printed matter relating to the Island, and extremely important holdings of public and private manuscripts. Cubbon's unique position made him the natural correspondant for descendants of Manx emigrants, and he was on terms of familiarity with members of the local farming and fishing communities. Many local families preserve notes or letters from William Cubbon, telling them what he knew or could discover of their genealogy.

A fruitful co-operation was established between William Cubbon and Ann M. Cannon, of Salt Lake City, Utah, which brought about a large programme of microfilming of Manx records by the Genealogical Society of Utah, commencing in 1949. Cordial relations have been maintained since that time, and a high proportion of genealogical source material has been filmed.

William Cubbon also looked forward to the day when the Manx Government would appoint an offical Genealogist (as found in Ireland) to assist principally the Manx abroad in finding their roots. This dream has never been realised, but in 1979 the Authorities launched 'OPERATION ROOTS' a one-off publicity exercise aimed at generating interest in the Millenium Celebrations for Tynwald, the Manx Parliament. The aim of the operation was to locate one million descendants abroad, of Manx ancestry. The result was several thousand letters from all over the world, from individuals expecting to have their ancestry established and officially certified.

At precisely the same time, a group of local family historians had met on the Island, at the instigation of Mrs. Mona Christian, and this Society was formed in February 1979. Our Society helped throughout the Millenium year, and has since continued to help welcome the descendants of Manx emigrants to the Island, and assist them in learning more of their ancestors, and their heritage.
