When his brother and family, threatened by Tories and Indians, took refuge in the hemlock swamp, he was their companion.

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Obituary – Judith "Jay" Munson

"Jay", Judith Ann (Yates) Munson, wife of "Quin" George Q. Munson, Jr., died Monday, May 23, 2005 at Lebanon, NH after a long and courageous battle with lymphoma. She was 67.

She was born in Fall River, MA on April 15, 1938, the daughter of Florence and William Yates. She received her bachelor's degree from Gordon College in Wenham, MA and a Masters degree in Early Childhood Education from Bank Street College, New York City.

She met her husband "Quin", George Q. Munson, Jr., at Gordon College and they moved to Sea Cliff, NY (Long Island) where they remained for 25 years and raised their family of three children.

Her interest in Early Childhood Education was sparked during her early years working as Head Teacher at St. Paul's Nursery School, Glen Clove, NY for eight years. She continued that work at Portledge School, Locust Valley, NY for four years.

Mrs. Munson was passionate about her work with young children and became an expert in Early Childhood Education culminating in becoming the founding director of Children's Corner Preschool, Syosset, NY in 1984. In 1988 she and her husband moved to New Hampshire, where she continued to share her professional expertise as a Head Start Coordinator for over 10 years.

In 1992 Mr. and Mrs. Munson and their son, David Munson, established Bedford Agway, now known as Bedford Fields. Their son, George Munson, later joined the family business. Mrs.

Munson was the heart of Bedford Fields and her vision was to create a welcoming place where people could find beauty for their homes and gardens. Her gentle and kind spirit was always a comfort to all who visited Bedford Fields.

Surviving family members include her mother, Florence Yates, of Concord, formerly of Middleton, RI, her husband, "Quin" George Q. Munson, Jr., of Bedford, three children; Portia Munson (Handlesman) of Catskill, NY, George Q. Munson III, of Lyndeborough, NH, and David Munson of Washington, NH, her seven grandchildren and two brothers, Steven Yates of Florida and Jeffery Yates of Rhode Island.

Funeral services were held at Bethany Covenant Church, Bedford, NH. Private burial was held in Catskill, NY.

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HEAD OF CLAN WAITSTILL

Waitstill⁴ Munson, son of Samuel³, grandson of Samuel², great grandson of Thomas, was born December 12, 1697 in Wallingford, CT, (*The Munson Record*, Vol. 1, page 320). He died in Wallingford on March 6, 1789 at the age of 91. He married Phebe Merriman (daughter of Caleb and Mary (Preston) Merriman), who was born September 16, 1699 and died in 1772 at the age of 73. They were married December 10, 1719. They resided in Wallingford, CT throughout their lives. Their ten children were all born in Wallingford.

2. Hannah⁵ born February 20, 1723
3. Samuel⁵ born December 7, 1723
4. Phebe⁵ born June 14 1726. She married Dec. 25, 1744 but died Jan 25, 1745 or 46.
5. Solomon⁵ born March 19, 1728
6. Waitstill⁵ born November 24, 1729
7. Medad⁵ born August 31, 1731
8. Mamre⁵ born January 20, 1734
9. Martha⁵ born June 11 1738 and died January 27, 1739
10. Martha⁵ born January 1740 and died January 1740.

Waitstill⁴ was the fifth son of Samuel³ and Martha __. Martha died January 7, 1707 and Samuel married Mary widow of Caleb Merriman in March 1708.. Waitstill was 10 years of age when his father remarried.. His stepmother, Mary had children from her previous marriage, one of whom was Phebe, who Waitstill subsequently married. As recorded on page 320 of *The Munson Record*, "When Widow Mary became the stepmother of Waitstill⁴, he was ten years of age, and her daughter Phebe was eight and one-half years old; these young people, eleven years and nine months later, were united in marriage."

The Munson Record also notes that "At the age of twenty-six he (Waitstill) was a surveyor of highways 'in ye east society,' and at the age of thirty-two was the first of six grand-jurors. In 1743 he was both surveyor of highways and grand-juror." The following paragraphs on pages 320 and 321 include his many real estate transactions and his bequeaths to his children and grandchildren.

The final paragraph includes an obituary notice written by Mrs. Munson Nash which reads, "Died at Wallingford, on Thursday the 5th inst., Mr. Waitstill Munson in the 92nd year of his age. From him descended 12 children", from eight of these 50 grandchildren, 155 great-grandchildren, and nine great-great-grandchildren, 226 descendants—38 deceased, 188 survivors."

To live in hearts we leave behind is not to die.

Even today the Waitstill Clan has the most descendants recorded in *The Munson Record*.

HEAD OF CLAN WILLIAM

William⁴ Munson, son of Samuel³ grandson of Samuel², great grandson of Thomas, was born October 13, 1695 in Wallingford, CT, "now Cheshire, CT." (The Munson Record, Vol. 1, page 244). He died on July 21, 1773. He was a member of the Congregational church. William⁴ married Rebecca, daughter of Thomas Curtis of Wallingford. They had eight children. Of the eight children, only four; William, Peter, Samuel and Amasa have records of descendency in the following pages of The Munson Record.

1. Martha⁵ born April 2, 1729
2. William⁵ born July 5, 1731, baptized July 11, 1731
3. Eunice⁵ born August 15, 1733, baptized Sept 1733
4. Peter⁵ born November 22, 1735
5. Hannah⁵ born 6 September 1737; married July 30, 1759 Titus, son of John and Marlo⁴ (Munson) Hitchcock who was born November 21, 1712. They had 1 child, Obedience⁶, who was born October 8, 1761.
6. George⁵ born October 7, 1739
7. Samuel⁵ born about 1741
8. Amasa⁵ born January 1741 or 42? The Munson Record, Vol. 1 page 244

William⁴ was the fourth son of Samuel³ and Martha². Martha died Jan 7, 1707. William was 14 years of age when his mother died. His father, Samuel then married Mary Merriman (widow of Caleb Merriman) on March 10, 1708. He was one of many full siblings, half siblings, and step siblings.

Information recorded concerning William⁴ only describes the land which he received from his father Samuel³ or which he purchased and which in turn he gave to his sons. From The Munson Record, page 245: William's⁴ home was a mile and three-quarters north of Cheshire Green. The stream running northward through the farm a quarter of a mile east of the house is still known as Honey-Pot Brook. On that place William's son Peter⁵ was born and died; there Peter's son Levi⁶ was born and died; and there Levi's son Levi⁷, our aged contemporary (1896), was born and spent the earlier portion of his life. "Our aged contemporary" phrase was written by Myron Andrews Munson, historian and writer of Volume I of The Munson Record published in 1896.

A footnote on page 244 of The Munson Record reads, *Honey-Pot Brook has its head in springs clear as honey within a mile of The Green eastward. It has been a famous habitation for trout; Levi⁷ has taken some from it which would weigh a pound. The brook flows into the Quinnipiac about

two miles northeasterly of the old William⁴ Munson place.

There is no record of his life's work or community involvement. One can assume that he was a farmer as were most of the colonists at that period in New England.

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Recollections:

Munson reunions were great events in my childhood. My parents entertained the Munson family often. We all worked hard to have the house and yard look their best.

Relatives came from Binghamton, Elmira, Syracuse and all around central New York. I grew up knowing and liking dozens of Munson cousins. Now I am 86 years old and these cousins are dying one by one. As I read these obituaries I thank God for the great family I was born in, and the wonderful times we have had.
