Walter Joseph Ogden was born on 27 September 1869 in Charleston, Coles County, Illinois. He was the second of two sons born to John Wesley Ogden and Frances Hutchinson Van Meter (Fannie). On the 1870 Federal Census¹ father was listed as a peddler, born in New York. His mother was listed as a dressmaker, born in Illinois.

Fannie died in Charleston on 17 March 1874 at the age of 24. John removed his small family to Chicago where he married again on 9 May 1876² to Anna S. Barker, daughter of wealthy industrialist John H. Barker of Michigan City, Indiana. There were two more children born of this union, Marian in 1879³ and John Wesley Ogden in 1885, one month after his father's death⁴.

Uncle Walter often fondly recalled growing up in a large mansion, with his constant companion the son of family retainers who "practically raised him". (see photo, possibly a wedding portrait)

Part of Walter's education was at a university in Germany. I inherited his black silk collapsible opera hat, monocle and working sword cane. By this time he had grown to his full height of 6' 4", a gentle, easy going personality that no one apparently wanted to test, as he claimed never to have needed the cane for protection.

In 1890 he is listed as a clerk residing at 3336 Michigan Avenue in Chicago. In 1896 and 1897 he is listed in the Michigan City, Indiana, City Directory as Asst. Bookkeeper with H & B Car Company, which was owned by his stepmother's brother, John H. Barker. He was boarding with his brother Harold and family in 1902 at 219 E. 7th Street in Michigan City.

LEGEND

At one period of time in his business career, he and three friends went to Olympia Washington and built the first sawmill in that frontier town. The mill provided all the lumber for the sidewalks and shipped timber to the Orient. FACT The first sawmill was built in the 1840s, thirty years before Walter was born.

In 1913 he was living in St. Paul, MN and worked for Northwestern Fuel Co. This company was a distributor of coal, primarily for home heating. They also maintained

a marching band, which participated in various events in the Twin Cities. I have a photograph of a very small drummer boy with Uncle Walter wearing the band uniform of blue and tan with a very tall shako. A treasured letter from his stepmother is addressed to him there and mentions that she had been in Egypt recently and would be presently going to Florence, then back to Karlsbad. She died in Hamburg, Germany in 1922. I often wonder where she was during the "war to end all wars".

By 1924 Walter was living in San Diego, California. There he met Grace O'Neil, who was a retired legal secretary from Terre Haute, Indiana. Grace was barely 5' tall and rarely weighed more than 100 lbs. They were the perfect couple because she was as feisty as he was easy going. On 26 November 1924⁵ they were married.

Around 1928 they decided to build a home and chose a site on Cypress Avenue on a ravine across from the zoo. The home became a showplace and was "written up" in several papers. It was two-story, with a three car garage, maid's quarters, an excellent outdoor aviary. The Scottish gardener, Hugh, imported the first Bird of Paradise from Hawaii to a place of honor on the lawn outside the living room by the lily pond. As a child I was enchanted by the gazebo and exotic fruit trees (strawberry guava for one) planted at the edge of the canyon and often heard the lions roar.

Their next door neighbor was an exiled Presidente of Mexico (I believe his name was Rubio) and he had a guardhouse and high walls around the property.

In 1930 Walter Ogden's cousin, Catherine Barker Spaulding, wrote that she was getting married ("please don't tell anyone") to Charles Hickox and was her pleasure to increase his annuity to \$10,000 per year. What a nice person.

By 1940 it was becoming more and more difficult to hire good help, so when Hugh retired as gardener-chauffeur and several good cook-housekeepers had come and gone, they sold their home and moved into the El Cortez Hotel, which at that time was one of the luxury hotels. From there, they moved to Artesia, California to be near Grace's brother Robert O'Neil and then back to San Diego on San Juan Hill above Old Town. Walter Ogden died in San Diego's Mercy Hospital on 11 January 1948⁶ and was placed in a crypt at Holy Cross Cemetery, which was a long way out in the country in those days. Now it overlooks a very busy freeway.

Walter Ogden was accustomed to wealth all of his life so he was not impressed by it nor affected by lack of it.

Status symbols as such were not important to him. He did get pleasure from having people remember him by name. He was an avid stamp collector and corresponded with Franklin D. Roosevelt as an equal. One of his favorite stories was how William Randolph Hearst would have his dining table set with fine china and crystal and elaborate silver ornaments alongside paper napkins and jars of mustard and catsup. He and Grace were frequently invited to high society affairs but rarely accepted. One in particular that they spoke of with regret was a reception for the Prince of Wales at the Hotel del Coronado where the Prince first was introduced to Mrs. Wallis Simpson.

MORE "UNCLE WALTER" STORIES as recalled by nephew, Jim O'Neil.

Auntie Grace always wanted a fine piece of "jewel jade". After many years, Uncle Walter decided she deserved it, so of course they had to organize a trip to Gumps in San Francisco because that was the "only" place to get good jade. Auntie Grace perused the stock (without prices marked) for some time, and then announced her choice. Uncle Walter approved her choice and asked the price. When told it was \$25,000 he nodded and asked if he could get another just like it. When told it was a unique, hand-carved ring and no other could exist, he declined the ring because he "really wanted a matched set."

While visiting in Montana, Uncle Walter was invited to go on a "roundup." When he learned that they would leave after dark and return by dawn he declined the offer, saying "I have been a lot of things in my life, but rustler is not one of them."

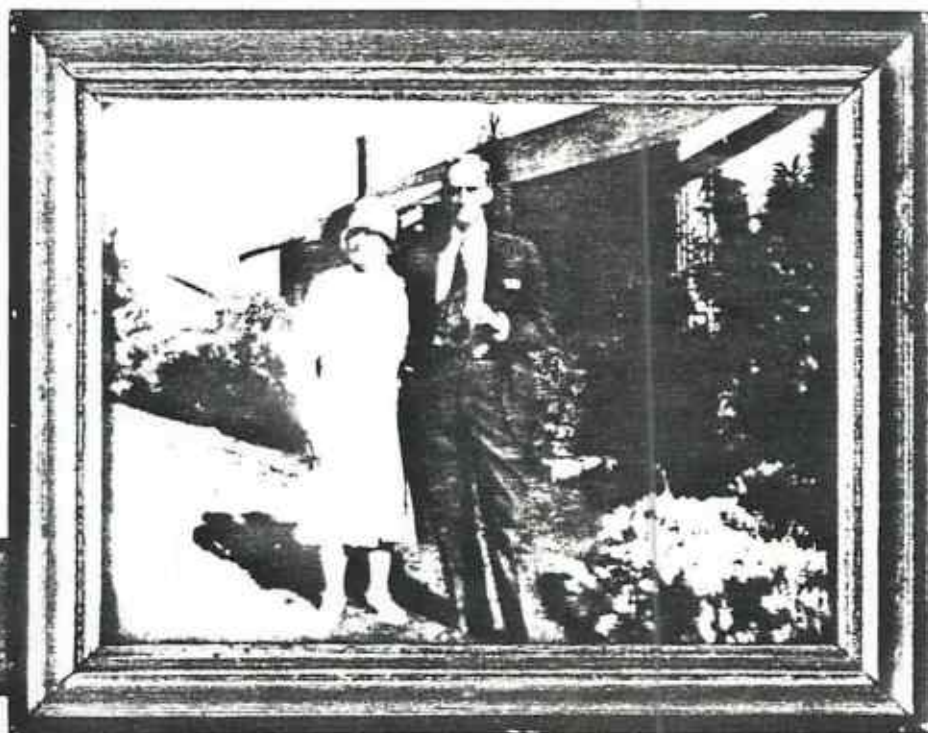

A MERRY CHRISTMAS!

A Brilliant Party.

AND A HAPPY THROG

Christmas evening witnessed the largest and most brilliant party ever known in this city, if not in this portion of the State. During the past summer and fall Coon & Gage, contractors of this city have employed most of their time and a large force of workmen in building a residence for Mayor J. W. Ogden, near the Methodist church, on Washington Street. The house was completed early in December, having cost its fortunate and happy possessor between eighteen and twenty thousand dollars, being in all respects the finest, handsomest, and most convenient family residence in the county. The building contains three stories with basement; is lighted with gas in every department and has water pipes leading to almost every room. To say that Mayor Ogden has furnished his magnificent home in a style that is entirely in accordance with the enormous sum spent in its erection and with excellent judgment and good taste would give but a partial idea of the internal appearance of the house, which must be seen to be appreciated and fully realized. Even then our powers of description would fall far short were we to attempt to portray the magnificence and splendor of its parlors, hall, libraries, etc. This much for the house; now let us tell you something of the party about which we intended to speak in the first place: invitations were sent to between three and four hundred persons, nearly all of whom were present, many ladies and gentlemen being in attendance from Mattoon, Paris, and other neighboring cities. By nine o'clock the greater portion of the guests had arrived, and, after having been welcomed by Mr. and Mrs. Ogden, were ushered to the various dressing rooms by polite and attentive servants; after which they were expected to enjoy themselves as none could help doing under circumstances so peculiarly pleasant. Surrounded by so much wealth, youth and beauty, mingled with sweet music and dazzling[sic] splendor, what mortal could avoid being happy? Certainly none. At eleven o'clock seventy-five persons were invited to supper, followed by others, and others, until all had partaken of a banquet fit for kings and queens. Never was such a supper, such an abundance and such a variety--endless and almost inconceivable--prepared for the benefit or pleasure of Charleston's favored people. Balshazzar's famous feast could not have surpassed. But time forbids our longer dwelling upon a description of this altogether pleasant affair. Suffice it to say that late and reluctantly the guests took their departure, only regretting that they could not always remain where all was so blissful and joyous; but with many kind wishes for the continued prosperity and happiness of Mr. Ogden and his amiable wife.
