JOURNEYS

I have received some more information from Wanda Forste of Portales, N.M. on Robert PARTON. It seems she was in contact with a Dave Parton of S.C who sent her the following information on Robert PARTON: Please remember that this is not documented and is merely a copy from a letter received years ago. If anyone can document this particular info, please let me know.

The state of the s

Robert, born 1589, came to America as a single man age 20. Probably answered add from London-Va Company for indentured servants. The contract called for 7 years service of Jamestown, Va and terminated with a gift of 100 acres and the tools to farm with. The first two suppliers involved 3 ships and about 125 people each. The third supply involved 9 ships and some 500 The deaths were unbelievable. Some 80% died with in the first two years. The third supply came the southern route by the Canary Islands where one ship turned back by the Azores and the Bahama Islands off Florida where they ran into a hurricane and lost another ship with all aboard. Shakesere wrote his classic The Tempest about that voyage. The leadship with all the management "Sea Venture" was blown off course and shipwrecked on Bermuda where they built another ship and came on to VA in the spring of 1610. The other six ships arrived in VA between AUG and OCT. They were too late to plant a crop, and the hurricane had destroyed the stores. Weevils got into what grain the settlers had stored for winter and with the new arrivals, didn't have enough food. This winter 1609/10 was called the starving time, even the the new settlers had brought the plague with them. Out of 400 people, only 60 survived. Robert PARTON was one of them. At the end of his indenture in 1616, he received his 100 acres at Charles City. When his bride, Margaret, came on the GEORGE in 1617 theyreceived an extra 50 acres because she paid her own transportation. Their children were born 1619-1621, 1624 and 1626 and he (Robert) held an honored position as an "Ancient Planter" given those who came over before 1612 and survived. He is shown on census taken between Jan and Marl625 with 3 children and 2 indentured servants. John Seward seems to have been a partner in a Bristol shipping company who came to VA near 1635. He put together a 1600 acre plantation called Levanecke?. He was a member of the House of Bergess in 1644 from Isle of Wight. In 1649, he filed for a lane grant listing 32 people whom he had paid transportation for from England. Robert PARTON and his entire family were among them altho they had been in VA 40 years. John Seward bought Robert PARTON farm and livestock in 1648.

Journey's cont.

Seward also had plantation called Blackwater. Robert PARTON s family seem to have been overseers at Blackwater and Sewards death (?). Robert PARTON, Sr sold his (Sewards?) farm to his son Robert, Jr in 1642 after leasing another in Elizabeth City County in 1638. Robert, Jr sold to Seward in 1648. Since the PARTONS owned no property or estate, there seems to be no records during 1650 to 1700. Robert JR was born 1624. There was a Robert PARTON that appears in Surry Co in 1700 and marries Elizabeth Rawlings."

How many questions did you come up with? I don't have much access to very early VA colonial records so one of you can document this info, please let me know.

PARTON Wills

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THE PARTON FAMILY

Nathaniel Parton, b. 1804, d. after 1880, married Barbara Carpenter, b. 1804, d. after 1880; both are buried at Round Hill Gementary 5 miles north of Rutherfordton, N.C.

Barbara was the daughter of David Carpenter (b. 1765, d. 1818) and Zeruah Johnson (b. 1784, d. 1836); Rutherford Co. marriage bond dated 5-1-1802.

Nathaniel and his two brothers came from Virginia to Burke Co. N.C.

One brother then left for Tennessee, the other went to Texas. On Feburary

16, 1838 recorded in deed book 43, page 197 of Rutherford Co., N.C. Nathaniel

and Barbara of Burke Co., sole 200 acres of land, being in Rutherford Co., N.C.,

on the east side of the second Broad River, to Thomas Forney for \$100.00.

In the 1840 census, Nathaniel and wife were living in Rutherford Co., N.C.,

where he worked in a mine.

To the union of Nathaniel and Barbara there were four children; (1).

Elemera "Mira" b. 1837, married Herman Hoyle, both buried in Greenville,

Tennessee. (2). John (b. 1838, d. 1868) married Martha Hawkings (b. 1838,
d. after 1890), both buried at Round Hill Cementary, Rutherford Co., N.C.

(3). Mary L. (b. 7-2-1844, d. 5-21-1928) married Samuel Edwards (b. 1-28-1850,
d. 3-29-1938). They leved on the Second Broad River, Rutherford Co., N.C.

(4). Peter b. 1848, and died at age 15.

John Parton, son of Nathaniel, inlisted in the confedrate army 1-22-1863. He was sent to the hospital for diabetes while serving in the Confederate Army.

To John and wife Martha, four children were born; (1). Alice b. 10-6-1861, married Col. Hayes, residence was in Moorsboro, N.C.

(2) John Hampton (b. 12-13-1862, d. 7-7-1946), Duried at Piney Knob, Rutherford Co. N.C. He was married three times; Let to Amanda Hayes (b. 1851, d. 1893) buried at Mt. Creek Church, Rutherford Co., N.C.; 2nd to Julie Frances Gossett (b. 4-18-1880, d. 6-5-1928) on April 25, 1900. She was buried at Piney Knob Baptist Church, Rutherford Co., N.C.; 3rd to Jeannie Head (b. 7-28-1908-d. 2-11-1982) on March IO, 1934, and buried also at Piney Knob. (3) Nancy (b. 11-19-1865) married James Sheehan, both were buried in Texas. (4) Elizabeth (b. 4-8-1866) married Thomas Hayes, residence was in Rutherford Co., N.C.

John Hampton Parton's home was in Rutherford Co., although he also worked in S. C. and Ga., he was in the sawmill business. He has left many descendants in Rutherford co., who are still in the lumber business. John was the father of 22 children.

Eleven of these children were of his first wife Amanda Hayes. Seven of these children died at birth or while very young, they are buried next to their mother. The remaining four grew to adults; (1) Millard (b. 10-19-1879 d. 3-26-1938) married Jane Tomblin (b. 3-17-1879-d. 5-2-1961). Their six children are; Verno (b. 8-25-1910) married first to Mary Jane Rainwater. (b. 6-10-1914-d. 3-28-1973), married second to Nellie Parton(b. 11-16-1914). she was wife of deceased Glen Parton. Therman (b. 3-25-1902-d. 11-22-1978) married Lillie Mae Walker; Leller(b. 4-20-1904) married bourgan Hayes; Eula (b. 10-1-1905-d. 2-1-1980) married Bracher Hall; Cleo (b. 1-3-1908) married Buddy Walker: Mae(b. 7-20-1912) married Melvin Elliot (b. 10-19-1904. (2). Edgar L. (b. 6-20-1881-d. 9-13-1953) married Victoria Jenkins (b. 6-6-1884d. 11-23-1971). Eleven children were born of the union; Eunice(b. 7-5-1901d. 3-13-1975) married G. B. Enloe (b. 6-15-1900); Myrtle(b. 6-13-1903-d.3-19-1963) married Vernon Hines (b. 4-16-1901-d. 5-19-1961); Mary (b. 8-25-1905) married Harlon Mace (b. 4-1-1902-d. 12-8-1976); Carvos (b. 10-29-1907-d. 3-2-1974) married Margarett Jones; Odell (b. 1-10-1910) married Sylvia Arrowood

(b. 1916); becar (b. 4-29-1912) married Alma Ward (b. 1915); Rev. Glenn (b. 5-23-1914-d. 3-8-1975) married Nell Holloway (b. 11-16-1914); Verle (b. 9-8-1916) married Clarance Arroyood (b. 5-27-1909-d. 12-5-1968); Edgar Jr. (b. 5-3-1919) married Lucille Nanney (b. 6-4-1923); Roland (b. 1-14-1923) married Ernestine Alexander; James (b. 6-6-1925) married Rachel Hendrix (b. 4-5-1926). (3) Mattie Parton (b. 1888-?) married Mark Dalton. Of the six children born to this marriage, three moved to California. Their children are; Eugene (d. at age 15); Clara married Boyd L. Rippy, residence in Shelby. N.C.; Mary Sue married James Green (buried at Missonary Cemetary, Forest City, N.C.); Allen, residence in San Clara, CA.; Lillian mareied Sherril Roning, residence in Riverside, CA.; Glen, buried at San Jose, CA. (4) Annie Pearl Parton (b. 9-28-1890-d. 4-?-1970) married James Aligha Crain. (b. 11-15-1881-d. 1957). From this union were eleven children: Vergie (b. 11-19-1904) married Grady Lowery; John Odis (b. 7-16-1906-d. 1982) married Mary Martin: Mattie Sue (b. 8-16-1908) married Lawarence Morgan: Keet Alvin (b. 8-8-1910) married Rhodie Byers; Jesse (b. 12-23-1913-d. 1956) married Agness Martin; Glaydes Mae (b. 10-13-1915) married Henry Kiser; Wm. Hicks (b. 4-2-1919-d. 12-?-1982) married Mary Kaye Dalton; Louise (b. 1-31-1920) married first to June Morgan, married second to P. B. Banks; James Henry (b. 3-3-1923) married Florence Dalton; Jene (b. 6-30-1930) married John Green; Dollie Rae (b. 4-13-1926) died young.







- 2. Need info on Jasper's younger brothers, William George who were listed with their parents William and Sarah on the 1850 Maury Co Tn Census. George was born in TN 1842 and William 1848. The boys were 8 and 2 yrs respectively so I doubt they went with their older brothers to MO. Their father, William, was not in Maury County by 1860.
- 3. William PARTON AND wife Sarah listed 1840 and 1850 in Maury Co, TN but gone by 1860. Besides the boys, John, Henry, Jasper, George and William, and 89 year old woman, Judy BARNES was listed in the household. Grandmother, mother-in-law, aunt?
- 4. Need Inform John and Sarah E. (Johnson) PARTEN. They were married 14 Dec 1853, in Greene Co MO. The 1860 Christian Co MO Census has them listed with Lucius b. 1855, Grant Allen b. 1857 and Sarah A. b. 1860. By 1870 they had moved to Taney Co, MO and by 1900 they were in Searcy Co ARK. Where and when did John die? Where and when did Sarah die? The 1880 Searcy Co ARK Has John listed with new wifs (?) Nancy and four daughters. Would like info on John and Sarah and Nancy if she was a second wife.

Hi Everyone!



- 1.ROBERT PARTIN, aged 36, arrived Virginia in the ship, Blessinge June 1609 According to the Charter of Orders from the Treasurer, Sir Thomas Smythe, those early VA inhabitants (who arrived before the governing of Sir Thomas Dale) were conferred as "Ancient Planters". They received at least 100 acres land, and other select rights. Robert Partin was an Ancient Planter. Undoubtably, in compliance with the Charter of Orders, Robert Partin received a Land Grant in 1619, from Sir George Yardley. This was before the date of recording of regular Virginia Land Patents. Robert Partin's original Patent, 1619, is referred to in item # 5, here.
