I am so sorry to be so late getting these sheets to you, but I did not feel that your Patton was in any way related to mine. I have most of the collateral lines if you want any of them. I have been searching for William Patton's father who was supposed to have been a minister in Ireland who emmigrated to the Colonies never to be heard of again. I have read 60 years of Synod records from Ulster and he was not mentioned in them. There were about 3 Samuels though. If anyone wants those references, I have taken down all the Pattons from ca 1730 - 1794. I did read somewhere that there was another Synod for Dissenters, and I suppose that he was in that one. Will try to find that one sometime. I also am trying to borrow thru Interlibrary loan the matriculation records of Glasgow University because most Ulster ministers went there.

Now for Cumberland Co. data. I asked a friend to look for Maturalization records. He hasn't yet, and I may have to go there agin to do it. I did spend one day at the Courthouse and Historical Society. The Society had tax records. In an application for the Pa. Scotch Irish Society it was claimed that Wm. Patton (records included) was implicated in the Men of Ireland revolt ca 1790. He presumably had to flee Ireland. Who knows? From the Braham family history comes the information that "Mary Ann Patton, my grandmother, wa born about 8 miles from Carlisle, Cumberland Co., Pa. Sept. 29, 1799." Patton family history says that William Jr. was the 3rd child and was 2 years old when the family came to America. I haven't been able to find a ships passenger list, so do not know if they went to Phila. or to S. Carolina where the man who bought property in partnership with him in Mercer Co. first settled. I have mixed feelings of this point of entry. These other people came in 1792 and Wm. Patton seems to be in Cumberland by 1795. Of course it is possible he came directly from S. Carolina to eastern Pa. You just wonder why. Wm. had moved to Mercer Co. by spring of 1800 as I have a deed recorded there.

This Alexander Patton possibly had a brother named Andrew Patton, inasmuch as Andrew Patton obtained a land grant of 150 acres on Back Creek, near Alexander Patton on the same date. I do not know of Andrew's descendants.

Alexander had only two sons, John and Samuel -- I believe I have data for all their descendants, except as noted below. Alexander also had at least one known daughter, Jane who married <u>William Rogers</u>, Orange Co., N.C.

Ludlow Patton, the representative of the Patton family in the Oranges, was one of the first of the New York business men to locate permanently in that part of Orange township known as . South Orange and Orange Valley. He visited the "water cure" establishment in 1851-2 and was so well pleased with the location and surroundings that he purchased twenty-six and one-half acres, being a part of what in the early times was known as the Zenas Freeman farm. It was located on the side of the mountain, partly in South Orange and partly in what was then Orange, now West Orange. He built a \$10,000 dwelling and a \$3,000 barn, a large sum in those days. He reclaimed, trimmed, adorned and put in superb condition these A beautiful fountain—the only one then in the oranges—sent up continuous. its jet of spray in the midst of a lawn dotted with the rarest and most graceful trees and shrubbery. It was at that time one of the finest residences in any part of the Oranges. He gave it the name of "Dawnwood." These improvements drew the attention of others to this locality and gave an impetus to the movement which had just begun in the sale of suburban property. The price paid by him at the time was only \$96 an acre. It is probably worth as much as that per running foot at the present time.

The name of Paton is written in old deeds Patton, and the family, originally from the south of England, is of considerable antiquity. An old parchment deed in the possession of an English family of the name states that "in the six-and-twentieth year of Henry VI, William Patten alias Waynflete (from a town in Lancashire where he was born) was son and heir of Richard Patten and eldest brother of John, Dean of Chichester." For his learning he was first consecrated Bishop of Winchester, then for his wisdom made Lord Chancellor of England, and was the sole founder of the Magdalen College, in Oxford.

Col. Robert Patton, the grandfather of Ludlow Patton, of Orange, was born in Westport, Ireland, in 1755, and died in New York City, January 3, 1814. He was brought to this country when he was seven years of age and resided in Philadelphia. In October, 1776, he enlisted as private in the Revolutionary Army, was taken prisoner by the British and confined for some time in New York City. After his liberation he rose to the rank of major and served under Washington and Lafayette; he was later promoted to a colonelcy. He was one of the original members of the Society of the Cincinnati. In 1789 he was appointed by President Washington, postmaster of Philadelphia, that office then being the most important in the country. He discharged the duties continuously for nearly twenty years when he resigned and : went to New York City. He was intimate with President Madison and the latter offered him the postmaster-generalship, but Patton refused the appointment on the ground that he was unwilling to remove his family from a free to a slave community. One of his chief characteristics was his strict integrity. When he was made postmaster he refused to appoint any of his sons to a clerkship and on his resignation he strictly enjoined them not to apply to be his successor, saying that the office had been long enough in his family and should now go to another. When war was declared in 1812 and a government loan, which every one prophesied would prove a failure, was placed on the market, he went at an early hour on the first day and subscribed \$60,000, asserting that if his country should be ruined his property would then be valueless. Col. Patton married Cornelia, daughter of Robert and Jemima (Shepard) Bridges. The latter was a son of Edward Bridges and Cornelia Culpepper, and through this line Mrs. Patton was connected with Lord Thomas Coalpepper, second colonial Governor of Virginia. Through the same line the descent is also traced from Oliver Cromwell. Col. Patton was a descendant of the noble family of Chandoss. By his marriage with Miss Bridges, Col. Patton had eight children, among whom was William Patton.

Rev. William Patton, D.D., son of Col. Robert and Correlia (Bridges) Patton, was born in Philadelphia, August 23, 1798. He was graduated at the Middlebury (Vt.) College, in 1818, and at Princeton (N.J.) Theological Seminary, two years later. He began his labors as city missionary in New York and organized the Broome Street Presbyterian, known as the Central Presbyterian Church, which he started with four members and which, under his pastorate, grew to be one of the largest and most influential churches in New York.

Rev. William Patton, D.D., died in New Haven, September 9, 1879. His wife, Mary Weston, born in Waltham, Mass., March 6, 1793, was the daughter of Zachariah Weston, born in Lincoln, Mass., March 8, 1751, a descendant of John Weston, of Salem, Mass., born 1631, died 1723. Dr. Patton was largely indebted for his success in his great life work to the prudent counsels and hearty sympathy of his admirable wife, whom he married soon after reaching his majority and to whom hes accomplished son, Rev. William Patton, D.D., President of Howard University, Washington City, owes no little of his eminence as a man and a minister. A brother of Dr. Patton was the late Robert B. Patton, Professor of Greek in the New York University. The children of Rev. William Patton and Mary (Weston) Patton were William Henry, William Weston, Cornelia Magoffin, Mary, Ludlow, Elenor Chandler, John Magoffin, Carharine Tace, John Angell James and Emily.

Ludlow Patton, fifth child and third son of Rev. William and Mary (Weston) Patton, was born in New York City, August 3, 1825. He was reared in that city and kept in training for the gospel ministry.On February 28, 1849, Mr. Patton married Miss Abby Hutchinson, daughter of Jesse and Mary Hutchinson, of Milford, New Hampshire. She was one of the celebrated Hutchinson Family of singers that achieved a world-wide reputation in their day. The last public performance of Mrs. Patton was on September 10, 1892, when she sang, along with her husband and her brother John. at the funeral of her life-long friend, John G. Whittier, the quaker poet. To the day of her death, which occurred November 2M. 1892, by apoplexy, her face beamed with purity and benevolence and her voice lost none of its sweetness. ... (apparently Ludlow Patton was still living at the time the booklet was written.)

pg. 59 Settlements Shortly after the conclusion of the Revolutionary War, in 1784, or 1785, settlers from the headwaters of the Catawba and the adjacent country, whose frontier establishment was the blockhouse at Old Fort, began to cross the mountains into the Swannanoa valley. Among the first of these was

Samuel Davidson, who came in with his wife and infant child and one female negro slave and settled upon Christian Creek of the Swannanca, a short distance east of Gudger's rord near the present railroad station called Azelea. He had been here but a short while when one morning he went out to find his horse. Soon his wife heard the report of guns, and, knowing too well what had happened, she took her child and the servant and made her way along the mountains to the Cld Fort. An expedition from there at once set out to evenge the death of Davidson. They found him on the mountain near his cabin, killed and scalped, and buried his body on the sport where it was found and where his grave may still be seen. ...

Chapter V Buncombe Tourty At this time the Swannanca River was recognized as the dividing line between Burke County on the north and Rutherford County on the south.

In 1785 Joseph McDowell, Jr., ran this dividing line, "Beginning at the west point of the line that formerly divided the above raid incunties, thence went to the Indian boundary as in the Act of Assembly of the caventeenth of May one thousand seven hundred and eighty-three." that is, to Pigeon River. It crossed Swannanoa River about half a mile above Biltmore. In 1788 this survey was adoped by the Legislatu From portions of Burke and Rutherford counties was subsequently formed the County of Burkenbe, mared for Col. Toward Burcombe, a North Carolina soldier of the Bavolution.

In 1729 this termitary would have been embraced in the County of Clarendon. It this time the County of New Herover, with indefinite western boundaries which seem to have extended to the Parific Coean, then called the South Jear, was formed, and the rame of Clarendon as a county disappears. From New Hanover County in 1738 was not off and exected the County of Bladen, whose western limits were left undefined. Again — from the County of Bladen was formed in 1759 the County of Arson, still with undefined western limits. Here Buncombe's genealogy divides into two branches to be united again in her own creasion.

That portion of her territory which was taken from Burke may be traced from this point as follows: In 1758 Rowen County was formed from a part of Arson County. and up to the beginning of the Revolutionary War continued in its entirety. In 1777 was formed from its western portion a new county called Burke.

That portion of Buncombe County which was taken from Rutherford may be traced as follows: In 1762 was formed from the western part of the County of Inson a new county called in honor of the new queen of England. Princess Charlotte of Mecklenburg, by the name of Mecklenburg County. In 1768 the western part of Mecklenburg County was erected into a new county, and named in honor of North Carolina's notorious colonial governor, Tryon County, but during the struggle for independence the North Carolinians were but little disposed to honor the name of their former oppressor, and when in 1779 this county had become inconveniently large, it was formed into two new counties, and the name of Tryon dropped, and the eastern part called Lincoln, while the western portion received the name of Rutherford County, in honor of Gen. Griffith Futherford.

In 1792, while David Vance from the upper Reers Creek settlement was a nember of the Legislature from Burke County, and Col. William Davidson, who lived on the south side of the Evennanos, about two miles from Asheville, represented Rutherford County in the same body, the County of Buncombe was formed of the western

portions of Burke and Rutherford counties, with its western borders fixed by the line of the territory which two or three years before North Carolina had ceded to the United States, and which was afterward created into the State of Tennessee.

In April, 1792, there was organized at the residence of Col. William Davidson, which stood on the south bank of the Swarpanoa, about one-half mile above its mouth, at a place subsequently called the Gum Spring, the County of Buncombe, in accordance with the provisions of the act creating that county. At this place was transacted for one year the business of the County of Buncombe, until in April, 1793, the county seat was fixed where it has ever since remained.

.. Among the friends who accompanied Carson on this occasion was the celebrated Colonel David Crockett, who married a Miss Patton on Swannanoa, and was killed at the Alamo, fighting for Texas and her independence.

Samuel Lusk was for some while coroner of Buncombe County. In April, 1799, be resigned that office and was elected sheriff. To this last place he was annually re-elected until April, 1803.

Colonel John Patton was born April 4, 1765, and was one of Buncombe's first settlers. He removed to that county while it was get Burke and Butherford and settled first where Ferminurst now stands. From here he removed to the Chitson place, on Swannanoa above the fold water works. After residing here for some while he returned to the vicinity of his former home, and bought and fixed his residence upon the Colonel William Davidson place, where the first County Court was held. At this place he continued to reside until his death on March 17, 1831. He it, was who formally opened on April 16, 1792, the first County Court. On the minutes of that court. immediately after the fustices were sworm and took their seats, appears this entur:

"Silence being commanded and proclamation being made the court was opened in due and solemn form of law by John Patton specialy appointed for that purpose."

At that term, on the came day, he was duly elected to the then very important office of county surveyor. Hear his new residence — he built, many years ago, a bridge soross the Swanzanca River. which remained until about the beginning of Tiw ear against the Justhern States. His house was for many pears famous as a Thomping place, being upon the Bureent's Turnette most, and he reiged here a lance family of children. many of whose descendants are yet living in Asheville. One of his sort, the late Controville Patton, regresented Buncombe County in the House of Tormona in 1836, 1838 and 1810, and subsequently in 1875, and after being for many pears a ditimen and prominent penabant of laborille, and in later life the clerk of the Inferior Pount of Buncombe County, died in 1996, highly respected by arrang one who knew him as a kind hearted but determined man of unswerring integrity and unpretentious usefulness. The late residence of Colonel John Patton stood on the southern side of the 'wantenos, at the ford about half a mile above its mouth. until within the last thirty years, when, after bearing for some time the name of the Haunted House, it was removed as being no longer tenantable. His wife, who was, hefore her marriage. Miss Ann Mallom, a Winginian, was hown February 12, 1768. and died on Avaust 21, 1855. She, with her husband, are buried at Hewton Coadeni-٠ وسعاءة عددست

Patton and Trwin was a firm of marchants composed of James Patton and his brotherin-law Andrew Trwin. Jenes Patton was born in Incland on Jehnwary 13, 1756, and emigrated to america in 1783. He was a weaver by trade, but soon became a prosperous remodent. After his arrival in America he labored for several years at mining,

well-digging, working on the canals, grabbing, etc. After this he set out from Philadelphia where he had landed, and with a small mapk of spode went couth as a neddler. He made his way into North Carolina and for several years traded in Wilkes. Burks and Buncombe counties, getting his supplies from the north. In 1791 he met Ardrew Brain, who afterwards parried his sister, and went into business with him. This partnership continued for twenty years, and was settled up in one day. James Patton taking the North Carolina lands belonging to the firm and Andrew Erwin taking those in Tennessee.

In 1807 these gentlemen moved to Swannanoa, and settled on the farm where Wr. There they lived until 1811, when they reroved Frank Reed now lives. to Isheville. Mr. Patton opened a store and hotel and engaged at the came time in tenning leather and farming. His hotel was the Lagle Hotel on Youth Wain Street, about midway between Symamore and Tagle streets. In 1831 he bought out and improved the Warm Springs. After a long and prosperous life he died at . Asheville on September 9, 1846. His tarrard stood on the west side of where Valley Street mow wins at a big poplar near where that street enters South Main Street. An autobiography of him is get in existence. The partnership between him and indrew Erwin was dissolved on March 11, 1914.

Andrew Irwin is the man to whom Bishop Asbury refers as "a chief man." He was born in Virginia about 1773, and died at his residence near the War Trace in Bedford County, Tennessee, in 1833. When seventien years of age he entered the amployment of James Patton, with whom he soon afterwards went into partnership as innkeener and merchant at Wilkesborough. North Carolina. In 1800 and 1801 he was a member of the House of Commons of North Carolina/from Wilkes County. He was DE. 145 Asheville's first postmaster. In 181h he removed to Augusta, Georgia, and afterward carried on an extersive mercantile establishment as the leading partner in various firms in Savarrah, Charleston, Mashville, New Orleans and elsewhere, but his business was unsuccessful and ended in disaster.

James W. Patton, the oldest son of James Patton above mentioned, was horn February 13, 1803. He became a merchant and hotel keeper in Asheville and conducted there a large tanyard and several other business undertakings. For many years he was chairman of the County Court of Buncombe and one of that county's most prominent men. He died in December, 1861.

A arranddaughter of this same James Patton mentioned above. Miss Morrison, became the wife of Albert T. Summey, whose long life in Buncombe County as one of its most worthy and best-known inhabitants reached down to a time comparatively recent. He was born in that part of Lincoln County which is now Catawoa County, Sertember 1, 1823.

In 1808 the County of Haywood was created out of Buncombe's territory, and included all of Western Horth Carolina beyond Buncombe County. ...

For some time there had been a small combined church and school house there. when on July 11, 1803, William Foster, Jr., conveyed the land on which it stood "including an old school house with a new one, and a frame Dwelling house, a spring, &c." containing eight acres, to "Andrew Erwin. Daniel Smith, John Patton, Edmond Sams, James Blakely, William Foster, Senr.. Thomas Foster, Jur., William Thitson. William Gudser, Samuel Murray, Joseph Henry, David Vance, William Brittain, George Davidson, John Davidson of Hominy, and the Reverend George Hewton," as a gift "for the Further Maintenance and support of the gospel In the neighborhood of Robert Patton's meeting house, and one from the neighborhood of the mouth of Hominy ...

"Robert Patton's meeting house" was the predecessor of Piney Grove near the present town of Swannanoa, and was on the side of the mountain about three-fourths of a mile east of Piney Grove to which it gave way.
