WILLIAM ELSON PEACH BIBLE RECORD

There are two Peach bibles, both in the care of Lydie Peach Heim Price. The first bible is intact. Family records begin in the 1700's and are kept current by Mrs. Price. The bible was kept at *Forest Place*, the home of Dr. John Peach, until the farm was sold. This property is now the Pin Oak Village on Mitchellville Road.

The second Peach bible is no longer in existence. Mrs. Price found the loose family record pages on a bookshelf when the Hamilton/Hyatt farm, *Brough*, was sold and Hyatt Price Hamilton was moving.

Nannie Peach Hyatt left her home, *Ash Grove*, and moved to *Brough* with her husband, Christopher Clark Hyatt of the founding family of Hyattsville. *Ash Grove* was the home of Samuel Peach and Caroline Hamilton Peach. There is a family cemetery on the property that Caroline started when her baby, Leonidas, died in 1824. The property is now part of the Glen Allen development. The cemetery is on Forest Arden Drive off of Mt. Oak Road and close to Route 301.

The colored people are included in many of our family bibles and there are stories about the Charity mentioned in this record. She was a loved member of the house and helped raise the children.

Both Lydie Price and her cousin [and PGCs member] Nancy Walker Bouvier are happy to share the above information and the family records for the benefit of all genealogists and historians.

One firm, Heritage Quest, was permitted to use the Archives' master films to make its product. The cost is around \$20 for a CD containing one roll of microfilm. Not all census years are yet available, but most will be soon. The company also is coming out with new indexes to the censuses on CD ROM.

The Learning Company is scanning census images and making them available online for a monthly fee of around \$10. Their project is beginning with the 1850 census in high-population states, then in the Midwest and on the East Coast. Their service, through its Genealogy Library.com web site includes other databases as well.

Also out is a new version of the PerSI (Periodical Source Index) CD. PerSI is an index to all of the genealogical and local history articles in English and French (Canadian) from some 5,000 publications, and includes more than 1.3 million citations by surname and locality. The complete collection of these publications is at the Allen County Public Library in Fort Wayne, Indiana, which issues both the CD and the 30 printed volumes it contains. The CD lists where else the publication cited might be found.

The 1881 English Census, with index, has been issued by the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-Day Saints' Family History Department. It is 25 disks for \$33. Included are 1.2 million pages covering England, Scotland and Wales and the Royal Navy; nothing on Ireland as that census no longer exists. It requires Windows 95 or better and 25 MB of hard-disk space. The entire census, or a regional part, can be ordered online from 1-800-537-5971.

◆ **EXTRACTS from The Pennsylvania Packet, and Daily Advertiser. THE AMERICAN EXPERIENCE OF 1787: A newspapers perspective.**

November 22, 1787.

Sweet and Sour Oranges, to be sold by the barrel or hundred, at Mrs. Hull's in Front street.

December 10, 1787. (Historical Note: Delaware was the first state to ratify the Constitution.) Philadelphia, Dec. 10.

The deputies to the State Convention of Delaware met at Dover on Monday the 3rd instant, December, and a house being formed, they elected James Larimer, Esq; President--on Thursday they ratified the New Federal Constitution by an unanimous vote, and on Friday every member signed the ratification.
