Dear Miss Vestal:

I've just come across your query concerning the Reeves-Rives-Crooke families in The Virginia Genealogist, Vol 8, No. 2, April-June, 1964

During the past several years I've done a great deal of work on the Reeves-Rieves-Rives family, including two inter-marriages with people named Crook or Crooke. I'm a descendant of Burgess Reeves (Burgis Rives), born in 1746 in what became Granville Co., N. C., and died in the Pendleton District, South Carolina, from which district he served in the South Carolina militia during the Revolution. I've followed substantially all of his descendants and hope to publish a genealogy of the Reeves-Rives family in the next few years.

Burgess was the son of Wm. Rives III, born around 1690-1700 in Virginia, died 1751 in Granville Co., N. C. ✓ He was the son of Wm. Ryves II, born around 1672, probably in Virginia and died in Virginia (no proof), son of Wm. Rives or Ryves I.

William Ryves or Rives I was born circa 1636, presumably in Oxfordshire, England, baptised at St. Mary and Magdalen, Oxford; died after 1695 in America, probably in Southern part of Virginia. In 1684-5 he was listed among the tax payers in Southworke Parish, Surry Co., Virginia. He had sons George, Robert, John, Timothy, and William.

The Parish Register of Albemarle Parish, Virginia, 1717-1778, lists children of George, John, Christopher, and Richard Rives baptised there between 1742 and 1778, and innumerable Rives, both men and women, acted as sponsors of other children there.

I don't know whether or not the William Ryves called the "emigrant" is the Wm. Reeves listed by Nugent in "Cavaliers and Pioneers," as coming to America in 1652.

There was a Wm. Rives in Chowan Precinct, N. C., in 1718 when he sold 15 acs. on the Moraltuck River.

I have a reference to the will of George Rives (born c. 1660 - died after 1719) who was in Prince George Co., Va., and his nephew George Rives (son of Timothy) born c. 1698, died 6/1/1746, Surry Co., Va.

I have no proof (except tradition) that Wm. Ryves, the emigrant, was the son of Timothy Ryves (born c. 1588 in England; died 9/1/1643 in Oxford, England), a "Gentleman and steward" of the University of Oxford. In 1644 he was a substantial tax payer in Oxford. His first wife Mary died 11/8/1629, his second wife Elizabeth died 1/6/1643, both in Oxford.

Timothy was the son of Richard Ryves (born c. 1547), who was the son of John Ryves and Amye Harvey. John lived at Damory Court, Blandford Forum, County Dorset (21 miles S. W. of Salisbury, England), which I visited in 1966. The old 3 or 4 story house known as Damory Court had been turned into a hotel. The alms house George Ryves gave the town of Blandford Forum is still operating and has the Ryves crest on its south wall with an inscription "George Ryves, Armiger," then some Latin, and the date 1682. The Ryves chapel, windows, and effigies in the church of St. Peter and Paul, Blandford Forum, were destroyed in the "Great Fire of 1731" which destroyed most of the town.

John Ryves was the son of Robert Ryves and his wife Joan, who received several grants from Henry VIII, including Damory Court. Robert was born circa 1490 possibly in France, came to Dorsetshire with Roger de Amory, a French knight, and died at Blandford Forum 2/11/1551. Robert is the earliest one I know of.

If this appears to be your Rives line, I'd like very much to know what additional information you may have, especially as to William Ryves, emigrant. I have more details as to collateral lines in each generation. I'll be glad to hear from you.

Dear Miss Vestal,

Thank you for your response to my query. First, I'm sorry but there was a typographical error and "Vav" should have been Van Reeves.

I have James Reeves will written in 1822 in Stark County Ohio. In it he names the following children: Johanna, Nelly, Aaron (he possibly moved to New Jersey), Martha, Abigail, Eunice, James, Manassa, and Van VanMeter Reeves. He names his wife as Sarah. Both he and his wife died in 1827 in Stark County Ohio. To date I have not found a county history that gives me any information. James Downing was an executor of the estate.

The Van Reeves you found in Brown County Ohio in 1850 is James' son. Van, first married Rachale Allenton 11 Sept. 1817 in Stark County. She died 5 Sept. 1835 in Guernsey County Ohio. Their children were: John m. Lydia Sims, Manassa m. Mary McFarland 2nd. Matilda Hall Hawkes, Rachael, Hester, Nathaniel, Fermelia m. Davidson, Maria m. Sieler, Myra m. Stull and Van Van Meter (died in Civil War).

He second married Matilda Stull (no date, but must have been immediately since first child was born July 1836. Children by second wife: Hannah, William, Lydia m. John Feustal, Margaret Reeves, Andrew J. Reeves m. Ella Dimick. By 1847 this family was in Hamilton County Ohio. The family moved to Muscatine County Iowa where I find them in 1860. He died in 1872 in Rock Island County, Illinois which is just across the Mississippi River from Muscatine County. They seem to have moved back and forth between the two counties. His second wife died in 1881. I do not find them in a county history either.

Manassah Reeves married Mary McFarland in Ross County Ohio in 1842. She died in Muscatine county Iowa in 1861. In 1862 he married Matilda Hall Hawkes. He was in the Civil War and I have his records. Matilda lived until 1923. I have found them in a history of Rock Island County.

From Manassah on I have a pretty good record of the family and quite a lot on Van Van Meter. Sometime I see the name as Van Meter without the first Van.

WILLIAM FRANKLIN REEVES

(HISTORY RUSH COUNTY - REFERENCE BOOK I-977-201 - R-952h, PAGE 390 - 1888)

A substantial farmer and prominent citizen of Center Township. Born in Brown County, Ohio, September 4, 1827. Parents Jabez and Nancy Reeves, who were also natives of State of Ohio. William moved to Rush County with his parents when two months old and located on farm in Center Township, the father having entered the land from the Government. Continued there until 1861. In that year moved to Knightstown where they still continue to reside. The father is now 82 years old and the mother 83. They were married February 26, 1824. Lived as husband and wife more than 63 years. William F. Reeves was reared upon the old home place assisting in clearing and cultivating in the summer and attending district school in winter. At the age of 19 he took up teaching which furnished his winter employment for five years. Since then he gave undivided attention to farming. He was married May 16, 1850 to Hanna M. Gilson who was born within present limits of Jackson Township, November 13, 1831, being the daughter of Andrew and Mary Gilson, both natives of Virginia. They were married in native state and came to Rush County about 1820. Here they spent the rest of their lives, the father dying in 1832 and the mother in 1841.

GEORGE REEVES was mentioned in early records of the 1700's as the one living on Conway land, in Northumberland County, which is at the mouth of the Potomac River, where it flows into the Chesapeake Bay. Most of the early records mention 25 or 30 people as the owners of single tracts of farmland, these being the English immigrants who were, in this way, being temporarily provided for. A Robert Reeves, and his wife, Frances, did not mention children in their Will; and a William Reeves left a Will in 1698 there, but it is non-existent now. Also, it has been determined that George could not have been a member of either of the early THOMAS REEVES es about whom books have been printed. At any rate, he was English, and a favored son, because he had the pull and the wherewithall to be given three land patents (with the full title of the King of England) for grants of 370 acres in 1724, 941 acres in 1726, and 55 acres in 1743, all in "Northern Neck", Va. This part became Prince William County, Va.

From these grants, he gave his brother, John Reeves, 330 acres, and lesser acreage to two possible married sisters. There was also a brother, Thomas Reeves.

In 1751, George Reeves made a deed of much of his land to four of his sons, John, Benjamin, Moses, and Asa, making provisions for his daughter, Elizabeth Haggard, and for himself and his wife, Ann, as long as they might live. The part deeded to our ancestor, Asa Reeves, included the homestead, 158 3/4 acres, and the care of his parents. Asa was only 12 years old at that time, and cared for his father there until his death in 1772/3; and did not sell until he sold the same 158 3/4 acres in 1789.

The HOMESTEAD, probably built as such before 1751, (although the first one was likely a log cabin), was a two story house, with a basement, and a hand-made brick foundation. The location is two gates back from the road which was the original northern boundary of the first grant of 370 acres. Where the house stood, on a knoll, there is now a huge walnut tree, with a few of the remaining foundation bricks and stones lying around it. The present owner, Woody Merchant, a car dealer in Manassas, is trying to get rid of these foundation bricks. When I asked him where they got their water, he told me that there is a spring just a little ways down hill from where the back of the house was.

With the help of Mr. Clark, the Tax Assessor in Prince Williams County, and with copies of the land grants from Richmond, Va., we know that the "3/4 acre" part of the 158 3/4 acre plot was the family cemetery. It is now Hixon Cemetery, where all the old graves are marked only with upright rocks. On one, after long study of the scratching in it, there seems to be enough designation for it to be identified as the one marking the grave of George Reeves, together with "born in 1695". The second rock to its left has the first part of the name, Elizabeth, the daughter mentioned in the 1751 deed.

With land to clear, homes to be built, roads to be made, food grown, and clothes to be spun and made, there was much to be done; but the main crop was tobacco. Even churches built had their cost recorded in terms of tobacco! _ _ _ _

Son, Benjamin sold his land in 1770. His Will was recorded in Cincinnati and Georgia. Many Benjamin and Austin Reeveses are his descendants. // Those who remained in Va. after 1789 were descendants of the nephew of the GEORGE, above.

In 1751, when GEORGE REEVES deeded much of his land to four sons, ASA was only 12, and received the homestead and 158 acres, including the care of his parents during their natural lifetime. Where the 2 story and basement house stood, there is now a huge walnut tree, with only a few of the foundation stones apparent. In 1789, ASA sold and the family moved, by way of the Cumberland Mountains at the extreme western part of Virginia, into Kentucky, and probably followed Licking River from its source to the fertile land that became theirs. (The enclosed map shows it as ISAAC REEVES' farm, as was willed by ASA.) It is at the southern edge of Fleming County, and about 35 miles from the Ohio River at Maysville.

ASA REEVES was a PATRIOT in the American Revolution, having given horses, riders, and wagons, for 4 days. (Prince Wm. Co. records.)

ELI REEVES grew up on the land that had been granted to his grandfather, GEORGE REEVES. Several old Indiana histories say that Eli served in the American Revolution post-war service, but no official records can be found to substantiate this. He settled in Fleming Co., Ky. at the age of 20, when his father, Asa Reeves did, around 1789, and married Sarah Redman.

In 1803, ELI enumerated the males over 21 in Clermont and Adams Counties, O. (the Little Miami territory), to help the Federal government decide whether to open Ohio for further settlement. Recommendations were accepted, along with those from other parts of Ohio, and it became a State that same year. His signature is on many Adams Co. records. His farm (found again by Virginia Reeves Keech in 1976) was in Byrd Township which was made part of the newly formed Brown Co. in 1819.

There was a great ceremony once a year when a famous Indian came to call on Eli Reeves, who must have been a mediator, since some Indians still claimed ownership of Ohio land. Possibly they "smoked the peace pipe"!

Jabez Reeves and Nancy Coe married when both were only 19. She had been an orphan from the age of nine when her father, Milburn Coe died, and the grandparents, John and Massey Tongue, left a small farm of 26 acres to the heirs of Milburn Coe - Daniel, Elizabeth, John, Polly, Samuel, Milburn, William, and Nancy Coe. So, Nancy was brought up by her brothers and sisters. She and Jabez probably went to the same school, as well as to an independent Christian church which had broken away from the traditional church at Red Oak.

In December 1826 Jabez Reeves entered 80 acres in Rush County, Indiana. He returned in the spring, built a log cabin, and moved there in October 1827 when their son, William was 1 month old. Here they raised a large family. By 1860, Jabez and Nancy Reeves had one of the most valuable farms in the county (listed in the Census as being in the Knightstown P.O. area of Rush County), sons William and Alfred Benton were married, and only Milton M. and J.N. Dallas were still living at home.

By 1888 Jabez and Nancy Reeves had retired and were living healthy, contented lives on the Henry County side of Knightstown. She died February 2, 1891, after which he lived with their daughter, Mary L. McCarty, in Knightstown until his death, August 17, 1895, at the age of 89½ years.

REEVES AND COMPANY

Alfred Benton Reeves, who had been manufacturing farm implements in Knightstown, moved his factory from Knightstown to Columbus in 1875. His partner was his nephew, Marshall T. Reeves, age 24, son of Benton's brother, William F. Reeves. It was not called REEVES & CO. until two other brothers of A. Benton joined them. These were J.N. Dallas Reeves, who had been in business for himself both in Knightstown and Indianapolis, who joined the company in 1879; and Milton Monroe Reeves (my grandfather), who came back to Indiana from Kansas where he had been farming, in 1880. It was called REEVES & CO. after Milton M. Reeves bought interest in it.

There were difficult times, financially, during the 1880's. Milton Monroe Reeves died in 1890, but Grandmother (Nancy Jane Reeves and our parents) kept their interest in the company. Alfred Benton Reeves sold his shares the same year, and, for some reason, Dallas was no longer in the company, although he had a lot of mechanical ingenuity, as did Benton. In the 1890's, Marshall T. Reeves was President, and Mr. Doeller was Treasurer, although they were on speaking terms only when it came to business, and church business.

My father, Charles A. Reeves, son of Milton M. Reeves, had started to work for the company right out of high school, before M.M. died. After father's furniture factory was washed out, in the flood of 1903, he returned to Reeves & Co. as Traffic Manager. He also went to farms to inspect threshing machines at times.

REEVES & CO. sold out to EMERSON BRANTINGHAM, and steam engines were replaced by more modern engines. Eventually, EMERSON BRANTINGHAM failed and had to close the Columbus plant. Father, (Charles A. Reeves), was the last person employed, and stayed until the last piece of machinery in the foundry was sold, in the summer of 1927.

REEVES engines are beautifully styled, and are now seen chiefly at antique farm implement shows in Canada and throughout the midwestern states.

REEVES PULLEY CO. had its beginnings in rooms at REEVES & CO. Some Reeveses had business interests with both firms.

Milton Monroe Reeves, son of Jabez Reeves, and brother to William F., Alfred Benton, and James N. Dallas Reeves, had a farm near Kokomo, Indiana for a few years after his marriage. Here, the first two children, Ora Stella and Charles A. Reeves were born. The family moved to Kansas to farm on a larger scale, but found that there was not adequate machinery, so; in 1880 they moved to Columbus where he joined his nephew, Marshall T. Reeves (son of William F. Reeves), and his brothers at Reeves & Co. Since M.M. Reeves died August 20, 1890, a few days before his 48th birthday, not much is known about him; but his widow, Nancy Jane Reeves outlived him for 33 years, and was well known in Columbus.

Nancy Jane Reeves, lovingly called "Jenny", was born July 13, 1849, in Rush County, to John B. and Abalena (Mock) Kirkpatrick, and was a first cousin to Amanda Kirkpatrick who married M.O. Reeves. She, like most Reeves families, was a member of Tabernacle Christian Church. She entertained the ministers at family dinners, using a large oval table that seated twelve. Her grandchildren felt at home in her large house catcorner from the German Lutheran Church on Fifth Street, where she spent much time crocheting beautiful pieces. She was a rather large woman, and dressed frequently in black. On October 11, 1923, after making her usual visit to her son's home on Seventh Street in the morning, the Lord took her home in the evening. She was the only grandparent we (George, Virginia, and Charlotte Reeves) had known, since the others all died before we were born.

Charles A. (Charlie) Reeves started to work at Reeves & Co.
soon after he graduated from Columbus High School. He and
Monta, who married young, had no child for 11 years, and en-
gaged in church and social activities in the community. Mr.
Reeves started a furniture factory between Hawcreek and Belmont
Street, where the present Statler Packing House is, but it was
doomed by the flood of 1903, and he returned to Reeves & Co.,
(later called Emerson Brantingham), as Traffic Manager. Soon
after Lucile was born, Monta Reeves died, and Lucile lived
with her grandparents until Mr. Reeves married Maud Cooper.

Before her marriage, Maud Cooper had taught school in Taylors-
ville, had lived in Washington while her father was a Congress-
man, had studied art at Herron School of Art in Indianapolis,
and had become an artist of landscapes and portraits. When she
married, she immediately took care of Lucile as her own daugh-
ter. The other three children were born, and the family, liv-
ing in a big house at 718 Seventh Street, had a "hired girl"
while the children were small. When the new shirt factory, on
north Washington Street, offered girls better positions, Mr.
and Mrs. Reeves became one of the first couples in town to buy
an automatic washing machine which they had seen on display
in Indianapolis. Mrs. Reeves always kept apace of modern times.

Charles A. Reeves was interested in the community, was a 32nd
degree Mason, and an elder at Tabernacle Christian Church, which
was the church where most of the Reeveses attended.

When Emerson Brantingham Co. closed its Columbus plant, Charlie Reeves stayed until the last piece of machinery was sold.

In 1927, Mr. and Mrs. Reeves bought a furniture store in the business area of Bloomington, combining his business abilities and former interest in furniture with her artistic talents for design and display. They made many new friends, and weathered the depression years when selling on credit became necessary. Mr. Reeves had an innate trust in others. When he was 85 and Mrs. Reeves was 82, they sold the furniture business and moved to Indianapolis to be near their daughter, Charlotte, violinist in the Indianapolis Symphony Orchestra.

Charles A. Reeves lived to be almost 87, and Maud (Cooper) Reeves lacked six weeks of being 90. They remained active in Christian Churches where they lived, but were both buried at Columbus which had been home to them most of their lives.

Mother, who had been a member of the Nature Study Club and the Magazine Club in Columbus while we were children, took up sketching and painting again when we were grown, and belonged to a small Bloomington and Nashville artists' club. Except for a few which she sold, we have kept her landscapes in oil. She was always interested in our welfare, and in her church, and took care of her own business matters until her death.

The last Easter Father was with us, he gave me (Virginia) such a big hug that I could feel every rib in his tall, thin body; and when the Lord called him home, he seemed to be just on the other side of a veil that separated us.

MARJORIE LUCILE REEVES (Charles A.- Milton M.- Jabez- Eli- Asa- George)

Lucile Reeves took the responsibilities of being an older sister to her brother and two sisters. She enjoyed visiting her Grandfather and Grandmother Abbett, and attended the Ladies' Aid Society with her grandmother to help quilt for the missionaries. She played piano well enough to play for prayer meetings, and helped her sister, Virginia, learn to play duets.

Lucile graduated from Columbus High School in 1920, went two years to Franklin College and two years to Indiana University. Her only year of teaching, in a town in Illinois on the Mississippi River, she met and married Fred M. Sultan, who was from Mississippi. They made Columbus their home. Here, their son, William Howard Sultan was born November 28, 1925.

In their later years, Mr. and Mrs. William A. Abbett, Lucile's grandparents lived with Fred and Lucile (Reeves) Sultan. Both Mr. and Mrs. Abbett lived into their 90's. Mr. Abbett was the person chosen to lay the corner stone when First Christian Church was built. She lived to be 91, and he, 99.

It was not strange that, in Lucile Sultan's employment with the Social Welfare Department of Bartholomew County, her assignment was work and visitation with the elderly. She retired young because of painful arthritis, but was a faithful and regular attendant of church and of her Sunday School class of which she had been a member since she was a young lady. She enjoyed many trips with the Senior Citizens, and is well remembered by friends, relative, and by the older people of the county whom she helped.

Lucile's husband, Fred M. Sultan was born in Mississippi April 21, 1900, and served in World War I. At times when his injuries kept him from working, he enjoyed tending his garden, and watching sports news. He also enjoyed reading the Psalms. He died April 3, 1970, which was almost a year before Lucile Sultan's death.

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WILLIAM A. ABBETT, Lucile Reeves' maternal grandfather, came from Trimble Co., Ky., and married Emma LeFever in 1866. The whole ABBETT lineage is enclosed in this, as there has been only one child per generation, all in Columbus. Monta Abbett Reeves' only child that lived was Lucile Reeves Sultan. Her only child was William Howard Sultan, and his only child was Fred Howard Sultan.

George C. Reeves took 4 years of H.S. Latin, and much Italian and Spanish, along with an English major, first as a Rector scholar at DePauw, and then from 1927 when the family moved to Bloomington, at Indiana University. He studied philosophy in Florence and Naples with the help of an international exchange fellowship, receiving a Ph.D. in Naples in 1932, and another at Indiana University in 1935 during his three years teaching of philosophy at Butler. In Los Angeles from 1936, he passed his civil service test in four languages (having ability also in German and French), and started a career with the U.S. government. From 1943 to 1972, he was an economist with the U.S. Tariff Commission. He is now retired and lives in College Park, Md., after various assignments in Mexico, Italy, and England.

He has had several article, column, and editorial publications of his writings, the last being a book, Tariff Preferences for Developing Countries, 1971, for the Tariff Commission. He was the leader of Great Books discussions in Greenbelt, Md. for many years, and has been active in the Greenbelt Community Church.

Virginia Reeves, as a girl, studied piano with Miss Louise Mason until she married, with Miss Kitchen until her death, and with Miss Eleanor Beauchamp who came from Indianapolis and taught many Columbus students on Saturdays at the Reeves home at 717 7th Street. Virginia graduated from high school in Columbus, and from Indiana University with degrees of Bachelor of Music, in Piano, and Master of Arts, in Music.

In 1932, as a Student Volunteer for Foreign Missions, she went to the Tokyo-Yokohama area where she studied Japanese language and culture, and taught piano at Ferris, the oldest organized secondary school and junior college for girls in Japan. She returned in 1937 and taught piano part-time, on a graduate fellowship that year, while taking some brush-up courses at Ohio State University. During 7 months in Los Angeles, visiting her brother, George, she met her future husband. She returned to Bloomington, Ind. to complete the courses in Public School Music, and then taught in northern Indiana and in southern Georgia before her marriage.

She traveled with her husband, who was in surgical supply work, throughout the States east of the Mississippi River, for several months; and then, did the office work and shipping of wheel chairs and walkers from home in Madison, N.J. while her husband traveled alone. During 1944 they worked together as director and organist at Dauphin Way Baptist Church, a church of 5000 members in Mobile, Ala., and then moved to Birmingham where he did not find employment.

Virginia, with the care of Richard, age 2½, and Kent age ½ year, returned to Mobile where she became organist at a small Episcopal church and taught piano part time until Richard was old enough to attend school. She taught public school music, grades 1-12, in Mobile County from 1948-'54, in Kent County, Md. from '54-'56, and in Montgomery County, Md., where she chose elementary grades only, from '56-'71, when she retired to do other things. (She was also a church organist most of this time.)

She is at present a pianist and timpanist, active at church and in the Friday Morning Music Club of Washington, and has many young Japanese friends among the wives of Japanese doctors who come to the National Institute of Health for periods of two to four years. The work in helping them with English conversation and Bible study is assisted by others who are able, and is an extension of the work begun in Japan years ago.

She is one of a fine group of Indianapolis ladies who frequently meet to eat out, or to celebrate special events and days. Everyone who knows Miss Charlotte Reeves likes her. 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## IS THERE A REEVE IN YOUR FAMILY?

By Jeanne Fraser MacDonald, Belton, S. C.

Sometime between the years 1750 and 1765, the four sons of Thomas Reeve and his second wife, Mary Wells, migrated with others from Southold and Southampton, N. Y., to what was then Ulster and Orange Counties, N. Y. They settled near Goshen, Middletown, Mount Hope, and what was then called Mamacating.

James Reeve, the son of James, settled near Newburg and Middletown. The children intermarried with the children of other pioneer families, and it follows that if your family was from Suffolk County, Long Island, or from Orange County you have some relatives named Reeve.

1. THOMAS REEVE, the father of the said pioneers, has been a rather mysterious figure in compiled Reeve genealogies. Since he was the grandfather of Judge Tapping Reeve, the founder of the most famous American law school of its day, attempts have been made to glorify him by giving him the military rank of Lieutenant, or by making him the descendant of William Purrier through the latter's daughter, Mary Purrier Reeve, all which he was not. He was born October 3, 1679, the son of Thomas Reeve (1646-1685) and his wife, Rebecca Davis at Southampton, Long Island. (1) When his stepfather Benjamin Davis died he remembered his stepson John, (probably because he was the "eldest son") but our Thomas was not mentioned. Until he was of age he seems to have been of Southampton for he is in the census there of 1698 with his brother John. (2) However, by 1737, when he married Bethia Horton, he was a farmer and blacksmith at Southold, Long Island.



BETHIA HORTON has been difficult to identify because of mistakes made in existing genealogies. In many ways her background was similar to her husband's. Her father, Barnabas, died when she was a child and her family scattered. Her mother was Sarah Wines, dau. of Barnabas Wines. When her grandfather Caleb\*2 (Barnabas\*1) Horton made his will in 1699, he remembered her two brothers, sons of his son Barnabas, deceased, but she was not mentioned.

Bethia Horton Reeve was born 1688. She died, according to her headstone, February 3, 1713 (old dating, ae. 26 years and 5 months. (3) The cause of her death is given in the Salmon records: "Bethia, wife of Thomas Reeve, died 1713 (1714 in modern dating) and infant died with mother."

1. Thomas Reeve m. July 20, 1719 Mary Wells\*4, born Southold, Long Island, 1-8-1694 (1695 mod. dat.) the daughter of William Wells, Jr. and his wife Elizabeth Tuthill. The date sometimes given for her death is incorrect. (The date, December 19, 1744, refers to the death of Mary Salmon Reeve, who was the wife of Lt. Thomas Reeve 1684-1761 †

In an old cemetery near Southold, Long Island, there is a lot with six graves and one of the headstones reads: "Here lies the body of Thomas Reeve, aged 59 years. Died November ye 9th 1738." Beside it is another, "Here lies the body of Bethia Reeve ae 15 years 7 days. Died March 1, 1739 (1740 mod. dat.)

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† Much of the confusion in the Reeve genealogies, in this generation, comes from confusing Thomas Reeve, the Lieutenant, and his wife Mary Salmon Reeve, with Thomas Reeve, the smith, and his wife, Mary Wells Reeve. The Lt. married, after his wife Mary died, Sarah Mumford, and thirdly still another, while the smith died in 1738.

Another grave was left vacant many a year before Timothy Bigelow was buried there in 1791. This one had probably been saved for Mary Wells Reeve, but since she had been buried elsewhere, the supposition is that she went to Orange County with her children.

The following children are recorded in the old records of Southold, L. I., and in the Salmon Records, as the family of Thomas Reeve, the smith:\*5

11-Thomas; born 4-20-1739. Recently his stone was taken from an Orange Co., cemetery and was in the possession of a curio shop in NYC. He died "4-1-1823 in his 83rd year.

Thomas Reeve's will was very simple; he gave to his son Abner five shillings besides what he had already given to him and the rest of his estate, which included real estate and personal, he left to his wife Mary, making her the sole executrix. It was witnessed by Moses Parnell, Ichabod Cleveland and Jonathan Horton. Probated and administration granted to Mary Reeve, 6-5-1739 \*6.



2. ABNER REEVE, son of Thomas & Bethia (Horton) Reeve, graduated from Yale College in 1731. He married Mary Langdon and entered the ministry shortly after that. By this wife, he had three sons and one daughter. After Mary's death in 1741, he married Deborah Tapping of Brookhaven by whom he had two sons: Tapping and Erasmus. Deborah died 1759, and he married for a third time to Phebe Foster of Southampton. He and Phebe were the parents of five more children.

Tapping Reeve, his son, was jurist, teacher of law, author of many legal works. He was born at Brookhaven in 1743. There have been several biographies of him. John C. Calhoun of South Carolina, secessionist, and one who advocated the principles of "State Rights" and helped foment the Civil War, was a student of his.

3. ELIJAH REEVE, Sr., son of Thomas & Mary (Wells) Reeve born at Southold, 1722, seems to have been a quiet, hardworking man of some ability, given to few words, fair but set in his convictions. Not very much is known about him. In 1759 he witnessed a will written by John Green of Goshen District and in it, he is called a blacksmith. In 1774, he was one of three commissioners in charge of laying out the highways. And in 1775, he lived in District 1, Goshen, N. Y., but in 1779, he is said to have been of "Mamakating Town". Shortly after that, he was of the Middletown district.\*7 He was listed in the 2nd Reg. Ulster County Militia along with his son, Elijah Jr., Capt. Wm. Bull, Capt. Wm. Faulkner, Capt. John Newkirk, John M. Seybolt, and John Seybolt, Jr.

Elijah Reeve, Sr., undoubtedly married twice. The name of the first wife is lost. His second wife was Widow Sarah--- who is buried beside him. Her stone reads: "Here lies Sarah, relict of Elijah Reeve, Sr. Died March 23, 1810 ae 74." †

In 1784, he was an officer of the Presbyterian Church, and the members met in his house until a church could be built. His residence was then called of "Deer Park".

The Rev. Ronald S. James, (Pastor of the Presbyterian Church of Mt. Hope at Otisville in 1963) says that there was a suit between Elijah Reeve in the church records and "Elisha" in the court records, about a sum of money which Elijah finally had to pay. (This may be why the family joined the Baptist Church.)

Elijah, Sr. died in 1789 and his headstone on what was once the Old Whitlock farm near Mt. Hope reads: "Beneath this stone lies deposited the remains of Elijah Reeve, Sr., through the various changes of life, a faithful friend, a pro-

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(† Foot note brought over from previous page.) The supposition that Sarah was his second wife, and not his first is based on the following reasons: (a) There is no daughter named for her, and only one grandchild. (b) The name Sarah has not been carried down in the family. (c) In his will Elijah Sr., returns to her all the things that she brought to him, which would indicate that she was a widow at marriage with property of her own. (d) He also informs his heir that if she should remarry and again become a widow and be in need, that she should be taken into his home again with all rights and privileges. Surely a father does not need to tell his children that they should care for their mother if she should be in want even if she should remarry? (e) In the Bible that she gave to her stepson, she inscribed it "A gift from Sarah Reeve." and not to Elijah from his mother," or "from his mother Sarah Reeve." Several who have worked in this genealogy have said that Sarah was a first wife, but I feel that they did not have access to her headstone. She would have been but 14 when she married, and perhaps even younger, for Elijah Jr., was born 1751, and some of his sisters may have been older than he,

To his oldest son, he left land bought of *Wm. Jellet*, and one-half of the tools except those belonging to the saw mill. To his youngest son, *Elisha*, "one half of the 400 acres I now live on with one half of the land bought of *William Jellet*." The rest of his estate to be divided equally between his eight children and one grandchild. To *Sarah*, his wife, the cows, flax, a room in his house, and all of the things she brought to him. The will was proved by *Elisha Reeve* of *Walkill*. It was dated Sept. 24, 1789.

4-JAMES REEVE,\*8 son of *Thomas* and *Mary (Wells) Reeve*, born 1736, went to *Orange County* 1763. He owned a farm between *Midletown* and *New Hampton*. He married *Hepzibah Moore*. Their children were:

5. ELIJAH REEVE, Jr., son of *Elijah Reeve, Sr.*, and his first wife, was born Sept. 2, old style, 1751. He m. Dec. 25, 1773, *Mary Seyboldt*, b. about 1754, in *Germany*, dau. of *John Mickle Seyboldt* and his wife *Mary Krizer*. *Mary* d. Aug. 6, 1783. He m. 2nd, *Mary Fox*, Feb. 7, 1786 \*10

*Elijah Reeve* was a member of the *Old School Bapt Church*. He had a distillery in the town of *Mt. Hope* and a warehouse in either *Otisville* or *Mt. Hope*. He had a grist mill and saw-mill adjoining *Moses Reed*, also \*7.

*Elijah Reeve, Jr.*, died Nov. 26, 1817 *ae* 66 yrs, 3 mo. and 6 days \*8 He left a will naming his surviving children and 2nd wife "Molly" or *Mary Fox Reeve*, to whom he left the bulk of his real and personal estate. But there is one strange thing



in his will. He says: "I give and bequeath to my son, Gabriel Reeve, the sum of thirty dollars to be paid in one year after my death. To my daughter Fanny Newkirk, the sum of 700 dollars to be paid. . . etc." The rest of his estate was to go to George Fox Reeve and Elijah Conklin Reeve after the death of their mother. \*11

Gabriel Reeve, the son of a Revolution War Soldier, and grandson of two Revolution War Soldiers, the nephew of four said soldiers, had married the daughter and granddaughter of Tories! (The thirty dollars may have represented "the thirty pieces of silver.")

Gabriel was a surveyor and clerk, and at one time worked in Paris, Ky. He was drafted for service in the War of 1812, (according to family tradition) and was taken prisoner by the British and held on one of the notorious prison-ships on Lake Erie. Gabriel acquired tuberculosis there, and killed him 12 years later. He moved from New York State to Ohio, living first at Marietta, and then at Wheelersburg. His death occurred Feb. 24, 1824 \*12

His estate was settled 1834. Hannah stayed in Ohio until her daughter, Frances married, then with her two sons, daughter, and son-in-law, Dr. John Kendall, came via the Ohio River, Illinois River, and ox-team to LaMoille, Illinois. Hannah died there 10-15-1853.

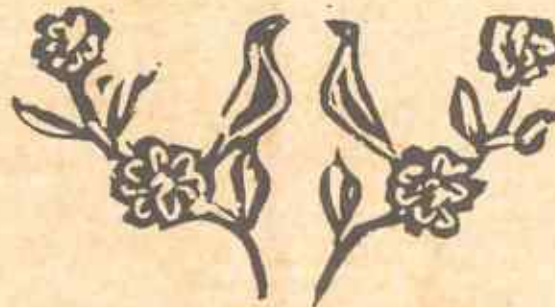

**ADDITIONS TO  
"IS THERE A REEVE IN YOUR FAMILY?"**

**Yesteryears—March 1966**

On p. 122. Rebecca, the wife of Thomas Reeves, the blacksmith of Southampton, died prior to 1694 as her estate was granted to her son John Reeves and his guardian John Penny June 12th of that year.<sup>1</sup> Her maiden name is unknown. She married second Benjamin Davis who died Dec. 20, 1692.<sup>2</sup>

On p. 123. Mary Wells Reeve (1695-1761) widow of Thomas Reeve, blacksmith of Southold, was buried beside her brother William Wells at Cutchogue, Long Island. She died June 19, 1761. Her age at death as given on her headstone was 66 years, 4 months and 16 days. This does not correspond with her known birth date. However, in 1965-66, a Mr. Wesley L. Baker visited that cemetery and noted that her stone seemed to have been recut and repolished at some later date.<sup>3</sup> The error in her age at death may have been made at that time. There could have been several reasons why Mary was buried at Cutchogue instead of Southold beside her husband: If she died of small pox or some other feared contagious disease; if the roads had been impassable because of rains; or if her brother considered the trip too dangerous as this was during the French and Indian War.

On p. 124. Nathaniel Reeve, son of Thomas and Mary Wells Reeve, born 8/8/1832, according to my notes also went to Orange County, N.Y. He was also a blacksmith. He married October 1, 1755, Mary Bedford, born 1738. (He could have been the Nathaniel Reeve who served in Capt. Thomas

Terry's Co. at Crown Point in 1758 along with his brother Thomas.) Evidently he moved to Elizabeth Town, N.J., shortly after his marriage as his oldest son Nathaniel Jr. was born there October 20, 1756. Soon after that he went to Orange or Ulster County, N.Y. (near the line). And in 1781, he removed to Berkley County, Virginia. The place and date of his death are unknown to me. The following children are recorded in the Bible of Mrs. Della Reeves Smith of Albuquerque, N. Mex. Nathaniel 10/20/1756; Rachel 1/28/1759; Mary 3/10/1761; Anna 3/10/1763; Hannah 2/17/1765; Keturah 4/20/1767; Samuel 3/23/1769; Lydia 4/29/1771; Bethier (sic) 5/20/1773; David 5/28/1775; Jonathan 3/22/1777; Stephen 4/26/1779 and Thebe 10/15/1781.<sup>3</sup>

I do not know whether Nathaniel Reeves, Sr., married Mary Shepard at Goshen in 1777 as his second wife, or if she married his son. Nathaniel Reeves, Jr., had a most eventful life. In his pension application, May 1833, he told a little about his career. It is worth retelling. "In the time of the Revolution my father with myself and the rest of his family moved down to Minisink, a low Dutch settlement on the Neversink which empties into the Delaware. While I lived at this place I entered the service of the United States as an *Indian Spy*. . . . Our business was to guard the settlement and alarm them in time of danger when we saw any signs of Indians. . . . We spied the frontier for about forty miles. . . . The Delawares and Shawnees were troublesome. I entered this service as a volunteer under Capt. Tyler. . . . In the year 1778 while I lived at the before mentioned place of my temporary residence to which my father and his family and myself had been driven<sup>4</sup> from the mouth of Ten Mile River on the Delaware, in the month of February, we went out again. . . . We saw Indian signs. While returning to the settlement we met with three families in canoes crossing to the settlement.

These were the families of Robert Landy (?), Jacob Walker, and ——— Wood. The heads of these families and the oldest sons were among the Indians acting against the whites. When we found them they had almost perished with cold and hunger. We took them to the Minisink settlement."

After the death of Capt. Tyler and Lt. Moses, who were killed in the battle of Lackowack, he says that they did not elect another commander, but went out alone finding their own provisions, arms, ammunition and clothing. It was during this year that part of old Minisink was burnt by the Indians, British and Tories. Some of the settlers were killed.

"In 1781 my father and family moved to Berkley County in Virginia<sup>5</sup> and in September of that year I was drafted for three months. I served as private in Capt. John Harte's company. We marched from Albemarle to Little York through Fredericksburg and Williamsburg. When we got there, we found the main American Army under the command of General Washington. There was cannonading which lasted for several days. I stayed there until they surrendered. At Noland's ferry I was discharged. . . . General Washington and General LaFayette were with the troops where I served."<sup>6</sup>

This man, born during the French and Indian War, saw active service during the Revolutionary War. Served as an Indian spy. Actually saw and served under Gen. Washington and Gen. LaFayette. Was present at the defeat of the British. He was a pioneer in that wilderness that was Ohio and lived to witness the War of 1812. He died sometime after 1840.<sup>7</sup>

P. 127-8. Deacon James Reeve born 1736, son of Thomas and Mary Wells Reeve, married 1st Mary Moore and not Hepzibah Moore as my article and others have stated. Their

father David Moore in his will bequeathed property to the children of his deceased daughters, *Mary Reeve* and *Hepzibah Case*.<sup>8</sup> James had eighteen children by his two wives. Seventeen of them were alive at his death. I could not believe that all of them belonged to one man and assigned some of them to his son James, Jr. However, Deacon James Reeves named them in his will, written 1803. A brief is as follows: "To my son James; to daughter Mary; to daughter Hepzibah; to son David; to son Joshua; to daughters, Lydia and Anna; to daughter Keturah and Dibrah; to son Isaac; to daughter Sarah; to daughters Mary (Think this should be Marian) Amutual and Jerusha; to son Elijah; to daughters Dolly (Dorothy) and Julia; to wife Mary; to son-in-law Stewart Brown. Wife Mary and Eli Corwin, Executors. Dated Oct. 31, 1803."<sup>9</sup>

P. 124. *Thomas Reeve*, born 1/20/1739, served in the French and Indian War. He died April 1, 1822, aged 83.<sup>10</sup>

John Henry Reeves

Chief among the breeders of fancy livestock in Wells County, Indiana, as well as among the thrifty farmers, stands John H. Reeves. He was born June 4, 1864, in Adams county, Indiana, and is a son of Dennis and Nancy ( Alberson) Reeves, natives of Randolph county, Ind.

Dennis Reeves was twice married but about a year after his first ~~wife~~ marriage he was bereft of his wife, and he next married Nancy Alberson in Adams county. This lady is a daughter of Joshua and Catherine ( Deeter) Alberson, who were the parents of ten children. After his second marriage Dennis Reeves came to Wells county in 1865 and purchases the farm of eighty acres on which John H. Reeves now lives. Dennis lived here until about 1882, when he purchased forty acres in Adams County, and has virtually resided there ever since, although at present living in Pyran, Ind. at the age of seventy-six and partially blind. His ~~wife~~ wife is now sixty-five years old, and has borne her husband eight children namely; John H. whose name opens this biography; Katherine wife of Lewis Nusbaumer; Winfield in Randolph county, Joshus, deceased, as are also James, Mary, and Willis.

John H. Reeves attended the Harper school house in Nottingham township, Wells county, until eighteen years of age, then his father moved to Adams, county, accompanied by John H. who worked until twenty-eight years <sup>old</sup> and for his father for no recompance beyond his expenses.

September 5, 1885, John H. Reeves was united in marriage with Miss Martha E Coffman, who was born July 27, 1867, in Wells, county a daughter of Jacob & Amelia Coffman, the former who was born in Hocking county, Ohio, and the latter in Wells county, Ind. Jacob Coffman is a son of Andrew Coffman, one of the old pioneers of Wells, county, and with his wife Amelia now resides in Ruth, Wells, County in quiet retirement and highly esteemed by their neighbors; they had born to them thirteen children, in the following order: Rebecca deceased, James, deceased, Martha E; wife of John H. Reeves., Nancy, deceased; Peter, residing in Wells, county; Charlotte, wife of William Fordice, of Huntington; Benjamin, deceased; Charles, in Wells, county; Mary, Edward, Bertha, Alta, deceased, and Esther.

John H. Reeves for eight years after his marriage continued to live and work on his fathers farm, which he then purchases. It is but just to add that the father deducted one thousand dollars from the purchase price, however in consideration of the labof the latter had previously performed, leaving a balance of eighteen hundred dollars to be paid by the son, who had erected all the buildings necessary, has underdrained the fields and meadows, and has sixty-four acres in a good state of cultivation; but he gives special attention to the breeding of Berkshire hogs, while he does not neglect other classes of live stock.

To the marriage of Mr. & Mrs. John H. Reeves were born six children namely; Glennie, Aug. 26, 1886; Tressie Irene, Nov. 25, 1889; Ernest, Jan. 30, 1892; Harold, Feb. 14, 1895; Baby Reeves, John Jan. 3, 1899, and an infant daughter, deceased.

In 1896 John H. and P. B. Alberson purchased a store in Phenix from Thomas Bouse and for some time conducted a prosperous general trade, Mr. Reeves subsequently selling his interest to Charles Mann; at the present time Mr. Reeves holds an interest in the fine Percheron Norman horse, Daniel, and of this animal he has charge. He also has six producing oil wells on his land, which have netted him about three thousand dollars.

Mr. & Mrs. Reeves are active as well as devout members of the United Brethern church in Phenix, of which Mr. Reeves is also a member of trustees. He is likewise a member of Lodge No. 721 I.O.O.F. at Petroleum, in which he has filled all the chairs and represented his lodge in the grand lodge; he is at present a member of <sup>Encampment</sup> ~~Lodge No.~~ <sup>145</sup> ~~%2%~~ I.O.O.F. of Pennville. He and his wife are likewise members ~~of~~ of Rebecca Lodge No. 571 at Petroleum, and Mrs. Reeves has missed attending its meetings but twice in two years. In politics Mr. Reeves is a Democrat and is very active in local affairs, having been largely instrumental in causing the Phenix gravel road to be laid out.

Indiana about 1836 and to Kentucky from N.J. or Mass. about 1812. There is an Ann but she married a VanSickle...

You did not give me dates for your Ann D. and I find ~~no~~ George and Caleb but no Jabez...so I doubt that it is the same line although it may be a branch of the same family. I copied this line because my uncle knew some of the family and thought we probably had a common ancestor.

My great grandfather Charles G. had charge of the Armory at Frankfort, Ky., and was a band leader. I hope to get a letter to the Kentucky Historical Society to see if they have records of his family. I only know that he died with tuberculosis when he was about 24 years of age and that he had a brother, Will, who went to Indiana or Illinois from Kentucky.

If I can help you further I shall be glad to do so and will let you know if I 'uncover' anything in Frankfort.

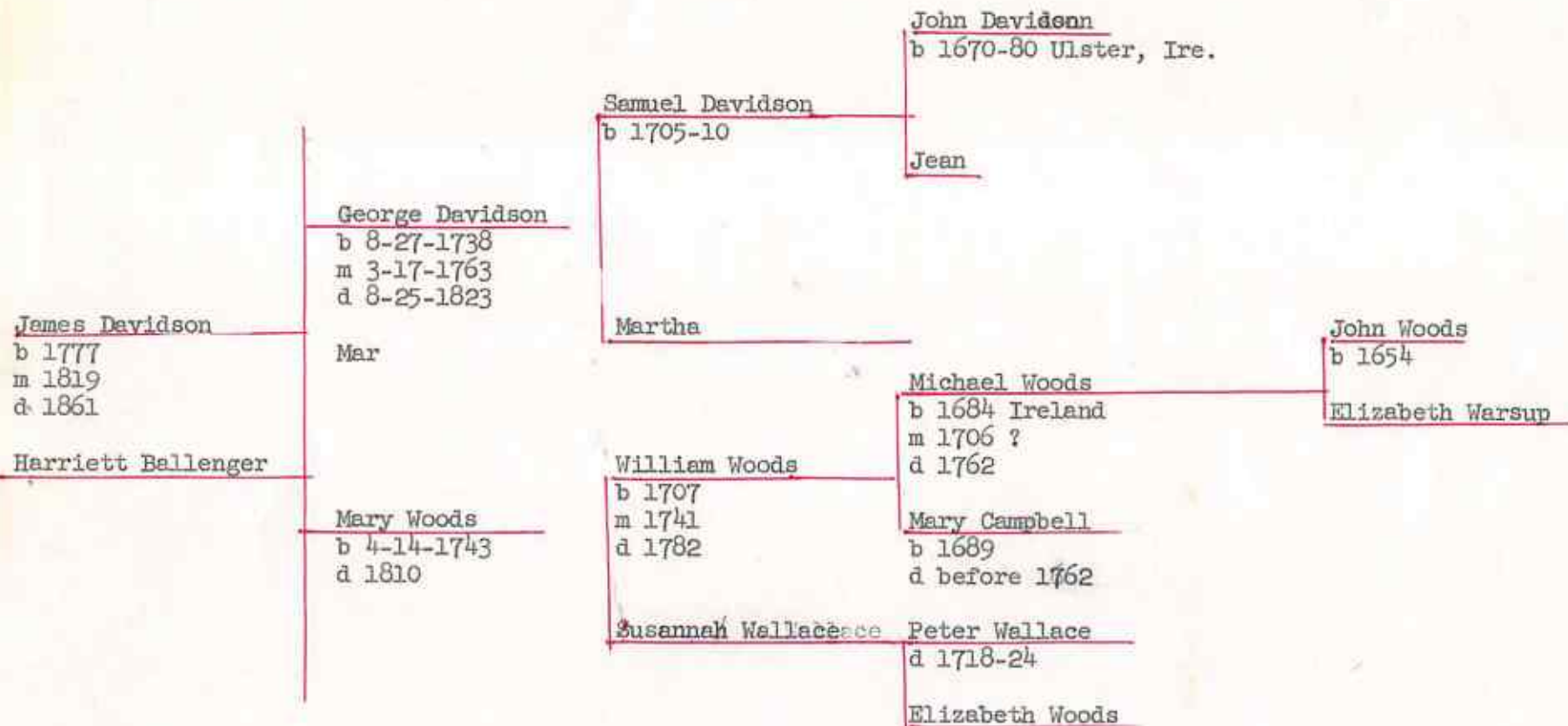

It was so nice to receive a letter from you, and to know of your interest in the Reeres family, (some times spelled Reeres)

My genealogy was compiled by my great uncle, David Lee Reeres, and his cousin, Mr. John Cottrell, many years ago.

It starts out, as follows:

George Reeres, sailed from Wales, landing in America in 1720 A.D. at the age of (17) seventeen years. He finally married and settled in Virginia, where he raised a



family of seven sons. He died about  
1798 A.D.

Asher Reeres, (who is my  
Revolutionary Ancestor) youngest  
son of George Reeres, was born in  
1758. When sixteen years of age he  
entered service in the Revolutionary  
war as a Cavalry man, and was  
shortly afterwards promoted to Corporal  
and assigned as one of General George  
Washington's mounted body guards.  
Served with honor and without  
injury through the war.

Several brothers, also  
served in the war, but no record  
of them have been kept.

Asher Reeres was married  
to one of Virginia's fair daughters  
in 1780 - Miss Wiana Miller. In  
1798 they removed to Tennessee  
in the vicinity of Knoxville, on the  
Tennessee river, where he purchased  
a large tract of land, where he became  
a pioneer farmer raising cotton, corn
