GENEALOGICAL DATA

Paul Revere

Baptized January 1, 1735.
Married (1) August 4, 1757, Sara Orne.
(2) September 23, 1773, Rachel Walker.
Died May 10, 1818.

Sara Orne

Born in Boston April 2, 1736. (Family Bible.)
Married August 4, 1757, Paul Revere.
Died May 3, 1773.

The above dates are all we know definitely about Sara Orne. There was at the time of her birth and for some years afterward only one Orne family in Boston. The marriage of John Orne and Martha Lackey is recorded in the files of Christ's Church and also in the vital statistics of Boston.

Their children were baptized in the First Church as follows:

Elizabeth, daughter of John and Martha, bapt.	October 25, 1730.
John, son of " " " "	December 10, 1732.
James, son of " " " "	April 21, 1736.
Martha, daughter of " " " "	dec'd November 7, 1736.

There the record ends. Sara may have been a twin with Martha or Martha may have been a child born earlier.

The father of these children, John Orne, was a son of John and Elizabeth (Williams) Orne, born February 16, 1709. His father, John, a cordwainer, died at the time of the terrible smallpox epidemic in Boston. He is buried in the Granary with two little daughters who died at the same time. His wife, Elizabeth, was a woman of property and social standing. She was sister of Jonathan Williams, an impor-

tant man in the Boston of his day. They were the children of Robert Williams, a founder of Roxbury. A third John was the father of this second John, a cordwainer of Salem, who moved to Boston. He married Mary Clark of Westfield. He was a son of the original John Horne. Another son of John Horne was Joseph, who was a great-grandfather of the Lois Orne of Salem who married Doctor William Paine of Worcester in 1773. Sara's probable father would have been a second cousin of the father of Lois Orne. The Boston Ornes seemed to keep in touch with their cousins in Salem. When Doctor Paine wished to make a very extraordinary and beautiful bridal gift to his fiancée he gave an order to Paul Revere for many pieces of silver to be marked 'L.O.' for Lois Paine, several of which bore the Orne arms. The bill for these pieces of silver was one hundred and eight pounds. A large proportion of them is owned by the Worcester Art Museum.

Rachel (Walker) Revere

Daughter of Richard and Rachel (Carlile) Walker.
Born in Boston December 29, 1745 (Family Record).

Married September 23, 1773, Paul Revere.

Died June 26, 1813.

Her parents:

Richard Walker. It has not been possible to trace this Richard Walker. Richard was a favorite name among the Walkers and there were several in Boston who might have been the husband of Rachel Carlile. We only know that he died December 28, 1777.

Rachel Carlile was the daughter of John and Hannah (Moore) Carlile.

Born March 25, 1705.

Died May 18, 1782.

John Carlile. Without doubt of the Carlile family of York, Maine.
Married Hannah Moore.

Hannah Moore, the daughter of Captain Thomas Moore and his wife Sarah.

Born in Boston April 26, 1662.

Her mother, Sarah Moore, died November, 1712, aged eighty years.
She was buried in King's Chapel Yard.

Thomas Hitchbourn, joiner.

Born in Boston March 2, 1676.

Married Frances Pattishall April 1, 1703.

Died November 6, 1731, act. 56. Is buried in the Granary.

Thomas Hitchbourn was probably a son of Thomas Hitchbourn and his wife Ruth. It was this older Thomas who beat his drum through the streets of Boston with a Challenger carrying a naked sword. A still older generation was Davy and his wife Ruth—Davy who was sentenced in 1641 to wear an iron collar 'till the Court please and serve his master.'

Frances Pattishall

Born in Boston in 1676.

Died September 14, 1749, aged 73. Buried in the Granary.

His great-grandparents with a few older generations:

Jean Rivoire, of Riaucaud, France.

His wife, Magdalena Malapongue.

Richard Pattishall, of Boston, New York and Maine.

He was the son of Edmund Pattishall of St. Mary Strand and his wife, Martha Denham. They were married in England about 1634. Richard, their oldest son, was baptized May 26, 1636. He came to this country with his father and one or more brothers and sisters. His first wife was Abigail. The second, from whom Paul Revere was descended, was Martha Woody.

Captain Pattishall was killed by the Indians on board his sloop at Pemaquid, in 1689.

Martha Woody, the daughter of Captain Richard Woody and his wife, Frances Dexter, was born the 25th day of the 11th month, 1651. She died April 21, 1718. She and her sister both seem to have been good friends of the Sewalls. The Judge attended her funeral with purple gloves and a mourning scarf, supplied by her family. She was buried in the King's Chapel Burying Ground.

Richard Woody was an important citizen of Roxbury. In 1678 he was ensign to Captain John Hull, who was lieutenant. He was son of an older Richard Woody and his wife, Ann. He was born about 1615. Married December 29, 1646, to Frances Dexter, a daughter of the famous Thomas Dexter of Lynn and other places.

In 1673 the whole Woody family were dismissed to the Third Church in Boston. They lived near Fort Hill in the south part of Boston. Later they deeded this home to Richard Pattishall. Frances seems to have had two brothers, but only one sister, Mary, who married Captain James Oliver, and so it came about that Thomas Dexter, her father, was buried in the Oliver tomb in the King's Chapel Yard. April, 1681, Sewall writes, 'Goodwife Everitt, Winthrop and Capt. Richard Woode dye suddenly.'

Frances Dexter was born in England.
