

Reflections on Civil War Major General Elliott Warren Rice

Resting under the shade of a pine tree in the beautiful loneliness of the old Floyd Cemetery, lies the remains of a Brevet Major General who fought valiantly for the Union in the American Civil War.

Elliott Warren Rice was born in Allegheny City, Pennsylvania, on 16 November, 1835. Like so many families during that time in America's history, his took part in the westward expansion, first to Ohio, where he attended college and then to Oskaloosa, Iowa, where he went to study law with his elder brother, Samuel, in 1858.

He entered the Union Army at the outbreak of the Civil War, enlisting as a private. He was made Corporal in the "C" Company of the 7th Iowa Infantry on 24 July, 1861, appointed from second Sgt. to Major on 30 August of the same year, and to the rank of Colonel on 7 April, 1862. Lt. Colonel J.C. Parrott was so prostrated by illness and exposure, that he was compelled to relinquish the command to Major E.W. Rice, of whom he says in his official report, "I knew it was placed in good hands, and from him, I was proud to learn that it did its duty unflinchingly."

Rice was still on crutches, but he accompanied Grant to Fort Donelson. He had recovered sufficiently to fight at Shiloh, in General W.H. L. Wallace's division. By the close of the battle of Shiloh, the 7th Iowa had been in service

about 8 months, participated in three important battles, with a loss of 300 of the 884 officers and men. At Corinth, in October of 1862, he commanded the 7th Iowa in a battle that saw the Union Army beat off a savage attack by General Van Dorn and some 40,000 troops. For awhile, the 2nd and 7th Iowa regiments had held the Union line without support.

Rice was then ordered to Bethel, Tennessee to take charge of that military district and then to LaGrange, to protect the railroad line that connected Memphis and Corinth. During the Atlanta campaign, Rice was put in command of the 1st Brigade, 2nd Division, 16th Corps, and for a time the division itself, taking part in all of the battles which led up to the siege or blockade of Atlanta. At one point during that relentless drive through Georgia, Rice's brigade beat off the onslaught of one of Hardee's entire Confederate divisions.

During Sherman's "March to the Sea," from Atlanta to Savannah, having been promoted to Brigadier General of volunteers on 22 June, 1864, Rice directed his brigade, which was now in Corse's division of Logan's 15th Corps, Army of the Tennessee. He participated in the campaign in North Carolina, which culminated in the battle of Bentonville, and the surrender of General Johnston's Confederate forces shortly afterwards.

Rice was promoted to Major General in the omnibus promotions of March 1865, and after being mustered out of the Army in August 1865, he remained in

Washington D.C. to practice law for the next twenty years. In 1885, poor health compelled him to move to the home of a sister in Sioux City, Iowa, where he died on 22 June 1887.

In an age that demanded that leaders rally their troops to perform heroic deeds under fire by exposing themselves to danger, General Elliott Warren Rice, won the reputation of a "Brave man." He was wounded seven times during the war, and he carried the bullet in his right thigh for the rest of his life that he received at Belmont.

Sioux City's "Elliott Warren Rice" Promotion Personally Demanded by President Abraham LINCOLN

Iowa Congressman, Josiah B. Grinnell, personally approached Lincoln's Secretary of War, Edwin Stanton, to urge that Rice be promoted to Brigadier General. He cited Rice's merit and the fact that his officers held him in such high esteem.

Stanton, who resented civilian interference in his War Department, was hostile.

"Your case, sir," he replied to Grinnell, "is like thousands of others. what we need now is victories, not Brigadiers. We are in a crisis. I refuse to make a promise to even consider the wish of a civilian at such a time. I'm sorry. My desk is loaded with business. Good Day, sir."

Grinnell, undaunted, made a second visit.

Stanton adamantly refused to discuss the subject. When Congressman Grinnell threatened to go over Stanton's head to talk to the President personally. Stanton growled. "If you get your request granted, I'll resign as Secretary of War."

After one more fruitless attempt, Grinnell made an appointment to visit with Lincoln. After Grinnell had finished presenting his case for the promotion of Rice to the attentive President, Lincoln asked for a bit of paper, leaned up against one of the pillars of the White House and wrote the following endorsement.....

"Without an if or an and, let E.W. Rice of Iowa be made a Brigadier General."

When Congressman Grinnell handed Stanton the executive order, Stanton glared at it, then crumpled it up and threw it into the wastepaper basket. "I'll resign," Stanton raged bitterly.

Grinnell turned to leave the office.

"Wait," the Secretary of War demanded. When Grinnell turned to face the Secretary, Stanton was smiling, instead of swearing. "Why don't you come and have dinner with me tonight?" Stanton offered in a conciliatory manner.

Suffice it to say, Elliott Warren Rice received his Brigadier General rank and Congressman Grinnell was tendered the Colonelcy of a regiment.

Through some confusion in the War Department, the promotion was written out to Elliott Rice's elder brother, Samuel. Thus, both Rice brothers became Generals in the Union Army. Samuel Rice served his country as faithfully as did his brother, Elliott.

At the battle of Jenkin's Ferry in April of 1864, Samuel A. Rice was wounded in the ankle. Sent home to convalesce, the wound failed to respond to medical treatment, and it finally led to the General's death in July of the same year. A statue of General Samuel A. Rice stands in Forest Cemetery of Oskaloosa, Iowa.

Rice, copied by his son, Charles Wells Rice of Flushing, New York, in 1930, to which have been added the latter's notes, and parenthetical explanations of relationship. This collection that is almost a genealogy in itself was furnished by Edwin S. Rogers of Reseda, California.

Our great-great-grandmother was beautiful and enchanting. Therefore our great-great-grandmother was a gypsy.

We are in the enjoyment of our usual health and trust this will find you the same. We shall be very glad to see you again before you return to Canada. Why can you not persuade your brother John to come down and make us a visit with you, if it is only a short one? We should be glad to have a visit from him and his wife. We expect to go to Duchess about the 1st of July to stay a week or ten days. After which we shall all be at home. Remember me in love to all our friends in Canada especially to those we have seen—Hannah and Cornelia. I do not yet despair making you a visit but business engagements will prevent that pleasure this season.

Editor's note: Benson J. Lossing was a prolific writer, turning out such voluminous works as "Field Book of the Revolution", "Our Country", and other historical tomes obviously requiring many hours of careful research. Judging from the above letter it would seem that he must have had a good editor or editors, for his writings, although sometimes heavy, are easy to read. How much of the data given here is fact and how much fancy calls for investigating. We have done none. Should you be interested in the actual genealogy of the family, better check elsewhere.

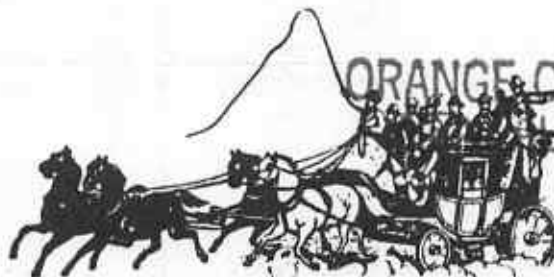

RICE - NICHOLS FAMILY HISTORY

From some elderly residents of Van Buren and Ozark, AR, descendants of six families who traveled together between 1840 and 1850 from Marshall Co, AL, to Franklin Co, AR it is possible to glean something of the NICHOLS and RICE families.

The NICHOLS family lived in Marion Co, TN before they moved to AL. LAWSON NICHOLS and his brothers or cousins, together with six other families (RANSOM, FULKS, SMITH, HUGHES, HIGHFILL, TAYLOR) made the trip from AL to AR in ox-drawn wagons. The journey took seven weeks. A number of the people had also been in Marion Co, TN (FULKS, SMITH, HUGHES).

The LEWELLYN RICE family, in Jefferson Co, TN in 1850, had moved to Franklin Co, AR before 1855. Lewellyn was originally from VA, apparently Washington Co. His father was PRESLEY RICE, born ca 1770, and must have farmed close to the NC border. LEWELLYN's younger brother, WILLIAM, was born in NC a year after LEWELLYN was born in VA.

The Washington Co, VA court minutes of 1778 reveals that a HENRY RICE was appointed road Overseer from the North Fork to the lower fork of Ranfros Creek. There weren't other RICES in the county so HENRY was probably LEWELLYN's grandfather.

In July (23rd) 1828, LEWELLYN married MARY FARMER in Jefferson Co, TN. In 1830 there were three RICE households close together: LEWELLYN, WILLIAM, THOMAS. (Could the name have been JOHN THOMAS RICE?) A near neighbor in 1830 was NIMROD FARMER and his wife MARY. In 1850 all members of the households were listed in the census and eighty year old PRESLEY was living with WILLIAM in Jefferson Co. LEWELLYN was just a few doors away. WILLIAM was a farmer; LEWELLYN a laborer.

In 1850 the rather large NICHOLS clan lived near Altus, AR. There is a NICHOLS Chapel Cemetery northwest of ALTUS. LAWSON and MARTHA NICHOLS lived near other TN-born NICHOLS families. JULIE, age 56, living alone but next door to URIAH NICHOLS, 33 wife, MARTHA, 38; and six children; CLIFTON, 39; JESSE, 31; wife JULIA. JESSE married JULIA RANSOM back in AL.

The offspring of LEWELYN RICE married in Franklin Co, AR. BIRD married JANE NICHOLS 6 Sep 1855. Brother THOMAS ANDRES, 23 married SARAH MARTHA CANUTE, 19, 1 Jan 1858. RACHEL married WILLIAM JASPER ENGLISH 1 Apr 1858. NANCY married GEORGE W. BARNES 9 Sep 1862.

By 1870 URIAH NICHOLS was a 50 year old widower with four children still in the house. JULIE, in her seventies, was living with URIAH. Down the road was LAWSON NICHOLS' widow, MARTHA, 65, with LAWSON WEBSTER NICHOLS, 24. NIMROD RICE, 25, with his young wife, MARGARET ELIZABETH TROTTER RICE, and her younger brother, SAMUEL, 21. LEWELLYN RICE, 60, and MARY, 62, were next with three unknowns: AGNES, 27, TN; JOHN, 19, TN; and THOMAS, 13, AR.

In 1880 the RICES and NICHOLS' I have been tracing were nearly gone. Oh, there were still lots of RICES and NICHOLS', even more in 1900, but the old familiar individuals had all but disappeared. LAWSON WEBSTER NICHOLS, 33, wife, MARY, 29, and ELLEN, 12, AR; Fred, 10, AR; Martha, 8, AR. Down the road URIAH NICHOLS, 60, and daughter AMANDA, 30, were sharing a house. The enumerator noted URIAH was feeble. He hung on long enough to marry again: SARAH JANE HIGGINS JONES BOURLAND NICHOLS. He was her third husband.
