EXPLANATION OF ORDER FOR PHOTOCOPIES

Please use the other side of this form to order photocopies of records relating to a person who served in the United States or Confederate Armed Forces. We can furnish photocopies relating to the following subjects:

- a. United States (not State) pensions claimed on the basis of service before World War I;
- b. United States (not State) bounty lands claimed on the basis of service before 1856;
- c. United States military service performed after 1774 and more than 75 years ago and Confederate military service. (NOTE - We do not have information relating to military service rendered before the Revolutionary War.)

Send us the completed form with one dollar. If you send more than one form at one time, your remittance should be for as many dollars as you send forms. Each order will be handled separately; so you may not receive all your photocopies at the same time. Be sure to enter your name and address on each form.

If we find a pension or bounty-land warrant application file which we believe relates to the person in whom you are interested, we will send photocopies of the documents we think most likely to be of interest to you. If no pension or bounty-land warrant application file is found, we will furnish copies of the military service record if one is available. If we do not find a file that appears to pertain to the person in whom you are interested, we will refund your money.

The military service records rarely contain family information. Furthermore, the record of a man's military service in any one organization is wholly separate from the record of his service in any other organization. We are ordinarily unable to establish the identity or nonidentity of men of the same name who served in different organizations. If you know that a man served in more than one organization and you desire copies of his military service record, a separate form and one dollar fee should be submitted for the service record in each organization.

State of North Carolina August Term 1832

Edgecombe County C. Court of Pleas & Quarter Sessions

On this 29<sup>th</sup> day of August personally appeared in open Court, before the Justices of the Court of Pleas & Quarter Sessions now sitting, Edmund Ricks, aged 74 - a resident of the County of North Carolina, who being first duly sworn, doth on his oath make the following declaration in order to obtain the benefit of the act of Congress of June 7, 1832.

That he was born in Surry County N<sup>C</sup> March 1<sup>st</sup> 1759, according to the family record which has been preserved. Residing in Surry County he was drafted into the service of the United States and attached to a company commanded by Captain John Cook of which company Henry Crafford was Lieut. The regiment to which this company belonged was commanded by Col. Allen Fort - He was employed during this time of three months upon James River in Virginia. He was not regular discharged but served out the period for which he had been drafted. - This was in the fall of 1776 -

In March 1777 he removed with his mother to North Carolina and settled in Wake County - in 1777 he was drafted for another three months year and was attached to a company commanded by Capt. Susan Mayo, who was succeeded by Capt. John Mayo and Jesse Mayo Lieut. - He does not recollect the regiment but it was commanded by Col. Richard Cobb Straight - He was aided in command by Major Shepard. He was employed upon Roanoke River and pursued the Tories up and down

Country bordering on that river. He was first sent  
in this company and was ultimately discharged  
Smithfield.

The facts stated in the first clause of this decla-  
ration are ~~the~~ documentary evidence to substantiate

those stated in the last be sustained by the oath of  
John Bryan who served with him.

I do hereby relinquish all claim whatsoever  
to a pension or annuity except the present and de-  
clare that his name is not on the pension roll of  
any agency of any State

are credible persons and their statements entitled to  
full credit.

Personally appeared before me Charles G. Hunter  
Justice of the Peace in and for said County Edmund Ricks  
who being duly sworn deposed and saith. -

That he was induced to make his declaration in  
Edgecombe County, he residing in Pitt, for the accommoda-  
tion of his witness John Bryan who resides near the  
Court House in the former town in the latter County. which  
said witness by reason of great bodily affliction is carried  
with great difficulty from place to place. - He did not  
procure the Certificate of a Clergyman for the reason of never  
being resident in Georgia. - For the support of the fact of his  
residing as first aforesaid he refers to certificate of Dr Bryan  
who served in same Company.
