RULES FOR DECEASED VETERAN CEMETERY MARKERS

Any family member for a deceased veteran of any war (except Texas Independence) may order a NEW marker -- veteran in an unmarked grave and never had a marker, a REPLACEMENT marker for a broken, stolen, or unreadable one.

HOWEVER DO NOT! DO NOT! return the old marker. What on earth would they do with it!? The person, whom spoken with confirmed that as in the past, a broken or unreadable marker should be taken up and destroyed... in other words, they do not want two government markers on a single gravesite.

Government markers for the Veteran may be placed in any cemetery, but a government marker for a spouse may be obtained only if they are buried in one of the national cemeteries.

It is suggested that especially with the Civil War, the upright marble reminiscent of the style of the time, be selected. They are beautiful!

Replacement medals can be ordered. ONE SET; not one for all members of the family who want one!

If you find a government headstone on the grave of an ancestor or loved one, remember that someone had to apply for it.
